

**VOLPONI RETIRED**

Last year's Breeders' Cup Classic winner **Volponi** (Cryptoclearance--Prom Knight, by Sir Harry Lewis) has been retired from racing after a last-place finish in Saturday's Classic, according to *Daily Racing Form*. The five-

year-old has been sold to an undisclosed Kentucky farm and will begin stud duties next season. A 10-percent interest in the stallion has been retained by owners Amherst Stable and Spruce Pond. "It was really great, a lot of fun," trainer and part owner P.G. Johnson said of Volponi's racing career. "It lifted everybody up. The financial part was great, sure, but having him in the family, that was the really great part about it." In addition to his 43-1 upset of last year's Clas-

sic, Volponi won the 2000 GIII Pilgrim S., the 2001 GII Pegasus H. and the 2002 GIII Poker H. He was second in this year's GI Whitney H. and GI Suburban H. On the board in 24 of 31 races, Volponi won seven times and earned \$3,187,232.

**NEW TRAINER FOR PAULSON HORSES**

Michael Paulson has transferred eight horses from trainer Laura DeSeroux to the barns of East Coast conditioners Bill Mott and Michael Matz, according to *Daily Racing Form*. "Mike has decided his horses would do better on the East Coast, so they are leaving on Friday," De Seroux said. Paulson, who manages the living trust of his late father Allen, added, "I think most of dad's pedigrees are better suited to the East Coast. I think the tracks are a little softer and the worker's comp situation in California is a factor." DeSeroux trained **Azeri** (Jade Hunter) to 11 straight victories and a Horse of the Year title in 2002 for the trust, but Paulson criticized the trainer's choice of races for the mare this season after a loss in the GII Lady's Secret Breeders' Cup H. "If [Azeri] had run in one of those New York races and, by the grace of God, beaten Medaglia d'Oro or Mineshaft, she might be Horse of the Year," Paulson told the *Form* Monday. Azeri has been at Ashford Stud in Kentucky since a tendon injury was discovered last week. The eight horses include four currently in training and four recuperating from injury.

**TILLERMAN FAILS DRUG TEST**

**Tillerman (GB)** (In the Wings {GB}) will lose his second-place finish in the G1 Queen Anne S. at Royal Ascot June 17 after testing positive for the banned substance clenbuterol. Juddmonte Farms' seven-year-old finished four lengths adrift of Dubai Destination in the one-mile contest, but will be disqualified and Teddy Grimthorpe, Khalid Abdullah's racing manager, revealed to the *Racing Post* that there are no plans to dispute the decision. "We won't be contesting it, but we are extremely disappointed," he told the *Post*. "Everything was followed within the guidelines, and it just doesn't seem to have worked out." A statement from conditioner Amanda Perrett read that Tillerman's post-race sample "tested positive to Ventipulmin, which had been administered to Tillerman under veterinary advice up to eight days before the race, which is the recommended withdrawal period for Ventipulmin." With his disqualification, Tillerman's connections forfeit the £55,000 prizemoney. **Right Approach (GB)** (Machiavellian) will move up to second and **Where or When (Ire)** (Danehill Dancer {Ire}) will get third.

**GRAND SLAM HOME RUN**

Once again the Breeders' Cup proved a great showcase for the sport, with plenty of drama, excitement, interesting stories, and excellent racing. There is an undoubted California bias when the races are held there (so what's going to happen in Texas?). The score was: California 5, Europe 3, Rest of America 1, counting the dead-heat as two wins. Even so, Dick Mandella's record-breaking four wins was the story of the day, and a great result for a team that's always been well respected, if not so frequently in the limelight. Even though by the end of the day he was in the same zone Frankie Dettori was in the day he rode the card at Ascot--come on, one-two in the Juvenile, dead-heat in the Turf, and win the Classic--Mandella's most impressive winner was Halfbridled. She was wide every step of the way and still won in a canter, earning a Beyer figure of 99. Mandella's Juvenile winner--what was his name?--won a decidedly substandard colts' race in a 92. The European contingent had a big day, too, with Six Perfections, Islington, and dead-heater and now dual Turf winner High Chapparral reproducing their best form in spite of shipping to California. Tellingly, Sir Michael Stoute, Islington's trainer, was quoted as saying Europeans were now really pointing their horses for these races. It also helps that the development of the Asian circuit means many of the better European horses have the option of finishing the season in December in Hong Kong instead of in October.

