**GODOLPHIN DUO HEADED TO STUD**

Two of Godolphin's top runners, G1 Dubai World Cup winner **Moon Ballad (Ire)** (Singspiel {Ire}--Velvet Moon {Ire}, by Shaadi) and 2002 World Series Racing Champion **Grandera (Ire)** (Grand Lodge--Bordighera, by Alysheba), have been retired and will stand the 2004 breeding season at Yushun Company's Hokkaido stud farm, it was announced yesterday. Four-year-old Moon Ballad had his finest moment when posting a five-length win in the G1 Dubai World Cup in March, but disappointed in four subsequent starts, most recently running fifth in the Sept. 27 G1 Jockey Club Gold Cup. In addition to his Group 1 score, the chestnut took the G2 Dante S. and G3 Select S. and was third in the G1 Epsom Derby at three, and captured Round 2 of the G3 Maktoum Challenge this season. He goes to the breeding shed with five wins from his 14 career starts and earnings of nearly \$4.5 million. "He handled both surfaces, dirt and turf, well, winning the Dubai World Cup decisively on dirt and breaking the course record on turf at Goodwood," trainer Saeed bin Suroor said. "We will miss him, but he has done very well for Godolphin and his pedigree is excellent, which augurs well for his stud career." Five-year-old Grandera captured six of his 22 career starts, including the G1 Singapore Airlines Cup, G1 Prince of Wales's S., G1 Irish Champion S. and Round 3 of the G2 Maktoum Challenge. His earnings totaled more than \$2.5 million. Jockey Frankie Dettori commented, "Grandera was a bundle of fun last year and won some great races." Added bin Suroor, "He is a very brave and tough horse, always trying to give his best. I am looking forward to training his sons."

**(BED) ROCK SOLID**

Displaying a brilliant turn of foot in the final eighth, Edmund Gann's **Betty's Wish** (Gold Case) sprinted away from the pack to capture the feature on Belmont's Columbus Day card, the Gill Pebbles H. The chestnut, purchased privately by Gann after a maiden victory in March, has progressed nicely under the tutelage of Bobby Frankel. She scored convincing open-length victories against allowance foes at Saratoga in early August and Belmont Sept. 5, then ran off with the restricted Starine S. at Belmont in her turf and stakes debut. A bit anxious around the first turn after breaking alertly, Betty's Wish settled into a tracking third as she raced in the clear up the backstretch. Putting a head in front nearing the quarter pole, it looked as if she'd have to work hard to account for the closing **Mystery Itself** (Pulpit), but a tap from jockey John Velazquez's whip prompted her to settle the contest in a matter of strides. "Bobby has brought her along real well," said Gann. "He hasn't tried to move her up too fast and the horse has developed, getting better each time. She'll go back to California with this rest of us."

Mobil, second behind stablemate Wando over the main track in the Queen's Plate, rebounded to win the GIII Toronto Cup H. over the turf July 12, but was fifth over the Mountaineer dirt in the Aug. 9 GIII West Virginia Derby. Returning to the Woodbine lawn and facing older horses, the bay colt won the Halton S. at this distance Sept. 1 before tiring to third after setting the pace in the 1 3/8-miles GII Sky Classic H. Sept. 28. Favored against four rivals, Mobil contested the pace before inching clear on the backstretch. He turned back the challenges of El Gran Maestro and Added Edge nearing the stretch and drew off despite jumping tracks left by the starting gate near the eighth pole. "He strutted his stuff today, but you could see he's a tired horse," commented winning rider Todd Kabel. "He just wasn't himself, but he was much the best. On paper, As De Pik (Arg) and Duvets (Arg) looked like they already had Saturday's G1 Gran Premio San Isidro in the bag. On form alone, the front-running Duvets, who won the G2 Premio Ecuador, appeared likely to get off to a fast start and soften up the competition for his late-running stablemate, Group 1 winner As De Pik. When the gates opened, however, that plan went down the drain as As De Pik jumped out to take an early lead, pursued closely by Duvets and Question (Arg) back in third. At the top of the stretch, As De Pik began to wilt under the pressure. Duvets gained command and appeared poised for success, but Question had other ideas. Showing his grit in deep stretch, the bay forged to the front late to score his first Group 1 victory.

