IN FOR THE KILL AT GOFFS

Set against a buoyant backdrop, the Goffs two-day Orby and one-day Challenge Sale enters unknown territory in preceding the Tattersalls Houghton Sale with its new date in the calendar. While the management of the sales company in Kill, County Kildare, usually have that major sale as a barometer, there is every reason for optimism this time based on the new records set at Keeneland, Doncaster and Milan. "The number of people looking at the yearlings has been very encouraging and the feedback from them has been very positive," commented Goffs' Managing Director Matt Mitchell.

"Given the sales results so far this year, we are looking forward to this week with

cautious optimism." The 400 lots split over the first two days will be the main focus. Among the world-class sires in the Orby catalogue are Nureyev, who is represented by his one and only yearling colt at auction this year, and exciting freshmen Dubai Millennium (GB) and Giant's Causeway. Thursday's 257-lot Challenge session spotlights a less elect group. Abbeville and Meadow Court Studs are the leading consignors at this year's sale with 23, while Yeomanstown Stud offer 18 and Camas Park Stud and Rathbarry Stud each have 17. Selling begins at noon today and at 11 a.m. tomorrow, with the Challenge beginning at 10 a.m. on Thursday. Catalogue and results can be viewed online at www.goffs.com. *Orby Preview cont. p3-4*

NO CANDY FOR BREEDERS' CUP

Trainer Ron McAnally confirmed yesterday that Sid and Jenny Craig's unbeaten **Candy Ride (Arg)** (Ride the Rails) will miss the GI Breeders' Cup Classic and point for a winter campaign instead. "He needs a little rest," McAnally explained. "I've had two meetings with the Craigs and their indication to me is, 'You're the horse trainer, do you want to run the horse, or not?'" In all fairness, I don't feel that the horse should run. He hasn't had a rest since he's been in training as a two-year-old." A newly turned four-year-old on Southern Hemisphere time, Candy Ride has not worked since before his track-record setting victory in the GI Pacific Classic Aug. 24. It would have been necessary to supplement him for \$800,000 in order to run in the Breeders' Cup Classic. "There's no question that they [the Craigs] would put up the money if I asked them to," McAnally added. "It was solely my decision...we can have a fresh horse for next year."

ALL EYES ON THE GOLD CUP

The nation's leading handicap horse **Mineshaft** (A.P. Indy), seeking his third straight Grade I victory, tuned up for this Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup with a five-furlong breeze in 1:01 2/5 over Belmont's main track. "He's doing great," stated trainer Neil Howard. "He's ready." The winner of the July 5 GI Suburban and the Sept. 6 GI Woodward has won six of eight starts this term. The Will Farish colorbearer will face a small but select field in the \$1-million event: **Moon Ballad (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}), **Empire Maker** (Unbridled) and **Evening Attire** (Black Tie Affair {Ire}). Godolphin's Moon Ballad, winless since his impressive victory in the G1 Dubai World Cup, was released from quarantine Sunday afternoon and was bedded down at Belmont Park. "He looks well," said Tom Albertrani, Godolphin's New York trainer. "Depending on what the weather is, we might give him a light work Thursday just to stretch his legs." **Dynever** (Dynaformer) and **Saarland** (Unbridled) were both removed from Gold Cup consideration yesterday afternoon by their trainers; both colts will likely opt for the GII Meadowlands Cup. Oct. 3.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

As everyone involved in a sizeable racing or breeding operation will know all too well, every piece of good news is usually countered by some less welcome happening. For every stakes win, you can expect a setback to a promising young horse, and it's a pretty safe bet that the mare who develops a serious illness will be a treasured producer, not one of the failures heading for the sales.

Sadly, it has been one of those years for Coolmore. The excellent news has concerned the evergreen Sadler's Wells, who already has his 13th sires' championship in Britain and Ireland safely in the bag, and the much younger Fasliyev, who has made such an impressive start with his first runners. The bad news, though, has been very bad. Danehill's death in the spring meant that Coolmore lost its highest-priced stallion while he was still at the height of his powers, and then Grand Lodge, who ranked fourth in the Coolmore hierarchy earlier this year, recently suffered a serious knee injury.

Fortunately, Fasliyev isn't the only comparative youngster in the Coolmore team who has raised expectations of brighter days ahead. Danehill Dancer has continued to remodel his image, transforming himself from a cheap horse geared toward the lower end of the commercial market into a stallion that all leading breeders will have to take seriously.

