**KALAMAN COULD BE THE MAN**

**Kalaman (Ire)** (Desert Prince {Ire}) bids to provide Sir Michael Stoute with his fourth renewal of today's G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood. Long held in high esteem, the secret was out before the half to Kalanisi (Ire) took his maiden at Newbury Apr. 12 and he continued to impress by beating Ikhtyar (Ire) by 1 1/2 lengths in the Listed Heron S. May 24. He suffered a troubled trip when beaten a length by **Zafeen (Fr)** (Zafonic) in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 17. Zafeen, beaten 3/4-length in the English 2000 Guineas, was burying the disappointment of his 14th placing in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas. Both represent the form of the

Royal meeting's mile contest, responsible for the last five sophomore winners of this race. While two winners of the St James's Palace S. have followed up here since 2000, three runner-ups have gone one better since 1994 and Kalaman may have the call if he stays out of trouble. Sophomores rule here, having beaten their elders 21 times since 1975. Strengthening the attack is **Trade Fair (GB)** (Zafonic), who was forced to miss the 2000 Guineas due to a minor setback in the spring. He returned to beat subsequent G3 Jersey S. winner Membership in the G2 King Charles II S. before annihilating a competitive assembly of rivals in the G3 Criterion S. June 28. Both came over seven furlongs and doubts linger over his ability to see out this mile. **Moon Ballad (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}), who was impressive in winning the G1 Dubai World Cup on dirt at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29, reverts to a mile having disappointed when running too freely in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot last time June 18. His pedigree suggests he needs further than this and a sterner challenge from the older horses may come from **Where or When (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}). After beating Hawk Wing in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot last September, he returned to be put firmly in his place by that rival when the 11-length runner-up in the G1 Lockinge S. May 17. He returned a sick horse when subsequently sixth in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 17 and is dangerous to write off. *Full field p. 4*

**CHANDLER ON THE STATE OF THE EMPIRE**

Juddmonte Farms President John Chandler yesterday offered up a rough sketch of the future of Juddmonte homebred **Empire Maker** (Unbridled), who spoiled Funny Cide's Triple Crown bid with a compelling victory in the G1 Belmont S. June 7. Chandler indicated that victories in the two races that were focal points for the Bobby Frankel trainee--the G1 Travers S. and the G1 Breeders' Cup Classic--would most likely spell the retirement of the regally bred colt, who would be sent to stud in 2004. "If he wins the races he's supposed to, the Travers and the Breeders' Cup Classic, then really there isn't much reason to keep him in training [next year]," said Chandler. "If he doesn't win, then there is a greater likelihood that he'd stay in training next year, but I'd say that the chances of him staying in training next year are not particularly great." First on the menu for Empire Maker is Sunday's GII Jim Dandy, for which he'll be the overwhelming favorite. Chandler opined the brief respite following the Belmont has only helped the colt, saying, "He's had a bit of time off and he's filled out and settled down a little bit. They go through a fairly rigorous training regimen up to the Triple Crown, but now he can settle into a routine. He matures as much mentally as much as physically with time."

**TEAM FUNNY CIDE OPTIMISTIC**

As Kentucky Derby winner **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) gears up for the second half of his season beginning with Sunday's G1 Haskell Invitational H., his connections are optimistic that the horse will return to his winning ways after falling short of his Triple Crown bid. Co-owner and managing partner of Sackatoga Stables, Jack Knowlton, and Funny Cide's jockey, Jose Santos, expressed confidence that the chestnut would be firing on all cylinders this weekend. "We'd like to win [the] race," said Knowlton. "It's a million dollars. It's a Grade I. Clearly we want Funny Cide to jump back up to where he was before the Belmont. We're not going down there [to Monmouth Park] not expecting to win. There are some nice horses in there, but Funny Cide is a special horse." Santos reiterated Knowlton's optimism, adding, "I have plenty of confidence that the horse can do it. He's coming in with a rest, and he's going to be strong and showing his best that day. I haven't lost any faith in the horse."

