GOING THE DISTANCE

Seven three-year-old fillies will be asked to travel a complete circuit of Belmont Park's main track this afternoon in the 12-furlong GI Coaching Club American Oaks.

None of the entrants have ever gone this far, but several own victories going a mile and an eighth. One of those is **Spoken Fur** (Notebook), who drew off impressively to win the GI Mother Goose S. June 28 in her first start for trainer Bobby Frankel.

Frankel, who has won six Grade I races in New York alone this year, admits there are question marks surrounding Spoken Fur's chances. "Hopefully she can go that far, but you really don't know until they try it," said the Hall of Fame trainer. The 7-5 favorite in the Mother Goose was **Yell** (A.P. Indy), who got into traffic trouble on the turn and had to settle for second, 5 1/4 lengths behind Spoken Fur. "We hope she'll improve," said trainer Shug McGaughey. "She got jammed up pretty good on the backside in the Mother Goose." The dark bay filly, a six-length winner of the GII Davona Dale S. Feb. 23, is bred top and bottom to get a route. "I don't think she'll have a problem with the distance," McGaughey added. **Savedbythelight** (Saint Ballado) strode home strongly in the off-the-turf Sands Point S. June 15, winning by 5 3/4 lengths in that nine-furlong test. Finishing behind her that day were **Little Bonnet** (Coronado's Quest) (third) and **Fircroft** (A.P. Indy) (fourth).

TRIPLE CROWN FOES TOP HASKELL WEIGHTS

The weight assignments for the GI Haskell Invitational H. came out yesterday, with Kentucky Derby and Preakness hero **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) and Belmont S. winner **Empire Maker** (Unbridled) each getting top weight of 123 pounds. But Funny Cide will be the lone heavyweight in the starting gate at Monmouth Park Aug. 3.

Trainer Bobby Frankel will run Empire Maker in the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga the same afternoon. Frankel is pointing **Peace Rules** (Jules) to the Haskell. The colt, who captured the GII Louisiana Derby and GI Toyota Blue Grass S. this spring, has been assigned 121 pounds for the nine-furlong event. Trainer Barclay Tagg, who coached Funny Cide to victory in two-thirds of the Triple Crown, is pleased that his horse won't have to give Peace Rules a bigger edge. "I've been saying for weeks that I wouldn't give more than two pounds to Peace Rules," the former steeplechase rider said. "If the spread had been bigger, we wouldn't be going [to the Haskell]." But Tagg is concerned about the amount of weight that some of the other Haskell invitees have been assigned.

Sky Mesa (Pulpit), who was undefeated as a two-year-old and came back after a lengthy layoff to be third in the July 6 GII Dwyer S. at Belmont Park, was weighted at 118, with Dwyer winner **Strong Hope** (Grand Slam) at 117. Both are possible for the Haskell. "Sky Mesa has been highly touted--he's no slouch," Tagg said. "I think the weights give him a big advantage. But you have to worry about all of them." Funny Cide is scheduled to have his next workout Monday morning. Frankel was uncharacteristically satisfied with the Haskell assignment for Peace Rules. "I thought we should maybe get three pounds from Funny Cide, but the weights are OK, it's no big deal," he said. "We're going to run."

Perfect Drift will be heavily favored after beating Mineshaft a head in the GI Stephen Foster H. at Churchill Downs June 14. The four-year-old gelding, with six wins and three seconds from his 13 career starts, looks to erase the memory of his last trip to Arlington, when he finished many lengths last behind Volponi in the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. **Iron Deputy** beat Volponi in his latest try, winning the June 14 GII Brooklyn H. by 2 1/2 lengths over the Classic hero. The four-year-old has been plagued by injury, but has made the most of his eight career starts, winning five races, including the Huntington S. at two and the Count Fleet S. at three. Fourth in his career opener, **Flatter** has been unbeatable since. The four-year-old ran through his conditions last year, but was off from September until June. The bay returned in an optional claimer at Churchill Downs June 27 and powered to a 5 1/4-length score. He makes his stakes debut.

A small yet select field for this stayers' event includes seven-year-old **Clety**, a late developer who progressed from the handicap ranks to finish on the board in the G1 Prix du Cadran and G1 Prix Royal Oak, both at Longchamp, last October. He secured his first stakes win in the Listed Prix Right Royal at this track Apr. 7, but has not been out since finishing as the runner-up in the G3 Prix de Barbeville at Longchamp Apr. 27.

Martaline rates the main danger based on his runner-up finish in the G2 Grand Prix de Chantilly June 8.

Undefeated **Hennie's Song** started her career with a victory over \$62,500 maiden claimers at Gulfstream Park Apr. 4 and has not looked back. The bay, a modest \$57,000 KESEEP yearling, rallied to win her first two starts while sprinting, but has led at nearly every call since stretching out to two turns for a Delaware allowance test May 20. A half-length winner in the May 31 Go for Wand S. over this track two starts back, she comes off a 2 1/4-length score over **Ladyecho** in the June 28 Susan's Girl Breeders' Cup S. at Delaware.

