GROUND FOR CONCERN

A talented field of seven was entered for Saturday's G1 Ireland the Food Island Champion S. at Leopardstown, but just who is running is up in the air after a controversial watering of the track yesterday.

While trainer Aidan O'Brien has gone on record saying his Breeders' Cup Turf hero **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) will only run on "safe" ground, connections of **Falbrav (Ire)** (Fairy King) are looking for fast ground for their multiple Group 1 winner. When Leopardstown racing manager Tom Burke continued watering yesterday and officials changed the description of the ground from good/firm to good, Falbrav's rider Darryll Holland expressed concerns that the artificial intervention was designed to ensure High Chaparral's participation, but would hurt his mount's chances.

"It seems the management have watered for one horse, and it's not for mine," Holland told *PA Sport* yesterday. "Falbrav needs fast ground. The ground at Leopardstown was naturally fast, so how can it be good now? I've given up good rides in Group 1 races over the weekend to ride on fast ground at Leopardstown. It's very disappointing. Some have asked for watering to be done in order to produce safe ground. Watered ground is not safe." Burke has said he may water again before Saturday to produce what he described yesterday as, "very, very safe ground."

RACING BACK WITH BIG BANG AT BELMONT

Belmont Park's Fall Championship meet springs into action Saturday with a trio of Grade I races which could help determine year-end Eclipse Awards. Will Farish's **Mineshaft** (A.P. Indy), one of the nation's top handicappers, leads the field in the G1 Woodward S. The four-year-old has been off since winning the July 5 G1 Suburban H. and will be looking for his third Grade I of the year in Saturday's nine-furlong contest. Mineshaft completed his Woodward preparation with a four-furlong drill in :52.05 over a sloppy Belmont track Wednesday. He will break from post two in the five-horse field. The Woodward field also includes **Puzzlement** (Pine Bluff), upset winner of the GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup in his last start. "I always thought he could win a stakes, but he hadn't proved me right until the Saratoga Breeders' Cup," commented trainer H. Allen Jerkens. "You never know if that can continue or not. He looks the same and is feeling good." Puzzlement was fourth, beaten 8 1/2 lengths by Mineshaft in the Suburban. "He could be a little better [now] than he was in the Suburban, but he'll have to be a lot better, especially at even weights," Jerkens said. Puzzlement, who went four furlongs at Belmont yesterday in :50.06, will break from post one.

Turf Stars in Man o' War

A field of eight, plus one main-track only entrant, was entered yesterday for Saturday's G1 Man o' War. **Whitmore's Conn** (Kris S.), coming off a 1 1/4-length victory in the G1 Sword Dancer, will be looking for his third straight score in the 1 3/8-mile affair. "I hope he's not at his peak yet this year," said trainer Randy Schulhofer. "He should be a little later this year peaking than last year because we got a later start. He's doing absolutely superb." Also in the Man o' War field is Edmund Gann's **Denon** (Pleasant Colony), winner of the G1 Manhattan over a soft Belmont turf course in June. The five-year-old was fourth after a troubled trip in the Sword Dancer. **Macaw (Ire)** (Bluebird), seeking his first U.S. victory in nine stateside starts, was second in the Sword Dancer. "He's getting better every time," trainer Barclay Tagg observed. "It's better to have a fast pace and he likes soft ground." After a week of rain in the New York area, he could get his wish. *Cont. p. 2*

GRAND LODGE INJURED IN AUSTRALIA

Coolmore stallion **Grand Lodge** (Chief's Crown--La Papagena {GB}, by Habitat), who is currently standing the Southern Hemisphere season at Woodlands Stud near Denman, New South Wales, sustained a knee injury in a paddock accident Thursday, according to published reports. The 12-year-old, who is currently standing for A\$38,500 at Woodlands, is scheduled to undergo surgery today at the Scone Veterinary Clinic in Scone, NSW. The winner of the 1993 G1 Dewhurst S. en route to a juvenile championship, the Kentucky-bred colt went on to score at the top level again at three when he won the G1 St. James's Palace S. Grand Lodge retired with four wins from 13 career starts and \$653,507 in earnings. The chestnut, who stood for a private fee during the Northern Hemisphere season at Coolmore Stud near Fethard, Co. Tipperary, Ireland, has sired 35 stakes winners, including champions Sinndar (Ire), Grandera (Ire), Indian Lodge (Ire) and Queen's Logic (Ire).

