**BOUTIQUE SEASON BEGINS AT SARATOGA**

The Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling Sales, the first of the season's select sales, kick off this evening at 7:30 p.m. in upstate New York. A total of 217 yearlings are set to go under the hammer by such world-class stallions as A.P. Indy, Carson City, Danzig, Deputy Minister, Dynaformer, El Prado (Ire), Gone West, Kingmambo, Kris S., Mr. Greeley, Rahy, Saint Ballado, Seattle Slew, Silver Deputy, Thunder Gulch, Unbridled and his son Unbridled's Song. The latter, who is having an outstanding Saratoga meeting as a sire, could leave yet another indelible mark on this sale early on when hip number 21 strides into the ring. The chestnut colt, consigned to the sale by Dromoland/Hartwell, is out of Grade I winner La Gueriere (Lord at War {Arg}) and is a half brother to

"He's got all the ingredients--the looks, the pedigree, he's a super mover and a lovely balanced horse," commented Robbie Lyons, who co-consigns the March 26 foal with Gerry Dilger of Dromoland. "He's by an excellent sire out of a great mare, and it doesn't hurt that he was raised at a quality nursery like Wimborne Farms." The immediate family made big news at this year's Keeneland April Sale, when his half brother by El Prado sold for a whopping \$850,000 to Fleetwood/NW Management. He is but one of many offerings Fasig-Tipton is pinning its hopes on. "We have an excellent group of horses," said Fasig-Tipton President Walt Robertson. "And, as I always say, it's all about the horses and if I'm right we're going to have a good sale. I like our group of horses as well or better than we've ever had. Do we have as many really, really top horses as we had two years ago? We'll see. But everybody that's supposed to be here is here." (Cont. p3)

**STROLL ROLLS TO HALL OF FAME VICTORY**

Claiborne Farm's homebred **Stroll** (Pulpit), who often kicks up a fuss prior to his races, managed to retain enough gas in the tank to steamroll over the yielding Saratoga lawn and 10 rivals, scoring an impressive four-length victory in Monday's GII National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame H. Sent off the lukewarm favorite for the Hall of Fame trainer/jockey combination of Bill Mott and Jerry Bailey, Stroll came into his graded stakes debut off a six-length allowance win at Belmont Park May 10 and a record-setting victory in Monmouth Park's 1 1/16-mile Lamplighter S. July 5. Full of run early, the eager bay stalked pacesetter leader **Sharp Impact** (Siphon {Brz}) through opening fractions of :23.55, :48.27 and three quarters in 1:12.80. Quick to respond when asked, the colt charged to the front at the three-sixteenths pole and drew off with authority late for the easy score. According to Mott, Stroll will probably make his next start in the GII Jamaica S. at Belmont Sept. 21. **FEVER NO LAUGHING MATTER FOR FUNNY CIDE**

**Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor), a disappointing third as the even-money favorite in the \$1-million GI Haskell Invitational H. at Monmouth Park Sunday, came out of the race with a slight fever. The winner of two thirds of the Triple Crown, he returned to his barn at Saratoga late Sunday night. According to trainer Barclay Tagg, the gelding had a fever of 102 [normal range is 99 and 101 degrees] and was tired following Sunday's defeat, but Tagg did not blame the abnormal temperature for Funny Cide's off day, instead attributing the lackluster effort to the track surface. "[Jockey Jose Santos] said he didn't like the going," Tagg said. "He was never comfortable." The chestnut was scheduled to make his next appearance in the \$1-million Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 23, but his participation in that race is now up in the air. "I honestly don't know [if he'll run]," Tagg said. "The Travers is just 20 days away."

**FRANKEL MAPS OUT FUTURE FOR STABLE STARS**

Haskell hero **Peace Rules** (Jules), who returned to the Spa in "good shape" following Monmouth's Sunday feature, will not run in the Aug. 23 GI Travers S. at Saratoga, trainer Bobby Frankel confirmed Monday. The three-year-old will instead take on older horses, including stablemate **Milwaukee Brew** (Wild Again), in the \$1-million GI Pacific Classic at Del Mar Aug. 24. Frankel will still be represented, however, in Saratoga's Mid-Summer Derby by GI Belmont S. winner **Empire Maker** (Unbridled). Far back early, the colt came up just a neck short as the 1-5 favorite in the GII Jim Dandy S. at Saratoga Sunday. There will likely be a change in tactics for his next start. "I learned something from the race," Frankel said. "I think in all his races, [Empire Maker] runs better when he's right there [with the leaders]. If I had [the Jim Dandy] to do over again, I'd have probably put him right in behind [the frontrunners] going into the turn."

