STAR GAZING

A trio of top three-year-old fillies will go to the post in the GI Gazelle H. at Belmont this afternoon in an effort to cement their Eclipse Award claims. The \$250,000 affair has attracted **Lady Tak** (Mutakddim), who comes off a brilliant, stakes-record setting victory in the GI Test S. July 26; **Island Fashion**

(Petionville), who has paired up romping victories in the GI Alabama S. and the GIII Delaware Oaks in her last two starts; and Alabama third **Spoken Fur** (Notebook), who returns to the scene of her impressive triumphs in the GI Mother Goose S. and the GI CCA Oaks. But there are some dark horses in the field who could make their presence felt. Godolphin's **Danuta** (Sunday Silence) will bid to follow in the foot-

steps of Imperial Gesture, who won the UAE Oaks last spring before returning to win the Gazelle. "We know it's going to be a difficult task for her, it's the toughest race she's had since she's come to the States," said trainer Tom Albertrani. The blaze-faced bay has been out just once since her April victory at Nad al Sheba, coming up a length short in a Belmont allowance over a muddy track June 20. Trainer Shug McGaughey sends out the unbeaten

GRADE I MINE

Will Farish's **Mineshaft** (A.P. Indy) looms an overwhelming favorite to garner his third Grade I victory this year when he goes postward in today's GI Woodward S. at Belmont. The handsome four-year-old posted a win in the GI Pimlico Special H. May 16 prior to his narrow loss in the GI Stephen Foster H. June 14, but rebounded to take the the GI Suburban H. with authority July 5. He took the rest of the summer off from competition, but trainer Neil Howard has his charge primed for a fall campaign which should culminate in a trip to Santa Anita for the GI Breeders' Cup Classic. "We were very pleased with how everything went this summer," said Howard. "It's a really good division of older horses." **Cont. p2**

TAKING THE HIGH ROAD

He saddled the "Iron Horse" Giant's Causeway to win this in 2000 and went painfully close with Galileo (Ire) and Hawk Wing in the last two renewals, but Aidan O'Brien may be back where it counts with **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) after today's G1 Ireland the Food Island Champion S. at Leopardstown. The dual Derby winner's progress was halted by a shoulder injury this spring, but he defied the considerable anchor of a seven-pound penalty when making a successful re-introduction in the G2 Royal Whip S. at The Curragh Aug. 10. His ability to handle Arlington and previous course wins will stand him in good stead, provided connections are happy that he has the "safe" ground he needs. **Cont. p2**

DARE TO DREAM

Juddmonte's **Oasis Dream (GB)** (Green Desert) bids to become only the second horse to complete Britain's sprinting "triple crown" and extend his tally of Group 1 wins to four in the G1 Stanley Leisure Sprint Cup at Haydock this afternoon. With seemingly the hardest pieces of the puzzle--the July 10 G1 July Cup and the Aug. 21 G1 Nunthorpe S.--behind him already, he is ready to match the feat of Ajdal, who completed the triple in 1987. To do so he must confirm Newmarket form with today's main opponent, the three-year-old filly **Airwave (GB)** (Air Express {Ire}). **Cont. p4**

Mineshaft is deservedly 2-5 on the morning line, but he still has four rivals to defeat before he can add the Woodward to his trophy collection. **Puzzlement** may have broken through with his win in the GII Saratoga Breeders' Cup H. Aug. 16, but the bay's best performances have come upstate; his best finishes at Belmont are a pair of seconds in five starts. He's sent out by Allen Jerkens, who is celebrating the 30th anniversary of Prove Out upsetting Secretariat in the 1973 Woodward. **Northern Rock** wired a solid allowance field, including Puzzlement, in his U.S. bow June 12. Following a close fifth in the GI Whitney, the chestnut switched to the turf for another allowance victory Aug. 15. Shipping in from Ireland is Hold That Tiger, who made an eye-catching late bid for third in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile in his previous trip to the States. Things haven't gone smoothly this year for the \$1.1 million purchase, a half brother to GI Belmont S. hero Editor's Note. He has failed to hit the board in three starts abroad in 2003, but gets Lasix in an effort to turn things around this time.

