CHAMPION VINDICATION RETIRED

Two-year-old champion **Vindication** (Seattle Slew--Strawberry Reason, by Strawberry Road), who has been on the sidelines since February, will not be ready in time for the 2003 GI Breeders' Cup Classic at Santa Anita Park, therefore connections have decided to retire the sophomore. Vindication, whose breeding rights

were purchased late last year by John Sikura's Hill 'n' Dale Farm, is expected to arrive at the Lexington farm next month. His stud fee for 2004 has not been determined. Undefeated in four starts last year, including the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Arlington Park, the \$2.15 million Fasig-Tipton Saratoga Yearling purchase earned the 2002 Eclipse Award for champion two-year-old colt. In 2003, Vindication's Triple Crown aspirations

were derailed when the colt sustained a suspensory injury while preparing for his sophomore debut and he later received oxygen therapy and stem cell treatment in California in an effort to bring him back to the races in the fall. "We have always held Vindication in the highest regard, and he never once let us down," said Satish Sanan, owner of Padua Stables. "His comeback from injury has been nothing less than remarkable and he continues to go to the racetrack with zest and verve, but we have really run out of time to achieve our ultimate goal, which has always been the Classic." The colt retires with \$680,950 in earnings.

NEW PLANS FOR MEDAGLIA D'ORO AND PEACE RULES

Bobby Frankel announced yesterday that he will change course with a pair of Edmund Gann-owned colts. The Hall of Fame trainer will send Aug. 2 GI Whitney H. winner **Medaglia D'oro** (El Prado {Ire}) to the GI Pacific Classic to face another Frankel star, Milwaukee Brew, at Del Mar Aug. 24 and **Peace Rules** (Jules), who won the Aug. 3 GI Haskell Invitational, looks likely to contest the GIII Pennsylvania Derby at Philadelphia Park Sept. 1.

WHOOPI CAT IN ADIRONDACK

Derrick Smith and Michael Tabor's **Whoopi Cat** (Tale of the Cat), coming off a maiden victory, outdueled **Unbridled Beauty** (Unbridled's Song) over a muddy Saratoga track to win yesterday's GII Adirondack S. The dark bay, a driving six-length victress in her July 11 debut, was bet down to 6-5 favoritism from her 5-2 morning line odds and was in prime stalking position up the backstretch after recovering from a mild stumble at the break. Leaving Unbridled Beauty alone to carve out wicked fractions of :21 1/5 and :44 3/5 seconds, Whoopi Cat then pounced on the pacesetter turning for home and was met with a resolute foe. The two battled gamely in upper stretch, but with a furlong remaining it became clear who would take this meeting. "The plan was for her to rate like she did the first time," said winning trainer, and co-owner of the filly, Patrick Biancone. "She was a little anxious at the gate. She is very fast, but she has stamina. She is a lovely filly. The [GI] Spinaway S. [Aug. 29 at Saratoga] comes back very quickly in 18 days, or maybe we'll wait for the [GI] Frizette S. NO TRAVERS FOR WANDO Plans for **Wando** (Langfuhr)'s next start remain up in the air, according to trainer Mike Keogh, but one thing is certain: Canada's newest Triple Crown winner will not be starting in the Aug. 23 GI Travers S. at Saratoga. "The Travers is just too close," Keogh said. "I've always done well with him with a bit more time in between his races." Keogh said three races are under consideration--the GIII Pennsylvania Derby at Philadelphia Park Sept. 1, the GII Super Derby at Louisiana Downs Sept. 20 and the GI Atto Mile at Woodbine Sept. 14. With his horse a major winner on both the turf and dirt, the trainer is not certain whether to point toward the Breeders' Cup Classic or one of the Breeders' Cup turf races, which is making it more difficult to pick his next race. Keogh, though, like many others, is looking forward to testing Wando at some point against top class competition in the U.S. The three-year-old has never won outside of Canada. "I'd like to try them, that's for sure," he said. "I think he will fit against those guys. The Atto Mile would be against older horses, while the Pennsylvania Derby and the Super Derby are against three-year-olds, which is something else we have to consider."