There were, as always, mass implications for divisional championships and, more importantly, sire lists. Kris S. now has the winner of the Juvenile--Action This Day, of course I remember--and Epsom Derby winner Kris Kin this year, so his stature, even if posthumously, has really been boosted. He has now vaulted to the top of the Juvenile Sire List, dethroning [Storm Cat](#). [Tale of the Cat](#) is now third, Halfbridled's sire [Unbridled](#) moves into fourth (with Unbridled's Song--boy, is he knocking on the door--seventh), and [Grand Slam](#)--yep, there's his name, the first time--fifth.

Though he trails European freshman sires [Fasliyev](#) (also by [Nureyev](#)) and Cape Cross, [Stravinsky](#) is still North America's leading freshman sire after Breeders' Cup weekend. Victory U.S.A.'s game third behind Halfbridled moved her sire Victory Gallop into second, ahead of Doneraile Court, whose Ruler's Court won the GII Norfolk so impressively, but was among the missing for the Juvenile. Minister Eric's second behind Action This Day propelled Old Trieste into fourth, with two sons of Storm Cat, Stormin' Fever and Forestry, in fifth and sixth, respectively.

One of the most interesting developments to follow--ers of the stallion market, though, had to be Cajun Beat's impressive (Beyer 120) win in the Sprint, sending his sire Grand Slam past [Distorted Humor](#) as the leading North American second-crop sire of 2003. On form before the race, four horses stood out: Aldebaran and three horses who all ran at Calder on July 12, the day I think they call the Summit of Speed--they have six sprint stakes races on the card. Anyway, Valid Video (who went on to win the GI King's Bishop) beat Cajun Beat (who went on to win the GIII Kentucky Cup Sprint) in one of the races, and Shake You Down ran a 121 winning another. So when they run those races at Calder next year, I think I'll be paying attention. I think I did happen to see those races this year, but I had no idea at the time what I was watching.

It is both an advantage and a disadvantage to have the numbers 'going for' him that Grand Slam has. The huge foal crops, at least theoretically, give him more chance of siring champions, but they also mean a significant percentage of breeders and other observers criticize him for not tallying higher success percentages. In my opinion, the jury is very much out on the whole question. They may be working with a population of mares that isn't capable of producing 10-percent stakes winners, but that's a series of research questions, and we just don't know the answers. Here's what we do know. From two huge crops, this year Grand Slam has sired 66 winners. He ranks fifth on the Juvenile Sire List, first on the Second-Crop Sire List for 2003, and he has sired three seriously good three-year-olds in Grand Hombre, Strong Hope, and now Cajun Beat. **Cont. p. 3**

Grand Slam, remember, was a seriously good horse himself, and, like his sire Gone West, he's a very good-looking horse. He made his debut one July day at Belmont Park over 5 1/2 furlongs. I can't remember what we had gone there to watch, but I remember watching the race with my friend Steve Dillman at the Sarasota Dog Track and Grand Slam only won by 11 lengths, equaling the track record of 1:03 in the process. Yikes! says I to Steve (or words to that effect). Make a note of that one. Sure enough, after being dusted off by perennial front-runner Coronado's Quest at Saratoga, Grand Slam came back to win the GI Futurity (at one mile) and the GI Champagne (1 1/16 miles) at Belmont, and went off second favorite to [Favorite Trick](#) for the Breeders' Cup Juvenile at Hollywood Park. But he was sliced into from behind and quite severely injured, to the point where there was a question if he would ever race again.

But not only did Grand Slam recover, trainer D. Wayne Lukas had him back in action by the end of March at Santa Anita, and he ran 10 times at three. His only win came in the nine-furlong GII Peter Pan, but he placed in the GII Jerome, GII Lexington, GII Swaps, and GI Haskell before Lukas dropped him back to six furlongs, and he closed out his career with a second to Reraise (with the next year's winner Kona Gold third) in the Breeders' Cup Sprint at Churchill Downs. He must have been pretty tough. In an interesting testimony to the limitations of numbers in predicting sire success, Grand Slam's best Beyer number was 107, which I translate to Timeform 119, but others might make as high as Timeform 123. In any case, Grand Slam is streets ahead, as a sire, of several horses who ran Beyers in the high 'teens, and therefore Timeforms in the 130s.

