FUNNY CIDE FAVORED IN HASKELL

Serenaded by Bruce Springsteen's "Born to Run," Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) will return to the races for the first time since his third-place effort in the GI Belmont S. in Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park.

The chestnut gelding yesterday drew post position five for the \$1-million race and was installed the 8-5 favorite. "I'm pleased with the way our horse is going," trainer Barclay Tagg said of Funny Cide. "He's grown some since the Belmont. I gave him 30 days off without a breeze,

then I breezed him four times in the last month." Tagg said that Funny Cide will ship from Saratoga to New Jersey on Sunday morning. In the Haskell, Funny Cide will again meet up with Derby third-place finisher **Peace Rules** (Jules), who drew the rail for the nine-furlong contest. The 2-1 second choice, trained by Bobby Frankel, is also expected to arrive at Monmouth early Sunday morning. **Sky Mesa** (Pulpit) was unbeaten as a juvenile, but has been sidelined much of his sophomore campaign. Third in his only three-year-old start in the July 6 GII Dwyer S., the bay colt will break from the two hole Sunday and is 7-2 on the morning line. "The Dwyer set him up really well," trainer John Ward said. "It was an ambitious spot, but it was a last resort if we wanted to get ready for this race. In the Haskell we get weight from two horses and this is a true two-turn racetrack. I don't know if he can handle Funny Cide, but we'll see. I think he's on top of his game."

IT'S A KNOCKOUT

"I've run out of superlatives," an emotional owner/breeder Jeff Smith said after watching his 10-year-old "war horse" **Persian Punch (Ire)** (Persian Heights {GB}) battle to a short-head success over **Jardines Lookout (Ire)** (Fourstars Allstar) to win yesterday's G2 Lady O Goodwood Cup. As he had on his way to winning this race two years ago, the gelding punished his rivals from the front under Martin Dwyer before knuckling down to fight all the way up the straight. As Darryll Holland took last year's winner Jardines Lookout wide into the centre of the track to avoid eyeballing the old warrior, Dwyer carried the chestnut across to engage. Hooking up for the final quarter, Persian Punch was passed with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining, regained the lead with 100 yards to race and clung on bravely as the runner-up rallied gamely. "You could see someone in armor on top of him charging down the opposition," Smith added. *Cont. p. 3*

A WHITNEY OCTET A talented field of eight handicap stars was entered yesterday for Saturday's 76th running of the GI Whitney H. at Saratoga. The nine-furlong race could offer 4-5 morning-line favorite **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}) the chance to gain a measure of revenge over **Volponi** (Cryptoclearance) who bested him in last fall's Breeders' Cup Classic. The Bobby Frankel-trained Medaglia d'Oro, who has not started since winning the GII Oaklawn H. in April, will break from post five in the \$750,000 race. "He's been training forwardly and he's done everything we've asked of him," Frankel said yesterday. "I think I've got him right. He's fresh and fit and that's usually when they run a huge race." Volponi, 4-1 on the morning line, is still seeking his first win of 2003. The five-year-old was second behind Mineshaft in the GI Suburban H. in his last start. "We've been pleased with the way Volponi has been running," said Kathy Johnson, co-owner and daughter of trainer Phil G Johnson. "He just ran into a really good horse the last time. We're glad he's not here for the Whitney." **Saarland** (Unbridled) was second in the GIII Westchester H. and just missed in the GI Met Mile before a third-place finish in the June 14 GII Brooklyn H. in his last start. "All his races have been good this year," said trainer Shug McGaughey. "I like the fact that we're getting quite a bit of weight from everybody. He's been freshened up, he's in light and he's got a good rider." Breaking from post two, Saarland is 12-1 on the morning line.

WAFIC SAID PULLS OUT Leading owner/breeder Wafic Said has announced that he is pulling out of racing at the end of the season and will wind up his entire bloodstock interests, including dispersing the Classic-winning fillies **Bosra Sham** (Woodman) and **Lady Carla (GB)** (Caerleon). Famed for the exploits of those fillies in 1996, when Bosra Sham took the G1 1000 Guineas at Newmarket before Lady Carla followed up in the G1 Epsom Oaks, Said cited the reason for his withdrawal was his continued absence from the racing scene. "I've had a marvelous time on the turf over the last decade and have thoroughly enjoyed being involved," he told the *Racing Post*. "The Sagitta sponsorship of the Newmarket Guineas Festival during the last six years has given me great pleasure. However, I am spending less and less time in England now and therefore am unable to get to the races and be involved as much as I would like. There is no reason why I may not own horses again in a small way in the future." Said's dispersal of the 16-strong broodmare band at Tattersalls later in the year includes G3 Fred Darling S. winner **Tante Rose (Ire)** (Barathea {Ire}) and daughter of **My Branch (GB)** (Distant Relative {Ire}). Other notables include the stakes-producing mare **Come On Rosi (GB)** (Valiyar {Ire}) and her daughter **Aunty Rose (Ire)** (Caerleon), as well as the two-year-old daughter of Lady Carla, **Vas Y Carla** (Gone West), and **Bay Tree (Ire)** (Daylami {Ire}), another daughter of My Branch. "It's a tremendously sad day but we have had some great times together," Said's racing and breeding manager Tim Bulwer-Long told the *Post*. "I have been lucky enough to be involved with some really special horses, the best of them being Bosra Sham and Lady Carla. Bosra Sham really caught the public imagination and was brilliantly trained by Henry Cecil. Also trained in the same year by Cecil, Lady Carla's eight-length Oaks victory was pretty staggering." Explaining the dispersal, he added, "There will be a complete dispersal of all stock, which will be conducted by Tattersalls at their various sales in the latter part of the year. The breeding and young stock will all be consigned by Watership Down and Kiltinan Studs on our behalf."