Sophomores have struggled to best their elders in recent times, with only Pentire (GB) and Giant's Causeway succeeding since 1993, but **Alamshar** has the credentials to arrest that trend. Another with course form, he followed up a hard-fought success in the G2 Derrinstown Derby Trial here May 11 with a staying-on third in the G1 Epsom Derby June 7. He bounced back to end the unbeaten run of Dalakhani (Ire) in the G1 Irish Derby at The Curragh June 29 before destroying a formidable field assembled for the G1 King George VI & Queen Elizabeth Diamond S. at Ascot last time July 26. His 3 1/2-length defeat of subsequent GI Arlington Million winner Sulamani (Ire) there establishes him at the top of the middle-distance tree, but he has to succeed where Galileo failed in following up his King George success at three. **Falbrav** has been a revelation with advancing age, taking his tally of Group 1 successes to six with an impressive performance in the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York last time Aug. 19. He had previously finished fifth over the 1 1/2 miles of the King George, where the rain-softened ground sapped his stamina, but is looking a world-beater over this trip, over which he also took the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 5. Godolphin have an enviable record in this, having won four of the last five renewals, but **Moon Ballad** has yet to show he can transfer the form of his G1 Dubai World Cup success on the dirt at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29 to turf this term. His fate may be determined by the Ballydoyle rabbit **France**, as he ran too freely when taken on in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 18. Moon Ballad shaped better when finding the mile of the G1 Sussex S. at Goodwood inadequate last time July 30 and will be suited by this track. Fillies have struggled in this since its early years, but both G1 Yorkshire Oaks winner **Islington** and G1 Irish Oaks heroine **Vintage Tipple** are fascinating in this intoxicating mix of talent.

Mokabra kept up the onslaught of the British-trained raiders at Baden Baden this week by battling to a hard-fought victory in this contest. After Big Bad Bob (Ire) captured Sunday's G3 Furstenberg-Rennen, Passing Glance (GB) followed up in Tuesday's G2 Oettingen-Rennen and Stormont (Ire) piled on the agony for the home team in Wednesday's G2 Goldene Peitsche. In the light of the foreign drubbing, local punters sent Mokabra off as the 2-5 favorite and he duly obliged. Stalking the early duel for the lead under Ted Durcan, he closed in the straight as Slawomira was committed. Passing that rival with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining, he was driven out to contain her determined rally, but answered every call. "He is just so lazy," jockey Ted Durcan told *PA Sport*. "From the moment we left the stalls he was off the bridle and only came on it when we came around the final bend. He is a really nice horse and will get seven furlongs easily." Mokabra progressed off his maiden score at Newcastle May 14 to finish third in a conditions event at Pontefract May 23. He was no match for the subsequent G1 Phoenix S. winner One Cool Cat when third in the G3 Anglesey S. at The Curragh July 13, but returned to winning ways when taking a conditions event at Ripon last time Aug. 16. Lunar Sovereign was improving with each start this season, including a solid third-place finish in the GI United Nations H. at Monmouth July 5, until a dismal eighth behind Whitmore's Conn last out in the GI Sword Dancer H. at Saratoga Aug. 9. Expect him to bounce back over the Belmont sod, where he is three-for-three lifetime. **Carpanetto**, second to MG1SW Vinnie Roe (Ire) last out in the Listed Ballyroan S. at Leopardstown Aug. 17, ships in from Ireland for top trainer Aidan O'Brien. This fresh face has speed and should be in a perfect spot sitting right off likely pacesetter **Balto Star**. "He had a few problems in the spring and didn't get to run," O'Brien said. "We always thought between a mile and a quarter and a mile and a half would be his best trip." All **Whitmore's Conn** does is win, but he continues to get no respect at the windows. After victories in the GII Bowling Green H. at 11-1 and the Sword Dancer at 24-1, it's time to take him seriously. Pat Day sits in for the injured Jean-Luc Samyn. "Pat's got a lot of patience," trainer Randy Schulhofer said. "He doesn't get nervous in the big ones and he's been there a number of times." **Denon** is perfect in two previous trips to the post at Belmont, winning the GI Turf Classic last fall and the GI Manhattan H. over boggy ground on the Belmont undercard. But the five-year-old bay has been victimized by bad trips in his last two outings--a close fifth in the GI United Nations H. July 5 and the Sword Dancer--and will need a clear run in order to return to his best form.

