TATES CREEK OUT OF BEVERLY D.

Juddmonte Farm's **Tates Creek** (Rahy), the 5-2 morning line favorite for Saturday's GI Beverly D. S. at Arlington Park, has been scratched from the race after trainer Bobby Frankel found difficulty in securing travel arrangements for his five-year-old charge.

Travel woes also forced Edmund Gann's **Bis Repetitas** (Red Ransom), another Frankel trainee, to be scratched from his intended engagement in the GI Secretariat S. Both horses are based in Southern California.

Juddmonte's **Heat Haze** (GB) (Green Desert), trained by Frankel but based at Saratoga, is slated to ship to Arlington today and is expected to make her start in the Beverly D.

SULAMANI ON TARGET DESPITE BRUISE

Godolphin's **Sulamani** (Ire) (Hernando {Fr}) missed a scheduled trip to the track yesterday morning due to a slight stone bruise, but connections are optimistic the four-year-old will still start in Saturday's GI Arlington Million. "Sulamani has suffered a slight stone bruise, which is the reason he did not go to the track [Thursday] morning," said Godolphin's racing manager, Simon Crisford. "He has not missed any work, and we are currently monitoring the situation. We hope to resume training [today]." Made the 8-5 morning-line favorite for his U.S. debut, the Saeed bin Suroor trainee is aiming for the 100th Group/Grade I victory for Godolphin.

SPOKEN FUR STARING AT BIG PAYDAY

When John Amerman purchased the three-year-old filly **Spoken Fur** (Notebook) privately off a three-race winning skein, he wasn't thinking of running her against Grade I competition right away. After trainer Bobby Frankel spent some time with the filly and concluded she deserved a shot in the GI Mother Goose S., Amerman acquiesced. Smart Move. After consecutive victories by Spoken Fur in the Mother Goose and GI Coaching Club American Oaks, the former CEO of Mattel is now on the cusp of sweeping NYRA's Triple Tiara. All that is needed is a victory in Saturday's GI Alabama S. at Saratoga. What's at stake, aside from the winner's share of the Alabama's \$750,000 purse, is a \$2-million bonus that

NYRA is offering up to any filly who can sweep all three races. The fact hasn't escaped Frankel. "[The Alabama] is the biggest race of the meet for me, actually...maybe that and the Travers," said the Hall of Fame trainer. "There's residual value in the Travers, but there's right-away money in the Alabama. It's like winning a \$4-million race." A pragmatic Amerman would, obviously, enjoy winning the bonus, but is just happy to have the filly in his stable after his MGISW Lido Palace retired earlier this year. "I was talking to Frankel in early June, right after the retirement of Lido Palace, and asked if he keep his eye out for a good filly. He said, 'You know, I might have one in the barn you might be interested in.' We talked about her pedigree, Beyers, sheet numbers; it took probably three minutes, and I said, 'Let's do it.' I knew nothing, *nothing*, about the bonus until the Coaching Club American Oaks. So if it happens, God bless, and if it doesn't, that's okay, too." Should she win, Spoken Fur would be the first filly to win the newly reconfigured Triple Tiara. *Alabama Field pg. 2*

Only two home entries defend this prize against raiders from Germany, Britain and Italy in a small yet select renewal. **Kalabar** is the main domestic hope and improved on a fourth-place finish in the Listed Prix de Suresnes at Longchamp June 5 to finish career-best second behind Look Honey (Ire) in the G2 Prix Eugene Adam at Maisons-Laffitte July 14 last time. **Saturn** has been somewhat consistent, if just below the highest level, and followed up a fifth in the G1 2000 Guineas at Newmarket May 3 with a fourth in the G1 Irish 2000 Guineas at The Curragh May 24. He was a shade disappointing in his most recent outing when seventh in the G3 Jersey S. at Royal Ascot June 18, but he rates a strong contender for his first attempt beyond a mile.

Prince Kirk has solid claims. He won the Listed Premio Gardone at Milan March 30, but improved upon that, despite not winning, in his two subsequent starts. He was second in the G2 Premio Parioli (Italian 2000 Guineas) at Rome Apr. 27 and filled the same berth in the G1 Prix Jean Prat at Chantilly June 1.

PURSE HIKE FOR PENNSYLVANIA DERBY

Management at Philadelphia Park yesterday announced that the purse of the track's showcase event, the GIII Pennsylvania Derby scheduled for Sept. 1, has been increased to \$750,000. In 2001, the Derby purse was boosted up to \$500,000 and the race has attracted some of the best sophomores in the nation, including two-year-old champ Macho Uno and 2002 victor Harlan's Holiday. "We were very pleased with the response we received from horsemen concerning the increase," said Director of Racing Sal Sinatra. According to officials, "Among those showing interest" in the race are multiple Grade I stakes winners **Peace Rules** (Jules) and **Toccet** (Awesome Again); and the undefeated colt **Soto** (Dehere).

