SKY MESA RETIRED TO THREE CHIMNEYS

Owner John Oxley announced yesterday that **Sky Mesa** (Pulpit--Caress, by Storm Cat), who bruised a foot during the running of the GI Travers S. at Saratoga Aug. 23, has been retired from racing and will stand the 2004 season for \$30,000 at Three Chimneys Farm near Midway, Kentucky. "Sky Mesa was a brilliant racehorse

with lousy luck," said trainer John Ward Jr. "By the time we get over his foot bruise, we'll have missed the remaining top races of this year." Undeclared in three starts at two, including the GI Hopeful S. at Saratoga, the \$750,000 KESEP yearling purchase missed a date at Arlington in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile last fall because of an ankle injury and sat on the sidelines until earlier this summer. "I thought we had the two-year-old champion, but he missed the Breeders' Cup Juvenile when he wrenched an ankle and then the Triple Crown races with another

mishap," said Ward. Third in his return in the July 6 GI Dwyer S., the bay finished an eye-catching second behind Peace Rules in the GI Haskell Invitational H. Aug. 3. before finishing last of six most recently in the Travers. The Harbor View Farm-bred colt retires with three wins from six lifetime starts and earnings of \$633,076. "The response to Sky Mesa has already been terrific," commented Three Chimneys owner Robert Clay. With champions Hidden Lake and Beautiful Pleasure already booked to the sophomore, Sky Mesa's connections are anxiously awaiting the colt to begin his new career. "I think breeders will be very impressed when they see how good-looking he is," said Clay. "He really is an outstanding individual. With his pedigree, race record and looks, he is very good value at that price."

BALLAD SEEKS REDEMPTION IN GOLD CUP

European invader **Moon Ballad (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}) is set to take on America's top handicap horse **Mineshaft** (A.P. Indy) when the two meet in Saturday's GI Jockey Club Gold Cup at Belmont. Moon Ballad kicked off 2003 with a pair of wins, including the G1 Dubai World Cup at Nad al Sheba Mar. 29, but failed to hit the board in his three latest tries, all Group 1 events. In light of the colt's failed attempts over the grass since the World Cup, Godolphin opted to send their charge over to take on the Americans over a surface which the four-year-old has shown an affinity. "We slightly ran out of options and took the view that [the Gold Cup] was definitely the best route towards the Breeders' Cup Classic," explained Godolphin Racing Manager Simon Crisford. "We haven't exactly picked out the easiest spot in the world for him for a prep race, but this is one of the premier races in North America." Hall of Fame jockey Jerry Bailey will be seeking his fourth Gold Cup win aboard Moon Ballad.

WEATHER HOLDS THE KEY TO QEII LINE-UP

Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's promising sophomore **Ikhtyar (Ire)** (Unfuwain) may be forced to miss tomorrow's G1 Netjets Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot if the forecasted rain fails to materialize. Racing manager Angus Gold told *PA Sport* yesterday that rain "would be a great help" to the colt, who has been off the track since winning the Listed Gala S. at Sandown July 4 due to a dry summer. "I have discussed it with [trainer] John Gosden and we decided that if the rain came, and the ground was good, obviously we'd be very silly if we didn't have him in. We will have to see tomorrow whether we get some rain, whether we consider it safe and then make a decision on Saturday morning--so he has been declared and at the moment he runs." Conditioner Gerard Butler is also hoping for wet weather to the mile event for G2 Lennox S. winner **Nayyir (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}), who disappointed when eighth in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville Aug. 10. "I'm very happy with him and he's been training very nicely over the last few weeks," Butler said yesterday. "I don't think he travels very well now, so we drew a line through his Deauville run and gave him a few weeks off after." All the main contenders were confirmed yesterday, including **Falbrav (Ire)** (Fairy King), **Russian Rhythm** (Kingmambo), last year's winner **Where or When (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) and **Dubai Destination** (Kingmambo).