Gazelle Octet (Belmont preview cont. from p. 1)

Belmont's Grade I trifecta is completed by the **Gazelle H.**, which attracted a field of eight three-year-old fillies. The nine-furlong race will feature a rematch between G1 Mother Goose S. winner **Spoken Fur** (Notebook) and the filly who derailed her Triple Tiara hopes with a win in the G1 Alabama, **Island Fashion** (Petionville). "She sure was impressive in the Alabama," Island Fashion's trainer Barclay Tagg admitted. "I don't know how she'll handle one turn. I've only run her once and that was around two turns. It doesn't seem like much bothers her, though." Spoken Fur had a five-race win streak broken with her third-place effort in the Alabama. Also in the **Gazelle**, is the always game **Lady Tak** (Mutakddim). "I'm extremely confident for the **Gazelle**," trainer Steve Asmussen said of the G1 Test S. winner. "She's one of the best three-year-old fillies and this will be an important race to decide the championship. If she wins, her, Bird Town and Spoken Fur will all have two Grade I wins this year. It will come down to who finishes the year the best."

AIRWAVE TACKLES THE DREAM

Airwave (GB) (Air Express {Ire}) will take on **Oasis Dream (GB)** (Green Desert) in tomorrow's G1 Stanley Leisure Sprint Cup at Haydock. Off the track since finishing third behind that rival in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket July 10, the filly was forced to sidestep the G1 Nunthorpe S. due to an infection, but her subsequent work has been satisfactory. "She seems to have all the old sparkle back, the only thing is she did nothing for virtually 10 days, so we have to just take the fitness on trust," conditioner Henry Candy commented yesterday. "I wouldn't be at all surprised if she didn't get a bit weary in the last furlong or so, but she is in great form in herself. If she is too keen early, then she is not going to finish, but she has actually got a bit more sensible as she has grown up. I think it's a shot in the dark really. I don't think I have ever run a horse on less work and we'll just have to see how she copes with it." Candy is respectful of July Cup and Nunthorpe S. winner **Oasis Dream**, who he described as "a very good horse," adding that he "wouldn't go completely overboard about him" and that "once we are really fit and well, I think it will be an interesting race." David Nicholls has warned that last year's sixth **Continent (GB)** (Lake Coniston {Ire}) will only run if there is sufficient rain. Haydock's Clerk of the Course Kirkland Tellwright yesterday reported the going as good to firm, with watering in progress.

With the three group races run at Baden-Baden so far this week having fallen to British-trained challengers, **Mokabra** may provide more woe for the Germans in this contest. Having taken a Newcastle maiden either side of chasing home the smart duo Cape Fear (GB) and Cop Hill Lad (GB), he finished a creditable third behind subsequent G1 Phoenix S. winner One Cool Cat in the G3 Anglesey S. at The Curragh July 13. He took a competitive conditions event at Ripon last time Aug. 16 and has a similar profile to stable companion Checkit (Ire), who was awarded this race 12 months ago. **Aristaios** is forced to shoulder a penalty for a short-head defeat of America America in the Listed Pokal-Sierstorpf-Rennen at Hamburg last time July 4. While he holds the third-placed debutante **Marabout Directa** and fifth-placed **Santita Rosita** on that form, he disappointed when only sixth in a conditions contest at Cologne last time Aug. 23 and has questions to answer. **Donatello** was second and **Letitzia** fourth behind Gooseley Lane (GB) in the Listed Oppenheim-Rennen at Cologne Aug. 3. **Slawomira** took a maiden on his debut at Bremen Aug. 24 and may prove the strongest defence against an English whitewash at Baden-Baden.