**RELIEF IN NACHEEZMO CAMP**

Ted Johnson's GSP **Nacheezmo** (Carson City), who was vanned off the track Sunday after finishing fifth in the GII Jim Dandy S., did not sustain any injury during the running, according to trainer James Bond. "He was a little funny in his right front," Bond explained Monday. "Jorge [Chavez] jumped off him to be cautious. Thankfully, it's nothing serious. All the X-rays came back negative. We'll monitor it for the next few days."

**SKY MESA FINE AFTER HASKELL**

**Sky Mesa** (Pulpit), runner-up in the Sunday's GI Haskell Invitational, was back at his Saratoga barn at 6:30 yesterday morning. The John Oxley runner was making his second start off a nine-month layoff in the Haskell. "He cooled out quickly and he wasn't nearly as tired as he was the first time back," Donna Ward, wife and assistant to trainer John Ward Jr., said. As for Sky Mesa's latest effort, she said, "I wish we had been a little closer to the pace, where he wouldn't have had quite so much to do [in the stretch]. We wanted him to rate off the pace, but, to me, there was no pace." The eye-catching bay also has his sights set on the 10-furlong Travers S.

**STRONG HOPE TO TRAVERS; OTHERS TO BYPASS**

Trainer Todd Pletcher confirmed Monday that Sunday's GII Jim Dandy S. winner **Strong Hope** (Grand Slam) will take another step up in distance for a rematch with Empire Maker in the Travers S. Aug. 23. In response to the detractors, Pletcher indicated that the bay, who has won five straight, doesn't need the lead to win. "We've never sat him off a horse, but we've never really had to," said Pletcher. "I don't think he's a horse that has to be on the lead to be effective. It's just a matter of he's a naturally fast horse and there's not going to be a whole lot of horses in front of him. He puts himself in the game and doesn't have to work real hard to do it." Not planning on making the pilgrimage to Saratoga is Haskell Invitational fourth-place finisher **Wild and Wicked** (Wild Again). According to trainer Ken McPeck, the David Randal-owned colt returned from his first lifetime defeat in good order, but will not make the trip. "He only got beat a length by the Derby winner [Funny Cide]. He's a nice horse and he obviously fits somewhere at that level, but we're going to skip the Travers at this point." McPeck mentioned that the GIII Pennsylvania Derby at Philadelphia Park Sept. 1 is likely to be the colt's next start. Also likely to bypass the Travers is Jim Dandy S. third **Congrats** (A.P. Indy). "I thought Congrats ran fine," commented trainer Shug McGaughey. "But he's still relatively green. That was only his sixth lifetime start and only his first start in a stakes." McGaughey indicated that an allowance test would be the colt's most likely next start. "I'm not tempted to run him in the Travers at all," the trainer said. "If the race were to unravel and at the last moment something happens that I don't want to see happen to one of the other ones, there could be a possibility. He'd have to carry 126 pounds against the others right now and I am not sure he's up to that."

**The Freshman Class...**

The Fasig-Tipton July Sale saw outstanding debut performances from new sires like Cat Thief (Storm Cat) and Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector), and those two are joined by a formidable group of their peers at Saratoga. Other new stallions with offspring on parade include the late Chester House (Mr. Prospector), Chief Seattle (Seattle Slew), whose first yearlings sold extremely well in July, Giant's Causeway (Storm Cat), Lemon Drop Kid (Kingmambo), More Than Ready (Southern Halo), Stephen Got Even (A.P. Indy), Tale of the Cat (Storm Cat), War Chant (Danzig) and Yankee Victor (Saint Ballado). "I think the young sires right here are stronger than they've been in the past," Robertson commented. "That's just the kind of sire that came into stud two years ago."

**The Princess and the Pauper...**

William S. Farish's Lane's End has had a profitable association with Jewel Princess, the champion older mare in 1996 and winner of that year's Breeders' Cup Distaff at Woodbine. The Versailles, Kentucky, outfit had the good fortune of consigning the then eight-year-old mare to the 2000 Keeneland November Sale, where she was sold for \$4.9 million carrying a foal by Storm Cat to the winning bid of John Magnier. Lane's End was also the consignor of her two-year-old of this year, a Storm Cat filly named Home Court, which made \$650,000 at last year's Keeneland September Sale. They are back and ready to come out firing tonight. Hip number 13 is a chestnut filly, also by Storm Cat, and Lane's End's Bill Farish is bullish on her chances. "She's a Storm Cat out of that mare, she's an exceptional individual," Farish commented. "She's a nice filly and with all that pedigree, what else can you ask for? She's got good size, she's well proportioned and those are the kind of Storm Cats that tend to sell well. We had the mare at the farm for a while for The Thoroughbred Corporation and this is far and away her best foal."