Awesome Humor was a perfect four-for-four last season, taking the GIII Debutante S. at Churchill Downs and the GI Adirondack S. and GI Spinaway S. at Saratoga, then was sidelined for 8 1/2 months. She showed little in her return, finishing a distant fourth in an optional claimer at Churchill May 14, but was back to her winning ways in her latest, capturing an optional event at Arlington Park June 6.

READING THE TEA LEAVES

There were only 8 percent withdrawals from this week's Fasig-Tipton sale (compared to 11 percent last year and 16 percent the year before), but this still meant that 21 percent fewer horses went through the ring at Fasig this year than last year. Considering that the clearance rate of those that went through the ring was 71 percent--up from just 61 percent last year and 62 percent in 2001--it was a very good result, with the sale's gross down by just 11 percent, to \$28.2 million. We have to agree with Fasig's Walt Robertson that the 5-percent drop in average and 4-percent drop in median were relatively inconsequential. The really good news was that 66 percent of those catalogued were reported as sold, versus 54 percent last year and 52 percent the year before. The sellers came to sell and the pinookers came to buy, the way the sheets read. Good domestic trade.

There was a tiny increase at Fasig's top level. In 2001, three yearlings cracked the \$500,000 barrier; last year, there were four. This week, five yearlings sold for a half-million or more. The sale has been concentrating a lot on young sires in recent years, and this looks a particularly strong group of first-year sires, so it's not a great surprise that four of the five '6 1/2-figure' sales' (six figures is \$100,000 and seven figures is \$1-million, so I calculate that \$500,000 to \$1 million is 6 1/2 figures) were from the first crops of their sires, and sold on Wednesday.

[Fusaichi Pegasus](#)' only representative topped proceedings at \$800,000, [Cat Thief](#) and Golden Missile each had a \$600,000 colt and [Lemon Drop Kid](#)'s only Fasig yearling brought \$500,000.

Since most sires had maybe three or four sell, the sire averages for this sale are not necessarily indicative of how the rest of their sales year is going to go; in many cases, it just tells us they had a nice yearling or two.

There were 15 first-year sires who had three or more yearlings sell, with 14 of the 15 ending up within \$40,000, one way or the other, of the sale average. The exception was 1999 Breeders' Cup Classic winner [Cat Thief](#), who also had a \$450,000 colt. He ended up with four selling from four offered, averaging \$336,250. Overbrook would be quite pleased to see him sustain that kind of average as the sales continue.

Two sons of A.P. Indy, Golden Missile and [Stephen Got Even](#), were among the five first-year sires with five or more sold. Golden Missile narrowly edged out another Overbrook stallion, the lightly raced [Cape Canaveral](#), for second place on average, with both coming in at \$133,000 and change. Golden Missile had eight sell; one brought \$600,000, the next highest price was \$115,000, and the rest were under \$100,000. His median was \$72,500. Cape Canaveral had just three sell, two of them fillies who brought \$200,000 and \$160,000. Stephen Got Even had six (of 10 offered) average \$76,500.

This crop's big hitters will be more in evidence at Saratoga in 2 1/2 weeks' time. Fusaichi Pegasus has six catalogued there, while [Giant's Causeway](#) (none at Fasig) has seven. Lemon Drop Kid, Chester House (none at Fasig), Cat Thief, [High Yield](#) and [Dixie Union](#) also have six each at Saratoga. [War Chant](#), who had one filly (\$200,000) at Fasig, has two at Saratoga, along with Golden Missile and Stephen Got Even.

Nearly half of this week's catalogue, and 90 percent of the first day's offerings, were by first- and second-crop sires. Of those with their first two-year-olds racing, Menifee was the most impressive. He had just three catalogued, and all three sold for \$150,000 and up: Mr. and Mrs. Jerome Moss must have seen something they liked, because they bought a colt for \$230,000 and a filly for \$190,000. Menifee thus averaged \$190,000 for the three.

Freshman sire Stormin Fever had a \$300,000 colt and had four yearlings average \$146,250.

Among older sires, four in particular notched notable six-figure averages.

Carson City, a very consistent sire of two-year-olds and sprinter-milers, had three average \$150,000. The steadily improving Mr. Greeley, led by the \$500,000 Thursday session-topping filly, had eight average \$137,375. Maryland sire Two Punch racked up an average of \$135,000 with four sold and Thunder Gulch, who had just had leading distaff earner Spain in his first crop--and who has just come back from Japan, had 10 average \$120,100, including a \$400,000 colt. Interestingly, all four of those are Mr. Prospector-line sires. Among the younger sires, Storm Cat, as you'd expect, and Seattle Slew were the other most prominent lines.

SPARKLING BLUE (f, 3, Smoke Glacken--Venting the Blues, by Cure the Blues), a \$25,000 KEENOV weanling and a \$70,000 OBSAUG yearling, ran fourth in a Monmouth maiden won by the ill-fated Advancing Storm last August, but went missing after that. Previously trained by Mary Hartman, the bay returned with Lasix added July 3 against \$50,000 maidens and romped by six lengths. The 5-1 shot quickly opened up on her rivals and held a six-length lead after a half in :45, but she looked to be in trouble when Arctic Drift (Gone West) came after her at the top of the stretch. Jockey Eibar Coa went to work on Sparkling Blue, convincing her to switch leads, and the filly shrugged off her challenger to win by 2 1/4 lengths.
