CHAPEL ROYAL REIGNS IN SANFORD

Trainer Todd Pletcher continued his dominance over the New York circuit with the help of his newest juvenile star **Chapel Royal** (Montbrook), who scampered away to a 5 3/4-length victory in Thursday's GII Sanford S. at Saratoga. Undeclared in two prior lifetime starts at Belmont Park, a 9 1/4-length romp in his debut May 15 and a 5 1/4-length score in the Gill Flash S. June 6, Chapel Royal showed that even the Saratoga slop couldn't stop him on this day. "He just shipped in a few days ago and he had never run over a wet track," said Pletcher. "I never worked him on one, for that matter. He's just a young horse, talented and learning. This colt has been as impressive as any two-year-old we've had." According to Pletcher, the colt will make his next start in the seven-furlong GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga Aug. 30. GODOLPHIN STRENGTHEN HAND

Godolphin yesterday took advantage of the lack of a Ballydoyle representative and snapped up Michael Kinane for the ride on **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge) in tomorrow's G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot, which has attracted a field of 14. Kinane, who has won the contest four times since 1990, will wear the black cap on the three-time Group 1 winner, who will sport the sheepskin cheekpieces made famous by Storming Home (GB) in 2002. Godolphin, who are seeking their 100th success at the highest level and their fourth renewal of this since 1997, are also responsible for last year's G1 Prix du Jockey-Club (French Derby) winner **Sulamani (Ire)** (Hernando {Fr}), the mount of Frankie Dettori, and G1 Gran Premio di Milano winner **Leadership (GB)** (Selkirk), who will be partnered by Jamie Spencer. Commenting on Grandera, who has failed to land a blow in Europe this term, Racing Manager Simon Crisford said yesterday, "His last two runs have been disappointing, but he's well in himself." Trainer Bill Mott holds a hot hand in Saratoga's first graded turf contest of the season with entymates **Del Mar Show** and **Patrol**. The former, who defeated eventual Breeders' Cup Classic winner Volponi in this event last year, finished fourth in the GII Citgo Dixie H. at Pimlico May 17, his second start of 2003, before settling for third last time out in the GII King Edward BC H. at Woodbine June. 15. Mott's junior entrant, four-year-old Patrol, has failed to hit the board only once in 10 career starts, but 2003 has been kind thus far. A neck winner in his debut at Gulfstream, a \$100,000 optional claimer over a mile, followed by a respectable third in the GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic at Churchill Downs May 3, the bay returned to action almost seven weeks later to score in the nine-furlong Dallas Turf Cup at Lone Star June 21. Trainer Allen Jerkens will try and play the spoiler with Saint Verre, the runaway winner of the off-the-turf GIII Fort Marcy H. Apr. 26. He returned to finish second and third, respectively, in a pair of Monmouth stakes, before gamely holding on for third in his most recent start in the mile GIII Poker H. over the Belmont sod July 5.

REDEMPTION FOR SULAMANI?

Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford also revealed that the operation is hoping that **Sulamani (Ire)**, who took the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29, will bounce back from his disappointing fourth placing in the G1 Grand Prix de Saint-Cloud last time June 29. "Sulamani obviously doesn't show a lot at home," he commented. "He is not a robust horse that requires a lot of hard work going into a race. Obviously, it was a great performance in Dubai, but we came back to Newmarket and we took our time with him because we knew the races for him were in the second half of the season. There were one or two legitimate excuses [at Saint-Cloud], but nevertheless we were disappointed that he didn't finish better than his position. Having said that, he's made significant progress since that event. I think going into the King George the whole of the Godolphin team would be a lot happier with him and very much hopeful that he can reproduce his best form."

Leadership fast, but no rabbit...

Crisford was quick to point out that stablemate **Leadership (GB)** would not be deployed as a pacemaker, adding that "the pace is going to be on." He added, "Leadership is a natural pace horse and, if for some reason, the pace was not strong enough, he could pick it up. I'm sure especially with the younger horses coming through probably with half a mile to run that the battle will really start early."

Alamshar Ready to Run...

Ante-post favorite **Alamshar (Ire)** (Key of Luck), winner of the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh last time June 29, heads the sophomore team and conditioner John Oxx revealed that the colt's back problems have not proved a major obstacle in the run-up to the race. "I wouldn't say we've no problems, but it's kept under control and he's in good form. He always bounces out of his races very well--they never seem to take much out of him and he's had an uninterrupted preparation since the Curragh." With only minimal rain falling at the Berkshire track, the going is officially described as good-to-firm, good in places.

Stoute Tightens Screws on Kris Kin...

Connections of **Kris Kin** (Kris S.) were satisfied with the G1 Epsom Derby winner's exercise yesterday morning and reported him firmly on course for tomorrow's feature. "He breezed out okay over four furlongs [Thursday] morning, so we're hopeful, but he doesn't show you much," commented owner Saeed Suhail's racing manager Bruce Raymond. "He doesn't gallop freely, but I think he's okay on good-to-firm ground; he was alright on it in the Derby. We just think that because he won on very soft ground at Doncaster last year that it would hamper the others, but I don't think he particularly needs it soft. It's going to be a strong race, but the distance is not a problem for Kris Kin and we beat Alamshar once, so I see no reason why we shouldn't beat him again."

Rain in the Forecast...

Clerk of the Course Nick Cheyne was expecting "some significant rain" before the race, telling *PA Sport* yesterday, "I think they are talking about 10 millimetres of rain." That rain is necessary if G2 Princess of Wales's S. winner **Millenary (GB)** (Rainbow Quest) is to take his chance. "Millenary doesn't like it firm," trainer John Dunlop said yesterday. "He's been unlucky really. He's seldom got the really easy ground he wants. It wasn't that slow at Newmarket the other day and if it was similar ground to that we'd be very happy to go."

