DALAKHANI CAN

Dalakhani (Ire) (Darshaan {GB}) outbattled **Mubtaker** (Silver Hawk) by 3/4 of a length to provide His Highness the Aga Khan with his fourth, and possibly his most memorable, renewal of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Lucien Barriere at Longchamp yesterday. In doing so, he joined Suave Dancer, Peintre Celebre and Montjeu (Ire) in completing the G1 Prix du Jockey-Club and Arc double in the same year. "He is a truly great racehorse," said the Aga Khan. "We were concerned about the soft ground and didn't really know what to expect, but he proved it was not a problem."

Take Charge Lady (Dehere) had to settle for second in her first three starts this season, but earned her second straight victory of the year--and her second straight in this event--when she fought off the late charge of **You** (You and I) to take yesterday's G1 Overbrook Spinster S. at Keeneland by a head. "I wonder if we didn't train her a little bit light for this race," trainer Ken McPeck speculated. "She's the kind of filly that takes a light touch and [jockey Edgar Prado] said she got a little tired the last part." But, he added, "I didn't want to take too much out of her before the Breeders' Cup Distaff." The four-year-old filly will look to exact her revenge on Azeri and Sightseek at Santa Anita Oct. 25. The Crowd's Choice...

Settled towards the rear by Christophe Soumillon throughout the early stages, 6-4 **Dalakhani (Ire)** was

always traveling strongly under cover as his rabbit **Diyapour (Fr)** (Alhaarth {Ire}) carved out the correct fractions. **Mubtaker** was committed by jockey Richard Hills in a bold manouevre at the top of the straight, getting first run on the favorite. But Dalakhani quickened on de-

mand inside the final quarter, making smooth progress to cut into Mubtaker's lead with every determined stride. The grey powered ahead with 250 yards remaining, then held that rival's game rally as they pulled five lengths clear of **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). "I had a beautiful trip," a tearful Soumillon said. "I had plenty in hand on the turn into the straight and knew he'd win. He is a real champion and I love him so much. He is a horse of a lifetime and I don't think I'll ever have the opportunity to ride such a great horse again."

A Star from the Start...

Dalakhani already enjoyed celebrity status before taking the French Derby at Chantilly June 1. Unbeaten as a juvenile, he capped his 2002 campaign with a victory in the G1 Criterium International at Saint-Cloud in November. He added facile scores at this track in the G2 Prix Greffulhe Apr. 20 and G1 Prix Lupin May 11. After his Chantilly success, he came up against Alamshar (Ire) in the G1 Irish Derby June 29, but lost his unbeaten record when finishing at the bottom end of the exacta at The Curragh. He was given the traditional mid-summer rest usually afforded prospective Arc champions, returning to beat **Doyen (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) by 1 1/2 lengths in the G2 Prix Niel over course and distance last time Sept. 14. De Royer-Dupre, celebrating his first renewal of this great race, said, "He is different from [sire] Darshaan as he has a more fluent action and more natural speed. His ability to quicken is tremendous and he came in for a beautiful ride from Christophe, who knows him so well." Connections of Dalakhani added that he is finished for the season, with his owner remarking, "It is too early to say whether he will remain in training for next year."

No Disgrace in Running Second...

Richard Hills was delighted with runner-up **Mubtaker**. "He's got a big heart," he said. "He was just a bit fresh with me and ran a little bit keen down the hill. In this ground, when you've got a horse traveling, you've got to keep going forward with him. When Dalakhani came past he had another go, but [the winner] was too strong." Conditioner Marcus Tregoning said of the six-year-old, "We thought we'd win, but [Dalakhani] is a very good horse and Mubtaker has run a terrific race. We had long discussions about running him, but Sheikh Hamdan was very good about it and left him up to me and it was the right decision. We have got the GI Canadian International [at Woodbine Oct. 19] and Hong Kong, but we've got to do the right thing."

High Chaparral Third Again...

