CALIFORNIA DREAMIN'

Juddmonte Farms' NetJets Breeders' Cup Mile hopeful **Oasis Dream (GB)** (Green Desert) got his first feel for the Santa Anita grass course yesterday morning, working an excellent four furlongs around the dogs in :47 with jockey Richard Hughes in the irons. It was easily the fastest of three moves at the distance. "That was perfect and he turned exceptionally well," Hughes

commented afterwards. "I had a second or two up my sleeve." Trainer John Gosden was somewhat taken aback by the drill. "He went that quick? That does surprise me," he admitted. "Maybe the clockers caught him a little bit late, they

might have been snoozing! He did it very easily, without [Hughes] moving, and he did it well. You've got to be positive." The homebred colt has not finished out of the top three in four starts this season, including victories in the G1 July Cup and the G1 Nunthorpe S. He comes into the Mile off a runner-up finish in the G1 Haydock Park Sprint Cup Sept. 6.

DISTORTED HUMOR 2004 FEE ANNOUNCED

On the eve of Kentucky Derby winner Funny Cide's start in the Breeders' Cup Classic, WinStar Farm in Versailles, Kentucky, has set the 2004 stud fee for **Distorted Humor** (Forty Niner--Danzig's Beauty, by Danzig) at \$50,000. "Distorted Humor is off to a tremendous start [at stud]," said Doug Cauthen, president of WinStar Farm. "We feel that this fee offers value to breeders and [we] expect another excellent book of mares in 2004." Already the sire of 50 individual winners from his two crops to race, 10-year-old Distorted Humor has been represented by nine stakes winners. In addition to his dual Classic-winning son Funny Cide, the chestnut is also the sire of Grade I winner Awesome Lady and graded-stakes winners Humorous Lady and Go Rockin Robin. His progeny have combined earnings approaching \$6 million.

CRISFORD BULLISH OVER SULAMANI

Simon Crisford yesterday admitted that Godolphin will be "very disappointed" if **Sulamani (Ire)** (Hernando {Fr}) does not provide the Dubai-based operation with their third Breeders' Cup Turf tomorrow. After revealing that the signs were "very, very positive" ahead of the four-year-old's tilt at the mile-and-a-half contest, he added, "Sulamani has done well since his last race [a 2 3/4-length win in the GI Turf Classic Sept. 27]. In fact, he has done nothing but improve since he ran in the Arlington Million, and Sheikh Mohammed's decision was exactly the right one. Obviously this is the one race the whole year has been geared around and everything that we've done has been aimed at this race.

He's doing extremely well at the moment, so we'll be very disappointed if he doesn't win." Crisford paid due respect to the competition.

"You always have to be afraid of a horse like Falbrav because he is exceptionally tough and he's very well travelled, he's a great campaigner. We're delighted he's running, because it gives the race a lot of credibility, and especially when we beat him, it'll be a great feather in our caps. He's an exceptional horse, but he has had a very hard campaign in Europe and I think the Cumani team have done really well to keep him at the peak of his form throughout the year. We're very hopeful that we can beat him, but he is a magnificent colt. I don't think you can ever be over-confident going into a race like this. He added, "We are as confident as we were with Fantastic Light and Daylami simply because the horse is really thriving at the moment and at the peak of his powers. We know how good Sulamani is. The whole team is very excited about the way he's doing and I think leaving him in New York to complete his preparation was exactly the right thing to do because it's very hot down in California at the moment. He's arrived there but he doesn't have to do anything now until [Saturday] so everything is spot on."

BREEDERS' CUP BULLETIN

For Mandella, the Classic's All About Heart...

For trainer Richard Mandella, the disappointment from a year ago remains fresh. Diamond A Racing Corporation's **Pleasantly Perfect** (Pleasant Colony) registered a smashing victory in the GII Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. and in the process stamped himself one of the favorites for the Classic. But he bled slightly in that effort and Illinois racing regulations required that the horse remain on the bleeders' list for 30 days and not 15 as in most other racing jurisdictions. All that would be transformed into ancient history with a positive effort from the strapping five-year-old, who will be making just the 13th start of his career. It's been a long and winding road, according to the conditioner. "I thought he was a beautiful yearling when I bought him for \$725,000 at Keeneland [1999 September Sale]," Mandella explained. "We sent him to Calumet Farm to break him and they said he was fat and lazy and didn't get fit after a couple of months. He would gallop a mile once around and be tired." There were obvious questions which needed to be addressed, particularly once he arrived in Mandella's barn. "He galloped a few days and I could see what they were saying," he continued. "The vet checked his heart rate and it would go down after a gallop when it should have gone up. We sent him to the San Luis Rey Equine Clinic, where Dr. Joe Cannon diagnosed it as a heart inflammation. I've never had that happen before. Thank God we didn't make him work harder." Sidelined with a respiratory illness following his belated career debut in May 2001, the bay returned with renewed vigor to win four of his eight starts in 2002, capped by his Goodwood success. "He was a different horse. Now he was the real thing," Mandella commented. Third to fellow Classic aspirant **Congaree** (Arazi) in the GII San Antonio H. first off the layoff in February, **Pleasantly Perfect** was fourth in the GI Santa Anita H. the following month before making a successful comeback in the Oct. 4 Goodwood. He stretches back out to 10 furlongs Saturday, which should work to his favor. "With his breeding and looks, it's not hard to imagine him liking a mile and a quarter on dirt," Mandella said.