Crowned champion two-year-old of 2002 by virtue of his record-setting G1 Middle Park S. success at Newmarket in October, **Oasis Dream** has lived up to that billing at three. After a respectable third behind Choisir (Aus) on his return in the G2 King's Stand S. at Royal Ascot June 17, he outbattled that rival in the G1 July Cup at Newmarket July 10, before delivering an exhilarating display of raw power in the G1 Nunthorpe S. at York Aug. 21. But he'll have to see off **Airwave** in order to complete this hat trick of big sprint victories. Last year's G1 Cheveley Park S. winner had looked special when winning the G2 Temple S. under a penalty at Sandown on her return May 26. Some of the mystique has been eroded by her half-length defeat by Choisir when runner-up in the G1 Golden Jubilee S. at Royal Ascot June 21 and third in the July Cup last time. She also missed the York contest due to an infection and only recently has the sparkle returned, according to her naturally pessimistic conditioner, but she remains a filly of the highest calibre. Wokingham H. winner **Fayr Jag** beat stable companion **Somnus** by a neck in a conditions race at Newmarket last time Aug. 22, but the latter may reverse that form with a cleaner trip. He had the Nunthorpe S. runner-up **The Tatling** back in third when winning the Listed Hackwood S. at Newbury July 19 and is capable of making the frame.

The top five finishers in the GII La Jolla H. Aug. 16--**Singletary**, **Devious Boy**, **Senor Swinger**, **Fairly Ransom** and **Sweet Return**--are all back for Del Mar's crowning event for three-year-old turf specialists, but there are several newcomers to the scene who bear watching. **Bis Repetitas** could finally be rounding into form for trainer Bobby Frankel. Given a brief freshening following a 3/4-length second in the GII Cinema Breeders' Cup H. June 29, the bay defeated **Outta Here** in a one-mile allowance over this course Aug. 21. The latter was making his turf debut that day and could find the added distance to his benefit this time. **Middleweight** has been nearly perfect since switching to the turf. Following a narrow loss in his grass bow June 28, he broke his maiden July 20 and promptly added a local allowance win Aug. 11.

Turf stakes often feature close finishes because the contenders all have figures in a narrow range, and the Del Mar Derby is no exception. As is often the case, trips will probably decide the outcome, and of the favorites **Singletary** should get the best trip. With good figures and a great Thoro-Graph pattern, he will be tough to beat. But the surprise here is that the fastest horse going into the race is one of the longshots.

Shizao showed a lot of speed at two, winning a six-furlong Curragh maiden in September before beating Miguel Cervantes in the Listed Tipperary S. the following month. She disappointed in finishing 10th when stepped up to seven furlongs in the G2 Rockfel S. at Newmarket on her final start of the season. She proved categorically that she stays that trip on her return when beating **Perfect Touch** by a neck as the highweight in a competitive handicap at The Curragh June 28, but her stamina has to be taken on trust as she tackles a mile for the first time. That is not an issue for **Favourable Terms**, who had **Soldera** back in fourth when winning the Listed Distaff S. over a mile at Sandown July 5. She split the smart fillies Chorist (Ire) and Monturani (Ire) when runner-up in the G3 Daffodil S. over an extended 10 furlongs at Chepstow last time July 25, but will be better suited by this drop back in trip. **Dossier** further strengthens the sophomore hand against an assembly of average older fillies. She followed a smooth debut score in a Naas maiden May 5 with a battling neck defeat of Twiggy's Sister (Ire) in the Listed Platinum S. at Cork last time Aug. 4.

PERFECT MOON SOLD GII Best Pal S. winner **Perfect Moon** (Malibu Moon) was purchased by Royce Jaime for a price characterized as "mid-six figures" and will join the barn of trainer Doug O'Neill. The gelding, expected to start next in Wednesday's GII Del Mar Futurity, raced previously in the colors of Annabelle Stute and The Hat Ranch and was trained by Mel Stute. Dennis O'Neill, the trainer's brother, represented Jaime in the transaction. Perfect Moon broke his maiden for a \$40,000 tag at Hollywood Park in May, then was second in the Haggin S. before reeling off victories in the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship S. and the Aug. 17 GII Best Pal S. To date, he has won three of seven starts and earned \$183,870.