Connections of With Reason must be ruing over not having raced him until the January of his fifth year. His successful debut on Wolverhampton's all-weather was the first time he was able to step out of the shadow of his illustrious stable companions, who he had led in their home exercise. Since then he has gone from strength to strength, winning the Listed John of Gaunt S. at Haydock June 7, the G3 Hungerford S. at Newbury Aug. 16 and finishing runner-up in the G3 Park S. at Doncaster last time Sept. 11. STORMING HOME TO SHADWELL IN '04 Storming Home (GB) (Machiavellian--Try to Catch Me, by Shareef Dancer) will retire to England's Shadwell Stud for the 2004 breeding season. During a European campaign for trainer Barry Hills, the bay won the 2002 G1 Emirates Airline Champion S. and the 2001 G2 King Edward VII S. Transferred to trainer Neil Drysdale for the 2003 season, Storming Home captured his U.S. debut in the Jim Murray H. and added the G1 Charles Whittingham Memorial H. In his most recent start, the five-year-old finished first in the G1 Arlington Million, but was disqualified after swerving at the finish and placed fourth. He is expected to start next in Sunday's G1 Clement L. Hirsch Memorial Turf Championship at Santa Anita, with his end-of-season target the Oct. 25 G1 Breeders' Cup Turf. To date, Storming Home has hit the board in 14 of 22 starts with seven wins and earnings of \$1,386,932.

We have mentioned before that Cherokee Run is very much is "own man" rather than being a typical representative of the Blushing Groom line. It is a point that he particularly made by siring champion Chilukki and multiple graded stakes winner Kafwain out mares from the Damascus line, historically a poor cross for Blushing Groom, and it is a point which was reemphasized at the weekend when his daughter, Dream About, proved much the best in the GII Mazarine Breeders' Cup S. The juvenile filly is out of a mare by Deputy Minister, and in taking the Mazarine, she became only the second unrestricted stakes winner bred on a Blushing Groom/Deputy Minister cross.

Dream About is the first stakes-winning juvenile from Cherokee Run's 2001 crop, but he's proved to be a good sire of two-year-olds from the very start of his career. He has six two-year-old stakes winners from his previous four crops, including Chilukki and GII Astarita S. winner Silentea in his first; Yonaguska, who dead-heated for the GI Hopeful S. in his second; and Kafwain, winner of the GII Norfolk S. and GII Best Pal S. and runner-up in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, in his fourth crop.

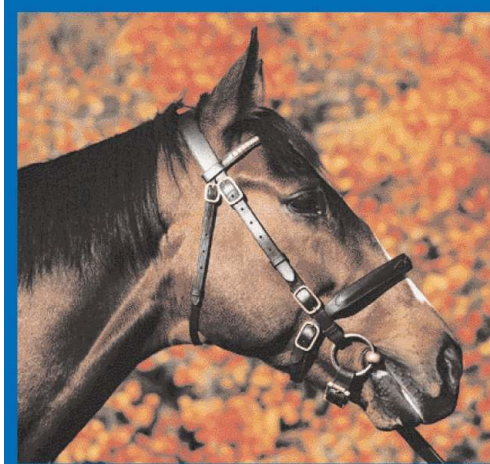
Dream About is Cherokee Run's sixth stakes winner this year, following five-year-old Scottish Bubbly; the three-year-olds During, conqueror of Ten Most Wanted in the GII Swaps S. and winner of the GII Jerome H.; Kafwain, who added the GII San Vicente S. to his juvenile wins; the GII Arkansas Derby winner Sir Cherokee; and Major Idea.

Dream About is the second foal of her dam, Social Director. This daughter of Deputy Minister preceded Dream About as a Woodbine stakes winner by taking the 1998 renewal of the Jammed Lovely S. Dream About's granddam, the Pleasant Colony mare Health Farm, became a stakes winner when winning the Tatling S. contested at Greenwood, the original site of the old Woodbine track. Dream About's third dam, Lean Cuisine, completes a hat trick of stakes winners. However, although Lean Cuisine won the Track Robbery S. and is dam of four stakes horses and ganddam of three stakes winners, she has two far more famous relatives.

