EYDON HALL DISPERSAL AT TATTERSALLS

DECEMBER The vast majority of the late Gerald Leigh's Eydon Hall Farm breeding stock will be offered at this year's Tattersalls December Sales, the auction company announced yesterday. Marketing director Jimmy George said the company was "anticipating in excess of 30 individuals in the sale, including weanlings, fillies in training and broodmares, but the full details have yet to be finalized." Executors of Leigh's estate reached the decision after consultation with Leigh's children, Sarah and Robin. "It was our father's wish for us to downsize after a period of time," they said in a prepared statement. "As we have our own careers, he wanted us to enjoy the horses but not have such a large operation. We will therefore be retaining a small band of broodmares and some racing prospects from the core families that he carefully developed over the past 30 years."



Gossamer *INPHO*

Among the Eydon Hall mares is last year's G1 Irish 1,000 Guineas winner **Gossamer (GB)** (Sadler's Wells), in foal to Rainbow Quest, who, if offered, is likely to be the highlight of the session. Two half sisters to Gossamer, **Brocatelle (GB)** (Green Desert) and **Zibilene (GB)** (Rainbow Quest), were sold at the 2000 and 2001 Tattersalls December Sales, realizing 1,700,000 guineas and 1,500,000 guineas, respectively, but as George added, "While the name of Gossamer will understandably be the one on everyone's lips, the Eydon Hall Farm dispersal will be a crown with many more than just one jewel in it." Edmond Mahony, Chairman of Tattersalls, said "We are naturally delighted to have been asked to handle the Eydon Hall Farm dispersal, but above all, we feel honoured. The band of broodmares so carefully assembled by the late Gerald Leigh made him one of the most globally respected figures in the world of Thoroughbred breeding, and the dispersal will be a massive tribute to three decades of achievement by a man admired not only by all at Tattersalls, but by an entire industry."

SILVER CHARM COLT ON TOP AGAIN

For the second day in a row, a colt by Kentucky Derby winner Silver Charm led bidding at the Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington. Robert and Beverly Lewis, who campaigned Silver Charm, purchased the gray yearling out of the stakes-winning mare Extra Rare (Rare Brick) for \$230,000. The session topper was consigned by James B Keogh's Grovendale, as agent. Through eight sessions, Keeneland has sold 2,004 yearlings for a total of \$257,281,000. Figures remain up compared with last year's auction. The average price of \$128,384 is up 30.6 percent from a year ago, while the median rose 20 percent to \$60,000. For yesterday's session, the buy-back rate fell to 11.8 percent. For the entire sale, the buy-back rate stands at 22.8 percent. One of the features of the opening days of the Keeneland September Sales was the demand for yearlings from the final crop of Unbridled. On the first two days, 14 sons and daughters of that stallion were sold for an average of \$871,429, including a \$2,800,000 colt out of Serena's Song, a \$2,400,000 half-sister to Favorite Trick, a \$1,800,000 colt out of Storm Alert and a \$1,100,000 sister to Banshee Breeze.

The death of Unbridled in the fall of 2001, when he was only 14, was a very serious loss to the breeding industry. However, there are signs that he has left at least one horse who may well be a legitimate heir. That horse is Unbridled's Song, a member of Unbridled's first crop and with his victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, his sire's first Grade I winner. In the spring following that triumph, Unbridled's Song looked as if he might also be a candidate to follow his sire as a GI Kentucky Derby winner following spectacular victories in the GI Florida Derby and GI Wood Memorial S. Unfortunately, Unbridled's Song was then beset by a variety of physical problems. In the Derby, he ran in an egg bar shoe and after setting very fast fractions, he faded in the stretch to finish off the board behind another son of Unbridled, Grindstone. In three subsequent starts that

year, Unbridled's Song failed to win, his best effort being a second in the GI Peter Pan. Kept in training at four, Unbridled's Song had an easy win in his lone start, the seven-furlong Olympic H., before another injury ended his career.

Time may show that we date the moment when the torch passed from father to son as the 2001 GI Breeders' Cup Distaff. Little more than a week after the death of Unbridled, his daughter Exogenous was favored for the Distaff. Tragically, she flipped over exiting the tunnel onto the track and was later put down. In her absence, Unbridled's Song's daughter, Unbridled Elaine captured the race, putting her sire squarely in the spotlight as Unbridled's heir apparent.

That first crop of Unbridled's Song, foals of 1998, has now produced eight stakes winners from 61 named foals. In addition to Unbridled Elaine, they include another GISW in Songandaprayer, GSW Griffinite and Unbridled Time, who earned over \$340,000, but might have had a more impressive record had he not been injured after his victory in the WHAS-11 S. early in his two-year-old career. There are six stakes winners in Unbridled's Song's second crop, headlined by Buddha, who defeated Medaglia d'Oro to take the GI Wood Memorial before suffering a career-ending injury. Unbridled's Song's third crop are currently three-year-olds and are headed by the GI Santa Catalina S. winner Domestic Dispute and Hennie's Song, an undefeated multiple stakes winner.

The weekend's stakes action revealed two more potential future stars for Unbridled's Song in Value Plus, who finished second to the spectacular Cuvee in the GI Futurity; and Marylebone, who finished very gamely to defeat stablemate Lokoya by a nose in the GI Matron. These performances are even more promising when one realizes that both Value Plus and Marylebone were making only their second starts. **Cont. p. 4**

Marylebone is the fourth foal and third winner produced by her dam Desert Queen. A \$725,000 yearling, she is a sister to Alpha Mama, who realized \$650,000 at the 2000 Keeneland September Sales, but has never started. Desert Queen does, however, have another black-type representative in Unigold, a three-year-old Silver Deputy colt who ran second in this year's renewal of the Predominate S., an English Derby trial. Desert Queen herself won three small races in 13 starts, but she was a sister to stakes winners Flicker Queen and Wavering Scene. Flicker Queen, the better of that pair, won the Duchess S. in Canada and produced an excellent runner in the Regal Classic colt Stephanotis, who won the GIII Dominion Day H. and several other stakes to amass earnings of \$843,295.