I reported on the 10-year-old son of Danehill in this column back in June, after his Australian son Choisir had achieved a sensational group race double at Royal Ascot. In that column I wrote:

"his book in his third season was notable more for its quantity than its quality. Certainly there was the occasional daughter of such good broodmare sires as Persian Bold, Darshaan, Shareef Dancer, Bering and Alleged, but these were considerably outnumbered by daughters of stallions whose cumulative Average Earnings Indices stand at less than 1.00."

My interpretation of this third crop was that Danehill Dancer would do very well to sire a group winner or two from this motley collection of broodmares. Yet that is exactly what he has done over the last month, thanks to Barbajuan's win in the G3 Solario S. in August and Venturi's victory over the Fasliyev filly Misty Heights in the G3 C.L. Weld Park S. two days ago.

The scale of Danehill Dancer's achievement is underlined by the prices paid for these youngsters as weanlings. Venturi was bought for a mere 4,000gns at Tattersalls, while Barbajuan was barely more expensive, at the equivalent of 4,761gns at Goffs. Danehill Dancer's group double is also notable on the score that these seven-furlong two-year-old winners are both out of mares by stamina-packed sons of Sadler's Wells. This must be music to the ears of Coolmore and its clientele, offering a tried-and-tested route for their many mares with Sadler's Wells blood.

The broodmare sires involved are the G1 Coronation Cup winner Saddlers' Hall, sire of Barbajuan's dam Courtier, and the French and Irish Derby winner Old Vic, sire of Venturi's dam Zagreb Flyer. Although both Saddlers' Hall and Old Vic were highly talented racehorses, they stayed too well to appeal greatly to commercial breeders and Old Vic, who has been transferred to the jumping sector, falls into the previously mentioned category of stallions with a cumulative AEI of less than 1.00. Although Saddlers' Hall has a higher figure of 1.33, thanks principally to the considerable earnings of his St Leger winner Silver Patriarch, he now spends his time covering enormous numbers of jumping mares (over 300 in 2002). **Cont. p3**

It is hardly surprising that Venturi attracted so little attention at the foal sales, as Zagreb Flyer never raced and her dam Flying Clipper was last of 11 on her only appearance. Also, Venturi's first three dams were all by horses which were pretty much strangers to success as stallions.

Venturi's second dam Flying Clipper was by Tepukei, a big, good-looking horse who owed his place at the Irish National Stud as much to his bloodlines as to his best achievement, a G3 win over a mile and a quarter. Tepukei started his stallion career at a fee of only £150 in 1974.

In 1976, the year that Flying Clipper was conceived, Tepukei was allowed to run with his mares. This idea was meant to provide mares--especially those with difficult breeding records--with a more natural means of conception. However, I seem to remember being told that the system produced unexpected problems. Tepukei quickly established favorites among his "herd" and repeatedly covered them, while ignoring some of the others. Apparently the people given the task of entering the paddock to remove the favorites deserved danger money.

Sarah Van Fleet, the third dam of Venturi, also had a comparatively undistinguished sire in Cracksman, a winner at up to two miles who was around 20 lbs below the best. Sarah Van Fleet won twice on the flat and five times over hurdles, but proved much more effective as a broodmare, producing the stakes-winning sprinter Van Laser and the excellent miler To-Agori-Mou, who numbered the 1981 2000 Guineas among his victories.

To-Agori-Mou's exploits resulted in his half-sister Flying Clipper being given the chance to visit some quality stallions and she produced the stakes winners Flying Girl (second in the Italian Oaks) and Condrieu.

Despite the comparatively plebeian nature of recent generations of Venturi's female line, her sixth dam is that very influential broodmare Sister Sarah (second dam of Nearctic) and the line traces to the legendary Pretty Polly. No doubt Venturi would fetch a bit more than 4,000 guineas were she ever to come on the market again.

Sire Power...

This year's freshman sensation Fasliyev, responsible for the top lot at Tattersalls Ireland's September Sale last week, has the largest representation here at 22, divided equally into colts and fillies. He is closely followed by Namid (GB), who has 20 in this sale and whose first crop have been well received, particularly at Doncaster a fortnight ago. As a mark of the strength of support for 2003's freshman sires, they account for three of the top six represented stallions in this sale. Spectrum (Ire) with 19 and Grand Lodge with 17 are the only established sires to split the new bloods Giant's Causeway, who has 18, and King's Best with 16.

Parade of Pedigrees...