Aldebaran is being made available to breeders for an initial fee of \$50,000 live foal, payable Sept. 1 of year bred. This initial fee is guaranteed only until the Oct. 25 Breeders' Cup Sprint at Santa Anita--slated to be the multiple Grade I stakes winner's

final start--after which the fee may be raised. Previously, the farm announced an early commitment program called the "Aldebaran Guarantee." This program afforded owners of highly qualified mares access to the stallion at the same stud fee in years five, six and seven if they wish to exercise this option. "Response to Aldebaran from breeders across the racing world has been strong, and we felt it appropriate to release the initial fee prior to his participation in the Breeders' Cup," said Darby Dan owner John W. Phillips. "Aldebaran is one of a small handful of outstanding stallion prospects being retired to stud this year and, at this price, we feel we are not only offering commercial breeders an exceptional value, but will ensure him an outstanding first book of mares. We are very optimistic about the coming season."

## BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

### Tenpins Out of Classic

Joseph Vitello's **Tenpins** (Smart Strike) will not contest the Oct. 25 GI Classic at Santa Anita, it was announced yesterday. The five-year-old Michigan-bred will instead be aimed towards the GIII Fayette S. at Keeneland, held the same afternoon as the Breeders' Cup, and the Nov. 28 GII Clark H. at Churchill Downs. Trainer Don Winfree indicated that he was disappointed in Vitello's decision, but was looking forward to a productive fall in Kentucky. "If I thought we were just going out there [to Santa Anita] to run, I wouldn't have wanted to go, either," said Winfree. "For the last 20 years, I'd have been tickled to have an even-money shot in the Fayette. But I thought we had a legitimate chance [in the Classic]." Tenpins has a pair of Grade III wins to his credit this term: the Prairie Meadows Breeders' Cup H. in July and the Philip H. Iselin Breeders' Cup H. at Monmouth in August. The chestnut finished a solid second to Perfect Drift in his most recent, the GII Hawthorne Gold Cup Sept. 28.

### Krone on Funny Cide?

The ever-effervescent Julie Krone has been named as a leading candidate to gain the mount on **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor), who was declared a probable starter for the Classic by trainer Barclay Tagg on Sunday. "It's not confirmed yet," said Krone's agent, Brian Beach. "We've talked about it and we're waiting for a call back." Funny Cide's regular rider, Jose Santos, is honoring a prior commitment to ride the horse he guided to an upset victory in last year's Classic, P.G. Johnson's **Volponi** (Cryptoclearance).

### Bluesthestandard Sprint Bound

Jeff Sengara's **Bluesthestandard** (American Standard) will be supplemented to the \$1 million GI Sprint, said Ted West, father of trainer Ted H. West. "Jeff must put up \$110,000 [\$90,000 in supplemental fees] to run him, and that's a lot of money to him," the elder West said. "But he's willing to do it to take a shot at the biggest sprint of the year. Jeff is in the lumber business in Vancouver, but not like Aaron Jones. Jeff is a small guy and he said the lumber business has been bad all year."

### Mandella Eyes Juvenile for Action This Day

Trainer Richard Mandella, who already has two possible starters for the GI Juvenile in **Minister Eric** (Old Trieste) and **Siphonizer** (Siphon {Brz}), announced that **Action This Day** (Kris S.) was also being considered for the mile-and-a-sixteenth event. "The way he just worked, if I can get him in, I'll give it a shot," the Hall of Fame trainer said after the bay work six panels in 1:12 flat over Santa Anita's main track yesterday morning. "Obviously, he went pretty good." Action This Day broke his maiden in his second career outing, a come-from-behind victory at the Juvenile distance at Santa Anita Sept. 28. In related news, Siphonizer worked four furlongs in :47 3/5 under Julie Krone.

### Asmussen Trio Works Towards Santa Anita

Trainer Steve Asmussen sent a trio of Breeders' Cup contenders to the track Monday morning at Churchill Downs. Juvenile hopeful **Cuvee** (Carson City), an 8 1/4-length winner of the GI Futurity Sept. 14, was credited with a five-furlong move in 1:01 3/5, the 13th fastest of 51 works at this distance. GISW **Lady Tak** (Mutakddim), preparing for the Distaff, worked the same distance in 1:01 flat, the seventh fastest at the distance. Asmussen explained that both horses actually worked seven furlongs, but were timed by Churchill clockers for only five. His third contender, Sprint challenger **Posse** (Silver Deputy), fired a five-furlong bullet in 1:00 flat. "We're extremely fortunate to be in this position," said Asmussen. "They're all happy and doing well. They've got plenty on their plate, so they'd better be doing well." Each horse worked in company with a stablemate and each had jockey Corey Lanerie in the irons.