Numbers in his favor or not, topping this particular group of second-crop sires in 2003 looks like big news, because this group of second-crop sires looks like big news. Distorted Humor was the leading freshman sire last year, beating out Awesome Again and [Elusive Quality](#), who lost the title when Elusive City was disqualified from two wins in Britain. Distorted Humor

regained the lead when Funny Cide won the Kentucky Derby and Preakness, and has held it until now. Tale of the Cat, fourth on the freshman sire list last year, is third on the second-crop list this year, and also third on the Juvenile Sire List, with three two-year-old graded stakes winning fillies. Deputy Commander, sire of Ten Most Wanted, is fourth, followed by Elusive Quality, Awesome Again, Indian Charlie, Touch Gold, and the surprising [Cape Town Swain](#), by the way, has made a big move forward, mostly due to Dimitrova, and is 13th this year after finishing 54th on the freshman sire list. This still looks a powerful bunch, so to make the lead in this crowd (the same weekend, five years later, that he ran maybe his best race) suggests Grand Slam is proving he can sire real class.

Though I'm a big believer in speed figures as a measure of ability, there has always been a question to what extent racing class translates to sire success. There were four 'numbers' horses among this second-crop sire group, and the news has not been so good for them. In 2003 earnings among second-crop sires, Formal Gold ranks 16th, [Skip Away](#) 20th, Will's Way 23rd, and [Gentlemen](#) 38th. So racing class is not enough. Also among the also-rans: 1997 default Horse of the Year Favorite Trick (22nd); Coronado's Quest, who regularly beat Grand Slam (well, more than once) (24th, off to Japan); and [Arch](#), who will evidently not be taking on his sire Kris S.'s mantle (30th).

## WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

Three years ago, Breeders' Cup was notable for victories of the offspring of young stallions and representatives of a wide variety of sire lines. In fact, the eight winners came from no less than seven different sire lines, and included winners from the first crop of [Honor and Glory](#), [Thunder Gulch](#)'s second crop, and the third crop of Holy Bull.

This year we have a picture which is a complete contrast. On Saturday, four of the races went to the offspring of stallions who are no longer with us, while other winners were by 22-year-old Sadler's Wells (two) and 19-year-old Gone West. There was also significantly less diversity as four of the winners were by Mr. Prospector-line horses, three from the Northern Dancer male line, and one each for Roberto and Ribot (both through stallions who are now deceased).

The Ribot line's triumph came in the day's crowning event--the GI Breeders' Cup Classic--and went to **Pleasantly Perfect**, who is by Pleasant Colony, a son of His Majesty and a grandson of Ribot. Winner the 1981 GI Kentucky Derby and GI Preakness S., Pleasant Colony has sired 73 stakes winners, including champions St. Jovite, [Pleasant Tap](#), Pleasant Stage and State Shinto. Classicism is also apparent in the distaff side of Pleasantly Perfect's pedigree as his dam Regal State is by Triple Crown hero Affirmed. Campaigned in France, Regal State was a precocious performer who captured the G1 Prix Morny at two and finished second against older males in the G1 Prix Jacques Le Marois at three. Regal State is half-sister to another French juvenile Group 1 winner in Seven Springs, also the dam of champion English miler and successful sire Distant View. Pleasantly Perfect's third dam Promessa is a sister to English Oaks winner Pia, and goes back to a sister to Bull Dog and Sir Gallahad III.

Pleasantly Perfect's pedigree is a complete outcross at five generations, but the His Majesty/Affirmed cross has produced a previous Grade I winner in the shape of the filly Chelsey Flower. His Majesty and Affirmed don't

have much in common close up their pedigrees, but they do have a lot of Rock Sand and Sundridge further back, and this pair is linked by the fact that Rock Sand's sire Sanfoin is a brother to Sierra, dam of Sundridge.

The other 2003 Breeders' Cup winner to stem from a male line other than that of Mr. Prospector is the late-running **Action This Day**, who took the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile on only his third lifetime start. Whether Action This Day can become the first horse to capture both the Juvenile and GI Kentucky Derby will not be known to us for several months, but at least he has a pedigree which should not see him fail for lack of stamina. Action This Day is a member of the final crop of Kris S., a lightly raced Roberto horse who began his career in Florida before moving to Kentucky, and ultimately compiled an outstanding stud record. With 72 stakes winners to his credit, Kris S. has been represented by four previous Breeders' Cup winners--Hollywood Wildcat (Distaff), Soaring Softly (F/M Turf), [Prized](#) (Turf) and Brocco (Juvenile)--and he's also responsible for this year's G1 English Derby winner, Kris Kin.

Action this Day gets more stamina from the distaff side of his pedigree as he is out of Najecam, a graded-stakes placed daughter of the G1 French Derby winner Tremolino. Najecam's dam Sue Warner is a daughter of the Argentine star Forli, a South American classic winner at nearly two miles, out of the champion English two-year-old filly Bitty Girl. This is a pedigree which not only promises distance, but also suggests a proficiency on turf, should Action This Day ever be given the chance to tackle this medium.

