HE'S THE MAN

Trainer Richard Mandella made World Thoroughbred Championship history at Santa Anita yesterday with a remarkable four Breeders' Cup winners. It wasn't the first time Mandella took four races on Breeders' Cup Day; a decade ago, also at Santa Anita, he saddled Kotashaan (Fr) to victory in the Turf and Phone Chatter to win the Juvenile Fillies, and added two more successes on the undercard. He did all of his winning in the main events yesterday, and three of the four scored at double-digit odds. "I don't know how to describe it," Mandella said. "The

day I won four here last time, if I had known I was going to do it, I could have really enjoyed it, but I was in shock all day and by the time I came out of the shock, everybody had gone home. And I am still in shock here. I didn't believe this could happen again, but it happened bigger and better." His first starter, **Halfbridled** (Unbridled) was no surprise, capturing the Juvenile Fillies as the 2-1 chalk. But **Action This Day** (Kris S.) posted the 26-1 shocker in the Juvenile and **Johar** (Gone West) was 14-1 as he dead-heated with repeat winner **High Chaparral** (Ire) (Sadler's Wells) in the Turf. Then **Pleasantly Perfect** (Plesant Colony) came from near the back of the pack to put the final feather in Mandella's cap, also at 14-1. Did one of the wins top them all? "I don't know how to answer that," Mandella said. "They are all great horses."

A PERFECT ENDING

Pleasantly Perfect (Plesant Colony) capped an incredible day for trainer Richard Mandella with a rallying victory in the \$4 million GI Breeders' Cup Classic. The five-year-old becomes the fifth winner to use the GI Goodwood Breeders' Cup H. as a stepping stone to Classic glory. He won the Goodwood by an eye-catching 3 1/4 lengths last year, but bled in the race and was prevented from competing on Breeders' Cup Day because of Illinois bleeder regulations. "I never had frustration over the rule in Chicago," Mandella said. "Rules are rules, and I don't have any problem with them. But, again I'll say that rules should be uniform from state to state so that people don't get mixed up or do the wrong thing when they travel. Nowadays, travel is a big part of racing." But the Hall of Fame horseman was in his own backyard yesterday, and made the most of the homecourt advantage. **Classic cont. p2**

Goodwood as Gold

Pleasantly Perfect had started just three times since his 2002 Goodwood victory, running third behind **Congaree** (Arazi) in the Feb. 2 GII San Antonio H. and fourth to Milwaukee Brew in the Mar. 1 GI Santa Anita H. Sidelined by a series of minor problems, including a foot injury in the spring, he was sent off the 7-5 choice in this year's Goodwood and closed from the back of the pack for the score. An outsider in the Classic, he was eased off the pace as Congaree and the 5-2

choice **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}) dueled through a half in :46.35 and a mile in 1:34.32. He closed ground to be fifth at the quarter pole, moved into third at the top of the stretch and kept coming in the final furlong to catch Medaglia d'Oro and edge clear. "This win was particularly gratifying because we did get set back last year," Richard Mandella said. "And you all heard about the virus he had that affected his heart sac and enlarged his heart when he was a two-year-old. So we had to wait a year to train him. But once he got healthy enough to train, we thought we had a good horse. A Double for Solis

Jockey Alex Solis, who had a record of one-for-40 in Breeders' Cup competition going into yesterday's races, upped his percentage significantly with wins in the Classic and the Turf. He was also second in the Juvenile with Minister Eric. "Right now I still don't believe the day I've had," Solis said. "All my horses ran incredible. In the past I've had some tough luck, but I always believed that God was saving the punch line for me." As for his Classic champion, he said, "Down the stretch, I knew he was coming on strong. He gave me a big kick, like he always does."

Perfect Pedigree

Pleasantly Perfect became the second Breeders' Cup champion, following 1991 Juvenile Fillies victress Pleasant Stage, for the now deceased Pleasant Colony. At \$725,000, Pleasantly Perfect was the highest-priced yearling for his sire in 1999. That price reflected not only his physique—imposing—but also his pedigree. He is a son of the G1 Prix Morny heroine Regal State (Affirmed), whose half sister Seven Springs (Irish River {Fr}) also captured that event and was the co-highweight two-year-old filly in France that year. Seven Springs went on to produce Distant View (Mr. Prospector), England's top three-year-old miler of 1994 and now a successful sire.