### Bailey to Ride Six Perfections

Jockey Jerry Bailey has been named to ride French champion **Six Perfections (Fr)** (Celtic Swing {GB}) in the GI Breeders' Cup Mile, the *Thoroughbred Times* reports. First or second in all nine career starts, the three-year-old filly was second in both the G1 Sagitta 1000 Guineas and the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas and most recently took the G1 Prix Jacques le Marois at Deauville Aug. 17. Bailey has a record 13 Breeders' Cup victories to his name, but has yet to score in the Mile.

**Falbrav Ships Saturday**

**Falbrav (Ire)** (Fairy King), winner of the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Sept. 27, will ship from England to California Saturday, but it has not yet been decided which Breeders' Cup event the five-year-old will target, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. A seven-time Group 1 winner on the grass, he could go for the Turf, or make his dirt debut in the Classic. As Falbrav is not Breeders' Cup eligible, he will have to be supplemented no matter which race is chosen. The supplemental fee for the Turf would be \$60,000, while the extra charge for the Classic would be \$240,000.

**Toccet an Outsider for Turf**

Dan Borislów's multiple Grade I stakes winner **Toccet** (Awesome Again) has been pre-entered in the GI Turf as an alternative to running in the mile-and-a-sixteenth Seabiscuit S. over Santa Anita's main track on the Breeders' Cup undercard, reports *The Blood-Horse*. "I want to see how the Seabiscuit looks," said Borislów. "If there isn't a ton of speed in there and it looks like we can get an easy lead, we may go there. But if the Turf looks like it's going to be a small field, and those other horses are going to be looking at his [butt], hopefully for the whole race." Toccet worked four furlongs on Santa Anita's sod in :52 4/5, the sixth fastest of eight moves at the distance.

**Works...**Trainer Patrick Biancone's **Zavata** (Phone Trick) zipped five furlongs in :58 4/5 at Santa Anita. The three-year-old is slated to contest the Sprint...Juvenile hopeful **Consecrate** (Silver Charm), trained by Bob Baffert for owner James McIngvale, breezed five panels in :59 flat... **Special Ring** (Nureyev), trainer Julio Canani's Mile candidate, blew out three furlongs in :33 4/5 under jockey David Flores. "David had a good hold of him and he wasn't driving or anything," said Canani. "I told David to go in :35 and just sit on him."...Padua Stables and Joseph Iracane's **Cajun Beat** (Grand Slam) blazed four furlongs in :46 4/5 at Calder, the quickest of 46 works at the distance. The GIII Kentucky Cup Sprint winner is gearing up for a planned run in the Sprint. Cornelio Velasquez is slated to ride.

Confession time. When I was trying to decide on the subject matter for this column three weeks ago, my first inclination was to write about the up-and-coming turf horse **Stroll**, following his Grade II success in the Jamaica H. However, I was sufficiently unsure about how to assess his sire **Pulpit** that I decided to look for a more straightforward (easier!) topic.

My problem was that I felt inclined to criticise **Pulpit**, on the basis that his record no longer justified his 2003 fee of \$75,000. At the same time, I certainly didn't want breeders to dismiss him as a failure. No horse could be considered a failure when his first two crops have produced colts of the quality of **Sky Mesa** (GI **Hopeful S.** and GII **Breeders' Futurity**), **Essence of Dubai** (GII **Super Derby**, GIII **Norfolk S.** etc) and **Stroll**, who has now won four consecutive stakes races.

In **Pulpit's** defense, I wanted to remind breeders that those first two crops totalled 99 named foals--a comparatively modest number by today's standards. Quite a few of the other stallions which took up stud duties in 1998 had far more representatives in their first two crops, with **Langfuhr**, **Alphabet Soup**, **Siphon** and **Spinning World** being among those with at least 150 named foals. **Pulpit's** third crop, which has already produced five two-year-old winners, is also comparatively small, with only 49 named foals. **Caulfield cont. p6**

While Pulpit doesn't enjoy the benefits of large numbers of runners, he did enjoy a considerable advantage over his contemporaries in that Claiborne ensured that he received plenty of high-quality producers. So the picture is far from clear and I suppose my message three weeks ago would simply have been that more time was needed to reach an accurate assessment of this good-looking son of A.P. Indy.