**MRLS Still A Factor...**

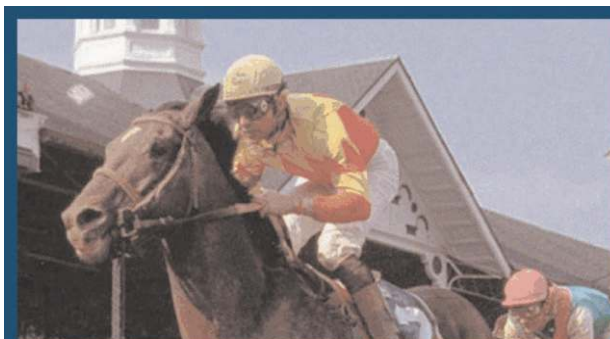
The Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome of 2001 will have some sort of impact on this sale, though officials at Fasig-Tipton are confident that they have assembled a representative August catalogue. "We're still minus the early foals from Kentucky," Walt Robertson explained. "We were in July and it's a segment that's just not there. But the MRLS applies only to horses that aren't here, not those that are here. We're close to the same numbers [in the catalogue] as last year [here], so numbers wise it hit us harder in July, but we're fine. I don't think it's going to hurt the price of horses, there's just less of them from that early segment. I think that there are fewer horses that don't belong here this year since I've been coming up here."

**It's All In The Family...**

Three hips before lot 21 takes his turn in the lime-light, a colt out of Lady Lochnivar, a full sister to the aforementioned La Gueriere, will get his chance. The chestnut, by A.P. Indy, is kin to a pair of horses who made good money in the ring. Priceless Storm (Storm Cat) sold for \$500,000 at the 2000 Keeneland September Sale while three-year-old Stealth Fighter (Deputy Minister) brought \$400,000 at the same sale in 2001. "He's just a lovely colt; certainly he's a good example of what his sire gets," commented Reiley McDonald, whose Eaton Sales consigns the colt. "I don't know if we have a better colt in the barn and we have the barn filled with some great colts. The mare gets great foals, she's a beautiful mare. This colt just floats in the paddock, he's a great mover and he has a great disposition. He's just a really nice colt."

**RHYTHM TO CONTINUE** Connections of **Russian Rhythm** (Kingmambo) look set to keep the filly in training next year. After taking Saturday's G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood, the chestnut was touted as a possible for the GI Breeders' Cup Fillies and Mares Turf at Santa Anita Oct. 25. However, owners Cheveley Park Stud may sidestep that race with a view to a four-year-old campaign. "I know the owners, Mr. and Mrs. Thompson, would very much like to keep her in training at four," racing manager Chris Richardson told the *Daily Mail* yesterday. "For this reason I think it is highly unlikely that she would go to the Breeders' Cup this year--especially as it is in Santa Anita, where European horses are not favored."

**GOLDEN APPLES TO SELL AT KEENELAND**

Gary Tanaka's **Golden Apples (Ire)** (Pivotal {GB}--Loon {Fr}, by Kaldoun {Fr}), last year's champion turf mare, will be sold at the 2003 Keeneland November Breeding Stock Sale. The five-year-old mare, retired after a runner-up dead-heat finish in the GI John C. Mabee H. in July, will be consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency. "We were ecstatic when Mr. Tanaka told us he wanted to consign the mare with us," Mark Taylor, head of the sale's agency, said. "Mr. Tanaka's race program is focused exclusively on quality. Golden Apples is an extraordinary mare who could represent the foundation of a breeding program." During her championship season, Golden Apples won last year's GI Beverly D., GI Yellow Ribbon S. and GII Santa Ana H. She claimed the 2001 GI Del Mar Oaks and GII Las Palmas H. On the board in 13 of 15 starts, Golden Apples won six times and earned \$1,621,787. The November sale runs from Nov. 2 through Nov. 16.