A Less Than Perfect Trip

Both **Ten Most Wanted** (Deputy Commander), who got the worst of it, and **Perfect Drift** (Dynaformer) were impeded when Kentucky Derby winner **Funny Cide** (Distorted Humor) drifted out sharply going into the first turn. Ten Most Wanted was carried very wide around the bend and never got into the hunt, finishing eighth. "We were moving nicely, but Funny Cide came out on Perfect Drift, pushing him out, and we had to snag up on his heels," jockey Pat Day said. "I tried to over-correct him, but he is a big, long-striding horse and not real light on his feet. He can't do that and get back into it." Added Gary Stevens, who was aboard Perfect Drift, "Going into the first turn, Funny Cide came up inside of me and he was real rank. He just kept knocking me out. I was six wide and finally I just eased back. He's a hell of a horse to put up with what he did and still run on." The gelding moved into fourth after a mile, but faded late to be sixth. As for Funny Cide, he sat just off the pace for seven-eighths, but tired in the drive and beat only 2002 Classic winner **Volponi** (Cryptoclearance) home. "This horse doesn't like hot weather," trainer Barclay Tagg said. "We knew that, but we took our shot. It was a lot to ask for him to face older horses in this spot after the long layoff." Jockey Jose Santos, on Volponi, said, "He came back a little short in his [left] front foot, but I think he'll be OK."

SHARING THE SPOILS

It took 20 years and a total of 144 individual Breeders' Cup races, but yesterday's John Deere Turf produced the first dead-heat in the history of the event when defending Turf champion **High Chaparral (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells) and **Johar** (Gone West) found the wire

on even terms, with **Falbrav (Ire)** (Fairy King) another head back in third. Put away following his Arlington victory, High Chaparral was bothered by shoulder problems which delayed his return to the races. He came back to score a 3/4-length victory in the G2 Royal Whip S. at The Curragh Aug. 10, just the prepara-

tion he needed for the step back up into Group 1 competition and a clash with Falbrav, Islington (Ire) and Irish Derby hero Alamshar (Ire) in the G1 Irish Champion S. at Leopardstown Sept. 6. High Chaparral withstood a late charge from Falbrav and survived a stewards' inquiry into alleged interference in deep stretch for the win that afternoon and, just as in 2002, prepped for the Turf with a third in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe Oct. 5. A son of 1996 Turf fifth Windsharp, Johar won the GII Oak Tree Derby and the GI Hollywood Derby last season and added a head success in the GII San Marcos S. Jan 20. Sideline with a shoulder injury of his own, the bay did not return until a third-place effort in the Harry F. Brubaker Aug. 22. He most recently set a dawdling pace in the Sept. 28 GI Clement L. The Making of a Classic

In a race which will be long remembered, High Chaparral raced in a midpack fifth and was guided to the inside as the field approached the final turn. Johar was content to trail for the opening eight furlongs of the contest and swung into action five wide turning into the stretch. Falbrav swept to the front in upper stretch and dug in gamely when challenged inside the final furlong, but could not hold off Johar and High Chaparral, who reached the line in tandem. "This is incredible," jockey Alex Solis said of Johar. "He broke real relaxed and I just had to be patient. He's a game little horse and he beat some of the best horses in the world. announced himself as a force to be reckoned with when he glided by his rivals. It was eerily reminiscent of 1993, when another lightly raced son of Kris S., Brocco, captured the Juvenile in his third career start. Action This Day opened his career with a rallying second in a one-mile Del Mar maiden Sept. 5. Sent off as

the even-money chalk over track and trip Sept. 28, the bay colt was far back early prior to weaving his way through traffic en route to a narrow victory. Action This Day had the longest odds of the three Richard Mandella trainees in this race—**Minister Eric** (Old Trieste) and **Siphonizer** (Siphon {Brz})—but the patient Mandella felt the colt was up to the task. “Well, it was totally Richard’s call, not my call,” said winning owner B. Wayne Hughes, savoring his first Breeders’ Cup success.

And the Last Shall Be First

Action This Day broke in a leisurely fashion and settled several lengths last as a solid pace developed up front, and was still near the back of the pack on the far turn. Jockey David Flores was able to save ground through the turn, then asked his mount to split horses and the bay responded, angling out four wide and taking aim at Minister Eric. Action This Day hit the front with his ears up in midstretch and strode home looking to do more. “By the time we got to the eighth pole, it was all over,” said Flores. “This horse was just covering so much ground that it made me so, so happy. It was a great feeling.” Mandella, half way through his record day, came up with the winning exacta. “Like I said all week, ‘he’s the man,’” quipped the Hall of Famer. “He was the ugly duckling this spring and now he is the swan.” The 8-5 favorite **Cuvee** (Carson City) got caught four wide on the first turn and packed it in after a half mile.