Aidan O'Brien believed that **High Chaparral**, who had the ideal position on the inside before staying on at one pace in the straight to be third in the Arc for the second straight year, may prefer going the other way. "Mick [Kinane] said when he was coming down the hill, swinging in, he started laboring and hit a flat spot like he did last year," he commented. "He said its possible he's not acting the same right-handed as he does left-handed. Even after the Irish Derby last year, he didn't feel like he could [handle right-handed courses], so its possible that he's better going left. He shows a lot more speed and class going the other way, but stayed on because he's a brave horse. We were happy enough and he ran a good race. Hopefully he'll be okay tomorrow and we'll go for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf [at Santa Anita Oct. 25]." Frankie Dettori said of fourth-place finisher **Doyen**, who was doing his best work at the finish, "The ground was very testing. He's a big horse and he couldn't show his acceleration. He'll improve for the experience." Kieren Fallon said of the disappointing **Kris Kin** (Kris S.), who beat only two home, "The ground didn't suit him. We thought it would beforehand because he won on it at two, but they change as they get older. It's a long year and he's been on the go, so maybe it's a bad time of year for our horses." Jockey Pat Smullen said of fifth-placed **Vinnie Roe (Ire)** (Definite Article {GB}), "I'd say this was one of the best Arcs ever and he's run out of his skin. A gallant Zee Zee Top dug deep to upset the favorites. Held up in rear off the respectable early pace, she was forced wide early in the straight to avoid the tiring leaders. But she overcame that trouble to match strides with Yesterday. The two closed on last year's heroine Bright Sky, and it was Zee Zee Top who prevailed, edging her rivals in the final yards. The daughter of the famed Colorspin (GB), Zee Zee Top was only having her third outing when winning the Listed Middleton S. May 14 and stepped up off that run to finish second, before being demoted to third, in the G2 Pretty Polly S. at The Curragh June 28. She finished a creditable third behind stable companion Russian Rhythm in the G1 Nassau S. at Goodwood Aug. 2 before disappointing when sixth in the G1 Yorkshire Oaks last time Aug. 20. "Her dam Colorspin won the Irish Oaks for me on very soft ground, so I thought these conditions might help her," trainer Sir Michael Stoute said. "She has been consistent all season, but the ground has probably made the difference today. She's very brave. She'll go home now to Meon Valley Stud." *Ximb finished fifth, but was impeded by sixth-placed Acropolis. Acropolis was coupled in the betting with Newton (originally third) and Tycoon (originally fourth). Under French racing rules, coupled horses are disqualified as a group and are placed behind the horse that suffered interference, moving Ximb into third.

