HARLAN'S HOLIDAY RETIRED

Ending the speculation that followed news of his injury in Saturday's GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H., connections of **Harlan's Holiday** (Harlan--Christmas in Aiken, by Affirmed) officially announced yesterday the retirement of the four-year-old. Stud plans for the bay, who finished last after sustaining a strained suspensory to his right hind in Saturday's race, have yet to be determined. Owned by Jack and Laurie Wolf's Starlight Stable, Harlan's Holiday is a three-time Grade I winner, having annexed the Florida Derby and Toyota Blue Grass S. as a three-year-old and adding the Donn H. to his resume earlier this year. He joins current freshman sire Menifee as the second major winner by the ill-fated Harlan to be retired to stud.

HILLENBRAND UPDATES STEVENS' CONDITION

After receiving a phone call from jockey Gary Stevens asking to clarify his situation, *Seabiscuit* author Laura Hillenbrand released a statement yesterday that sorted out conflicting press reports. Stevens, who was thrown from Storming Home in Saturday's GI Arlington Million, suffered a collapsed lung in the fall and fractured his C-5 vertebra. The fracture was determined to not be serious and there is no threat of nerve damage. According to Stevens' theatrical agent, Eddie Goldstone, the injuries will force Stevens to the sidelines for a month, meaning the Hall of Famer will miss Sunday's GI Pacific Classic aboard Candy Ride (Arg) (See p4 for more information). Stevens said he wasn't sure what spooked his mount to veer badly just prior to crossing the finish line, but said that Storming Home had, the morning before the race, stopped on the track at the spot of the subsequent accident and refused to move. Despite the horse's erratic behavior, the resilient jockey said that he'd happily ride Storming Home again.

RIGHT MAN FOR THE JOB

Few horses have been talked about as much this year as **Kalaman (Ire)** (Desert Prince {Ire}) and His Highness the Aga Khan's colt is ready to transform reputation into substance in today's G1 Juddmonte International S. at York. The half to Kalanisi (Ire), who was beaten by Giant's Causeway in a memorable finish to this race three years ago, is in the right hands as he bids to provide Sir Michael Stoute with his fifth renewal. Despite all the past winners from Freemason Lodge having been older horses, there has been no secret made of the regard with which this particular colt is held. He made light work of a Newbury maiden Apr. 12 before beating the impressive subsequent Listed Gala S. winner Ikhtyar (Ire) in the Listed Heron S. at Kempton May 24. He suffered a troubled trip when beaten a length by Zafeen (Fr) in the G1 St James's Palace S. at Royal Ascot June 17, showing a similar strong-finishing style to Kalanisi, who excelled when stepped up from a mile.

Soumillon Lands Ride...

Jockey Christophe Soumillon, following the revelation that Johnny Murtagh was taking a break from racing because of a back injury and related weight problems, will replace that rider on Kalaman. Soumillon was pleased to learn that he would be re-united with the Sir Michael Stoute-trained colt, on whom he won the Listed Heron S. at Kempton May 24. "I was impressed with him when he won the Heron Stakes and I'm really looking forward to riding him in the big race tomorrow," he told *PA Sport* yesterday.

Dubai Destination Out...

Meanwhile, Godolphin has scratched **Dubai Destination** (Kingmambo) after the four-year-old failed to please connections after his fifth placing in Sunday's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville. "Dubai Destination was a bit quiet this morning and definitely will not run at York," Racing Manager Simon Crisford said yesterday.

Dogs o' War...

Though receiving a bit of a break after Dubai Destination scratched, Kalamán will still have to face the old dogs of war **Nayef** (Gulch) and **Falbrav (Ire)** (Fairy King) in this test, and that duo have shown enough in their engagements this term to suggest he will have to do it the hard way. Nayef, who beat Golan (Ire) in this contest 12 months ago, bounced back from a third-placing in the G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29 to take the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 18. Despite finishing only fifth on that occasion, last year's G1 Japan Cup winner Falbrav comprehensively reversed form with his arch-rival when beating him by 3/4 of a length in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 5. He again had Nayef behind when the pair finished fifth and seventh, respectively, in the G1 King George VI and Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot July 26. Aidan O'Brien, who saddled the "Iron Horse" to deny Kalanisi in the epic of 2000, relies on the progressive **Mingun** (A.P. Indy), who stepped up off a facile score in the Listed Celebration S. at The Curragh June 29 to beat Carnival Dancer (GB) by a head in the G3 Meld S. at Leopardstown last time July 26. **Magistretti** (Diesis {GB}) took the G2 Dante S. at this track May 14 before finishing ninth in the G1 Epsom Derby June 7 but bounced back to finish 1 1/2 lengths behind the smart Vespene (Ire) when runner-up in the G1 Grand Prix de Paris at Longchamp last time June 22.