Blue-Collar Koko Goes For Glory...

She's not as well-bred in as some of her Distaff rivals, but don't tell that to **Got Koko** (Signal Tap), who could lock up a championship with a victory over **Sightseek** (Distant View) and company on Saturday. The Texas-bred four-year-old comes from humble upbringings. Eileen Hartis, who operates Runaway Farm in Scaly, Texas, purchased Got Koko's dam, Baby North (Northern Baby) for just \$11,000 carrying a foal by Signal Tap from the consignment of Fred Seitz' Brookdale Farm at the 1998 Keeneland November Sale. Hartis, a self-professed "backyard breeder," consigned the filly to the 2000 Keeneland September Sale, with Craig Bandoroff's Denali Stud as agent, where the filly brought a final bid of \$30,000 from trainer Bruce Headley. "I tried to

raise her right and give her the basics," Hartis commented. "Then she has to move to the next level." And she has done just that. After winning three of her first seven trips to the post, Got Koko began to turn the corner with a 17-1 upset in the GI La Brea S. last December. For good measure she added victories in the GII El Encino S. and the GII La Canada S., defeating Sightseek, to become just the third filly to sweep Santa Anita's La Canada series. Sidelined following a fourth-place finish in the GI Santa Margarita H. in March, the bay returned to be second to Azeri in the GII Clement L. Hirsch H. at Del Mar Aug. 10, but put an end to the Horse of the Year's 11-race winning streak in the GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H. Sept. 28. What would a Distaff win mean to her breeder? "This is a dream and a blessing," Hartis commented. "Monday morning I go back to cleaning stalls and spreading manure." She could go back the breeder of a champion.

UNBRIDLED'S SONG TOPS TAYLOR MADE

Once again, Unbridled's Song heads the Taylor Made Farm roster as the Kentucky nursery announced their 2004 stud fees. The grey son of Unbridled will stand for \$125,000 in the upcoming breeding season, up from \$100,000 in 2003. "We believe the 2004 fees that we set offer breeders significant value," said Ben Taylor, president of Taylor Made Stallions, Inc. "At these stud fee levels, we feel confident breeding our own and customers' mares." Forestry remains at \$50,000, while Artax and Exploit, who stood for \$15,000 and \$25,000 this year, have been reduced to \$10,000 and \$15,000, respectively. The fee for Our Emblem, sire of champion War Emblem, has been cut to \$15,000 from \$35,000.

RIDE THE RAILS TO GOLDEN STATE Ride the Rails (Cryptoclearance--Herbalesian, by *Herbager), the sire of GI Pacific Classic hero Candy Ride (Arg), will stand the 2004 breeding season at Pegasus Ranch near Petaluma, California, for a fee of \$7,500. The sire of eight stakes winners (four group) in Argentina, the dark bay is currently standing at Haras Abolengo near Buenos Aires. The 12-year-old stallion registered his most important victory on the racetrack in the Foolish Pleasure S. at two and was third to Dehere in the GII Fountain of Youth S. and runner-up to Holy Bull in the GI Florida Derby in 1994. He retired to stud with a record of 14-4-3-3 and earnings of \$255,096.

MAJOR BOOST TO FILLIES' PATTERN At a special meeting Oct. 21, the European Pattern Committee has announced that older fillies will be given more balanced opportunities in an effort to encourage their staying in training in Europe rather than heading to North America after their three-year-old seasons or being retired to the breeding shed. "There are gaps in the current European race program for fillies beyond the age of three and, whilst the Committee is not looking to create a separate set of races purely for fillies, their opportunities will be significantly enhanced," said Tristram Ricketts, the committee's chairman. Details of specific races will be announced as soon as they are finalized in the individual countries. The majority of changes will be concentrated in the 8-10 furlong category, in which five new Group 1 races and five new Group 2 races are expected to be announced. There will also be additional Group 1 and 2 opportunities over 12+ furlongs, and at least 10 new Group 3 races over a broad spectrum of distances. Upgraded existing races will provide the basis of these new opportunities, while new races will be created to fill any gaps in the program. "This is likely to be a two-year project, with the vast majority of upgrades occurring in 2004, but with some further additions in 2005," Ricketts added. "The new program may take a little time to bed down, but the European racing authorities hope to catch the immediate attention of a number of owners who traditionally send good fillies to America at the end of their three-year-old career."