ASMUSSEN PAIR WORK Both of trainer Steve Asmussen's star three-year-olds, **Lady Tak** (Mutakddim) and **Posse** (Silver Deputy), worked yesterday over Saratoga's muddy main track. Lady Tak, who was brilliant in her recent victory in the GI Test S., breezed five furlongs in 1:01 4/5, the second fastest of four works at the distance. The filly is likely to reappear in either the GI Ballerina H. going seven furlongs against her elders Aug. 24 or the GI Gazelle H. at nine panels Sept. 6, a race restricted to three-year-old fillies. "It's either/or," said Scott Blassi, an assistant trainer of Asmussen's. "She worked good and she feels good." Asmussen's other gun, the GII Riva Ridge S. victor **Posse**, worked an easy half mile in :50 3/5 in preparation for the GI King's Bishop S. going seven furlongs on the Travers S. undercard Aug. 23. His was the fourth fastest of six works at four furlongs.



MGISW AFFIRMED SUCCESS RETIRED Nine-year-old racing veteran **Affirmed Success** (Affirmed--Towering Success, by Irish Tower) has been retired because of recurring ankle problems, according to trainer Richard Schosberg. The winner of 17 of 42 lifetime starts, including the 1999 Cigar Mile, the 2002 Carter H. and the 1998 Vosburgh S., all Grade I events, the gelding raced through seven seasons and has earned \$2,285,314. In 2003, the bay scored in two of four starts, including the GIII Toboggan H. at Aqueduct Mar. 15 and finished fifth in what would be his final career start in this year's Carter Apr. 12. Affirmed Success is scheduled to head to Buttonwood Farm in Rhinebeck, New York, but there is speculation that he may be sent to the Kentucky Horse Park.

SENIOR SWINGER PRIMED FOR LA JOLLA Bob and Beverley Lewis' **Senior Swinger** (El Prado {Ire}) turned in a strong half-mile work in :47.20 Monday over the Jimmy Durante turf course at Del Mar. Trainer Bob Baffert is preparing the colt for Saturday's GIII La Jolla H., a major prep for the Sept. 6 GII Del Mar Derby.

NAKATANI TO RIDE PERFECT SOUL West Coast jockey Corey Nakatani, who finished second on Gary Tanaka's Sarafan in the 2002 edition of the GI Arlington Million, will have a chance to atone for that loss when he partner's Charles Fipke's **Perfect Soul (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) in Saturday's 21st running of the 10-furlong event. The Roger Attfield trainee, who scored in the nine-furlong GII King Edward Breeders' Cup H. at Woodbine June 15, is scheduled to breeze over that track Wednesday morning before heading out to Chicago later in the day.

When Brookside Farms reduced its broodmare band by selling 16 mares at Keeneland's January Sale in 2000, it owed the bulk of its aggregate takings of \$9,195,000 to just three mares. Two of them, Claxton's Slew and Solar Slew, had already produced champions, respectively being the dams of the Paulson stars Escena and Cigar, and now it looks as though Tacha, the third member of this illustrious trio, may also have produced a champion in One Cool Cat, her second foal for her new owners.

Even though there were excuses for the odds-on Three Valleys in third place, One Cool Cat once again showed enormous potential when he extended his winning sequence to three in Sunday's G1 Phoenix S.

At \$2,200,000, Tacha was the highest-priced of the five animals purchased at the sale by the WinStar partnership of Bill Casner and Kenny Troutt, and the money has proved to be very well spent. The Seattle Slew filly Tacha was carrying at the time has won twice since being sold for \$250,000 as a yearling and One Cool Cat added \$3,100,000 to Tacha's income when he was bought by Demi O'Byrne at Keeneland just over a year ago.

That price made One Cool Cat the highest-priced yearling colt of 2002. His connections must now be hoping that he is set to follow the example of several previous July sales-toppers, such as Nureyev, Royal Academy, A.P. Indy, Forestry and Fusaichi Pegasus, by ultimately developing into a very valuable stallion prospect.

Coincidentally, Tacha's dam Savannah Dancer was another very high-priced purchase at Keeneland's July Sale. With Northern Dancer as her sire and the champion filly Valoris as her dam, Savannah Dancer was guaranteed to cause a stir in the reckless days of 1983. Remember, Valoris had recorded impressive victories in the 1000 Guineas at The Curragh and the Oaks at Epsom. What's more, Valoris ranked alongside Val de Loir (Prix du Jockey-Club) and Kalila (dam of Prix du Jockey-Club winner Roi Lear) as one of the 18 foals out of the astonishing broodmare Vali.

Valoris herself had already produced three notable performers in the Irish Oaks runner-up Vincennes, the Oaks second Val's Girl and the G2 Geoffrey Freer S. winner Valinsky, who was also placed at Group 1 level. No wonder Allen Paulson was prepared to go to \$2,500,000 to secure her. While her price was eclipsed by two of Northern Dancer's sons, including the notorious \$10.2 million Snaafi Dancer, it was enough to equal the world record for a yearling filly.