THUNDER GULCH WILL NOT SHUTTLE Thunder Gulch (Gulch--Line of Thunder, by Storm Bird) will not shuttle to his normal summer base at Coolmore Stud's Australian facility in Hunter Valley, New South Wales, as he has for the past seven seasons. The 11-year-old stallion, who stood the 2003 breeding season at Ashford Stud in Versailles, Kentucky for \$65,000, has been an overwhelming success on both sides of the equator. In North America, the attractive chestnut has been represented at the top level by 2001 Horse of the Year Point Given and all-time leading distaffer Spain, while in Australia, Thunder Gulch is the sire of dual Group 1 winner Tempest Morn (Aus) as well as Tully Thunder (Aus). Overall, the Kentucky Derby and Belmont S. winner is the sire of 261 winners (28 stakes winners) from five crops of racing age and was the leading sire in the U.S. in 2001.

After watching Persian Punch battle his way to another group victory, owner and breeder Jeff Smith admitted, "He is just the most extraordinary animal I think we've ever seen--you can go on and on, but we should just all enjoy the moment as we won't see his like again. Unless he does it the hard way, he doesn't win and he doesn't like an easy race--he needs a challenge. It can be no coincidence that when you're talking about David Elsworth you're talking about the trainer of Desert Orchid and Persian Punch. He says the horse is probably peaking at 10 years of age." The trophy haul of Persian Punch now includes the G2 Prix Kergorlay, two Goodwood Cups, three renewals of the G3 Henry II S., two renewals of the G3 Jockey Club Cup and G3 Lonsdale S. apiece, as well as two third-place finishes in the G1 Melbourne Cup. "He never seems to ask for anything and gives everything and he's a wonderful horse to be involved with," Elsworth added. Persian Punch will now be aimed at the G1 Prix du Cadran at Longchamp Oct. 5 and the G3 Jockey Club Cup at Newmarket Oct. 18.

The Tatling, who was purchased by journeyman trainer Milton Bradley for £15,000 after winning a claimer at Catterick last July, took the latest step up the ladder in this competitive contest. The six-year-old started to show improvement almost straight away for his new yard and confirmed that he was more than a handicapper by finishing third in an above-average renewal of the Wokingham H. After winning the Listed Porcelanosa Sprint S. July 5, he finished third in the strong-looking Listed Hackwood S. last time July 19. Held up in rear by Darryll Holland throughout the early stages, he tracked Slap Shot, but was short of room behind that filly approaching the final eighth. Switched soon after, The Tatling's momentum carried him past Slap Shot with 50 yards remaining as Dragon Flyer closed fast on the stands' side. "He's very reliable now, but in his early days before we had him he was unreliable," Bradley explained. "They said he was very in and out, with nuts and bolts in his knee and all manner of things wrong with him and I said I'd like some more with the same."  Majestic Missile confirmed his beating of Nights Cross in a conditions event at Chester last time July 11 with a stylish display of speed here. Held up on the heels of the leaders by Michael Hills throughout the early stages, the strong-traveling colt was full of run approaching the final eighth where he was aimed through a gap between Dallaah and Harry Up (GB) (Piccolo {GB}). Squeezing past those rivals soon after, he quickened impressively to settle the result in a matter of strides as Nights Cross closed to fill the runner-up spot. "We always thought he was fast," trainer William Haggas said of the colt, whose winning time was just over a second outside the record. "I was beginning to worry that he was getting a bit too free, but actually he's just a fast horse. I've only got him in the G2 Gimcrack S. [at York Aug. 20] and we'll have to see if there's a supplementary for the G1 Nunthorpe S. [at York Aug. 21]. If we have to bypass the Gimcrack we could go straight for the G2 Flying Childers S. Warhol (Saint Ballado), a \$4-million purchase at the 2001 Keeneland July sale, was injured Tuesday morning at Saratoga after flipping over in his first day under the tutelage of D. Wayne Lukas. The bay colt, purchased privately by Bob and Beverly Lewis from Michael Tabor, was training over the Oklahoma track when he saw something and spooked. "I was sick," the conditioner told *Daily Racing Form*. "It bothered me more than anything I've witnessed in a long time. We're trying to get to the bottom of it. The hips and pelvic area are so hard to X-ray." Trained in Europe by Aidan O'Brien, the half brother to MGISW Tout Charmant was winless in three starts last season, but won his maiden by two lengths at Leopardstown in his last start July 5.

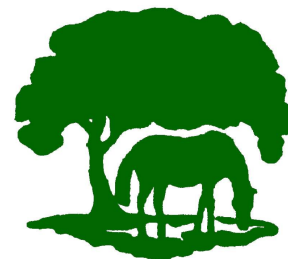

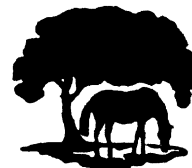

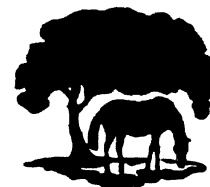
