FALBRAV TO THE TURF

Trainer Luca Cumani yesterday ended the lengthy debate as to the Breeders' Cup target of **Falbrav (Ire)** (Fairy King) by announcing that connections have opted for the Turf. Despite being pre-entered in the Classic, the Teruya Yoshida and Luciano Salice-owned five-year-old will not tackle the dirt for the first time. "He will go in the Turf," Cumani told *PA Sport* yesterday. "The owners decided that it was the most sensible course of action as we would have been guessing a bit on the dirt." Jockey Darryll Holland, who has partnered Falbrav to success in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown July 5, G1 International S. at York Aug. 19 and G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. at Ascot Sept. 27, added that he was "thrilled" that it had been decided to aim for the Turf. "It will be rock hard, which he'll love," he said. "I rode at Santa Anita for three seasons as an apprentice so I know the track well and I'm not at all worried about the distance of a mile and half. It is a totally different experience to riding in a mile-and-a-half race in Europe. Basically, I'm on the best horse in the race and I'm not sure Sulamani or High Chaparral want hard ground. My chap will love it, and he's a jet-setter who knows how to look after himself."

Distaff hopefuls **Got Koko** (Signal Tap) and **Elloluv** (Gilded Time) worked yesterday at Santa Anita. The

four-year-old Got Koko went five furlongs in 1:03 under regular rider Alex Solis. "It was just a little tune-up, nice and easy," trainer Bruce Headley commented. VIA MILANO TAKES RESERVOIRS

Via Milano (Fr) (Singspiel {Ire}) was twice runner-up in Deauville stakes company, but broke through with a 2 1/2-length victory in the G3 Prix des Reservoirs yesterday. The filly was beaten just over a length by eventual G1 Prix Marcel Boussac winner Denebola in the G3 Prix de Cabourg over six furlongs Aug. 2 and, upped to seven furlongs for the G3 Prix du Calvados Aug. 23, she finished the 1 1/2-length runner-up to Green Swallow (Fr). Held up in mid-division by Dominique Boeuf off the fast early tempo, she quickened impressively to hit the front approaching the eighth pole. Despite drifting left under pressure in the closing stages, she was comfortably beyond the reach of the late-closing **Colony Band** (Dixieland Band). "I have been in racing for 36 years and this is my first group success," commented owner Antoine Capozzi. "I bought her privately at the sales here last year for €40,000, so that was obviously a good investment." An emotional trainer Julie Laurent-Joye Rossi added, "This is fabulous as it's only my second year as a trainer. She has been running against the best of her sex and gone close so she deserves this. She handled the trip and the bend very well as she is very intelligent. She will be put away until next year with the G1 Poule d'Essai des Pouliches [French 1000 Guineas at Longchamp] in mind." **Click for the Racing Post [chart](#).**

One of the oldest adage's in the book is that a stallion's progeny start to perform from the point when he either is exported or dies. So after Jules, who had been exported to stand permanently in Brazil in 2002, died in that country this spring, it looked like a double guarantee of success for his progeny. That's proved to be the case, and a look at the 2003 third-crop sire table shows Jules in third place (behind Langfuhr and Alphabet Soup) with 2003 earnings fast approaching \$4,000,000.

The Jules story is one which demonstrates the volatility of the stallion market. The deal to send him permanently from his Florida home to South America was done shortly before his son Peace Rules began to emerge as one of the better two-year-olds of 2002, and there is little doubt that had the runners from his second crop emerged in his first, Jules would have been traveling, not south to Brazil, but north to Kentucky.