Action This Day's pedigree represents the successful cross of Roberto-line stallions over Sharpen Up-line mares, a pattern which has also produced European classic winners Mister Baileys and Classic Park and Canadian champion Windsharp. We can also note that Action This Day's third dam is by Habitat, who is by Sir Gaylord, a horse bred on the same Turn-to/Princequillo cross as Kris S. Habitat's broodmare sire Occupy is also the sire of the second dam of Kris S., so it can be seen that Kris S. and Habitat are bred on very similar lines.

We have just mentioned Windsharp as a product of the Roberto/Sharpen Up cross, and Windsharp put in an appearance on Breeders' Cup day as the dam of **Johar**, who deadheaded with High Chaparral for the GI Breeders' Cup Turf. Johar's pedigree represents a stellar piece of pedigree planning as no less than four of the eight horses in the third generation of the pedigree of his sire Gone West are repeated in the pedigree of Windsharp, all through genetic relatives. To start with, Johar is a product of the very successful Mr. Prospector/Roberto cross, a pattern which brings together the similarly bred Nashua daughters Gold Digger (dam of Mr. Prospector) and Bramalea (dam of Roberto). Gone West's broodmare sire Secretariat is half-brother to Sir Gaylord, who appears as the sire of Johar's third dam. This pattern appears in six other Gone West stakes winners, and another eight by his sons. Finally, at the top and the bottom of Gone West's pedigree, we find Native Dancer and Mixed Marriage. This pair is reunited as the sire and dam of Atan, who is here as the father of Sharpen Up. Gone West and Sharpen Up combine in three Gone West stakes winners and another six by Gone West sons.

Before leaving Windsharp, we must mention that she is off to a flying start to her stud career, as Johar is her first foal, and her second is the recent GI Del Mar Oaks heroine Dessert (by [Storm Cat](#), who like Gone West is out of a Secretariat mare).

The other Turf deadheader, **High Chaparral**, was defending the title which gained last year and was one of two [Sadler's Wells](#) winners on the day, having been preceded by the filly **Islington**, who captured the GI F/M Turf event. My colleague Andrew Caulfield paid sufficient homage to the magnificent Sadler's Wells in his column yesterday, so we won't dwell on this pair other than to note that both are out of mares by Darshaan, so continue the tremendous record that Sadler's Wells has built up with mares descending from Never Bend (a half brother to Sadler's Wells' maternal grandsire, Bold Reason).

Oddly enough, having appeared as the sire of a winner of the longest race on the card, Gone West also turns up as the grandsire of winner of the shortest of the Breeders' Cup events, the GI Sprint. This went to **Cajun Beat**, who is a member of the first crop of [Grand Slam](#). The Breeders' Cup rather owed Grand Slam one, as he suffered a near-career ending injury when one of the favorites for the Juvenile before finishing second in the Sprint the following year. Grand Slam's progress has been one of the revelations of the year. With his first crop of three-year-olds, he now has six stakes winners, Cajun Beat being joined as a graded stakes winner by the promising pair of Grand Hombre and Strong Hope. In his second crop Grand Slam is represented by a trio of stakes winners, including the graded stakes winning Limehouse, and if his first crop is anything to go by, there are almost certainly some more stars waiting in the wings.

Cajun Beat's dam, Beckys Shirt, is a multiple graded stakes placed daughter of Cure the Blues, a horse who is turning out to be a very good broodmare sire. Her granddam Thundertee was a fast multiple stakes winner, who was also graded stakes placed, but within living memory the family has producing nothing approaching the class of Cajun Beat. Happily, the six-cross pedigree does offer plenty of reasons to explain this upgrading of talent. Firstly, Cure the Blues has as his granddam the mare Speedwell, a 3/4-sister to Secretariat. That great performer appears here as broodmare sire of Grand Slam's own sire Gone West, giving Secretariat/Speedwell 4x4. There are at least four other stakes winners by stallions carrying Secretariat out of mares by Cure the Blues, including A.P. Indy's Grade I-winning son, Golden Missile. There is also a lot of La Troienne in the background and multiple strains of two horses who presence seems to compliment each other, Bold Ruler and Tom Fool.

The victories of Islington and High Chaparral continued a great day for the European contingent, who had earlier captured the Mile courtesy of the French-trained three-year-old filly **Six Perfections**. Perhaps we shouldn't have been surprised that Six Perfections knew her way home in the Mile, as she is out of the Riverman mare Yogya, a half-sister to Miesque, heroine of the Mile in 1987 and 1988.