**JOCKEY CHANGE FOR VOLPONI** Trainer P.G. Johnson announced Monday that Hall of Fame jockey Jerry Bailey will take over the reigns on defending Breeders' Cup Classic champion **Volponi** (Cryptoclearance). The five-year-old, second in Saturday's GI Whitney H. at Saratoga, will make his next start in the GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup Aug. 16 followed by the GII Meadowlands Cup Oct. 3.

Cumbrecita surprised everyone by winning this Group 1 at Palermo Saturday. Although a winner of the G2 Ramon Biaus last year and placed in many graded events in recent months, it seemed implausible that she could beat local heroine Luna Local. Unaware of the odds against her this time, Cumbrecita raced alongside the favorite and a couple of lengths behind the leader Telechica (Arg) (Halo Sunshine). Once in the stretch, Cumbresita was fortunate to avoid the traffic problems that held up Luna Local and Paulistinha and when pace-setter Telechica started to weaken, she found a hole to pass, leaving the troubles behind for the rest. In the final strides, she beat Luna Local by 3/4 of a length, landing her first Group 1 in the process and her third race out of 12.

**TRAVERS PREPS**

Two Mr. Prospector-line sires, [Grand Slam](#) (Strong Hope) and Jules (Peace Rules) may have sired the winners of last Saturday's Travers preps, but the two best prep races, I reckon, were run by the respective seconds: Empire Maker (Unbridled) in the GII Jim Dandy, and Sky Mesa (Pulpit) in the GI Haskell. I'm leaving the cash for an exacta box on those two for the Travers.

Interestingly, Empire Maker and Sky Mesa represent the two most promising 'two-turn dirt' lines going in American breeding right now. That's American breeding, as opposed to American-breeding-for-Europe.

Gainsborough Stud Managing Director Michael Goodbody predicted a decade ago that American and European breeders were about to diverge, to develop lines which work one place but not the other. So it is proving. In America, Seattle Slew, primarily but not exclusively through [A.P. Indy](#), is becoming increasingly influential in American (two-turn dirt) pedigrees; and [Unbridled](#), an offshoot of Mr. Prospector through Fappiano, has Unbridled's Song hovering on the fringes of making it big, and Empire Maker, who promises to be a real top-flight sire prospect when he retires.

**Sale Time**

It's been a few years since I've been to Saratoga, and I must say the grande dame of American racing is weathering well. One of those periodic revivals which sees lots of restoration work in storied neighborhoods and small downtowns has smartened the old girl up, and the weather hasn't been bad, too, not like it can be here. The racetrack was hopping Sunday. If they could have more race meets at Spas in August, there would be less of an attendance problem in racing. But now it's sale time, and Saratoga has what may be the burden this year of being the first major yearling sale of the season.

Expectations are guarded. Circumstances outside the industry's control--war, the economy--guarantee a more sober, businesslike approach to the proceedings. This isn't the 'Nineties. And circumstances within the industry have been sobering, too. An estimated 30 percent of the early Kentucky foal crop lost to MRLS tempers expectations, too. But, within those parameters, the consensus is that it's a nice catalogue with plenty of nice horses in it. There seem to be plenty of people on the grounds and activity is brisk.

**Sires of the New Era**

One [Storm Cat](#) colt, one [Danzig](#) colt, one [Kingmambo](#) colt, a colt and a filly from the last crop by Seattle Slew; the old guard is passing, and the prominent commercial sires in this catalogue aren't very European, either. A.P.Indy is the big name among the proven sires in this catalogue, and the very American supporting cast features names like Silver Deputy, Unbridled's Song, [Thunder Gulch](#), Carson City, and Saint Ballado.

But this is an important group of first-year sires. They have some really big shoes to fill, and there are some five-star racehorses among them. The Big Four of this crop are horses with European as well as American appeal: [Fusaichi Pegasus](#), [Giant's Causeway](#), [Lemon Drop Kid](#), and [War Chant](#). They have six, seven, six, and two catalogued respectively, but--like all other sires, really--there will be a lot more to judge from in September.

