FOLLOWING IN HIS FATHER'S FOOTSTEPS

In 1982, Lord Howard de Walden's Diesis (GB) made Newmarket his own by completing the demanding Middle Park--Dewhurst double. Twenty-one years later, his son **Three Valleys** bids to prove the feat can still be done in today's G1 Darley Dewhurst S. The Juddmonte Farms colorbearer followed a smooth Nottingham conditions score on his debut May 16 with a dramatic eight-length demolition of his rivals in the G3 Coventry S. at Royal Ascot June 17. Excitement turned to anti-climax when he finished a

moderate third to One Cool Cat in their much-hyped match in the G1 Phoenix S. at The Curragh Aug. 10, but he returned sick from that effort. He timed his recovery to perfection to beat **Balmont** (Stravinsky) by 3/4 of a length in the G1 Middle Park S. Oct. 3, displaying the "frighteningly exceptional" speed, according to conditioner Roger Charlton. **Snow Ridge (Ire)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}) was described by conditioner Marcus Tregoning as the best two-year-old he has trained after his debut score in a Kempton conditions race Sept. 6, and he lived up to the hype by taking the G2 Royal Lodge S. over a mile at Ascot Sept. 27.

A CHAMPION'S FAREWELL

This afternoon's G1 Emirates Airlines Champion S. at Newmarket will provide a bittersweet moment as both **Nayef** (Gulch) and **Alamshar (Ire)** (Key of Luck) make their final racecourse appearances before honorable retirement. Sheikh Hamdan bin Rashid al Maktoum's distinguished homebred Nayef failed to deliver on his considerable promise early in his career, but announced his arrival in the major league with a victory in this contest two years ago. Since that day he has traveled to Dubai twice, winning the G1 Dubai Sheema Classic last March and finishing third in this year's G1 World Cup, and has held his own in the fiercest of Europe's championship events. The winner of the G1 Juddmonte International S. at York last term, he returned to beat **Rakti (GB)** (Polish Precedent) in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot June 18 and was runner-up to archrival Falbrav (Ire) in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 5. The five-year-old disappointed when seventh behind Alamshar in this year's renewal of the King George July 26, and found Falbrav too tough again when third in the International S. last time Aug. 19, but has enjoyed the break that has proved so effective at freshening him in the past.

The Sophomore Challengers...

His Highness the Aga Khan's Alamshar marked his arrival in the G1 Irish Derby June 29, becoming the only horse to lower the colors of subsequent Arc winner Dalakhani (Ire). His subsequent defeat of Sulamani (Ire) in the King George stamped him as one of the top sophomores in recent times, but he disappointed when fourth to High Chaparral (Ire) in the G1 Irish Champion S. Sept. 6. However, connections have come to the conclusion that he is better right-handed, as all of his impressive performances have come going that way. He bids to become the first winner of the King George to follow up here in the same season since Brigadier Gerard (GB) in 1972. Fellow three-year-old **Russian Rhythm** (Kingmambo) rattled up a sequence this term in the G1 1000 Guineas May 4, G1 Coronation S. June 20 and G1 Nassau S. Aug. 2. She proved she can handle the colts when chasing home only Falbrav in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot last time Sept. 27. **Champion S. field, p2**

This time last year, **Trade Fair** was the subject of intense scrutiny as he prepared for the Dewhurst S., where the colt became notably unbalanced entering the famous "dip" in this track approaching the final eighth, but still finished a respectable third behind Tout Seul (Ire). His conditioner blamed inexperience for that showing, and Trade Fair gave credence to that suggestion when returning from a minor setback to take the Listed King Charles II S. in impressive fashion over course and distance May 31 and looked a world-beater when beating **Just James** by four lengths in the G3 Criterion S. June 28. Sixth behind Reel Buddy in the G1 Sussex S., he looked better than ever when powering to an emphatic score in the Listed Dubai Duty Free Cup at Newbury Sept. 19, and he can cement his position as the best seven-furlong performer in Europe here. The chance that **Nayyir** will follow up his impressive success of 12 months ago has been compromised by the recent lack of rain. He holds **Arakan** and **Tante Rose** on the form of his sole success of 2003 in the G2 Lennox S. at Goodwood July 29, where he had the rain-softened conditions he relishes. Eighth in the G1 Prix Maurice de Gheest at Deauville Aug. 10, he needs a career-best performance to emulate Moorestyle (GB) and win back-to-back renewals. **Tillerman** could provide Juddmonte Farms with a one-two if he can reproduce his third-placing behind Falbrav (Ire) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Sept. 27.