Champion sire Sadler's Wells is represented by a select assortment of 10 yearlings, halved from 2002, including some choice fillies such as Abbeville and Meadow Court Studs' [hip 72](#), out of Petroleuse (GB), the granddam of Peintre Celebre from an excellent family. The ill-fated Danehill has 15 in the sale, including Camas Park Stud's [hip 333](#), a colt out of a half-sister to Danehill's dam Razyana. Nureyev's sole offering is Pat O'Kelly's Kilcarn Stud's [hip 59](#), a colt from the family of Distant View whose second dam was the G1 Prix Morny winner Regal State, also the dam of Pleasantly Perfect and Hurrican State. Kilcarn Stud, who often provide the highlight here, will also give buyers in Europe their first opportunity to get their hands on the progeny of Dubai Millennium (GB). His sole entry is [hip 149](#), a colt out of Spirit of Tara (Ire), a full sister to Salsabil (GB) and a half sister to Marju (Ire). If his looks match his pedigree, he could be the favorite to top the sale.

On the Goffs Honor Roll...

Graduates of the sale include Godolphin stalwart Grandera (Ire), who was crowned last year's World Series champion by virtue of his successes in the G1 Singapore Airlines International Cup, G1 Prince of Wales's S. and G1 Irish Champion S. Also on the honor roll is the three-time G1 Irish St Leger winner Vinnie Roe (Ire). Fillies who have flown the flag in recent times are G1 Moyglare Stud S. winner Mail the Desert (Ire), G1 Irish Oaks winner Margarula (Ire), G1 Prix Vermeille winner Pearly Shells (GB) and G1 Tattersalls Gold Cup winner Rebelline (Ire). In the past 12 months, Mr Dinos (Ire) and Leadership (GB) have added their names to the Group 1 winners to have emerged from the Orby Sale.

Admire Groove was unbeaten in three starts before running third behind Still in Love (Jpn) (Sunday Silence) in the Japanese 1000 Guineas in April, then was away slowly in a seventh-place finish in the Japanese Oaks in May. In her first start since, the filly settled in mid-pack before driving clear late for a confident score. "When I found an opening turning for home, I thought I'd be able to catch the pacesetter," commented winning rider Yutaka Take. "Her run today was much improved from the spring." Winning trainer Mitsuru Hashida added, "She's a filly with a lot of potential. We were unhappy with her performances in spring, but I hope she will have a great autumn campaign." Admire Groove is expected to start next in the Oct. 19 G1 Shuka Sho, the final leg of the filly's Triple Crown. Favored Still in Love, winner of the Guineas and Oaks, finished fifth.

Roscoe Pito had shown nothing but disdain for his challengers of late, capturing in succession the July 20 Province H. going 8 1/2 furlongs at Hastings, the Aug. 4 Breeders' Cup Stallion H. over the same trip, and the Emerald Downs Breeders' Cup Derby at nine panels on Labor Day. The dark bay, off as the favorite to win his fourth straight, broke alertly and secured a rail position as a rival pressed him through fractions of :23 flat, :47 1/5, and 1:11 3/5. Shaking loose leaving the quarter pole, he opened up a clear advantage into the stretch and won under a moderate Pedro Alvarado drive. Steady Smiler and Rindanica both closed well from off the pace to get second and third, respectively. Roscoe Pito is from the family of leading sire Red Ransom.

Ubetshedid Euthanized:

Ubetshedid (King Pellinore), the dam of multi-millionaire Best Pal, was euthanized Sept. 12 due to declining health at age 23. The pensioned mare had been looking after an orphaned foal this year, but began to deteriorate when the foal joined a group of weanlings. Ubetshedid failed to hit the board in her lone career start, but produced Best Pal to the cover of *Habitony as her fourth foal and forever earned a home at Mr. and Mrs. John C. Mabee's Golden Eagle Farm. A foal of 1988, Best Pal won the GI Hollywood Futurity, the GI Norfolk S. and the GII Del Mar Futurity at two and went on to win the inaugural Pacific Classic as well as being the runner-up in the 1991 GI Kentucky Derby. Best Pal's four-year-old season was outstanding, as the California-bred won four of five starts, the GI Santa Anita H., GI Oaklawn H., GI Charles H. Strub S. and the GII San Fernando S. while earning over \$1.6 million. He later added a victory in the GI Hollywood Gold Cup before retiring with earnings of \$5,668,245. Though he remained her finest offspring, Ubetshedid also produced the graded stakes placed colts Prosperous Bid (Mr. Prospector) and American Day (Nureyev) as well as the multiple stakes placed filly Best Mate (Woodman). Godolphin will be represented by G1 Queen Anne S. winner **Dubai Destination** (Kingmambo), while the John Gosden-trained **Ikhtyar (Ire)** (Unfuwain) was also left in despite doubts surrounding his participation. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's promising sophomore needs rain to take his chance. The Niarchos Family's G1 Prix Jacques le Marois winner **Six Perfections (Fr)** (Celtic Swing {GB}) was the most notable withdrawal at yesterday's stage.