A Fitting Memorial

Though he died in May of 2002, Kris S. has had an exceptional season, capped by his fifth Breeders’ Cup winner in Action This Day. That achievement moves him into a tie with Danzig and into second behind Sadler’s Wells (6). In 2003, the late son of Roberto now has four Grade/Group 1 winners, and has the notable distinction of siring the winners of both the Epsom Derby (Kris Kin) and the Breeders’ Cup Juvenile in the same year. “He had been keeping me going for so long,” said Kris S. Robillard, who inspired the stallion’s name. “I wanted to be here today because I had a feeling it was going to be a special day, like 10 years ago when he had two winners and a third. [He] deserves so many accolades that he didn’t get. I’m partial, though.” Action This Day has a weanling 3/4-sister by Dynaformer.

(Grand Slam) left Santa Anita grinning as the three-year-old gelding dropped a 22-1 bomb to handily take the GI Sprint. Stalking the pace from a close-up four-wide position, Cajun Beat watched **Zavata** (Phone Trick) and second choice **Shake You Down** (Montbrook) sizzle through

blistering fractions of :21 flat and :43 1/5. Finding his Rhythm

The fast-improving Cajun Beat began to blossom over the summer, running a game second in an open allowance test on Churchill Downs' sod in mid-June before completing the exacta as a 26-1 shot in the Gill Carry Back S. at Calder July 12. Reappearing two months later, he captured the Gill Kentucky Cup Sprint by three quarters of a length, earning a 113 Beyer in the process. "We took a big gamble coming here, but he had been training so good and his last race, he ran such a big Beyer number," said winning trainer Steve Margolis. "He showed his abilities today. He can lay where he was today and make the lead. He is versatile."

Claimer to Contender

Jeff Sengara's **Bluesthestandard** (American Standard) was haltered by his current connections for \$50,000 out of a Santa Anita claimer last December. Since then, the six-year-old has gone on to become a MGSW and came flying late to nab his second Grade I placing on the year.

The stretch running **Aldebaran** (Mr. Prospector) was asked to do something he'd never done before: run shorter than seven furlongs. As it turned out, the cut-back in distance proved too much for the bay, who was last of 13 early before picking off horses through the stretch to finish sixth, beaten just over five lengths. "I had to alter course slightly turning for home, but it was for the better, because I could save some ground," said jockey Jerry Bailey. "He was flying. A sixteenth past the wire, we were by all of them."

Ethan Man Vanned Off

Ethan Man (Glitterman), a 23-1 shot who never figured in a 10th-place finish, was vanned off the track. On-call veterinarian Dr. C. Wayne McIlwraith said the four-year-old had swelling in the suspensory ligament in his left front leg, but did not consider the injury serious.

Sting, sixth in the first edition back in 1999, came back to win it in 2000. Starine (Fr), 10th in 2001, was the winner in 2002. Add to that list the name of **Islington (Ire)** (Sadler's Wells). Third after a terrible trip in the 2002 F/M Turf, the bay filly outfinished **L'Ancrese (Ire)** (Darshaan {GB}) to win it by a neck. "Last year, she had bad luck at Arlington,"

trainer Sir Michael Stoute said. "She is a wonderful filly. There are not many better."

Shades of Things to Come...

A five-length winner of the G1 Nassau S. at three, Islington prepped for the 2002 F/M Turf with a solid fifth-place finish in the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe. She faced the best of the European runners again this year, running third against colts in the G1 Prince of Wales's S. at Royal Ascot in June and sixth when beaten less than three lengths by Falbrav in the G1 Eclipse S. at Sandown in July. She had no trouble beating fellow distaffers in her next outing, winning the Aug. 20 G1 Yorkshire Oaks by a length, and covered herself in glory when third in the G1 Irish Champion S. There she finished a neck and a head behind High Chaparral (Ire) and Falbrav; those two finished just a head apart in yesterday's GI Breeders' Cup Turf. The 5-2 choice taking on fillies once again after the trip to California, Islington settled in the middle of the pack as **Bien Nicole** (Bien Bien) opened as many as eight lengths on the front end. She angled to the outside as the field reeled in the pacesetter on the far turn and kicked it into gear as L'Ancrese took over at the head of affairs. The two Irish-breds battled to the wire, with Islington edging ahead at the wire. "I thought she was by far the best filly in the race," winning jockey Kieren Fallon said. "This is one of the best fillies I think I've ever ridden." Peter Reynolds, spokesman for the Estate of the Late Lord Weinstock, added, "This means one hell of a lot to the owners. Lord Weinstock passed away last year and the family are keeping the operation going. Sir Michael Stoute, the first British trainer to win a Breeders' Cup race in California, was picking up his third Breeders' Cup score overall. "She's been examined by the veterinary crew and no injuries have been found, but they have taken her back in the ambulance for safety's sake."

