FALBRAV APPEAL FAILS

The Irish Turf Club's Appeals and Referrals Committee has denied an appeal to reverse the order of finish for the Sept. 6 G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown. Trainer Luca Cumani lodged an appeal on behalf of owners Luciano Salice (Scuderia Rencati) and Teruya

Yoshida after local stewards decided not to amend the result on the day of the race when **Falbrav (Ire)** (Fairy King) finished a neck second to **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). The committee, made up of Frank Clarke, Frank Hardy and Michael Osborne, found that interference did take place but was not sufficient to alter the result of the race. "Obviously we are disappointed with the outcome," Cumani told *PA Sport*. "We thought the horse would have won, and it's slightly disappointing that they did not

agree. But we received a good hearing and we will put it behind us now." Cumani added that a decision on Falbrav's participation in the Breeders' Cup will be made today. Aidan O'Brien, trainer of High Chaparral, added: "I don't want to say much about it. I'm not happy or relieved. It's over now, end of story. We look forward to America with the horse next weekend."

Godolphin Take Two

Godolphin will be represented by a select team of two at Saturday's Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita, it was announced yesterday. Turf hopeful **Sulamani (Ire)** (Hernando {Fr}) and **Mezzo Soprano** (Darshaan {GB}), who heads for the Filly & Mare Turf, will have their final serious workouts at Belmont Park tomorrow. "Sulamani and Mezzo Soprano are both doing well," commented trainer Saeed bin Suroor. "They will travel to Santa Anita on Wednesday after working in the morning."

Azeri Out of Breeders' Cup

Azeri (Jade Hunter) will not be defending her title in the Oct. 25 G1 Breeders' Cup Distaff. It has not yet been decided if the reigning Horse of the Year will race again. In a statement released Sunday night, owner Michael Paulson said, "[Skipping the Distaff] was a hard decision to make, but I am confident it was the right decision and in the best interest of Azeri. I was concerned to see two very fast works over the last two weeks, and her response to such has not made me feel confident that she has recovered totally from whatever affected her unusual performance [third] in the [GII] Lady's Secret [Sept. 28]. I do not believe that she would be 100 percent ready to compete in the World Thoroughbred Championship races." Trainer Laura de Seroux, added, "She walked this morning and is fine, but in my opinion, she should be retired. I've been expressing my concern over what she's been trying to telegraph to me. Sooner or later, something is going to jump up and make it very clear." A winner of 14 of 16 career starts, including eight Grade I victories, Azeri has earned \$3,044,820. She will be shipped to Kentucky before it is decided whether or not to retire her.

Asmussen's Army Works

A trio of Steve Asmussen trainees put forth their final serious works Monday over a fast Churchill Downs track in preparation for Saturday's Breeders' Cup at Santa Anita. G1 Juvenile candidate **Cuvee** (Carson City) zipped five furlongs in :59 1/5 while working in company with a stablemate, the co-fastest at the distance. "He needs to stay pretty fast," said Asmussen. "We're looking at a large field, he's a forwardly placed horse, he is the target for them in the race and he needs to be ready for a good one." **Lady Tak** (Mutakddim), whose G1 Distaff chances received a boost with Azeri's defection, also worked five furlongs. The three-year-old got the distance in :59 3/5, the third-fastest time of the morning. Working with a pair of stablemates, she finished behind one of them on orders from Asmussen. Asmussen's third BC bullet, **Posse** (Silver Deputy), breezed an easy four furlongs in :49 3/5, which ranked 20th among 40 works at the distance. "We've got Pat on our side and, if we get the trip, he'll fly home," said Asmussen. (*Breeders' Cup Bulletin cont. p.2*)

It's Got a Great Beat

Padua Stable and John and Joseph Iracane's **Cajun Beat** (Grand Slam), gearing up for the GI Sprint, received a relaxed "maintenance work" at Churchill yesterday. The three-year-old breezed four panels in :49 2/5, the 16th fastest of 40 at the distance. "We just needed something to stretch his legs, and that's what we got," said trainer Steve Margolis. Cajun Beat is slated to ship to California Wednesday and will most likely gallop Thursday, according to Margolis. In related news, fellow Sprint contender **Great Notion** (Elusive Quality) worked five furlongs in :51 2/5 over a fast surface at Trackside Louisville training center. Despite the pedestrian time--only one of the 15 other works at the distance was slower--trainer Darrin Miller was pleased. "It was good," he said. "I thought 'less was more' with him."