Savannah Dancer went a long way towards justifying her price by taking the GII Del Mar Oaks over a mile and an eighth. She was also the highest-rated turf performer, at 121 pounds, on the Blood-Horse Free Handicap for three-year-old fillies, her rating reflecting her second against the colts in the Hollywood Derby.

One aspect of One Cool Cat's record that must delight his connections is the fact that he has so far tackled little more than six furlongs. There is good reason to expect him to improve as the distances lengthen, possibly up to a mile and a quarter next year.

Valoris was obviously an influence for stamina, and so was Savannah Dancer. A mating with Blushing Groom resulted in Brier Creek, a Group 3 winner who did all his winning at distances between one and a half miles and two miles. The first of Savannah Dancer's numerous visits to Mr. Prospector also resulted in a classy performer with a degree of stamina in Sha Tha. After being beaten two lengths in a pair of Group 1 events over a mile, Sha Tha ran well over a mile and an eighth in two graded stakes, notably winning the GII All Along S.

Sha Tha in turn produced the very talented State Shinto, a Pleasant Colony colt who did well at up to a mile and a quarter.

One Cool Cat's dam Tacha is a winning sister to Sha Tha. As a high-priced daughter of Mr. Prospector, she was an obvious candidate to visit Storm Cat soon after her purchase, even though the mating produced 3x3 to Northern Dancer. The Overbrook star had already established a very encouraging strike rate with daughters of Mr. Prospector by the start of 2000. His first 24 foals bred to this pattern included six stakes winners, including Finder's Fee, Tale of the Cat, Sea of Secrets and Catenus, plus others of promise, such as Katz Me If You Can.

Cne Cool Cat is more closely inbred to Northern Dancer than any of Storm Cat's previous major winners, but you'll find 3x4 to him in the Group 1 winners Black Minnaloushe, High Yield and Sophisticat. This year's French Oaks winner Nebraska Tornado even has three lines to Northern Dancer (3x5x4), so it seems that you often can't have too much of this particular good thing where Storm Cat is concerned.

PLETCHER CONTINUES TO DOMINATE IN NEW YORK Trainer Todd Pletcher, who bagged Belmont Park's Spring/Summer training title with a record 40 wins, showed no signs of slowing down yesterday when he saddled School For Scandal to victory in a seven-furlong claiming event at Saratoga, giving the former D. Wayne Lukas assistant 24 victories in the first 18 days of the 36-day meet. That win tied Hall of Fame trainer Sylvester Veitch, who set a Saratoga record of 24 wins in 24 days in 1954. "What [Veitch] did was a phenomenal accomplishment," said Pletcher. "He had a small stable of horses and won at a high percentage. You really can't compare to what he did because the business is different now than it was 50 years ago."

SARATOGA NEW YORK-BREDS, CIDE TWO?

Two years ago, a colt by Distorted Humor went through the ring at Fasig-Tipton's New York-bred Yearlings Sale at Saratoga. Funny Cide brought just \$22,000 that evening, but after being gelded and joining the Sackatoga Stable string, went on to make history as the first New York-bred winner of the Kentucky Derby. Can **Kate's Humor** (Distorted Humor) follow suit? The bay colt brought a final bid of \$170,000 to top the second and final session of this year's New York-bred Yearlings sale, held yesterday in the Humphrey S. Finney Pavilion. Consigned by Lakland North LLC, agent, the May 11 foal was purchased by Mike Downing, agent. He is a half-brother to MSW Elvi Gamble (Prospector's Gamble). A share in Distorted Humor sold for \$500,000 at the Stallion Access Champagne Sale Friday night. The highest-priced filly yesterday at yesterday's sale was a daughter of first-crop sire Lemon Drop Kid out of GSP Ginny Dare (Pilgrim). The bay, from the consignment of Francis and Barbara Vanlangendock's Summerfield, as agent, was bought for \$125,000 by Crupi New Castle Farm, agent. She is from the family of graded-stakes winners Lykatil Hill and Classic Account, as well as champions Fort Marcy and Key to the Mint. A Valid Expectations colt consigned by Summerfield also went for \$125,000 as the second-highest priced colt of the session. The dark bay, out of SP With a Princess (With Approval), was purchased by Greg Norman. His second dam is MSW Regal Princess (Royal and Regal). With a catalogue that was 24-percent larger than last year, the two-day sale saw a drop in both the average, which was off 20 percent, and median, which was down 23 percent.