Judging by the reception given to Pulpit's fourth-crop yearlings at the sales this year, it looks as though buyers still have faith in him, with individuals selling for \$900,000, \$400,000, \$300,000, \$250,000, \$240,000 and \$210,000. Stroll's brother didn't fare so well, being led out unsold at \$275,000. Even so, Claiborne has slashed Pulpit's fee to \$35,000--the same as it was when he sired his first two crops. This has to be a sensible move, especially as his son Sky Mesa is making his debut at Three Chimneys at a fee of \$30,000 and his paternal half-brother Mineshaft is joining his sire A.P. Indy at Lane's End at a fee of \$100,000.

Claiborne bred and own Stroll, who was scoring his fifth straight victory when he took the Gill Calder Derby. Needless to say, he is out of a well-qualified mare, Maid For Walking. This ex-English mare was bought for 210,000 guineas, in foal to Indian Ridge, as a four-year-old at Tattersalls' 1996 December Sale. Maid For Walking's price placed her 14th on the list of top-priced broodmares at the sale, so you can guess that this mare, who had cost only 25,000 guineas as a yearling, had shown plenty of ability.

The nearest that Maid For Walking came to winning a stakes race was her ¾-length second in the G3 Princess Margaret S. over six furlongs at Ascot at two, but she earned a great deal more than many stakes winners.

By coming out best of the fillies when second of 28 in the Tattersalls Houghton Sales Conditions S., she picked up a bonus of £125,000, which isn't included in her official earnings. She then contested the Tote Two-Year-Old Trophy, a race in which the weights are governed by the median yearling price achieved by the runners' sires the previous year. As Maid For Walking was a daughter of Prince Sabo, an inexpensive sprint stallion, she had to carry only 111 lbs in a race where

the top weight was 126 lbs. She made full use of the 13 lbs she received from the G2 winner Princely Hush to collect the first prize of nearly £90,000.

Prince Sabo, who gained both his group successes over five furlongs, is inbred 4x4 to the brilliant miler Tudor Minstrel. He wouldn't be many Europeans' idea of a first-rate broodmare sire, but his best daughters are doing well. Easy Options, a filly whose speed led to her being recruited to the Godolphin team, has two stakes winners among her first three foals and Maid For Walking now has two very good turf colts among her first four foals, the other being the multiple stakes winner Patrol (by Lear Fan). Part of Maid For Walking's attraction to an operation of the calibre of Claiborne must have been the outcross nature of her pedigree, which has several distant lines of Hyperion, including three through Tudor Minstrel. There is no Northern Dancer or Raise A Native in her pedigree, but this hasn't been a major factor in her success with Lear Fan and Pulpit.

Don't get the idea that Stroll comes from a blue-collar background--far from it. His second dam, the Sharpen Up mare Stinging Nettle, was a two-year-old stakes winner at Ascot and three of her daughters are doing well as broodmares. Her talented Indian Ridge filly Maid For The Hills is dam of a Giant's Causeway colt which sold for 350,000 guineas at the recent Houghton Sale, where a Machiavellian colt out of Stinging Nettle's grand-daughter Lady In Waiting sold for 280,000 guineas.

Lady In Waiting was sired by an unraced son of Sadler's Wells, but that didn't stop her winning at Group 2 level or from finishing second in a Group 1 event. Her dam, High Savannah, is also the dam of Savannah Bay, a Group 3-winning stayer. Stinging Nettle was herself a half-sister to Gairloch, a high-class English juvenile who later did well as a stallion in France, while Stroll's fourth dam, Joyce Grove, was a half-sister to Zabara, winner of the 1952 1000 Guineas, and to Rustam, one of the best English two-year-olds of 1955. With a background like this, it isn't so surprising that Stroll is doing so well on turf. He must have good prospects of stepping up to Grade I level next year, especially if his temperament allows him to stay further than nine furlongs.

With victories in the Birdonthewire S. and Calder Derby, Bailey's earnings on the year jumped to \$20,347,993.
