TIZDUBAI TO MISS REST OF 2003

Darley Stud Management's **Tizdubai** (Cee's Tizzy), a full sister to Horse of the Year Tiznow, will miss the remainder of the season, and a tilt at the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies at Santa Anita, after suffering a condylar fracture of the right front leg. According to trainer Eoin Harty, the injury is not life or career threatening and the winner of the Aug. 9 Gil Sorrento S. at Del Mar will likely resume training in about 90 days. The undefeated filly will be shipped to Dubai later this year and is likely to compete in 2004 under the Godolphin banner. The \$950,000 KEENOV weanling purchase is also a full sister to multiple graded-stakes winner Budroyale and graded stakes-placed Tizbud. She has been scratched from the Juvenile Fillies field for Period 3 of the Breeders' Cup Future Bet. No replacement will be named.

PARK ACCORD EUTHANIZED

Trainer Jeremy Noseda's well-regarded juvenile **Park Accord (Ire)** (Desert Prince {Ire}--Tiavanita, by J.O. Tobin), among the favourites in ante-post lists for next year's G1 1000 Guineas, was euthanized yesterday after sustaining a fractured off hind cannon bone during exercise on the Newmarket gallops. The half-sister to G1 2000 Guineas winner Island Sands (Ire) stepped into the limelight with a lofty reputation for her debut at Kempton Sept. 5, winning her only start by a length. Noseda told his official website, "I'm extremely sad and disappointed for her owners, Seamus and Patricia Burns, and their family. It's a huge loss to my staff and myself, as she was a filly with enormous talent and potential." Coral spokesman David Stevens told *PA Sport*, "This filly had been one of the most talked-about horses of the season, and had been backed into 16-1 before she had even set foot on the racecourse, giving some indication of how well regarded she was."

FU PEG FILLY TOPS KEENELAND DAY 9

A filly from the first crop by 2000 Kentucky Derby hero Fusaichi Pegasus (Mr. Prospector) brought a final bid of \$260,000 to top the ninth session of the 2003 Keeneland September Yearling Sale in Lexington yesterday. The chestnut, out of Bet Twice Princess (Bet Twice), a stakes winner of \$205,485, is from the family of champion Althea and graded-stakes winners Aquilegia, Twining and Aishah. Consigned by Taylor Made Sales Agency, Agent CC, she was purchased by Lake View Farm. First-crop sire Vicar (Wild Again), winner of the 1999 Florida Derby, accounted for the top-selling colt yesterday. The dark bay, out of the unraced mare Singing Bird (Wavering Monarch), was consigned by Forbush Farm and purchased for \$180,000 by trainer Bob Baffert, agent. While the percentage of RNAs was up on the day, from 14 percent a year ago to 21 percent yesterday, the overall percentage of RNAs remained unchanged from 2002. Figures for average and median continue to show gains, with the session average rising 23 percent and the session median increasing 20 percent. The overall average is up by an eye-catching 31 percent, while the median has risen 19 percent from a year ago. The 12-day sale continues through Saturday. **Keeneland September cont. p2**

CHILEAN HORSE OF THE YEAR DEAD

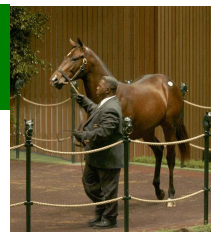
Ballistic (Chi) (Barkerville--Ballady, by In Reality), the champion grass horse and Horse of the Year in Chile in 2002, was euthanized Tuesday, the *Thoroughbred Times* reports. The seven-year-old gelding fell in his stall at Club Hipico de Santiago, suffering a severe spinal injury. "Trying to save him was useless," Dr. Carlos Rodriguez, the attending veterinarian, told *Thoroughbred Times*. "We would have only caused him more pain." A winner of 15 stakes, including five group races, at distances from six furlongs to a mile and a quarter, the bay once reeled off 10 in a row. His biggest victory came in the 2002 G1 Clasico Club Hipico de Santiago. Third defending his title in that event this year, he captured the Sept. 12 G2 Clasico Ilustre Municipalidad de Santiago in his final start. Ballistic will be buried in the Club Hipico veterinarian clinic park.