Nayyir, who nearly died after suffering a severe case of travel sickness in Hong Kong last December, defied a four-pound penalty to collect back-to-back renewals of this contest. He proved effective at a mile when winning the G3 Diomed S. and he had sufficient pace to finish third in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at an extended six furlongs. But his best performances have come over this specialist trip and his finest hour came with a decisive win in the G2 Challenge S. Patiently brought back into training, he marked his revival by finishing sixth in the G3 Chipchase S. Held up towards the rear by jockey Eddie Ahern off the furious early pace, he made smooth progress wide in the straight to lead with 300 yards remaining before holding the late thrust of the luckless Arakan. "He was the flagship last year and he's the admiral this year," conditioner Gerard Butler commented. "Last year, it wasn't as good a race as this time as there were a lot more nicer three-year-olds in it but he just performs." Carrizo Creek finished third behind Bayeux in a strong course-and-distance maiden on his debut May 21 before breaking his maiden at Brighton May 30. He produced a smooth performance to win the valuable Goffs Challenge at The Curragh on yielding ground last time June 27. Over a course softened by rain, the imposing colt dwelt from the stalls and had to race on the heels of his rivals under jockey Kieren Fallon. Brought wide with his challenge inside the final quarter mile, he quickened to hit the front at the eighth-pole and gave a brief scare when jumping the path soon after. That did not affect his momentum and he held his advantage in the drive to the line as Old Deuteronomy challenged gamely. "He's a very, very talented colt and at the moment, you'd have to say he was the best of mine," trainer Brian Meehan told *PA Sport*. "He is in the G2 Gimcrack S. [at York Aug. 20] and I would have to say that the G1 Middle Park S. [at Newmarket Oct. 3] sounds likely. He is just progressing all the time."

Phoenix Reach overcame relative inexperience to book his place in the line-up for the G1 St Leger at Doncaster Sept. 13. Runner-up to subsequent 2000 Guineas third Norse Dancer (Ire) last June, he suffered a split pastern but suggested he retained his ability when winning a Newbury maiden last time July 3. Held up in mid-division throughout the early stages by Darryll Holland, he was hampered as the race began to develop, but soon recovered to quicken in the straight and take command with a quarter-mile remaining. Challenged by Hawk Flyer soon after, he warded off that threat and the post came in time as the rapidly closing High Accolade ran out of real estate under a five-pound penalty. "He's a fragile horse at the best of times, but Darryll was very impressed by him and wants to ride him in the Leger, so it's all systems go," trainer Andrew Balding said. "It's been challenging--he's had three screws and a pin put in his near-fore fetlock, so it's full credit to the horse to come back from that. He's learning all the time and will only get better." **Kings Point** and **Nevisian Lad** face a stern task as they bid to belie penalties picked up due to their group successes at Newmarket's July meeting. While the former is proven at the trip, having won the G3 Superlative S. there July 10, **Nevisian Lad** has to prove his stamina after his G3 July S. success over six furlongs the previous afternoon. **Nevisian Lad** had previously chased home the top-class **Russian Valour (Ire)** and **Kheleyf** in the G3 Norfolk S. over the minimum trip at Royal Ascot June 19, so may find this trip beyond him. Of the unexposed types, **Lucky Story** has a highly progressive profile, having stepped up off a disappointing debut to win a weak maiden at Ayr June 20 before following up in smooth style in a conditions event at Pontefract 10 days later. His trainer has a clutch of smart juveniles and he has made no secret that this colt takes high order amongst them. **The Mighty Tiger** was third behind stable companion **Old Deuteronomy** in a Newmarket maiden May 31 before winning a similar event at The Curragh June 28. He bids to provide trainer Aidan O'Brien with his first renewal and end his conditioner's drought in the major British juvenile races so far in 2003.

Voodoo Dancer seems to be as tough as teak, both as a traveler and a runner. She has made frequent appearances on both coasts and has been in some fierce racetrack battles, but on the basis of her efforts this season, the five-year-old mare might be better than ever. Winner of the GI Garden City Breeders' Cup H. at three, Voodoo Dancer added the GII Palomar H., GIII Locust Grove H. and GIII Beaugay H. last year, these being in California, Kentucky and New York. She was also beaten inches after a couple of fierce battles with Juddmonte Farms' formidable **Tates Creek** in the GI Yellow Ribbon S. and the GII Diana H.