Six Perfections is a Mr. Prospector-line horse, but descends through one of the less celebrated branches of his sire line. Her grandsire Damister was one of the first good Mr. Prospector sons to race in Europe. Winner of three group races at distances of around 10 to 12 furlongs, Damister also took third in the G1 English and G1 Irish Derbys. Overall, he was a disappointment at stud, but did get a really good horse in Six Perfections' sire Celtic Swing, a spectacular winner of the G1 Racing Post Trophy at two and successful in the G1 French Derby at three. Six Perfections is from Celtic Swing's second crop, and is one of only three Northern Hemisphere-sired stakes winners by her sire, so we'd be inclined to give considerable credit to Six Perfection's extremely strong female line.

Ironically, the widest margin victory in the Breeders' Cup went to the longest-priced winner. **Adoration**, the outsider of the field for the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff, parlayed an easy lead into a 4 1/4-length win. Adoration is by the deceased [Danzig](#) horse, Honor Grades. A half brother to [Summer Squall](#) and [A.P. Indy](#), Honor Grades was another to earn his stripes in Florida before making the move to Kentucky. He's so far sired 25 stakes winners, the others including millionaire Honor Glide and graded stakes winners Whata Brainstorm, Gone Fishin, Epic Honor, Kalu and Dr. Park, as well as New Zealand Group 1 winners Honor Lap and Honor Bound. Adoration's pedigree is quite an outcross, but since she is out of a mare by Key to the Mint, she's bred on a proven cross. Danzig and his sons have at least eight stakes winners out of mares by Key to Mint and his sons, and at least 13 stakes winners on a cross of Danzig-line stallions with mares from the male line of Key to the Mint's sire Graustark, the most notable being the GI Kentucky Derby winner Sea Hero.

While Adoration's victory ended the championship aspirations of some of her rivals, the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, saw a championship secured. **Tomorrow**, *Alan Porter examines the pedigree of Halfbridled.*

*Although I may sound like a typical owner pumping his horse, you should give credit to what Ashado accomplished in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies race. She was shipped across the country to temperatures 50 degrees higher than those in New York, contended with the hype and commotion at a track that was not her home and ran two turns for the first time on a surface with which she was not familiar. Halfbridled is a great horse, but is it possible what Ashado had to overcome was more than two lengths?*

**SOUTH DAKOTA MAN HITS PICK SIX JACKPOT**

Graham Stone, one of two partners in the winning wager in the Breeders' Cup Ultra Pick Six stepped forward yesterday, detailing his strategy and how a couple of small-time horseplayers with \$8 walked away with \$2,687,611.60. Stone confirmed that he and Will Dixon, partners in a wholesale jewelry business in Rapid City, South Dakota, held the lone ticket in the Breeders' Cup Pick Six and were 50-50 partners in the wager. Stone, who made the selections, singled four of the races, using Six Perfections (Mile), Islington (Filly & Mare Turf), High Chaparral (Turf) and Pleasantly Perfect (Classic). He preferred Aldebaran in the Sprint, but worried that the six-furlong race was too short for him. He added eventual winner Cajun Beat to his ticket after reading a column by *Daily Racing Form* and *Washington Post* columnist Andrew Beyer touting his chances. In the Juvenile, his top selection was Tiger Hunt. He added eventual winner Action This Day to the bet because he said he reminded him of 1999 Juvenile winner Anees, a horse he had made a winning bet on four years earlier. His most harrowing moment came in the Turf, when High Chaparral finished in a dead heat for the win with Johar. The placing judges took nearly 10 minutes to post the order of finish. "I just about had a stroke waiting for that photo," Stone said. After Pleasantly Perfect gave him his sixth winner, he checked the Santa Anita website to see what the payoff was. He misread the result chart, believing, at first, the \$18,663 paid to anyone selecting all six winners. "I saw the \$18,000 and I was a little disappointed," said Stone. "I figured some people had all six, but not that many. Then I saw what it really paid and I called my wife over to look at it. I was shocked."

**Money in the bag...**

After it was confirmed that Stone had purchased the only winning ticket on the wager, racing officials, determined to avoid any further Pick Six scandals like the one that rocked the sport a year earlier, went over every aspect of the bet and concluded it was legitimate. Stone said he will mainly put the money aside, but plans on one treat for himself. He has never seen a live horse race, something that will change next summer. "My dream has always been to go to Saratoga," he said. "That I'm going to do."

"Hopefully there should be some nice juvenile races for him out there," said Nimmo. "He's a real good mover who should go on any ground and the sire [Intikhab] could do well out there as he's by Red Ransom." The sale continues today at 10 a.m.
