KONA GOLD RETIRED

The distinguished racing career of champion sprinter **Kona Gold** (Java Gold--Double Sunrise, by Slew o' Gold) has officially come to a close. The nine-year-old gelding, a winner of 10 graded-stakes races, ended his career with a fifth-place effort in Saturday's GII Bing Crosby

Breeders' Cup H., a race he won in 2001 and 2000. Kona Gold capped his 2000 championship season with a record-setting victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint, running the six furlongs at Churchill Downs in a track record 1:07.96. Trained by Bruce Headley, the bay was ridden by Alex Solis in 28 of his 30 starts. On the board in 23 outings, Kona Gold won 14 times and earned \$2,293,384. Among his victories are the 2001 GI San Carlos H., the 2000 and 2001 GII Potrero Grande Breeders' Cup H., the 2000 GII Palos Verdes H.

and GII Ancient Title Breeders' Cup, the 2002 GIII Los Angeles H. and 2003 GIII El Conejo H. Kona Gold, owned by Irwin and Andrew Molasky and Headley's wife Aase, was second in the 1999 Breeders' Cup Sprint and third in the 1998 Sprint.

FILM MAKER DELIVERS CLASSIC

Film Maker (Dynaformer) bided her time before unleashing a powerful stretch run to capture the GIII Lake George S. by an expanding 2 1/2 lengths at Saratoga yesterday. The bay filly closed behind slow fractions to finish second behind pacesetter **Impolite** (Two Punch) last time out in the July 6 Little Silver S. and she faced the same conditions yesterday. Impolite was loose on the early lead through fractions of :24.18, :48.23 and 1:12.21, while Film Maker raced mid-pack. Jockey Edgar Prado, looking for his third win of the afternoon, waited in traffic on the turn, then asked Film Maker to split foes in upper stretch and the filly easily accelerated to the front. "I knew I had horse, I was just hoping that something would open up--and it did," Prado explained. "She really exploded. I thought she was much the best." Trainer H Graham Motion added, "I was a little antsy at the top of the stretch, but I had Edgar on top of my horse and I feel pretty confident with him on my horses." Proud Citizen Readies for Whitney

Robert Baker's **Proud Citizen** (Gone West), second to War Emblem in last year's Kentucky Derby and Preakness S., breezed five panels over Saratoga's Oklahoma training track in 1:01 1/5 in preparation for Saturday's GI Whitney S. "I think he's actually better than he was as a three-year-old," said trainer D. Wayne Lukas yesterday. Vanned off the track following a fifth-place finish in his final start of 2002 in the GI Belmont S., the bay spent the remainder of the year recovering from surgery to repair a fractured knee. Winless in his first three starts of the year, Proud Citizen finally showed his old fire with a 4 1/2-length score last out in a two-other-than allowance at Churchill Downs July 6. "His win was a tick off the track record," said Lukas, adding, "I think he earned his way into the [Whitney]."

Posse Set For Amsterdam

Posse (Silver Deputy), a nose winner over Midas Eyes last time out in the seven-furlong GII Riva Ridge S. at Belmont Park July 7, covered a half mile in :48 2/5 over the Oklahoma track Monday morning in a final preparatory move for Saturday's GII Amsterdam S. "His last three races...all of them have been really impressive," said Scott Blasi, trainer Steve Asmussen's New York assistant. "He really had to earn his money against Midas Eyes. He's going into the Amsterdam in great shape." The Bill Heiligbrodt-owned colt has won half of 12 lifetime starts with \$489,581 in the coffers so far.

Next Stop on the Frankel Train?

Sunday's GI Go For Wand winner **Sightseek** (Distant View came out of the race in good form, according to trainer Bobby Frankel and will likely make her next start during Belmont's Fall meeting. However, the Hall of Fame trainer would not rule out a possible try in Saratoga's GI Personal Ensign H. if GII Shuvee H. and GII Delaware H. winner **Wild Spirit (Chi)** (Hussonet) was to defect from the 10-furlong contest. Another Frankel trainee, **Zenda** (Zamindar), who was a three-length winner in a Saratoga allowance Sunday, may make her next appearance in the GI Beverly D. at Arlington Park Aug. 16. "She was only 75-percent fit [Sunday]," said Frankel. "It was a good race to get her going." The Group 1-winning filly has three wins and three seconds from nine career outings and has amassed \$406,560 in earnings to date.

As married men everywhere will surely appreciate, it's nice to be proved right every once in a while. I am currently feeling ever-so-slightly smug about the words I wrote early in April for TDN's Freshman Sire Preview, when I said that the signs pointed "towards Fasliyev being this year's leader of the pack."

But even I would admit that you hardly needed the powers of Nostradamus to make this prediction. Fasliyev had, after all, been Europe's highest-priced new stallion of the 2000 season, at 25,000 Irish guineas, his fee reflecting his dominance of the two-year-old scene throughout 1999.

As I explained in April: "He won all five of his juvenile starts, including the G1 Phoenix S. and G1 Prix Morny, taking the latter easing up by four lengths even though five of his six opponents became Group winners. He topped the International Classification for two-year-olds by five pounds from two other unbeaten juveniles, Distant Music and Giant's Causeway."

Then came the fracture to a pastern which meant that Fasliyev followed the example of two other notable juveniles, Raise a Native and Hail To Reason, by covering his first mares at three. The big difference was that, whereas the American colts' very successful first crops respectively numbered 11 and 13, Fasliyev has over 100 foals to represent him.