This year has seen more air miles and more photo-finishes for Voodoo Dancer. Given a well-deserved rest after the GI Yellow Ribbon, Voodoo Dancer, opened the 2003 campaign with a third in the GIII Beaugay H. at Aqueduct. In search of the firm ground she loves, she then packed her bags for the trip to Hollywood Park, where for the first time she successfully stretched out to 10 furlongs, defeating Dublino and Megahertz in the GII Beverly Hills H. (the form of that race was stamped at the weekend, when Megahertz took the GI John C. Mabee H., with Dublino dead-heating with **Tates Creek** and Golden Apples for second). One month later, Voodoo Dancer was back on the East Coast to carry top-weight in the GI Diana H. at Saratoga. Just as it had last year, the Diana came down to a battle between Voodoo Dancer and a Juddmonte color-bearer trained by Bobby Frankel. Once again it took a photo to decide the outcome, but this time Voodoo Dancer emerged the victress, getting home by a neck. *Cont. p. 7*

**KEY RACE # 3 OF 2003**

Ten Group 1 winners of 19 Group 1 races, a South African-bred Group 2 winner in Dubai, and a pacemaker lined up for what was surely one of the best renewals ever of the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth S. last Saturday. The three Derby winners in the field ran 1-2-3, with this year's Irish Derby winner Alamshar producing a scintillating performance to cruise home ahead of last year's French Derby winner Sulamani and this year's Epsom winner Kris Kin, running a boxcar Postmark (the *Racing Post's* speed figure) 134 in the process.

Alamshar did benefit from a great tactical ride by Johnny Murtagh. He and Nayef had the speed to lay off the pacemaker Izdiham, evidently sensing that it was not a breakneck pace on the dead ground. Meanwhile, Sulamani and Kris Kin were in their customary positions, more in front of them than behind. Murtagh won the race coming off the turn; as Nayef backed up, Alamshar shot clear, and the race was over. Sulamani and Kris Kin never had any chance of getting to him. Significantly, both Frankie Dettori (on Sulamani) and fourth-placed Bollin Eric's rider Kevin Darley commented on the lack of pace afterwards. I'm not saying anyone would have beaten Alamshar, who, after all, does have the speed to lay handier, but it would have been closer. In establishing himself as the top middle-distance horse in Europe, Alamshar confirmed for good the status of his sire Key of Luck as one of Europe's rising stallion stars. Known until now as Anabaa's year-older, smaller three-quarter brother, Key of Luck has now become a name in his own right. By Chief's Crown (sire of another Irish-based son to sire a Derby winner, [Grand Lodge](#)), Key of Luck was the first foal of Balbonella, surely one of the best mares Sheikh Maktoum has ever owned. Winner of the then-G1 Prix Robert Papin, Balbonella produced only five foals before her untimely death at the age of 12. Her first two foals were colts-- Key of Luck and Anabaa. She then produced three fillies: Always Loyal (by Zilzal), winner of the 1997

French 1000 Guineas; Country Belle (by Seattle Slew), a Listed winner in France whose first foal is last year's G2 Gimcrack winner Country Reel; and a Danzig filly, Danzella, who was sent to Australia.