As a trial for the G1 St Leger this contest has a fine record, producing two winners and two runner's-up in that Classic in the last 10 runnings. One of the most impressive to complete the Voltigeur-Leger double was Milan (GB) and his trainer Aidan O'Brien saddles two this time in **Brian Boru** and **Powerscourt**. Jockey Mick Kinane has chosen the latter despite the score between these colts being two-nil in favor of the former, who beat him by 1 1/4 lengths in the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster in October and who had him back in sixth when fourth in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh last time June 29. Nevertheless, the fact that Powerscourt made his seasonal return in that Classic confirms the high regard in which connections hold him and he gave all the right signals when taking a 10-furlong conditions race at Leopardstown last time July 16. Sir Michael Stoute has won this race four times since 1982, also saddles a dup in **Hawk Flyer** and **Piano Star**. Both have ground to make up on **High Accolade**, who had the former back in third when beaten a short head by Phoenix Reach (Ire) under a penalty in the G3 Gordon S. at Goodwood last time July 29 and the latter back in fourth when winning the Listed Predominate S. at that track May 20. He may be given most to do by **Delsarte**, who meets him on three-pounds better terms than when beaten by two lengths in the G2 King Edward VII S. at Royal Ascot June 20. **Preview cont. p3**

Jockey Darryll Holland was yesterday looking forward to partnering **Chorist (GB)** in tomorrow's G1 Aston Upthorpe Yorkshire Oaks at York. Cheveley Park Stud's colorbearer is one of eight fillies bidding to deny **Islington (Ire)** a repeat success in the contest and impressed her jockey when winning the G3 Golden Daffodil S. at Chepstow last time July 25. "She's very very tough and I like her a lot," Holland said. "She's one of those that when a horse comes to her girth she really puts her belly to the floor and battles." Jimmy Fortune partners **Ocean Silk**, who finished runner-up in the G2 Ribblesdale S. at Royal Ascot June 19 before disappointing when seventh in the G1 Irish Oaks at The Curragh last time July 13. "She ran flat in the Irish Oaks, but seems very well in herself," Fortune commented. "Hopefully, we'll have a big run from her and Islington looks the filly we all have to beat."

Sent off as the favorite by the betting public, Disney Walt earned his first Group 1 victory while running his winning skein to three. After finishing last in his first start on the dirt at Palermo in April, he broke his maiden by five lengths at the end of May when moved to the turf. In mid-July he won an allowance race at San Isidro by nine lengths in a very impressive way and came to this event as the most dangerous rival for G1SW Cacht Wells. Disney Walt was quickest into stride from the gate, but Lo Esencial (Arg) (Mutakddim) went for him and grabbed the lead 100 meters after the start. Although that foe set speedy fractions, Disney Walt tracked him intently. Once they had turned for home, Disney Walt tackled the leader and powered clear for the victory. Harry Potter looked as if he might threaten leaving the turn, but flattened out through the lane, while Cacht Wells rallied from the last to get up for third. **Results cont. p4**

NO BREEDERS' CUP FOR SANTA CATARINA

Bob and Beverly Lewis' **Santa Catarina** (Unbridled), winner of the GII Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks in mid-June, will not participate in this year's Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita and will instead take aim at the La Canada series. "I'll freshen her up," trainer Bob Baffert told *Daily Racing Form*. "She's had little physical problems. She'd have to run against Azeri, and I want her to grow up. She needs the time." Santa Catarina was most recently fourth in the American Oaks over Hollywood's lawn July 5. The La Canada series begins in late December with the seven-furlong GI La Brea S. at Santa Anita.

SULAMANI BIDES TIME AT BELMONT

Godolphin's **Sulamani (Ire)** (Hernando {Fr}), who was awarded victory in Saturday's GI Arlington Million when Storming Home was disqualified from first, will take up temporary residence at Belmont Park in Elmont, New York while his connections chart a course for the star four-year-old. "He will stay in the USA for the moment at our stable up at Belmont, but the [G1] Arc [de l'Arc de Triomphe] is still very much part of the plan," Godolphin racing manager Simon Crisford told *Racing Post*. "We have to consider the [Sept. 6, GI] Man o' War S. for him and there is also the [Oct. 25, GI] Breeders' Cup [Turf], but we have to look at all the options."

SONS OF SEEKING THE GOLD

Although the circumstances weren't ideal, the Godolphin team were understandably delighted that Sulamani's promotion to first in the Arlington Million finally helped them reach the magnificent landmark of 100 Group 1 victories. Needless to say, there have been numerous stars among the horses which contributed to this extraordinary achievement (gained in the space of less than ten years), but none shone so brightly as Dubai Millennium, the stunning son of Seeking the Gold who contributed four of the previous 99 wins (by a total of over 22 lengths).

Of course, Dubai Millennium succumbed to grass sickness at the end of April, 2001, after he had covered 82 mares during his first season at Dalham Hall Stud. Because quite a few of those mares hadn't had time to conceive, Dubai Millennium's legacy amounts to only 56 foals.