Quick off the blocks...

Because of the exceptional maturity shown by Fasliyev right from the start, everyone was bound to demand a quick start from his offspring, and they could hardly have been faster out of the gate. By last weekend, 35 of them had raced in Britain or Ireland, with plenty more competing throughout Europe.

At least 19 of them have won and his most impressive statistic is that three of them (the English colts Russian Valour and Kings Point and the French filly Much Faster) have already collected total of four Group races (plus two other stakes races). Pretty good going, considering that Europe has so far staged only 11 Group contests for two-year-olds. There should be more stakes winners to come, a prime candidate being Carry On Katie, who strolled home 12-lengths clear on her debut at Ascot on July 25.

The biggest contributor to Fasliyev's impressive total is the unbeaten Much Faster, who was gaining her third stakes success when she easily won the G2 Prix Robert Papin two days ago. Even though Much Faster enjoyed a clear advantage by racing against the rail, she is clearly very talented.

As I commented back in April that Fasliyev bears a much stronger physical resemblance to his broodmare sire Mr. Prospector than to his sire Nureyev, I find it interesting that Much Faster is inbred 3x4 to Mr. Prospector (as well as 3x5 to Northern Dancer).

Her second line of Mr. Prospector comes through her broodmare sire Zafonic, who is shaping up nicely in this role. Zafonic, of course, was a brilliant son of Gone West and this is by no means the first time that Gone West has featured in the pedigree of a very good two-year-old inbred to Mr. Prospector, other examples being Elusive Quality's Prix Morny winner Elusive City and Mr. Greeley's Futurity S. winner Whywhywhy. This is clearly an option with a lot of potential.

As you might guess from her being by Zafonic, Much Faster's dam Interruption was bred by Juddmonte Farms. Interruption was foaled when her dam, Intermission, was 22-years-old and she was by no means one of her dam's better physical specimens. She was never able to race and was considered surplus to requirements, partly because Juddmonte had other Zafonic fillies from the Intermission family. Incidentally, another of these fillies, the minor winner Imbabala, is currently being ably represented by her first foal, Kalabar. This son of Kahyasi recently failed by only a short neck to win the G2 Prix Eugene Adam.

Much Faster's third dam, Peace, is one of the most widely represented mares in the Juddmonte stud book, through the descendants of her daughters De Stael, Balabina, Flaming Peace and Intermission. De Stael, best known as the dam of the Eclipse Award-winning Wandesta, may yet increase her total of stakes winners to five through her promising three-year-old Piano Star, and her daughter Valencia has been doing very well this year with her very fast son Deportivo.

Much Faster's second dam, Intermission, earned a Timeform rating of 117 in the process of winning three of her six starts, including the prestigious Cambridge-shire H. Although Intermission produced nothing better than a Grade III winner--the Sadler's Wells filly Interim--she has produced several successful broodmares and Interruption follows Welcome Break and Twixt as her third daughter to produce a Group winner. Twixt, like Interruption, produced her Group winner--the smart French and American performer Bon Point--to a son of Nureyev.

Interval, another of Intermission's daughters, was good enough to finish third in the 1000 Guineas and is now the second dam of Continent, a winner of two of Europe's best sprints last year. This underlines the continuing strength of a family which can produce above-average performers over a wide range of distances.

It is going to be interesting to see how far Much Faster can carry her speed, as Fasliyev never had the opportunity to race over further than six furlongs. Remember, though, that Fasliyev's dam Mr. P's Princess is a half sister to the Kentucky Derby seconds Desert Wine and Menifee, so there is a good chance he would have stayed a mile.

AZERI CONFIRMED FOR HIRSCH Horse of the Year **Azeri** (Jade Hunter), who is currently riding a 10-race winning streak, including a recent win in the GI Vanity H. at Hollywood Park July 21, will make her next start in the GII Clement L. Hirsch H. Aug. 10, according to owner Michael Paulson. "Looking at the training schedule of getting to the Breeders' Cup, we thought at this juncture that traveling all that way and the weather being so unpredictable, that it wouldn't be the prudent thing to do for the horse," explained Paulson. The five-year-old, who worked five-furlongs in :59 Monday at San Luis Rey Downs in Bonsall, California, reportedly will have one more work Monday prior to the Hirsch. "She worked in her usual splendid style," said trainer Laura De Seroux. "She shaded 59 [seconds for five furlongs], galloped out [six furlongs] in 1:11 and change and [seven furlongs] in 1:24 and change. She's in a very good holding pattern for the Clement Hirsch."

SARAVA RECOVERING AFTER SURGERY Belmont S. winner **Sarava** (Wild Again), who underwent emergency colic surgery Sunday morning following a sixth-place finish at Del Mar July 26, was doing well Monday, according to Dr. Joe Cannon of the San Luis Rey Equine Hospital. "Dr. Cannon said the horse's attitude was much improved [Monday] over Sunday," said Dr. Vince Baker, regular veterinarian for the four-year-old. "[Dr. Cannon] said the horse was depressed and was still having problems [Sunday]. His protein level has come up and right now, we're just waiting for him to come back."

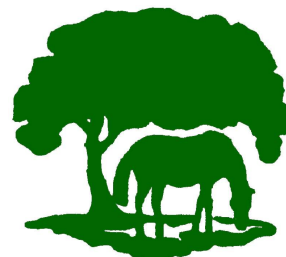