Key of Luck had a checkered career at the racetrack, but one in which he proved to possess speed, precocity and versatility. He started four times as a two-year-old when trained by Criquelette Head, all over five or six furlongs, all in black-type races. He won two, including the G3 Prix d'Arenberg, and was second in the other two, in the space of two months. He was then off the track for 20 months, returning on June 1 of his four-year-old year. From six starts that term, he won an amateur riders' race over a mile, and was five times out of the money. He went to Dubai with Godolphin in the winter of 1996 as a five-year-old and won all three of his starts there on the dirt, including a 20-length win in the Dubai Duty Free, running the 10 furlongs in virtually the same time as Cigar did winning the Dubai World Cup on the same night. From there he went to America with trainer Kiaran McLaughlin and ran a close second to Star Standard in the GI Pimlico Special. He started three times at six, running fourth to Singspiel in the 1997 Dubai World Cup, and retired to stud in Ireland at around a \$5,000 fee. He'd already established himself as a very useful sire by the end of last year. With his first crop just three at the end of 2002, he had a 2.00 A Runner Index, 4.00 for B Runners, and an eye-catching 4.26 ABC Index rating for two-year-olds. Needless to say, his days of obscurity are now totally over. He's a big-time sire now and, as if to emphasize the point, he had a two-year-old stakes winner, Lucky Pipit, for Sheikh Maktoum last week as well.

**Rolling, Rolling, Rolling ...**

It really does seem like every day you pick up the paper, there's another winner by [Fasliyev](#) and, if he hasn't had a winner, Cape Cross has. The accompanying table (p6) was compiled through racing of last Sunday, but on Monday night, Fasliyev had winner number 19 (from 51 runners and 94 named foals), and 'veteran' freshman sires Imperial Ballet and Soviet Star also had winners. So did Daylami, whose name is going to start appearing more in the papers. **Cont. p. 6**

Last week was a good one for Europe's two leading freshman sires. Fasliyev closed the week out with 18 winners, including three group winners. Much Faster, who had already won a Group 3, was gifted a golden rail under Thierry Thulliez, and easily beat [Danehill Dancer](#)'s full brother Colossus in the G2 Prix Robert Papin. The previous day, first-time starter Carry On Katie had thundered home for a 12-length win at Ascot. On Saturday, the Royal Ascot G3 Coventry S. third Privy Seal became Cape Cross's first stakes winner, winning the seven-furlong Tyros S. at Leopardstown. Cape Cross already had three other colts stakes-placed in good races among his 12 winners to date.

Nobody ever really knew how good Fasliyev was. He was unbeaten in five starts at two, but fractured a pastern and was retired. The next year, his stable's [Giant's Causeway](#) made a few headlines himself, so Fasliyev did not go to stud as the best-known or most expensive of Ballydoyle's 1999 two-year-olds. But Raise

a Native never ran after he was two, and he turned out pretty well as a sire, if Mr. Prospector, Alydar, and Exclusive Native are anything to go by. Fasliyev never raced beyond six furlongs (I have a feeling Raise a Native didn't either, but I'm not sure about that), but has already had a Group 3 winner at seven. It's highly probable they'll go the Guineas distance.

Here's another interesting point. Fasliyev is by [Nureyev](#) out of a Mr. Prospector mare. Of his first three group winners, one (King's Point) is out of an Unfuwain mare--inbred to Northern Dancer; another (Much Faster) is out of a Zafonic mare--inbred to Mr. Prospector. The third (Russian Valour) is out of a Septieme Ciel mare--dis-tantly inbred to Northern Dancer. Cape Cross is by Green Desert, a son of [Danzig](#). Of his first four stakes horses, three are out of mares by Northern Dancer-line sires: Privy Seal is out of a Royal Academy mare (Nijinsky II); Cedarberg is out of a [Sadler's Wells](#) mare; and Cape Fear is out of a Polar Falcon mare (Nureyev). See a pattern? *Special thanks to La Table des Lions for the great meal!*

After starting once on the main track, Voodoo Dancer has only finished out of the first three twice in 19 starts on the turf, and when one looks at her pedigree, it's no surprise that grass is her game. Her sire, Kingmambo, a son of Mr. Prospector and the brilliant turf miler Miesque, was a three-time Group 1 winner over a mile at three in Europe, including a victory over older horses in the G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp. Although he did sire GI Belmont S. winner and champion older male Lemon Drop Kid in his second crop, Kingmambo has predominantly made his name as a sire of outstanding turf performers.