With many of these 56 belonging to the Maktoum family or other owner-breeders, few of Dubai Millennium's progeny were ever likely to make it to the sales ring. That number was further reduced by Sheikh Mohammed's decision to buy as many of his old favorite's progeny as possible. Consequently, there are only a handful of Dubai Millennium yearlings in this year's major European sales. Among them are Kilcarn Stud's colt out of Spirit of Tara, a sister to the triple classic winner Salsabil; a half-brother to the GI San Juan Capistrano H. winner Passinetti; and a colt out of Miss Satamixa, a mare who – like Dubai Millennium – won the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois.

Remarkably, Miss Satamixa – along with the American mares November Snow, Storm Song and Tribulation – is one of 17 Grade/Group I-winning racemares among the dams of Dubai Millennium's 56 foals. Clearly Dubai Millennium received every help in the quest to pass on his exceptional talents, which Timeform acknowledged with a rating of 140.

The weight of expectations being carried by Dubai Millennium's heirs has become heavier over the last few weeks, thanks to the Grade I successes achieved by two of Seeking the Gold's other stallion sons, neither of which enjoyed anything like the same support as Dubai Millennium.

Lady Tak, who was winning for the sixth time in nine starts when she took the Test S. at the end of July, comes from the third American crop by Mutakddim, who started his career at Hill 'n' Dale Farms at a fee of only \$5,000. Now we have Island Fashion, an impressive winner of the GI Alabama S., who comes from the third crop by Petionville. This accomplished son of Seeking the Gold stood his first season at Crestwood Farm at a fee of \$10,000, but his fee was quickly halved.

Add in the fact that Bird Town, winner of the GI Kentucky Oaks and GI Acorn Stakes, is a member of the first crop by Cape Town and you'll see that three of this year's best sophomore fillies are all by sons of Seeking the Gold. Perhaps it isn't just coincidence that these high-class performers are all fillies, as Seeking the Gold has long had a reputation for being a "filly sire," notwithstanding the Grade 1 successes of his sons Dubai Millennium, Cape Town, Lujain and Secret Savings. The Claiborne stallion has twice as many Grade 1-winning daughters to his credit, with Cash Run, Seeking the Pearl, Flanders and Heavenly Prize among them.

The very well-connected Mutakddim, who is inbred 3 x 4 to the three-time champion broodmare sire Buckpasser, also has a predominance of fillies among his growing list of stakes winners, but this list also includes three Group 1-winning sons in Argentina (Lac Azur, El Charlatan and Luna Real). With over 140 mares bred in Kentucky in 2002, Mutakddim is likely to go on to even better things.

Significantly, Petionville is also inbred 3 x 4 to Buckpasser. Perhaps this explains why his good winners this year include Harbor Blues (Arizona Oaks), Keiai Sakura (Audubon Oaks) and Petionville Indeed (Walmac Lone Star Oaks) in addition to another Oaks winner (of the Delaware variety) in Island Fashion.

Although Petionville never scaled the heights achieved by Seeking the Gold, he had a pretty solid record. By the time he won the GIII La Jolla H. on Del Mar's turf course in August 1995, his record stood at six wins from nine starts, with five of those victories coming at stakes level. He had earlier won the GIII Louisiana Derby and the GII Ohio Derby, so he was a graded winner on both dirt and turf.

With three medium-sized crops aged three or over, Petionville has also sired two Graded-winning males, in Publication (a GII Arlington-Washington Futurity winner with three lines of Buckpasser) and True Passion, as well as the Grade II turf-winning filly Caught in the Rain. Four graded winners from his first three crops is again surely a pointer to greater things to come, especially as True Passion has a non-winning dam, Caught in the Rain has an unraced dam and Island Fashion has an unraced broodmare sire in A Native Danzig. Island Fashion, though, is out of a good-class racemare in Danzigs Fashion, who earned nearly \$200,000.

So what will Dubai Millennium, a much better race-horse than either Mutakddim or Petionville, achieve with his highly accomplished mates, I wonder?

Summerfield (Francis and Barbara VanLangendonck) consigned the bay colt. A pair of fillies each realized bids of \$170,000 to earn the sale's next highest prices. The first through the ring was Hip [18](#), a bay by first-year sire Yes It's True who was scooped up by Nick De Meric, agent. Johnson Hollow Farm consigned the youngster, who is out of the Deposit Ticket mare Safety Deposit. Just four horses later came Hip [22](#), a Tour d'Our filly brought to the sale by Big C Farm, Agent IV. Out of the Tri Jet mare Scintillating Suzi, Hip 22 was knocked down to Amy Tarrant. With an increase in average of 13.7 percent, from \$38,872 in 2002 to \$44,215 in 2003, the sale enjoyed solid gains over last year's event. 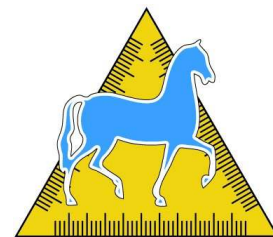