In part, Jules was somewhat a victim of the high expectations held for him. A spectacular 14-length winner of a Belmont Park maiden on his two-year-old debut, he took the one-mile Gill Nashua S. on his third outing. After a failed attempt to make a classic runner out of him, Jules dropped back to six furlongs to win a Monmouth Park allowance event and then added the 8 1/2-furlong Long Branch S. He made just one more start before an injury ended his career after a third in the six-furlong Housebuster S. *Cont. p. 3*

Retired to Bridlewood Farm in Ocala, Florida, Jules took to stud not only the reputation of probably having unrealized potential as a racehorse, but also a very fancy pedigree. By Forty Niner, whose Florida-based son End Sweep had just made a sensational start to his stud career, Jules was out of the Devil's Bag mare Bonita Francita. This four-time winner was a 3/4-sister to Coup de Folie, dam of champion French two-year-old and outstanding sire, Machiavellian (by Mr. Prospector, the grandsire of Jules). Jules' granddam, Raise the Standard, was a half sister to none other than Northern Dancer, and was bred on very similar lines to the dam of another stallion sensation, Danehill.

With this embarrassment of riches in his background, nothing less than instant success would satisfy, and Jules' first-season record of eight winners of 11 races, including stakes winners at Ladbroke Downs and Rockingham Park, didn't exactly stamp him as End Sweep revisited. Halfway through his second season things did not look a lot better, and with his runners from his shuttle seasons making a bright start in Brazil, the decision to accept an offer from that country was an understandable one.

Of course, the stallion business is a very unpredictable one and a few months later, Jules looked a very different commodity. His first crop never did really excel, producing only three minor stakes winners. The results of his second season, however, tell another story, and he now has five stakes winners from his second U.S. crop. That crop is headed by Peace Rules, hero of the GI Haskell Invitational H., GI Blue Grass S. and GII Louisiana Derby; False Promises, who became a stakes winner for the first time with a win in Saturday's GIII Hawthorne Derby; and the four-time stakes winner The Name's Bond. We can also note that his third crop includes French Village, who won two of the three Florida Stallion Series events for fillies, and that in Brazil, he has six graded stakes winners in his first two crops.

Since Jules was a Mr. Prospector-line horse free of Northern Dancer, descending from a half sister to Northern Dancer, and having another strain of Northern Dancer's granddam Almahmoud in his pedigree through Halo, it seemed a good bet that he would follow his

close relative, Machiavellian, and do well with mares carrying Northern Dancer. This has proved to be the case. Of the 16 stakes winners Jules has sired in North and South America, Northern Dancer is found in the dams of 15. There appears to be a predilection for the Nijinsky II strain, as Nijinsky II appears in the dams of five of Jules' stakes winners.

False Promises doesn't have Nijinsky II in his pedigree, but he is out of a mare by Storm Bird, like Nijinsky II, a Windfields Farm product bred on the Northern Dancer/Bull Page cross. Sold for \$37,000 at the OBS April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale (just a month after Peace Rules had changed hands at the same venue for \$35,000), he is the third foal of his dam, Stormy Divorce, having been preceded by the winning Skip Trial filly Restraining Order. At \$150,000 the most expensive Storm Bird yearling of her crop, Stormy Divorce won just once. However, her pedigree gave her significant residual value, as she was already half sister to three stakes winners. The most notable of these was Rocky Marriage, a son of Riva Ridge who won two of three juvenile starts in England, but then returned to the U.S. to campaign through the age of seven. Rocky Marriage ended up with five stakes victories to his name, the most notable of which came in the GII Bold Ruler H. Rocky Marriage had a durable and talented brother in the shape of The Red Rolls, who started 50 times over six seasons, retiring as a multiple stakes winner of \$373,766. The pair also had a hard-working half sister in the Royal and Regal filly, Lemhi Love. She squeezed 56 starts into four seasons, and won five stakes events and placed in eight others. She's now dam of Grade I-placed Love At Noon, and grandam of the minor stakes winner Tahoe Affair.

False Promises's second dam, Exciting Divorcee, a daughter of the GI Preakness S. winner Candy Spots, won four small races, but she is a sister to a far better known runner and producer in Belle Marie. Born one year after Exciting Divorcee, Belle Marie won four stakes events, including the GII Santa Susanna S., and produced a champion in the shape of Lemhi Gold, a Vaguely Noble son whose triumphs included the GI Jockey Club Gold Cup, GI Marlboro Cup and GI San Juan Capistrano H.