Likely hot favorite Diamond Green (Fr) (Green Desert) was a late defection because of the heavy going, but this race unveiled a star as Juddmonte Farms' American Post outclassed his opponents with an exhilarating burst of speed. Settled in third, he stalked Charming Prince before cruising alongside that rival with 350 yards remaining. Quickening dramatically when asked the question, he settled the result in a matter of strides. "The ground is horrible out there, but it actually felt firm on him," jockey Richard Hughes said. "He just ploughed through it. He played up going out onto the track, but he was just trying it on--he was too fresh and well. I gave him a kick in the belly and he just went clear." American Post was beaten a short head by Ximb (Fr) (Septieme Ciel) in a debutantes contest at Deauville July 31 before winning a course-and-distance conditions event last time Sept. 14. "He is a talented horse who has gone from strength to strength since his debut," commented trainer Criquette Head-Maarek, winning this for the third time, but for the first since 1985. "He can be coltish as he showed at the start, but once he is off he can really run. Richard got there too soon, so next year I will make sure he has a proper pace to help him." The Niarchos family's Denebola showed the same acceleration as her dam Coup de Genie to provide Pascal Bary with his fourth renewal of this prestigious contest. But, unlike her dam, who struggled in the mud when fifth behind Bary's Sierra Madre (Fr) in this race 10 years ago, Denebola was always traveling easily in the rain-softened ground under Christophe-Patrice Lemaire. Quickening impressively inside the final quarter, she cut down previously undefeated Green Noon with 125 yards remaining before asserting for the victory. Denebola broke her maiden when beating subsequent G3 Prix Eclipse scorer Bonaire (GB) in the G3 Prix de Cabourg at Deauville Aug. 2. She ran with credit on a testing surface when third behind Whipper in the G1 Prix Morny at Deauville last time Aug. 31, but relished the step up in trip here. "The way she works, her breeding and her liking for soft ground meant she had a lot of things going for her," Bary said. "She ran well in the Prix Morny last time, but the trip was a bit short. She will not run again this year and we will have to think about next year." Lemaire added, "She's a very good filly with a tremendous turn of foot and was very generous at the end." After conditioner Roger Charlton revealed Friday that Patavellian couldn't keep up with his Middle Park hero Three Valleys at home, the gelding paid that juvenile the ultimate compliment by taking this sprinting showpiece on his stakes debut. Drawn in the low numbers, Steve Drowne made the most of his favorable berth to stalk the early pace before committing his mount at halfway. Taking command with quarter of a mile remaining, he was comfortably clear as The Trader lunged late. Patavellian, who just lasted the seven furlongs of the Bunbury Cup H. at Newmarket July 10, has been kept fresh since winning the valuable and prestigious Stewards' Cup H. over six furlongs Aug. 2 at Goodwood. "A year ago he was a selling plater," Charlton said. "He hasn't stopped improving since he went sprinting. He doesn't look like, nor is bred to be a sprinter, but the blinkers have worked. Full credit to the owner John Deer, as I wanted to go for a Listed race, but he persuaded me to run here and it's a nice surprise. He would not have run if it had been fast ground, but we took a shot and it's paid off. He'll be put away for the year." Connections of the runner-up will aim the horse at the G1 Hong Kong Sprint Dec. 14 if he receives an invitation. Westerner provided owner Alec Wildenstein with a "pleasant surprise" at 10-1, becoming the second horse to carry the famous royal blue colors to victory in this contest after Victoire Bleue (GB) in 1991. Always traveling easily in mid-division off the even tempo set by 2001 hero Germinis, the bay made smooth progress to pass the tiring Persian Punch (Ire) (Persian Heights {GB}) and one-paced Mr Dinos (Ire) (Desert King {Ire}) in the straight. Adopting the tactics made successful in Saturday's features, he was taken to the centre of the track and stayed on past the game long-time leader with 1 1/2 furlongs remaining. Never in any danger from there, he was pushed out to assert under Dominique Boeuf. Westerner was campaigned over a mile last term before showing dramatic improvement when stepped up to a mile and a half to win the Listed Prix de la Porte de Madrid at this track May 8. With his stamina proven, he stretched out again and duly ran with credit to finish runner-up to Martaline (GB) in the G2 Prix Maurice de Nieuil July 19. "Last year, I realised too late that he was a stayer, but when he went over a mile and a half he improved," Lellouche explained. "He has run well against good stayers on fast ground, but I knew he needed this soft surface. He has had a hard race, so we'll put him away for the season now." 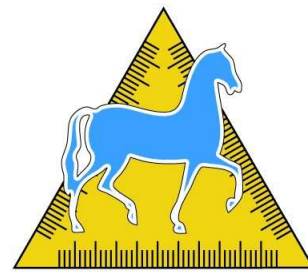