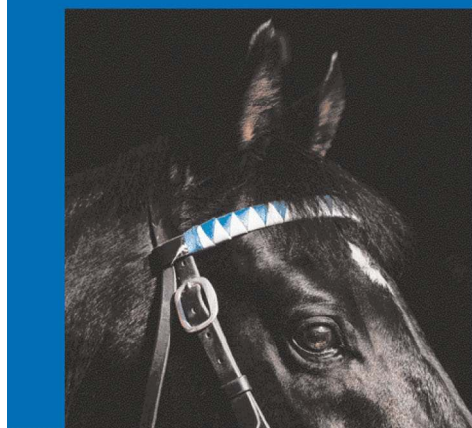

HARLAN'S HOLIDAY TO AIRDRIE Multi-millionaire Harlan's Holiday (Harlan--Christmas in Aiken, by Affirmed), retired after injuring a suspensory ligament in the GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. Aug. 16, will embark on his breeding career in 2004 at Airdrie Stud near Midway, Kentucky for a stud fee of \$17,500. "We are really excited to have this horse," said Airdrie's Brereton Jones. "He has everything we look for in a stallion prospect. He was a graded stakes winner at two, three and four. He could sprint or stay and beat the best. He is one of the best-looking horses you have ever seen." A \$97,000 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July yearling purchase, the blaze-faced bay earned \$3,632,664 while racing in the colors of Laurie and Jack Wolf's Starlight Stables, winning the GI Florida Derby, the GI Blue Grass S. and the GI Donn H., as well as placing second in this year's G1 Dubai World Cup and GI Hollywood Gold Cup. DR. BRENDLER RETIRED Graded stakes winner Dr. Brendler (Distant View--Lady of Vision {Ire}, by Vision) has been retired after suffering a torn suspensory ligament when finishing a close fifth in the GI Sword Dancer Invitational H. at Saratoga Aug. 9. Stud plans have not yet been finalized. Racing in the colors of breeder Francis O'Toole, Dr. Brendler defeated champion sprinter Mozart (Ire) in winning the Listed Leopardstown 2000 Guineas Trial S. at The Curragh in 2001 before repatriating to the U.S. The Maryland-bred bay enjoyed his finest campaign this year, winning the GII Citgo Dixie H. in May prior to a third in the GI Manhattan H. June 7 and a second in the GIII Stars and Stripes Breeders' Cup H. July 5. He heads into retirement with a record of 29-5-3-3 while bankrolling \$377,607.

"I want to get him ready for the Sunshine Millions sprint at Gulfstream in January."

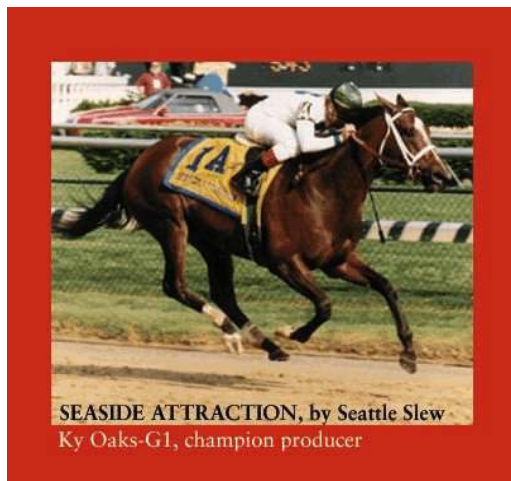

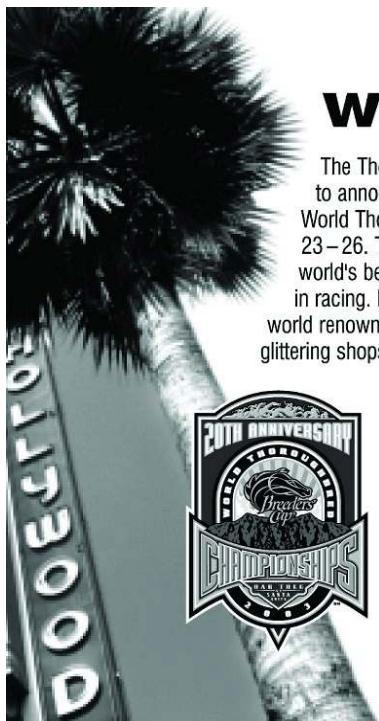