SELF-FULFILLING PROPHECY

There isn't anybody who follows the game who doesn't know by now that, in the 19 Kentucky Derbies run since John Gaines dreamed up the Breeders' Cup, no winner of the previous year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile has won the following year's Kentucky Derby. Now the winners of four of the most important Breeders' Cup preps are passing the race: the Mahmoud Fustok pair of Silver Wagon (by freshman sire Wagon Limit, winner of the GI Hopeful, trained by Ralph Ziadie) and Eurosilver (Unbridled's Song, winner of the GII Lane's End Breeders' Futurity, trained by Nick Zito) will be among those on the sidelines. Zito's GI Champagne winner Birdstone (Bird Town's half brother by [Grindstone](#), owned and bred by Marylou Whitney) is also sitting the race out, as is Sheikh Mohammed's Ruler's Court, a blinkers-on 14-length winner of the GII Norfolk, at Santa Anita. He's by another first-year sire, Doug Arnold's Buck Pond Farm's Doneraile Court. Ruler's Court's defection is particularly surprising, considering he's trained in Southern California, but Sheikh Mohammed and his advisers must have read the statistics.

It doesn't take a rocket scientist to work out that, if the winners of most of the key preps don't run, the chances of this year's Juvenile winner breaking the hoodoo at the 20th attempt are diminished. There's been a fair degree of moaning about these absentees, but, you know, Messrs. Fustok and Zito and Sheikh Mohammed have all been at this game a long time now. All it does mean is that none of those four is likely to be champion two-year-old. That's up to them.

In the meantime, it leaves Ron Winchell's Cuvee, trained by the up-and-coming Steve Asmussen, the even-money favorite to win Saturday's seventh race at Santa Anita (the sixth Breeders' Cup race). If Cuvee, a winner of four of his five starts by a combined 30 lengths, gets the two turns, he's 1-to-10. His last two runs, Jerry Bailey up, in the GII Saratoga Special (slop

and GI Futurity, were wide-margin wins with Beyers of 103 and 101, respectively--good enough to win the Juvenile most years, when the winners of four of the big preps did run. But Cuvee is not bred to win two-turn races. [Carson City](#) is a great little sire (and what tremendous value, still at \$35,000), but he's pretty much a true Raise a Native: two-year-olds and sprinters. The dam went two for three at two and is a 3/4-sister to the speedball Olympio. Under the second dam are also Grade II two-year-old winner Call Now (Del Mar Debutante); Grade II-winning miler Wild Wonder; and GII San Vicente S. (seven furlong) winner Early Flyer, all bred by the late Verne Winchell, The Donut King. It doesn't actually shout 'two turns,' does it? You can also point out F/M Turf contender Bien Nicole out of the second dam, but, come on, she's by Bien Bien.

Yet history is not as much against Cuvee as his pedigree suggests. [Favorite Trick](#), by Phone Trick, was so much the best of his crop (except for [Grand Slam](#), who was badly cut into in the race) that he won the Juvenile by five lengths and became default Horse of the Year. He did win the GII Jim Dandy at nine furlongs at three, but his contemporaries had caught up and passed him. Johannesburg had never run further than six furlongs when he won at Belmont Park (a one-turn 1 1/16 mile) in 2001. He never won again, but he got 8 1/2 furlongs that day. The race this year may be tarnished by absentees, but Cuvee can do no more than beat what runs against him, and it just could happen that way on Saturday. His pedigree says he is beatable, but what can beat him?

Last Tycoon: The Second Coming

In 1986, French trainer Robert Collet engineered a massive upset when three-year-old sprinter Last Tycoon won the Breeders' Cup Mile at Santa Anita at 36-1. The lesson wasn't lost on the wily John Gosden, who's come back to Santa Anita with Oasis Dream, Europe's top sprinter this year. His current Timeform rating is 134, 10 pounds higher than Europe's best miler in the Mile, the French-trained filly Six Perfections (124).

The Americans are in trouble in the Mile, is the way it looks from this corner. Either Oasis Dream runs as fast, or nearly as fast, at Santa Anita's Mile as he sprints, in which case he wins. If he doesn't, Six Perfections, one of about six really top-class three-year-old fillies in Europe this year (Russian Rhythm, Yesterday, Dimitrova, Nebraska Tornado, and--remember this name--Musical Chimes), should win. But both could be compromised by today's draw. Gosden is quoted as saying between four and eight is ideal.