An Eventful Morning for Peace Rules

Mile hopeful **Peace Rules** (Jules) "looked good" in his final prep for the race, working four furlongs in :47 1/5 at Hollywood Park yesterday morning, but got loose after the move when his exercise rider Marco Ramirez was unseated as he pulled up. Both horse and rider escaped the incident unscathed. "The stirrup snapped off," Ramirez explained. Trainer Bobby Frankel added, "It's a good lesson for these guys. You've got to take care of your tack. Nobody wants to do the work to clean the tack, but this is a good example of why you do it." As for the workout, Frankel said, "He did it real easy." Peace Rules hasn't been out since running second in the GI Travers S. Aug. 23.

Still In Love became only the second horse to sweep the Japanese Filly Triple Crown when she came from just off the pace to take Sunday's G1 Shuka Sho. Coming off a disappointing fifth-place finish in September's G2 Rose S. in the first start of her autumn campaign, Still In Love settled in mid-pack early. Taken to the outside for the drive, the filly powered to the front in upper stretch and held off favored Admire Groove late for a 3/4-length score. "She was very responsive today, so when I asked her turning for home, she answered impressively," said winning jockey Hideaki Miyuki. "I am very pleased to sweep the triple crown."

Meisho Bowler broke on top and was left alone on an uncontested lead and won easily. The brown colt broke his maiden in July and won the listed Phoenix Sho in August before earning his first graded stakes success in the G3 Kokura Nisai S. in September. "He wanted to go to the front from the start, but I was able to rate him and the 1600 meters was no problem," commented winning rider Yuichi Fukunaga. According to trainer Toshiaki Shirai, Meisho Bowler will make his next start in the G1 Asahi Hai Futurity S. on Dec. 14.

2001 Japanese Oaks winner Lady Pastel had been winless since taking the G3 Nakayama Himba S. in March. The mare settled in mid-pack behind the fast early pace of Smile Tomorrow and stormed down the lane to win going away. "I was expecting Smile Tomorrow to be far in front of us, but my horse delivered an impressive stretch run," explained winning jockey Masayoshi Ebinain. "I just trusted that she would be able to get it done." Lady Pastel is expected to start next in the Nov. 16 G1 Queen Elizabeth Commemorative Cup.

The in-form partnership of Criquette Head-Maarek and Olivier Peslier will prove the main danger and **Colony Band** is that team's representative. The Wertheimer-owned filly created a favorable impression when breaking her maiden at maisons-Laffitte Oct. 1, and has solid place claims at least.

As you'd expect, there were some very well-connected youngsters among the 12 candidates for Saturday's G1 Darley Dewhurst S., such as Antonius Pius, a \$1.5-million Danzig colt out of a Group 1 winner, and Haafhd, a colt sired by a champion two-year-old from a Classic-winning mare. Unfortunately for the pedigree purists, the eventual winner, Milk It Mick, wasn't one of them. This colt's plebeian background was no doubt one of the reasons why he was sent off at 33-1, even though he had won a Group 3 contest over the same course and distance only 16 days earlier.

In fact, Milk It Mick's immediate pedigree is far removed from the aristocratic bloodlines you hope to find in a winner of Britain's most prestigious two-year-old contest--a race won in the past 40 years by such notables as Nijinsky, Mill Reef, Grundy, The Minstrel, Storm Bird, Diesis, El Gran Senor, Generous, Dr Devious, Zafonic, Grand Lodge, Pennekamp and Rock of Gibraltar.

Milk It Mick was conceived in 2000, when his sire Millkom covered the grand total of four mares at an advertised fee of £3,500. It was a somewhat similar story with the Dewhurst hero's dam Lunar Music, who was conceived in 1993, when her sire Komaite attracted 26 mares at a fee of £1,500.

In view of his background, it was hardly surprising that Milk It Mick failed to attract much attention when his breeder, Mrs. Yvette Dixon, offered him at Doncaster Bloodstock's October Yearling Sale. The colt was bought in for 14,000 guineas, but his visit to the sales qualified him for auction races, in which the weights are based on sales prices, and he duly won three of them in May and June.

He has been kept busy ever since and the Dewhurst was his 12th race--a remarkable total for a European two-year-old of Milk It Mick's talents. As he finished no closer than second in any of his first six starts in stakes company, he will give the handicappers a few problems when they try to decide the year-end juvenile rankings. However, exaggerated waiting tactics have helped bring out the best in this admirably tough colt on his last two starts.