Lemon Drop Kid is a Kingmambo who won Grade I races on the dirt at two, three and four, out of a Seattle Slew mare. He himself looks much more Slew than Kingmambo, and he seems to be throwing yearlings with Slew-like scope. Whether the Europeans will gamble on him we'll have to wait and see, but, interestingly, he is just one of four prominent first-year sires represented at Saratoga who is either by A.P. Indy or out of a Seattle Slew-line mare. A.P. Indy sons Golden Missile and [Stephen Got Even](#) were strongly represented numerically at Fasig-Tipton July, and will be again in September, but each has a couple at Saratoga. *(Bill Oppenheim cont. p8)*

The other Seattle Slew-influenced prominent first-year sire is [Dixie Union](#), who is by [Dixieland Band](#) out of a [Capote](#) mare. He's a very impressive-looking horse himself, and The Judges and I (thanks and a tip of the hat to The Judges, boys) were quite impressed with what we saw: a little Seattle Slew scope on top of the Dixieland Band speed type. Dixie Union also has six in the sale.

Not to forget Storm Cat, the Northern Dancer line which is so effective everywhere, and especially for speed and two-year-olds. [Forest Wildcat](#) (four at Saratoga) has graduated to the ranks of proven Summer Sale sires, and Forestry (eight) is second-leading Freshman Sire, and off to a very promising start. Debuting sires [Cat Thief](#) and [High Yield](#), with six each, add to the ranks of promising Storm Cats. Both have good credentials, and should sell well up here. Throw in Empire Maker's half brother Chester House (six), and it all adds up to an interesting--and intriguing--group of genuinely promising first-year sires.

### What They're Saying At The Sales...

#### *Reiley McDonald, Eaton Sales*

"I think there are going to be some pretty good buying opportunities here. I haven't seen quite the traffic I'd like to see with the number of horses in the sale and the number of horses of this kind of quality. There's been a lot of activity at the barn. There seem to be a lot more end users here than at the July Sale.

#### *Tim McMurry, bloodstock advisor*

"There are a lot of really nice horses here, there really are. It's a typical Fasig-Tipton catalogue, they do a really nice job getting some good horses here. We have a pretty long short list. We're focused on buying a certain kind of horse, but there are certainly other horses we like. You have a number of players in the game who are looking for the same kinds of horses and in that case there is going to be a good amount of competition for that group, like there is at any other sale."

**HALL OF FAME INDUCTS FOUR** Thoroughbred racing's Hall of Fame opened its door to four new inductees yesterday morning in Saratoga, New York, as jockey Mike Smith, late trainer Hubert "Sonny" Hine, champion Dance Smartly and champion Precisionist were all honored. Smith has guided such accomplished champions as Vindication, Azeri and Holy Bull, whom he tabbed as "the best horse I've ever ridden." The 37-year-old was quick to name a number of riders, trainers and agents who helped him along the way. Carolyn Hine was present to remember her husband, Sonny, as a passionate man who lived and breathed horse racing. Sonny Hine's crowning achievement was Horse of the Year Skip Away, who won 10 Grade I events, including the Breeders' Cup Classic, while earning in excess of \$9 million dollars. The first filly to win the Canadian Triple Crown, Dance Smartly was elected in the Contemporary Female Horse category. Tammy Samuel-Balaz accepted the award on behalf of her late father, Ernie Samuel, and Sam-Son Farm, who co-owned the filly that won 12 of 17 starts, including the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Inducted in the Contemporary Male Horse category was Precisionist, who captured the 1985 GI Breeders' Cup Sprint on his way to Champion Sprinter honors. Wanda Hooper accepted Precisionist's plaque on behalf of her late husband, Fred Hooper.

**BLACK TIE AFFAIR TO STAND IN VIRGINIA** Champion **Black Tie Affair (Ire)** (Miswaki), who has been standing stud in Japan since 1998, will return to the United States after being purchased by Donna Hayes' The Stallion Company and will stand at Blue Ridge Farm in Upperville, Virginia. He will most likely stand by private treaty. The 17-year-old, named 1991 Horse of the Year and Champion Older Horse after winning the GI Breeders' Cup Classic, stood his first six seasons for \$15,000 at Vinery in Lexington, Kentucky before being shipped to Japan to stand at East Stud. Negotiations to bring him back to the States were brokered by bloodstock agents Carols Moore and Rollin Baugh. The gray will stand alongside another 1991 champion who returned to the U.S. after a stint in Japan, Sprint Champion Housebuster.

**MONMOUTH SETS RECORD FOR HASKELL** Monmouth Park's 10-race card Sunday, highlighted by the GI Haskell Invitational, brought out 53,638 patrons which helped the Oceanport oval set a record for all New Jersey tracks. Wagering records also fell on Haskell day as total handle of \$12,532,532 eclipsed the old mark of \$11,256,345 set in 2001 while on-track betting of \$3,965,735 surpassed the record of \$3,950,002 that stood since 1968.