Gracefully has to defy a penalty for her success in the G3 Prestige S. at Goodwood last time Aug. 24, but Name of Love (Ire), Moonlight Paradise, Bint Salsabil and Musicale all succeeded in making light of the burden in the last decade. Barry Hills, who won this with Negligent (GB), Yawl (GB) and Hula Angel, saddles **Bay Tree** and **Tarot Card** in this year's renewal. The former showed battling qualities to win the Listed Sweet Solera S. at the July Course here Aug. 9 before finishing ninth behind Denebola in the G1 Prix Marcel Boussac at Longchamp Oct. 5. Tarot Card followed an impressive Goodwood maiden score on her debut July 30 with a respectable fifth in the G1 Fillies' Mile at Ascot last time Sept. 27 and may appreciate this drop back to seven furlongs. John Dunlop has not won this since Bint Salsabil in 1995, but it is interesting that he considers **Snow Goose** worthy of her place in this lineup. Confined to conditions races and nurseries so far, she has rattled up a three-timer and proved too tough to crack when the highweight in a course-and-distance nursery last time Oct. 4. Richard Hannon saddled Distant Valley (GB) to win this two years ago and relies on **Surf the Net**, who has been off the track since a smooth debut score in a six-furlong maiden over the July Course June 27.

In a race marred by the dramatic unshipping of Willie Supple from Fayr Jag (Ire) (Fayruz {GB}), Ashdown Express swooped wide of the trouble to record his first group success. Held up towards the rear by Richard Mullen throughout the early stages, the winner was full of run inside the final quarter and was asked to quicken down the outside of the field. As Fayr Jag caught heels on the inner, causing disruption to those packed against the rail, Ashdown Express delivered instant acceleration to cut down Royal Millennium and Ted Durcan in the final 100 yards. Ashdown Express has been a model of consistency this term, but needed the confidence boost of a Yarmouth conditions score Aug. 6. After finishing third in the G3 Hungerford S. over seven furlongs at Newbury Aug. 16, he was fifth in the G3 Park S. over the same trip at Doncaster Sept. 11 before finishing fourth in the G2 Diadem S. over six furlongs at Ascot last time Sept. 27. "He has been settling a lot better this year, which has given him a chance to show his turn of foot," conditioner Chris Wall explained. "Richard rode a very good race."

Soaring Free Flies at Keeneland...

Sam-Son Farm's GI NetJets Breeders' Cup Mile contender **Soaring Free** (Smart Strike) breezed a smart five furlongs in :59 3/5 at Keeneland yesterday morning. Beneath exercise rider Hugh Chapman, the four-year-old got his opening three-eighths of a mile in :35 1/5 and the half in :47 2/5 before galloping out six panels in 1:13. Trained by Mark Frostad, the gelding has won five of his seven trips to the post this season and is three for five since being switched to the turf, including wins in the GII Nearctic H. and the GIII Play The King H. Second to **Touch of the Blues (Fr)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) in the GI Atto Mile two back, Soaring Free was most recently fourth, beaten 2 1/2 lengths behind fellow Mile candidate **Perfect Soul (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) in the GI Shadwell Turf Mile in Lexington Oct. 4. Despite having been ridden for most of this season by jockey Todd Kabel, Soaring Free will be partnered in the Mile by New York-based rider John Velazquez.

Euro Trainers Express Concerns...