Milk It Mick has one unlikely distinction for a Group 1 winner: none of his four grandparents, Cyrano de Bergerac, Good Game, Komaite and Lucky Candy, ever managed to win a stakes race. What's more, Good Game's sire Mummy's Game won nothing more important than a Group 3 event before embarking on a moderate stallion career which ended in Italy. And Lucky Candy's sire, the unfashionably-bred Lucky Wednesday, cost less than 2,000 guineas as a yearling before developing into a leading 10-furlong performer in 1977.

So why is Milk It Mick as good as he is?

To me, the most obvious place to start looking is his sire, Millkom, who will be remembered in America for his very impressive victory over Kaldounevees in the 1995 Man o'War S.

This son of Cyrano de Bergerac started his racing career in the French Provinces as a two-year-old in 1993, when he won all five of his starts, including a couple of Listed races. The question he then had to answer was whether he could graduate to group company, because none of Cyrano de Bergerac's first 196 foals of racing age had managed to win or be placed in a group race up to that point.

Millkom answered this question with a highly emphatic "Yes" as a three-year-old. Firstly, he won the G1 Prix Jean Prat and then he used his considerable powers of acceleration to take the G1 Grand Prix de Paris. He was gaining his fourth group success of the year when he took the G3 Prix du Prince d'Orange, in the process extending his unbeaten record to 10. By this stage, I was beginning to think that Millkom was a throwback to Cyrano de Bergerac's extraordinary broodmare sire Brigadier Gerard, who remained unbeaten in 15 starts, but Millkom was beaten into ninth place next time out, when he stepped up to a mile and a half in the Arc.

Millkom was very much an enigma. Not only was he a lot better than he had a right to be, but he also stayed very much better than might have been expected. Cyrano de Bergerac never tackled more than six furlongs and Millkom's dam, Good Game, made nine of her 10 starts over five furlongs. Good Game's sire, Mummy's Game, never tackled more than 7.2 furlongs, while her broodmare sire, Deep Diver, was an exceptionally fast sprinter.

One thing we did know for sure was that Millkom was a very good colt at his best. However, his chances of becoming a successful stallion were compromised by several factors. After suffering a tendon injury in winning the Man o'War, he was unable to race at five and managed only one start at six. Consequently, he was pretty much a forgotten name by the time he retired to stud in England in 1998--especially as he had never raced in Britain. Add in his less-than-impressive parentage and he was bound to struggle, which he did. Perhaps he will enjoy greater support now that he has returned to France.

Ordinary breeds Extraordinary..

Milk It Mick's dam Lunar Music won three times over five furlongs, but she was only ordinary, as you can guess from her best annual Timeform rating of 67. Her sire, Komaite, didn't run until he was four, when he won a maiden race in Ireland, and he has never been represented by a group winner during a lengthy career. He is a very well-bred individual, though, by Nureyev out of that outstanding broodmare Brown Berry.

When Komaite was mated to Sugar Token, a half-sister to Milk It Mick's second dam Lucky Candy, the result was Lunar Mist, a filly who won six of her eight starts as a juvenile in 1995. Timeform summed up Lunar Mist as "tough and genuine; held up and has a good turn of foot," so history has repeated itself with Milk It Mick.

Toughness was also the hallmark of Gunner B, a half-brother to Milk It Mick's third dam, Be My Sweet. As a winner of the G1 Eclipse S., Gunner B ranked as the most distinguished member of this family until Milk It Mick came along. This very successful sire of hurdlers and steeplechasers died early this year at the age of 30, having covered over 20 mares at the age of 29.

Topping the colts early was [hip 112](#), the sole offspring of freshman sire Stormin Fever

Monmouth and Meadowlands Apply for 2004 Dates:

Monmouth Park and the Meadowlands have applied for a combined 141 Thoroughbred dates for next year. Under the proposed schedule, Monmouth would race 72 days, May 29 through Sept. 5, while the Meadowlands would hold 69 live dates from Sept. 6 through Dec. 11. The New Jersey Racing Commission will meet Nov. 5 to consider the proposal.

Banker's Gold to Reigle Heir Farms:

Sophomore sire **Banker's Gold** (Forty Niner--Banker's Lady, by Nijinsky II) has been acquired by Reigle Heir Farms and will stand the 2004 season at the Pennsylvania farm. The nine-year-old stallion has sired 31 winners and two stakes winners from his first two crops. He will stand for a fee of \$3,500, or \$3,000 for Pennsylvania-registered mares. He stood the 2003 season at Airdrie Farm in Kentucky.