A Champion's Resume

Europe's champion two-year-old filly last year, Six Perfections was unlucky when runner-up in both the G1 1000 Guineas (to Russian Rhythm) and the G1 Irish 1000 Guineas (to Yesterday {Ire}). Her losing streak continued when second by a neck to Bright Sky (Ire) in the G2 Prix d'Astarte at Deauville Aug. 3, but the blaze-faced black filly regained her reputation two weeks later in defeating stablemate Domedriver (Ire), last year's Mile hero, in the G1 Prix du Haras de Fresnay-Le-Buffard-Jacques le Marois. Finishing behind her that day was the even-money favorite Dubai Destination, winner of the G1 Queen Anne S.; Nebraska Tornado, the G1 Prix de Diane heroine who went on to win the G1 Prix du Moulin; and Clodovil (Ire), victor of the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains.

Race to Glory

Six Perfections arrived with a lofty reputation, but there were concerns over her drawing post 13 because of the short run to the first turn. She acted up behind the gate and finally had to be loaded sans jockey Jerry Bailey, who climbed aboard once the filly was safely inside. Breaking alertly, Six Perfections was able to save a bit of ground near the back of the pack as 3-1 favorite **Peace Rules** (Jules) went up to set the pace. She was behind a wall of horses turning for home, but she came through a narrow hole to head **Touch of the Blues (Fr)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) in deep stretch before edging away late. "I told them she might be fractious going into the gate, but it wasn't an issue once the race started," said winning rider Jerry Bailey. "She has a great turn of foot and put in an exceptional performance."

A Family of Note

Six Perfections was produced by Yogya, a Riverman half sister to superstar miler--and broodmare--Miesque (Nureyev), who doubled up in the Mile in 1987 and 1988 to provide the Niarchos family with their first two wins in this contest. The famed light and dark blue colors were later carried to victory by Spinning World (Nureyev) in 1997 and Domedriver (Indian Ridge {Ire}) last year. Miesque went on to produce a pair of Classic winners over a mile: Kingmambo (Mr. Prospector) and East of the Moon (Private Account). Will Six Perfections attempt to duplicate Miesque's feat? "I think she will [stay in training]," said Bary. "If [so], we will try to be ready for August, come back for the Mile and have some success in Texas. How is the weather in Texas?"

Peace Hopes Fade

Peace Rules became the second favorite, following Sightseek, trained by Bobby Frankel to fail to hit the board on Breeders' Cup Day. "He had the rail and that hurt us," explained rider Edgar Prado. "They pressured us the whole way; he never got a breather." A graded stakes winner on turf, the chestnut hadn't been on the lawn since winning the Hill Rise S. Dec. 28, and hadn't raced since his second in the GI Travers S. Aug. 23.

The far outside post proved no obstacle. **Halfbridled** (Unbridled) raced four wide around both turns, but charged down the Santa Anita stretch to win the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies by a handy 2 1/2 lengths. In the process, jockey Julie Krone became the first woman rider to take a Breeders' Cup event. "This mare is just so great," Krone said. "I can't say enough about her. I did more pulling than pushing. She's just a phenomenal filly." Halfbridled has now won her five races by a combined 16 1/2 lengths.

A Making of a Champion...

Trainer Richard Mandella, who took the 1993 Juvenile Fillies with Phone Chatter, knew from the start that Halfbridled was something special. "It's like somebody left a gift on my doorstep," he said. "She's never been a problem. She's responded to everything we have ever asked her to do. It's really been a very easy journey...I can only thank [owner Alain Wertheimer] so much." Owned and bred by Wertheimer et Frere, Halfbridled made her debut at Del Mar and cruised from off the pace to a facile 4 1/2-length score. She came back to take the Aug. 30 GI Del Mar Debutante, then stretched out to a mile and a sixteenth and showed another dimension, taking over after the opening half and making it a perfect three-for-three. The amazon filly broke well from the far outside yesterday and was able to move over to the four path as they raced around the first turn and down the backstretch. She was breathing down the neck of **Victory U.S.A.** (Victory Gallop) after six furlongs in 1:10.84, grabbed a short lead as they straightened for home and pulled away to win handily. "She turned for home and was just holding the horses off," Krone said. "As I was riding her, she put an ear back and one up and whenever somebody came to her, she kept pulling this beautiful tremendous stride. She's just amazing."