SUMMING PENSIONED Summing (Verbatim--Sumatra, by Groton), winner of the 1981 GI Belmont S., has been pensioned from stud duty, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. Residing at Getaway Thoroughbred Farms near Romoland in California since 1992, the 25-year-old stallion covered four mares in 2003 and stood for \$2,500. The classic winner's most accomplished offspring was two-year-old champion filly Epitome, who won the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies in 1987. As a broodmare, the filly produced UAE highweight sprinter Faltaat, stakes winner Danjur and multiple graded stakes winner Essence of Dubai. From 19 crops, Summing sired 17 stakes winners and five Grade/Group winners, including Sumptuous and Mexican champion Brazilian Beat. A modest winner at two, Summing secured a pair of victories in the GIII Hill Prince S. and the GIII Pennsylvania Derby before eking out a neck win in the final jewel of the Triple Crown while denying Kentucky Derby and Preakness hero Pleasant Colony. Adding the Pegasus H. to his resume later that season, the bay was retired to Jonabell Farm, where he stood through 1991, with seven wins from 23 starts and earnings of \$615,096.

Mineshaft Sharp for Gold Cup:

Mineshaft (A.P. Indy) prepped for the Sept. 27 GI Jockey Club Gold Cup Monday, going five furlongs in :59 3/5. "It was a good work," trainer Neil Howard said. "We were looking to go in 1:01 and change and he went a little quicker, but he did it nice and within himself. He obviously likes this track." The colt will have his final breeze at the beginning of next week.

A Listed winner at Newmarket as a three-year-old, Millennium Dragon made one start in Dubai over the winter, finishing a distant eighth to Ipi Tombe (Zim) in the Al Fahidi Fort S. Feb. 6. The bay ran third in an off-the-turf contest at Belmont June 7 in his U.S. bow and followed that up with a front-running victory in a one-mile allowance July 4 on the grass. Shipped up to Woodbine, he caught a yielding course and could do no better than sixth in the GIII Play the King H. Aug. 16, but turned things around with this impressive effort. He broke from the rail and contested the pace from the inside, then found himself seriously challenged by favored Joe's Son Joey at the top of the stretch. But Millennium Dragon found another gear and opened up daylight on his rival in deep stretch, missing the course record by 2/5 of a second.

Hidden Truth Injured:

Hidden Truth (Danzig), second in the July 13 GIII Lexington S., suffered a fractured right front cannon bone after running third in an allowance test at Belmont Park Sept. 10. The three-year-old underwent surgery to have four screws inserted in the leg the following day. "[The fracture] wasn't bad, the only problem was that it kind of branched out a little at the top, that's why Dr. [Stephen] Selway had to put in a fourth screw," said trainer Neil Howard. The colt has three wins, two seconds and a third from nine career starts for earnings of \$123,562. It is hoped that he will be back to the races in the spring.

Peb Exhibit to be Featured at Racing Museum in 2004:

The National Museum of Racing and Hall of Fame will celebrate the 50-year reign of Pierre Bellocq, aka Peb, as America's preeminent Thoroughbred racing cartoonist with an exhibit of his work. "We are seeking original Peb artwork from throughout his career for an exhibit to open in July of 2004," curator Kate Cravens said. The cartoonist for the *Daily Racing Form*, Peb arrived in the U.S. in 1954 at the invitation of Laurel Race Course owner John Shapiro and created a logo, program cover and poster to promote the Laurel's Washington D.C. Arlington Sets 2004 Dates:

The 2004 meet at Arlington Park will run May 14 through Sept. 19, it was announced yesterday. "The 2004 schedule will mean eight fewer days of live racing," Arlington President Cliff Goodrich said. "However, with the additional host dark days in February, we will be able to offer significantly increased purses during a shortened Summer Festival. In the end, by giving up some live racing days, we will improve our racing product." The Summer Festival of Racing, which was 41 days this year, will run 36 days next season.

Jockey Club Releases Breeding Statistics for 2002:

As of Sept. 8, 35,588 live foals were produced in 2002, surpassing figures from 2001, according to the Jockey Club yesterday. "Although we're nearly 1000 live foals ahead of last year at this time with virtually identical numbers of mares bred, the pace of 2003 Live Foal/No Foal Report submissions by breeders is lagging about two percent behind early returns of recent years," explained Matt Iuliano, vice president of registration services for The Jockey Club. A total of 4,282 stallions covered 63,825 mares in North America last year, as compared to 4,445 stallions against 63,793 mares in 2001. Iuliano added that an additional 3,500 to 4,000 live foals reports are expected from a small percentage of breeders before final figures can be ascertained. Kentucky once again led all states in breeding activity with 20,017 mares producing 12,582 foals in 2002, which represents a 7.6-percent rise. The largest gains were made by New York, where live foal figures increased by 10.8 percent over last term while Washington experienced a 17.5-percent drop, the biggest loss during that period. Statistics issued by the Jockey Club also include progeny by stallions standing in North America but foaled abroad, including live foals by NA stallions reported from Great Britain (58), Ireland (49) and Korea (46).