Yesterday, Dimitrova, and Musical Chimes, plus Vermeille winner (over Yesterday) Mezzo Soprano are all in town for the Filly & Mare Turf, for which four-year-olds Islington and Bright Sky are the highest-rated Europeans. The American contingent is pretty salty, too with the Juddmonte/Frankel pair of Tates Creek and Heat Haze, Megahertz and Voodoo Dancer. This looks a very good race. I still think Yesterday is the best filly in the race, but she's contrived to get beaten in her last four starts. There's a big word for this year's French 1000 Guineas winner

Musical Chimes (by In Excess, so she should just about handle California). Apparently she made a huge move to just miss to Tates Creek in the GI Yellow Ribbon.

High Chaparral, Sulamani, and Storming Home are all either are or were trained in Europe. It would be pretty surprising if one of these four doesn't win, regardless of Santa Anita's biases. They're the four best horses in the race, and they're all top-class.

European Freshman Sires

Europe's two top freshman sires, [Fasliyev](#) and Cape Cross, have both generated more progeny earnings than [Stravinsky](#) (who is also third in Europe), North America's top freshman sire. True, Fasliyev has had an amazing 70 runners, but they do include 30 winners and seven stakes winners. Cape Cross has 23 winners from 51 runners, four of them stakes winners and, like Fasliyev, another four stakes-placed. The jury is still out, obviously, as it always must be on freshman sires; so many turn out to be flashes-in-the-pan. But this does look a strong group, in Europe, anyway. Daggers Drawn and [Orpen](#) have 21 and 22 winners, respectively, and each has the earners of over £300,000 so far. Dr Fong's second stakes winner on Monday takes him into sixth, ahead of Sunline's sire Desert Sun, who has his first European crop, with Intikhab, French-based Verglas, and the 'reverse-hemisphere' [Danehill](#) horse, Danzero rounding out the top 10. Desert Sun and

Danzero, particularly, have benefitted from big sales-race winners. Gold Away, Imperial Ballet (originally a Venezuelan stallion), Daylami, [Second Empire](#), and repatriated Soviet Star fill the next five spots, and they're doing all right, too.

CHAMPION FLY SO FREE DIES Pensioned from stud duty last November, **Fly So Free** (Time for a Change) died yesterday morning at Three Chimneys Farm from congestive heart failure. "A year ago, Fly So Free developed a heart condition that could have been aggravated by continued breeding activity," said Three Chimneys President Dan Rosenberg. "[Owner] Elizabeth Valando didn't think twice and retired him immediately. His well-being has always been paramount to her, and Fly So Free was quite comfortable until the end. Elizabeth was able to come to Kentucky in time to see him last night and he died this morning about 6 a.m." The 15-year-old stallion was buried next to Chief's Crown and his sire at the Midway, Kentucky farm. Bred in Kentucky by Bruce Hundley and Wayne Garrison, the chestnut was purchased for \$80,000 at the 1989 Keeneland July Sale and raced in the colors of Thomas J. Valando. "Fly So Free was like a fairy tale for Tommy and me," said Valando's widow, Elizabeth. "He was the first horse that Tommy ever bought, and the horse brought so much enjoyment to our lives and introduced us to so many wonderful people. Truly, Fly So Free changed our lives, and for that I will always be grateful." Fly So Free capped his Eclipse Award-winning campaign of 1990 with triumphs in the GI Breeders' Juvenile and the GI Champagne S. At three, he added victories in the GI Florida Derby and the GII Fountain of Youth S. and was also second in the GI Blue Grass S. and third in the GI Travers S. He continued racing at four and five, taking his earnings to \$2,330,954 with a win in the GII Fall Highweight H. in 1993 before embarking on his stud career. From six crops to race, Fly So Free sired G1 Dubai World Cup hero Captain Steve, who earned over \$6.8 million, Canadian champion Free Vacation, and additional graded stakes winners Arabian Light and Take the Cake.