Desert Queen's granddam, stakes-placed Seen and Silent, is a half sister to Overturned (by Wavering Monarch and therefore closely related to Desert Queen), winner of the GIII Arlington Oaks and GIII Rare Treat H., and dam of GSW Capsized. Another half-sister to Seen and Silent to make an impact is the stakes-winning Full Out filly In Full View. She is dam of GSW Nice Assay, who in turn is the dam of MGISW Came Home, one of the best colts of the 1999 foal crop; and MGSW A. P. Assay. Desert Queen's fifth dam Boss Well is a mare with an intriguing pedigree as she is by the little-seen Boss Hoss, a brother to Blue Larkspur, and her granddam Blessed Again is a daughter of Blue Larkspur. For the record, Blessed Again is 3/4-sister to We Hail, the third dam of In Reality (a horse who appears in the pedigree of Unbridled Song's sire) and she's also granddam of Prince Blessed, the sire of Unbridled's Song's third dam.

Marylebone herself represents an extended version of the cross of stallions descending in mail line from Mr. Prospector over mares descending from the male line of Mr. Prospector's fellow Raise a Native son (but a very different horse in physique and aptitude) Majestic Prince. This cross has produced at least 23 unrestricted stakes winners to date, including Marylebone's fellow GISWs Gold Fever, Mahogany Hall and Nonsuch Bay. Marylebone's pedigree also displays a tremendous build up of genetic relatives from the La Troienne family. Unbridled is inbred to the mare Aspidistra, who is by Better Self, and Better Self also appears 4x4 in the pedigree of Marylebone's dam. Better Self was by La Troienne's son Bimelech out of a mare by War Admiral, which means that he was bred on something of a reverse cross to the numerous important mares who were by War Admiral out of daughters of La Troienne. One of the most notable runners and producers bred on that formula was Busanda, the dam of Buckpasser, and a look at the pedigree of Marylebone shows Buckpasser 6x4. If that weren't enough, the two Buckpasser strains actually come in through the closely related pari of Magic (third dam of Unbridled) and Uncommitted (dam of Wavering Monarch). Both these mares are out of daughters of Better Self, and so have La Troienne 4x4 through the closely related Busanda/Better Self. There is one other link we have to note to complete this rather complex puzzle. Remember that we said that Marylebone's sixth dam Boss Well was inbred 1x3 to the brothers Boss Hoss/Blue Larkspur? Well, in turn, they are closely related to Baba Kenny, the granddam of Better Self, a horse who puts in four appearances in the pedigree of Marylebone.

THIRD BREEDERS' CUP POOL SET The fields for this weekend's third and final wagering period of the Breeders' Cup Future Bet have been set by the National Thoroughbred Racing Association. Wagering, which opens Friday at 2 p.m. ET and closes Sunday at 9 p.m. ET, is available for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf and Breeders' Cup Mile, all run Oct. 25 at Santa Anita. **Cuvee** (Carson City), who won Sunday's GI Futurity at Belmont, is the 6-1 morning-line favorite for the Juvenile, while **Halfbridled** (Unbridled) is the 2-1 choice in the Juvenile Fillies after her victory in the GI Del Mar Debutante. **Voodoo Dancer** (Kingmambo), winner of the GI Diana H., is listed as the 6-1 pick in the Filly and Mare Turf and the GI Eddie Read H. winner **Special Ring** (Nureyev) is favored at 8-1 in the Mile. Morning line odds were established by Mike Watchmaker of *Daily Racing Form*.

TOCSET TO GOODWOOD MGISW Tocset (Awesome Again) will make his next start in the Oct. 4 GI Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. at Santa Anita, according to *The Blood-Horse*. The three-year-old won last year's GI Hollywood Futurity and GI Champagne S. and was sidelined for much of this season. He returned to take the restricted Widener S. at Philadelphia Park and is coming off a fifth-place showing over a sloppy track in the Sept. 1 GIII Pennsylvania Derby. Connections hope to use the Goodwood as a prep for the Oct. 25 GI Breeders' Cup Classic.

OBS WINTER SALE MOVED The Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Winter Mixed Sale has been rescheduled to avoid a conflict with the Keeneland January sale. The OBS auction will now be held from Jan. 19 through Jan. 22. The closing date for entries remains Nov. 14. The Keeneland sale, originally set to begin Jan. 5 will now begin on Jan. 12.

No Armistice to Country Life:

No Armistice (Unbridled--Ataentsic, by Hold Your Peace) has been retired from racing and will stand the 2004 breeding season at Country Life Farm in Bel Air, Maryland. Racing for owner B. Wayne Hughes, the six-year-old was runner-up to sprint champion Kona Gold in last year's GIII Los Angeles H. and was third in this year's GIII El Conejo H. On the board in 11 of 14 starts, No Armistice won four races and earned \$211,200. "We lost leading sire Allen's Prospect after surgery last week, and with Malibu Moon now in the Bluegrass, we have two big empty stalls," explained Country Life manager Josh Pons. "Mr. Hughes thought No Armistice would help fill the void." No Armistice will stand as the property of Hughes and Country Life for a fee of \$3,000.