SKY MESA TO FACE FUNNY CIDE IN HASKELL

Trainer John Ward has opted to send GI Hopeful S. winner **Sky Mesa** (Pulpit) to the \$1-million GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park Aug. 3 to face dual Classic winner **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor), thus bypassing a shot at GI Belmont S. winner **Empire Maker** (Unbridled) in Saratoga's GI Jim Dandy S., held on the same day. "If you plan to go against a Triple Crown horse, the best time to get him is his first race back," said Ward, but the ever pragmatic trainer was quick to add that, "[Funny Cide] has come back and worked well." Undefeated at two, including wins in the Hopeful and the 1 1/16-mile GI Lane's End Futurity at Keeneland last October, the striking bay finished third in his only prior start this term, the GI Dwyer S. at Belmont Park July 6. Ward hopes for a good finish in the Jim Dandy and the Haskell, which would set the stage for a classic rematch in the Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 23. "The Travers could probably be one of the best story lines in racing," said Ward. "Everything is setting up for a ratings show, but it's not just a two-horse race [Empire Maker and Funny Cide]--there are others, including us, if Sky Mesa runs well here." Also slated for the nine-furlong Haskell are **Peace Rules** (Jules), **Kool Humor** (Distorted Humor), **Congrats** (A.P. Indy), **Excessivepleasure** (In Excess {Ire}) and **Wild and Wicked** (Wild Again).

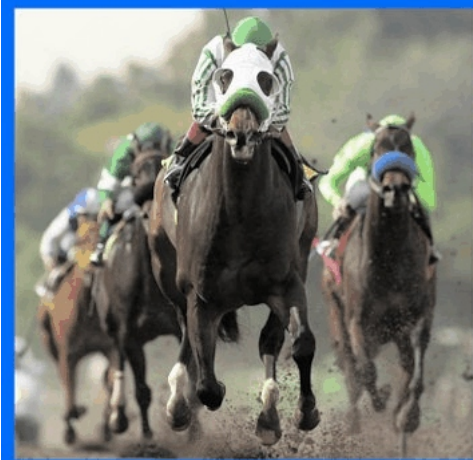

MAGIC WEISNER LAST IN RETURN Magic Weisner (Ameri Valay), last seen finishing a game second to War Emblem in the 2002 GI Haskell Invitational at Monmouth Park, returned to the racetrack yesterday, but failed to fire while running last in Laurel's sixth race. After his runner-up finish in the Haskell, the four-year-old gelding battled through a near-fatal bout of the mosquito-borne West Nile Virus. He resumed training in February and put in 17 official works prior to his return in yesterday's seven-furlong \$36,000 optional claimer. Sent off the 6-5 favorite, Magic Weisner broke slowly and was never in the race, finishing sixth and last. The race was won by **Inner Harbour** (Capote). "There's nothing wrong with him," Magic Weisner's owner, breeder and trainer Nancy Alberts said after the race. "He just couldn't get it in gear. That's sad. Poor Magic. It's back to the drawing board. His rear end is still weak and it looks like we'll just have to go back and give him some more time." Magic Weisner raced to prominence last season with a second-place effort in the GI Preakness S. He also captured the GI Ohio Derby. On the board in 11 of 15 starts to date, the bay has won seven starts and earned \$888,110.

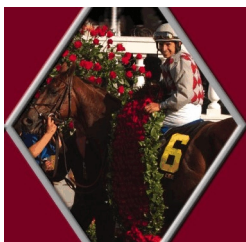
It had been exactly one year since Puzzlement's last trip to the winner's circle, but the four-year-old came running in the stretch to get the job done. The Florida-bred had hit the board in several big races this season, running third in both the GI Donn H. and the GI Gulfstream Park H., but his most recent outing saw him finish fourth to Mineshaft in the GI Suburban H. July 5 at Belmont. Allowed to settle well off the pace in this five-horse affair, Puzzlement moved into contention four wide on the turn, collared the battling pair of Thunder Blitz and Quest inside the final furlong and was going away under the wire.

NORTHERLY INJURED, FUTURE UNCERTAIN

The immediate future of reigning Australian Horse of the Year **Northerly (Aus)** (Serheed) is uncertain after the dual Cox Plate winner suffered a tendon injury to his right fore tendon. Northerly, the winner of A\$9.4 million and nine Group 1 races, has not raced since a three-start Sydney autumn campaign that culminated in a boil-over second when odds-on favorite Freemason (Aus) beat him by a short half head in the G1 BMW S. at Rosehill. Trainer Fred Kersley's wife and Northerly's managing part-owner, Judith Kersley, said there was "every chance" Northerly would be retired immediately, with connections awaiting the outcome of scans on his injury. "That's racing, you have to take the good with the bad. We're grateful for what we've had," she told Australian Associated Press. Northerly has 19 wins, seven seconds and two thirds from 34 attempts and he is second only to Sunline for prizemoney earnings, with the mare amassing A\$11,351,607 during her career. Northerly captured the 2001 and 2002 Cox Plates and he also won Australian Cups in 2001--running a track record of 1:59.46 for 2000m at Flemington that still stands--and 2003, when he scored by four lengths, his last victory. Jockey Patrick Payne, who partnered Northerly during the latter part of his career, said, "He was such a peoples' horse. He wasn't the best looking horse and he could be beaten on his day, but he had real guts about him and I think that's what people admired so much about him, he never gave in."

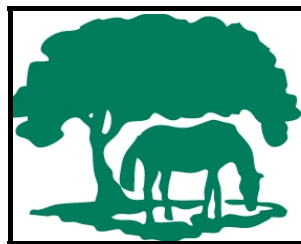