Jockey Pat Valenzuela had six Breeders' Cup victories to his credit going into yesterday's 20th edition of the event, but hadn't visited the winner's circle on racing's championship day since guiding Fraise to a nose score over Sky Classic in the 1992 Turf. It took 11 years and a 40-1 shot, but Valenzuela was back on top of the game yesterday, pumping his fist and grinning ear-to-ear after a wire-to-wire triumph aboard **Adoration** (Honor Grades) in the GI Nextel Breeders' Cup Distaff. Anatomy of an Upset...

Adoration showed signs of promise at the start of her career, winning three of her first six starts as a three-year-old. The bay filly captured the GIII Seniorita S. on the grass at Hollywood and the GII Hollywood Breeders' Cup Oaks on the main track, but failed to hit the board in her next five starts and was shelved after finishing fourth behind **Got Koko** (Signal Tap) in the Jan. 19 GII El Encino S. The \$40,000 KEESEP yearling returned to take a restricted stakes by a hard-fought nose at Del Mar Sept. 4, but was overlooked at 25-1 in the Sept. 28 GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H. After pressing the early pace, she weakened late to finish fourth, then was moved up to third on the disqualification of **Elloluv** (Gilded Time). Making her third start off the layoff, the four-year-old had blinkers off for the Distaff and set comfortable fractions and was never challenged, winning handily. "This is her third race back and I guess the third time is the charm," Valenzuela said. "We weren't surprised. She had run a great race [in the Lady's Secret]. I only got beat three lengths that day and I had to check pretty hard. The trainer took the blinkers off and she relaxed." "I pulled her out on the backside, but I didn't have any horse," Bailey said. "I never had a confident feeling." **Take Charge Lady** (Dehere) was also a disappointment, pressing the pace before fading to sixth. "I was able to get good position behind [Adoration]," jockey Edgar Prado said. "I just didn't have the horse to go after her." But trainer Craig Dollase was thrilled with the performance of three-year-old **Elloluv**, who chased the winner down the lane to be a clear second. "It was a giant race," Dollase said. "She sat up close and finished. It was a big run...and we'll be back next year."

Juddmonte Farms' American Post made light work of Fantastic View to evoke memories of France's last winner of this contest. That came back in 1974, when Alec Head sent Green Dancer to Town Moor to take this prestigious race. Ending the 29-year drought, American Post stalked Magritte (Ire) before sprinting to settle the contest in a matter of strides passing the quarter-mile marker. For Alec Head's daughter, Criquette, the colt's success was an emotional highlight. "It is my first time at Doncaster and, as my father, who watched the race on television in Normandy, won the race in 1974, it means a lot to me to have won it also," she commented. American Post opened his account in a conditions race at Longchamp Sept. 14 before turning the G1 Grand Criterium into a procession back at that track last time Oct. 5. His four-length defeat of Charming Prince (Ire) there came over soft ground, but he proved he could handle these quicker conditions under a confident Christophe Soumillon, who was always in the right place in this tactical affair. Bookmakers Ladbrokes quote the stoutly-bred colt, who was described by her conditioner as "having the physique of a sprinter," at odds of 8-1 for the G12000 Guineas and 12-1 for the G1 Epsom Derby. Head-Maarek was not rushing to commit American Post to specific targets afterwards. "I don't know what we will do next year because Prince Khalid has a lot of good two-year-olds over here too, but he has never won the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains (French 2000 Guineas), so perhaps he might want to go for that," she explained. Eight-time Group 1 winner Lonhro was the shortest-priced favorite for the Cox Plate since 1967, but was denied a ninth victory at the top level as outsider Fields of Omagh outfinished fellow longshot Defier to post the upset. Coming off a second-place finish in the G1 Toorak H., Fields of Omagh settled just off the leaders through the early going. He closed to take the lead in the final quarter and was all out to hold off Defier to the wire. It was a gratifying triumph for the connections of the gelding, who has been plagued by injury. "He injured a suspensory," co-owner Bryan Martin said. "We brought him back, and then it was gut-wrenching when he did his suspensory again...in March." But the six-year-old had looked 100 percent coming into the Cox Plate and, as Martin explained, "If you race horses, you've got to keep believing, you've got to keep dreaming, and he's got a giant heart, this horse." Fields of Omagh is by Rubiton (Aus) (Century {Aus}), who posted four Group 1 wins, including the 1987 Cox Plate. Lonhro was 12 lengths out of it five furlongs from home and still had four to make up at the 700-meter mark. He closed resolutely, but had to settle for third. The five-year-old will now be sent to the paddock for a break. "He tried his best and he can't do any more than that," trainer John Hawkes said. "He had his chance, and the best horse won on the day."

When I got to the quarter pole, he didn't have a whole lot to do to get past [Tenpins] and I just tried to keep his mind on it. He was the best horse today."