DUBAI DESTINATION RETIRED *Dubai Destination* (Kingmambo--Mysterial, by Alleged), the horse who beat Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) at two before returning from injury to win the G1 Queen Anne S., has been retired to stand at Dalham Hall Stud. Godolphin's talented performer, who was bred at Calumet Farm and cost \$1.5 million as a yearling at Keeneland, was originally titled Copernican, but was renamed by owner Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid al Maktoum. He received plaudits from trainer Saeed bin Suroor yesterday. "He was very impressive when he won the Queen Anne S. at Ascot this year, beating the best milers in Europe. He was a machine when he was right and had a lot of speed, being able to show an excellent turn of foot. Dubai Destination is a very good-looking horse and did well for us. We were unlucky that he did not race more than eight times. He should do well at stud." Dubai Destination broke his maiden at Newmarket's July Meeting in 2001 before beating the "Rock" by a comfortable length margin in the G2 Champagne S. at Doncaster in September. Kept off the track until the following May, he started only once at three, finishing runner-up to the ill-fated Coshocton in the Listed Predominate S. at Goodwood. His six-length score on his four-year-old debut in a Nottingham conditions event June 4 was followed by his finest hour at the Royal meeting 13 days later. In beating Tillerman (GB) by four lengths in the Queen Anne S., he established himself as one of Europe's top milers. Nevertheless, he failed to shine on his two final starts, finishing fifth in the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois Aug. 17 and eighth in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. Sept. 27, and the decision was made to retire the four-year-old to the Newmarket stud. "He was a great racehorse--one of the few to beat Rock Of Gibraltar--and very honest with a tremendous turn of foot," said regular jockey Frankie Dettori. Racing manager Simon Crisford added, "He is a magnificent looking colt who had all the right credentials to be a champion racehorse. His defeat of Rock Of Gibraltar in the Champagne S. was stunning to watch and it was great to see him bounce back to his very best at this year's Royal Meeting with another scintillating performance. He put up some remarkable performances during his career, but we felt now was the right time to stop with him." He retires with four wins and two seconds from his eight starts for earnings of \$383,819.

VINNIE ENTERS QUARANTINE *Vinnie Roe (Ire)* (Definite Article {GB}) yesterday entered quarantine ahead of a possible tilt at the G1 Toohey's New Melbourne Cup in Flemington Nov. 4. The horse was a solid fifth in yesterday's G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Lucien Barriere. "He is very game and we have no excuses," trainer Dermot Weld said. "We got a perfect run. I am as proud of him as ever. We will see in the next 10 days or so whether we will take him back to Melbourne."

PLETCHER POINTING THREE FOR CUP Trainer Todd Pletcher will likely start three runners in the Breeders' Cup: **Ashado** (Saint Ballado) in the Juvenile Fillies, **Chapel Royal** (Montbrook) in the Juvenile and **Balto Star** (Glitterman) in the Turf. Ashado, winner of the G1 Spinaway, lost her unbeaten record when third in the G1 Frizette S. Saturday. "She kind of got bottled up from the 3/8-pole to the 3/16-pole," said Pletcher. "She picked it up a bit, but wasn't able to suddenly accelerate; that isn't her way of running. I've got to talk to the owners, but I'd be inclined to give her a shot in the Breeders' Cup." Chapel Royal, second to Birdstone in the G1 Champagne S., may be on a plane to L. A. as well. "I guess you can make a case that the track wasn't particularly kind towards speed," said Pletcher. "We think he might like the tracks out in California, so we'll probably take a shot with him if the trains well."

MEDAGLIA D'ORO PREPS FOR CLASSIC G1 Breeders' Cup Classic contender **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}) covered seven panels in 1:28.60 at Hollywood Park yesterday. Jockey Jose Valdivia Jr. was aboard for the move. "The horse is doing good," said Humberto Ascanio, assistant to trainer Bobby Frankel. "He'll have a couple more works before the Breeders' Cup." The handsome four-year-old has not raced since his runner-up finish in the G1 Pacific Classic Aug. 24.

New Orleans voters overwhelmingly approved a proposition Saturday that will allow Fair Grounds Race Course, located in New Orleans, Louisiana, to install slot machines. With 99 percent of the 442 precincts reporting in Orleans Parish, 58 percent of voters said 'yes' to the proposition that permits Fair Grounds to install up to 300 slot machines before June 30, 2004, an additional hundred machines after July 1, 2004, and up to 500 machines after July 1, 2005. If Harrah's New Orleans Casino reaches a threshold of net profits exceeding \$350 million at any time, the number of machines allowed increases to 700. A total of 15 percent of revenues generated from the slot machines will go towards purses, with another three percent being earmarked for breeders. "This is the first step in a bright future for the Fair Grounds," said Bryan Krantz, president and general manager of Fair Grounds. "We're just overwhelmed in the effort put forth by our employees and friends who worked so hard to see this proposition pass."