LADY'S SECRET PURSE BOOSTED The Oak Tree Racing Association has increased the purse of the GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H. to \$300,000 following the news that **Azeri** (Jade Hunter) would be back to defend her title. The Lady's Secret will be the final prep prior to the Breeders' Cup for the reigning Horse of the Year. "The purse increase is being funded solely by Oak Tree, not by horsemen," said Sherwood C. Chillingworth, Oak Tree's executive vice president, who is hoping to get some new faces for the Lady's Secret. "The top five finishers will all benefit from the purse increase."

JOHNSTON'S JUVENILES READY FOR ACTION

Trainer Mark Johnston has outlined plans for his talented group of two-year-olds. Johnston said MGSW **Attraction (GB)** (Efisio {GB}) will defend her unbeaten record in the G1 Cheveley Park S. at Newmarket Oct. 2. "She is on course for the Cheveley Park and is fully recovered from an overreach," he explained. "She's head and shoulders above anything she's run against, but the gap wouldn't be as exaggerated now. Afterwards she will go straight to the G1 1000 Guineas S. [at Newmarket in May]--I don't know if she'll stay the mile but we'll certainly find out there." The Middleham-based conditioner also revealed that G2 Vintage S. winner **Lucky Story** (Kris S.) would contest either the G1 Dewhurst S. at Newmarket Oct. 18 or the G1 Racing Post Trophy at Doncaster a week later. "He's still lazy and laid-back and we have the option of waiting for the Racing Post Trophy, but he'll definitely run next in a Group 1," he said. While G3 Norfolk S. winner **Russian Valour (Ire)** (Fasliyev) is most likely to miss the remainder of the season, G2 Futurity S. winner **Pearl of Love (Ire)** (Peintre Celebre) is on course for next Sunday's G1 National S. at The Curragh. "Russian Valour had a bit of a problem after Royal Ascot," he explained. "I'm not sure if he's going to make it back this season, but he'll be put away for the G1 2000 Guineas. The mile has to be a big question mark, but he can always go back to sprinting afterwards. Pearl of Love is definitely on target for the National S., with or without [G1 Phoenix S. winner] **One Cool Cat** (Storm Cat). That will probably be his last run of the season, but nothing is set in stone."

ALLEN'S PROSPECT EUTHANIZED **Allen's Prospect** (Mr. Prospector--Change Water, by Swaps) was euthanized Wednesday from complications following surgery at New Bolton Center in Pennsylvania for removal of a tumor under his jaw. "He had a fast-growing tumor under his throat latch," explained Josh Pons, syndicate manager for Country Life Farm, where Allen's Prospect stood his entire 17-year stud career. "We sent him to New Bolton for high-resolution head x-rays. Dr. Dean Richardson felt that the tumor might spread to his airways, and the decision was made to remove the growth." The 21-year-old stallion appeared to be recovering from the surgery, but lost coordination in his hind end Monday evening and by Tuesday morning was unable to stand up. "He suffered a rib injury in his struggle and that made breathing difficult," Pons said. "We did not want to prolong the horse's suffering. He was put to sleep Wednesday afternoon around 1:30 p.m." Allen's Prospect, raced by the late Allen Paulson, was retired to Country Life after his racing career was prematurely ended by a fractured splint bone. He is the sire of 57 stakes winners, including King of the Heap, Gin Talking, In C C's Honor and Secret Prospect. His progeny have earned nearly \$39 million. Allen's Prospect was named Maryland's Stallion of the Year in 2001.

He was acquired for \$2.6 million at the 505 dispersal in 2000 and continued his career for The Thoroughbred Corp. The dark bay won his first two starts last year, including the Gill Bay Meadows Breeders' Cup H., before running second in the Gill San Gabriel H. Dec. 29 in what would be his final career start. He retires with a record of 18-6-4-2 and earnings of \$561,983.