WILD AND WILD WORKS TOWARDS TRAVERS

Trainer Ken McPeck sent out GII Ohio Derby winner **Wild and Wicked** (Wild Again) to a half-mile breeze over the sloppy main track at Saratoga Thursday. The three-year-old went the four furlongs in :48 1/5, the second fastest of 11 works on the morning at that distance. Fourth by 10 lengths in his most recent start, the GI Haskell Invitational H., Wild and Wicked is now a likely starter in the GI Travers S. Aug. 23, according to McPeck. "He's going to run here and he seems to love this racetrack," the conditioner said. "I think his last race is a throw-out. For whatever reason, he might have been a little dull from the ship down and the heat. He didn't run near the race he's capable of running." McPeck opted for the Travers instead of the Sept. 1 GIII Pennsylvania Derby upon hearing that Peace Rules, winner of the Haskell, might run at Philly Park after the track increased the purse of the race to \$750,000.

NYRA to Seek Six-Week Spa Meet Again in '04:

The Board of Trustees of the New York Racing Association approved plans for a 36-day meet for Saratoga Race Course in 2004 at its regularly scheduled meeting Wednesday. The six-week meet would run from Wednesday, July 28 through Labor Day, Monday, Sept. 6. The dates are subject to the approval of the New York State Racing and Wagering Board, who will review the complete NYRA schedule later this year.

Argentine Group winner Artist Johanna found the competition too tough in her American debut, a 1 1/16-mile allowance test the Belmont turf May 15, and hadn't seen racing action since. Fresh off a sharp work in :59 flat over five panels, the bay went off the second longest price on the board. Camped at the back early, she charged along to challenge in upper stretch, surged to the fore at the furlong marker and held on late for the narrow score.

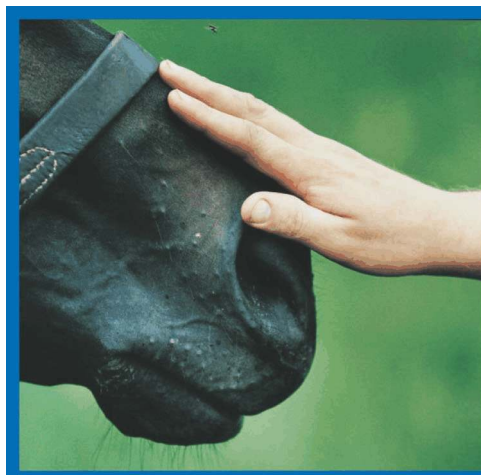

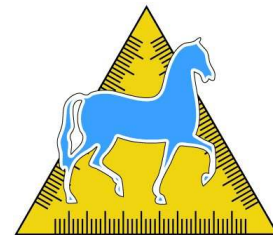

INTERNATIONAL ATTRACTS QUALITY

Racegoers are in for a treat as early as the third race on the opening day of York's Ebor meeting next Tuesday. There are 18 entries remaining after yesterday's confirmation stage for the G1 Juddmonte International and the line-up is almost a complete who's who of Europe's top middle distance performers. Last year's winner **Nayef** (Gulch) heads the list and the Marcus Tregoning-trained five-year-old will renew rivalry with **Falbrav (Ire)** (Fairy King), who beat him in this year's G1 Coral-Eclipse S. at Sandown July 5. "I'm very happy with him," Tregoning told *PA Sport*. "He's fresh and he's well, and he looks in good form. Obviously, he will be suited if the ground stays on top and it will work well for him if there is a nice dry spell building up to the race. I don't think I'd run him unless I thought we were there with a winning chance, otherwise we might as well give the horse a break. He acts on the track. It's a long straight at York. I just want to get him back on course and see him running at his best at the highest level again. If he doesn't win he'll be thereabouts." As for Falbrav, trainer Luca Cumani was enthusiastic. "He's in excellent form and he's come out of the Eclipse and the King George in very good form, and we are looking forward to York," said the conditioner. "He's a five-year-old, he's strong, mature, he can take a lot of top-class races in a short space of time. Mentally, he's very, very good. The track will definitely suit him. It's a flat course and especially if the ground is going to be on the fast side, that will suit him fine." Other notable possibles include G1 Dubai World Cup winner **Moon Ballad (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}) and **Dubai Destination** (Kingmambo), although the latter is pointing to Deauville for this Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois. The contest is also set to enjoy a fine supporting cast including Sir Michael Stoute's G1 St James's Palace S. runner-up **Kalaman (Ire)** (Desert Prince {Ire}), progressive three-year-old **Ikhtyar (Ire)** (Unfuwain) and G2 Dante S. winner **Magistretti** (Diesis {GB}). Stoute also has **Princely Venture (Ire)** (Entrepreneur {GB}) entered for the 10 furlong, 88-yard contest. Aidan O'Brien's trio consists of **Mingun** (A.P. Indy), **Brian Boru (GB)** (Sadler's Wells) and **Powerscourt (GB)** (Sadler's Wells).