A daughter of In Reality, Lean Cuisine is out of Summer Legend, who is the dam of Dream About's fellow Mazarine winner, champion Canadian two-year-old filly Legarto. Summer Legend's half sister Desert Trial had foals by In Reality on seven occasions, and four of these matings produced stakes winners, all of them 3/4-brothers or sisters to Lean Cuisine. The best of these were the first two product of the marriage, the filly Desert Vixen and the colt, Valid Appeal. Desert Vixen was an absolutely outstanding filly who captured six Grade I events at three and four and also finished a close second against males in the GI Washington D.C. International. Valid Appeal was not quite as talented as his sister, but did win the GII Dwyer H. and placed in four other stakes events, including the GI Futurity S. Subsequently, Valid Appeal became an outstanding sire in Florida, getting 86 stakes winners, and he is also now a leading broodmare sire, his daughters having produced at least 12 Grade I winners.

Although there have been only two stakes winners bred on the Blushing Groom/Deputy Minister cross, the reverse cross has fared better. There are already at least nine stakes winners by Deputy Minister and his sons out of Blushing Groom-line mares, including GISW Awesome Again and GSW Posse, Better Than Honour, Red Hannigan and Turnberry Isle. Blushing Groom also appears elsewhere in the pedigree of Deputy Minister-line GISW Take Charge Lady and Composure. As far as Cherokee Run and Deputy Minister are concerned, it's probably significant that Cherokee Run has Bimelech and his 5/8ths-sister Big Event 5x5 via the very closely related Better Self and Blue Eyed Momo. Bimelech is often seen in the pedigrees of good Deputy Ministers, and here he and Big Event are represented by horses which give particularly strong concentrations of the mare Queen Mary, the background to which Deputy Minister throws.

GOLD MOVER RETIRED Edward Evans' **Gold Mover** (Gold Fever--Intentional Move, by Tentam), who finished third last time out in the GI Ballerina H. at Saratoga Aug. 24, has been retired from racing, according to the *Blood-Horse* yesterday. The five-year-old mare recently arrived at Evans' Spring Hill Farm near Casanova, Virginia and appears likely to be bred to millionaire Mineshaft in 2004. Trainer Mark Hennig explained the decision. "There was nothing major, just something nagging her," Hennig told the *Blood-Horse*. "She's done enough and she retires sound." Retiring with 13 wins from 31 lifetime starts and earnings of \$1,523,010, the chestnut scored in six graded stakes over three seasons; the GII Schuylerville S., the GIII Kentucky Cup Breeders' Cup S., the GIII Debutante S., the GIII Forward Gal S. and consecutive editions of the GII Princess Rooney H. The homebred also finished first in last year's GI Humana Distaff H., but was placed second through disqualification.

SAY FLORIDA SANDY TO BUCKRIDGE Recently retired **Say Florida Sandy** (Personal Flag--Lolli Lucka, by Sweet Candy) has been purchased privately by Walter Downey from John Rotella and will stand his first season at Amy Boll's Buckridge Farm near Hudson, New York. The nine-year-old's new connections hope to syndicate the MGSW and his fee has tentatively been set for \$5,000.

The yearling, out of Ribot's Guest (Ire) (Be My Guest), was consigned by Victor Stud and was purchased by Skymarc Farm. Goffs sold 231 yearlings yesterday for an aggregate of €5,577,400. The average, €24,145, was down 7.5 percent from the 2002 figure of €26,090. The median rose 5.3 percent to €20,000. Goffs attracted buyers from around the world during its two-day Orby sale and yesterday's Challenge sale. Russian trainer Andre Netsvetaev bought two lots during the Orby sale. He bought lot 342, a son of Kayf Tara (GB), for €20,000 and lot 382, a son of Diktat (GB), for €12,000. Chilean Ossama Aoughazale, who owns Grade I winner Wild Spirit (Chi), bought a yearling filly by Indian Ridge (Ire) (lot 360) for €380,000 and a filly by King's Best (lot 387) for €100,000. "We are delighted that buyers from Russia and Chile bought here during the week and we hope that it is a trend that will be continued," commented Goffs's Matt O'Dwyer. The Hong Kong Jockey Club got into the action, buying a pair of colts by Danehill. The group purchased lot 322 for €240,000 and lot 43 for €150,000, as well as lot 109, a colt by Green Desert, for €110,000. The yearlings will be resold at the Hong Kong International Sale in December 2004.