Voodoo Dancer is out of the 18-year-old Zuri, a daughter of Danzig, another horse whose progeny have frequently excelled on turf. Voodoo Dancer is Zuri's only stakes winner, but she is also dam of Waycross, a daughter of Conquistador Cielo, who placed in several stakes, including a third in the GII Sorrento S., and of Gravette, a Demons Begone filly who took the runner-up spot in the GIII Oaklawn Breeders' Cup H. Waycross has been extending the family's success another generation as she is dam of Tulsa and Jakes Corner, a pair of current minor black-type winners by In Excess.

Voodoo Dancer's granddam Visibly Different is by another turf star, Sir Ivor, a horse who in Europe is generally acknowledged as a "great" and whose credits included the 1968 renewals of the English Derby and Washington D.C. International S. A minor winner, Visibly Different produced six winners, only one of which earned black type, this being the Audubon Oaks third Bright Link. Visibly Different was out of Tatallah, a daughter of the South American-bred Tatan and champion two-year-old filly Leallah. Runner-up in the Astoria S., and third in the National Stallion S. at two, Tatallah became a successful producer and subsequently a good tap-root mare. Dam of 10 winners from 13 runners, she was represented by only one stakes winner, the Junior Miss heroine Joi'ski, but in addition to Voodoo Dancer, she is ancestress of at least 14 other black-type winners, including her grandson Engine One, who took the GI Vosburgh H.; the G3 Prix Messidor winner Neuilly; and current Californian stakes performer Singletary. Tatallah's dam Leallah did even better in this department, as she is ancestress of a slew of major stakes winners, among them Group and Grade I winners Miswaki, Lacovia, Tobougg, Eternity Star, Martial Law, Lujain, Almutawakel, White Muzzle, Clever Trevor, Sir Beaufort, General Challenge, Notable Career, A P Valentine and Peter Davis. Of the these, we can note the GI

Dubai World Cup winner Almutawakel as having a very similar background to Voodoo Dancer, as he is by a son of Mr. Prospector out of a Danzig line mare, who also carries Sir Ivor.

When Kingmambo retired to stud, there were some merchants of doom who predicted that, as a son of Mr. Prospector out of a mare by a son of Northern Dancer--the two predominant male lines of the era--he would struggle to find mares with which he could work (this being based on the presumption that one would want to avoid inbreeding to Mr. Prospector and Northern Dancer). However, in company with Thunder Gulch, Distorted Humor, Elusive Quality, Grand Slam, Not For Love and Smoke Glacken, Kingmambo has demonstrated that this pedigree formula is no bar to success.

For Kingmambo the figures reflect that he has sired 40 stakes winners from his first seven crops of 477 foals (which include current two-year-olds), and has 14 percent stakes winners to starters. In addition to Voodoo Dancer and Lemon Drop Kid, who we have mentioned above, these include El Condor Pasa, a champion in Japan and France; champion French two-year-old colt Okawango; English G1 2000 Guineas winner King's Best; Bluemamba, who took the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches-French 1000 Guineas; Russian Rhythm, successful this year in the English G1 1000 Guineas and G1 Coronation S.; and the 2003 G1 Queen Anne S. victor Dubai Destination.

It is true that Kingmambo hasn't been successful with inbreeding to Mr. Prospector or his sire Raise a Native. However, we should first note that as a horse who is predominantly sire of turf horses who are generally miler to middle-distance performers, it's unlikely that Kingmambo would respond to attempts to duplicate a primarily speedy dirt influence. Secondly, in this particular case the Mr. Prospector/Raise a Native comes in through the male line, and inbreeding to an ancestor in the immediate male line of a stallion usually needs careful handling. On the other hand, with the Northern Dancer influence, one which does well on turf, and is in the center of the pedigree, Kingmambo has enjoyed considerable success. In fact, Northern Dancer is found somewhere in the distaff side of 22 of Kingmambo's stakes winners (55 percent). Voodoo Dancer is one of four stakes winners--three graded--out of Danzig mares, and other Kingmambo's with Northern Dancer in the dam include additional Group/Grade I winners El Condor Pasa, Okawango, Russian Rhythm and Dubai Destination and additional group and graded scorers American Boss, Parade Ground, Parade Leader and Penny's Gold.