A trio of important European trainers have told *Racing Post* that they have deep concerns with Santa Anita Park, the host track of this year's Breeders' Cup. "We'd really prefer for the race to have been at Belmont Park or Churchill Downs, where the climate is similar to here and the flight is not so long," Sir Michael Stoute, who sends out Filly & Mare Turf hopeful **Islington (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells), told the *Post*. John Gosden, who trained Royal Heroine (Ire) to victory in the inaugural Mile at nearby Hollywood Park in 1984, is also critical of this year's venue. "It's like running round the inside of a barrel," Gosden told *Racing Post*, describing the Santa Anita turf course. "If the Americans get a start on you, you don't get it back. The draw can wipe out a certain percentage of the field, particularly at Santa Anita, where the stalls are right on top of the bend. Anyone outside of seven or eight gives a big sigh and the stomach sinks. It's a severe disadvantage." Gosden conditions Mile favorite **Oasis Dream (GB)** (Green Desert). TATTERSALLS OCTOBER WRAP-UP Part 2 of the Tattersalls' October Yearling Sale, which concluded last night, continued the trend seen at the more upmarket Part 1 and Houghton Sales. With about 200 more lots than in its 2002 guise as the Autumn Yearling Sale, the catalogue generated a 117-percent rise in aggregate to 3,520,800gns. The average and median prices were also records, while the clearance rate remained at around 69 percent. Tattersalls Chairman Edmond Mahony said, "We have experienced three momentous yearling sales this month, and this week's newly branded 'October Yearling Sale Part 2' has been just as successful in its way as its more glamorous counterparts, the Houghton and October Part 1. We have seen records across the board and, without doubt, the crucial feature has been the new date for the fixture. We have always found this week to be a great week for a yearling sale and moving the sale from its traditional position at the end of the Autumn Horses in Training Sale has been a resounding success." He added, "In total, we catalogued more than 50 percent more yearlings this week than at the same sale last year, but just as with the Houghton and Part 1 of the October Yearling Sale, we have been delighted by the overall standard of the catalogue and, again, despite the numbers, the quality has not gone unnoticed by the buyers. As well as wide margin records for average, median and turnover, we have had nearly 50 yearlings sell for 20,000 guineas or more, compared with 13 at this sale last year, and a top price of 92,000 guineas, almost double the 47,000 guineas top price in 2002. Demand for quality individuals has been sustained from start to finish, which is the hallmark of a successful yearling sale, and a tribute to the changes made to the date and format of the sale." **Cont. p6**

The record for top price at the sale, 56,000gns, which had been set only 24 hours earlier, was broken no fewer than three times last night, with two lots making 60,000gns and pride of place going to a filly by Xaar (GB) out of Hamsah (Ire) (Green Desert). Consigned for Lady Herries' Angmering Park Stud from Kingwood Stud, she was purchased by trainer William Haggas for 92,000gns. Haggas, who outbid agent Gill Richardson for the filly, was buying for owner Tina Miller. The final session saw a total of 100 yearlings sell for an aggregate of 991,600gns. The average was 9,916gns and the median was 5,100gns.

INCHINOR DIES AFTER SURGERY

Woodland Stud stallion **Inchinor (GB)** (Ahonoora {GB}--Inchmurrin {Ire}, by Lomond) died last Sunday after complications from surgery, according to *Racing Post*. The 13-year-old stallion shattered his left front pastern Oct. 2 and underwent surgery to repair the injury at Rossdale and Partners veterinary clinic the following day. The chestnut appeared to be on the road to recovery after suffering complications from the anaesthesia, but suffered a relapse Oct. 12 and died. "He was a wonderful servant," Peter Stanley, manager of Stanley House Stud, told *Racing Post*. "He got such genuine horses. There are very few proven horses that people can afford to use. But you could start a young mare with him and give her an excellent chance. "I couldn't commend Rossdale's team enough. They did a first-class job. It was just one of those things." The first foal from Italian champion Inchmurrin, Inchinor won the G3 Greenham S., the G3 Criterion S. and the G3 Hungerford S., and also posted a second in the G1 Dewhurst S. and a third in the G1 Sussex S. At stud, Inchinor has been represented by 13 stakes winners to date, headed by Golden Silca (GB), a highweight in England, Ireland and Germany; and Summoner (GB), hero of the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. in 2001.
