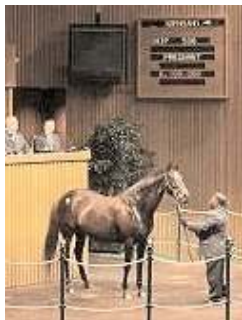

## A SHARP NOVEMBER WIND

"The complete package." That's what Sheikh Mohammed termed **Windsharp** (Lear Fan), who lit up the board at Keeneland yesterday to the tune of \$6.1 million. How else can you describe a top-class racemare whose first two foals are Grade I winners, and was just represented by a Breeders' Cup winner? Bloodstock agent John Ferguson, on the phone with Sheikh Mohammed, prevailed in a bidding duel with Ira Gumberg of Skara Glen Stables to acquire the 12-year-old mare. "We expected her to make a good price," said Ferguson. "Sheikh Mohammed wanted to make sure that he was on the phone just to make sure I got the job done." In foal on a Feb. 27 cover to **Gone West**, Windsharp is the dam of four-year-old **Johar** (Gone West), co-hero of the GI Breeders' Cup Turf; and **Dessert** (Storm Cat), winner of the GI Del Mar Oaks. "It's very unusual that you get a mare who's a champion breed a Breeders' Cup winner with her first foal and another Grade I winner with her second foal," said Ferguson. "She was basically, in Sheikh Mohammed's opinion, she was the complete package. Obviously, bred the way she is, there are all kinds of options for her, and for **Gone West** to have a Breeders' Cup winner is a wonderful accomplishment. Suffice it to say that we couldn't be happier." At \$6.1 million, Windsharp is the second highest price of this year's sale and is the fourth highest price in Keeneland history. *Keeneland cont. p2*

**Sharp Eyes...**

After bidding on his own throughout the sale, Ferguson was on the phone with Sheikh Mohammed throughout the bidding for **Windsharp** (Lear Fan). Underbidder Ira Gumberg was a few strides behind Ferguson along the rail. Gumberg, representing his father's Skara Glen Stable offered his congratulations to the winning bidders, saying "she's the best horse I've ever seen." He added, "I was past where I wanted to be. I thought that maybe she was going to fall in the \$4-million range, since she has a little bit of age to her. She's a magnificent mare. She has a great future ahead of her. I'm happy for John Ferguson. He's one of the leaders in the industry and to have someone like that buy a trophy--a mare of that quality--is great for the industry." It's been a long road for Windsharp, who was purchased for \$8,500 at Keeneland September in 1992 before beginning her racing career in France. She has an unraced two-year-old colt by Storm Cat named Ancient Art. Her 2002 colt by Fusaichi Pegasus died and she was barren for 2003.

**A Numbers Game...**

Windsharp topped the 12 horses which sold for seven figures Tuesday, giving a total of 23 for Book 1. The strong trade for top mares led to significant increases numbers across the board. "It was pretty wonderful," said Keeneland's Geoffrey Russell. "We're back to a situation of a major dispersal. Well-thought out breeding plans that unfortunately had to be dispersed too early. We're delighted to have accommodated The Thoroughbred Corporation; I hope that they're as pleased with the results as we are. The median is up for both days. The Thoroughbred Corp. mares I consider to be at the top end, so with the median going up I think there was strength below them as well. It helps the bottom line tremendously. Young, attractive mares are selling very, very well. Talking to some of the consignors, some of them are shocked at the strength of 'the next-level-down' from the superstar mares."

**No Secrets Here...**

Betty Moran of Brushwood Stable went to \$1.4 million to secure a weanling filly by Storm Cat out of Garden Secrets (Time for a Change). Sold as hip 619 from the consignment of Eaton Sales, agent, the chestnut filly is a 3/4 sister to GI Acorn S. winner Forest Secrets (Forest Wildcat). "I loved the filly's pedigree," explained Moran. "She's by Storm Cat, and most of the Storm Cat broodmares that have been selling have been bringing \$3 million, so I guess if I make her and she makes a good racehorse, I'll have a Storm Cat broodmare eventually." Of the weanling's seven-figure price tag, Moran admitted, "I thought she would go for a little bit less."

**The Right Stuff...**

Habibti (Tabasco Cat) will be joining the broodmare band at Shadwell after bloodstock agent Rick Nichols went to \$2.9 million to secure the four-year-old multiple Grade I winner yesterday. In foal to Point Given, the chestnut captured the GI Hollywood Starlet and GI Del Mar Debutante as a two-year-old in 2001. At three, she finished second in the GI Santa Anita Oaks and GI Las Virgenes S. and was third in the GI Kentucky Oaks. "She's gorgeous, a great racemare," exclaimed Nichols. "We just wanted to have her and that's exactly what we thought we'd have to pay. She's a lovely mare with a great race record. She did it as a two-year-old with two Group 1s as a two-year-old." Habibti was consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent.

**Poetry In Motion for Hughes...**

On the heels of his victory in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile with Action This Day, California-based owner B. Wayne Hughes was active during yesterday's second session, going to \$2.05 million to acquire hip 418, **Poetically** (Silver Deputy), sold carrying a foal by A.P. Indy from the consignment of Fred Seitz/Brookdale Farm, agent. Canada's champion two-year-old filly of 2000 while trained for Kinghaven Farms by Roger Attfield, Poetically is a half sister to another Sovereign Award winner in Primaly (Alydeed) as well as GSW Whiskey Wisdom (Wild Again). "[Bloodstock advisor] Seth Semkin and [trainer] Ron Ellis picked her out," said Hughes. "She was our second choice of the sale. Saudi Poetry [\$2.2 million, Monday] was our first choice, but we're glad to get this one. We like A.P. Indy a lot. The mare is a beautiful mare, a champion and she's young." With his purchase during Monday's opening session of hip 333, **Iftiraas (GB)** (Distant Relative {GB}), in foal to Gone West, Hughes' broodmare band now numbers 47. He boards at several Central Kentucky nurseries, including Three Chimneys, Castleton Lyons, Walmac and Lane's End. Owner of Kentucky Derby fourth Atswhatimtalknbout (A.P. Indy), Hughes intends to retain the in-utero colt to race. The mare is due early next year. As far as a decision as to who they might breed back to, Hughes said, "If the foal looks good, we'll probably send her back to A.P. Indy."

**Ferguson Sharpens His Skills...**

A couple of hours before he signed the ticket for Windsharp, John Ferguson saw off all bidders at \$3.1 million to take home one of the prize possessions from the Thoroughbred Corp. consignment, seven-time Grade I winner **Sharp Cat** (Storm Cat), in foal to Gone West. "Obviously she was an outstanding racemare, but she is also a half sister to Royal Anthem (Theatrical {Ire}), who was a great racehorse of himself on the turf," said Ferguson. "She had a very nice yearling by Fusaichi Pegasus who made 1 1/2 [\$1.5 million] in September and she's in foal to Gone West, so obviously we are delighted to have her. She'll be an asset to any stallion. She was a mare we were very keen to have." Her weanling colt by Thunder Gulch, which followed her into the ring yesterday, brought a final bid of \$275,000 from Chiefswood Stables. For Alice Chandler, whose Mill Ridge Sales is handling the Thoroughbred Corp. consignment, the sale has been profitable, yet bittersweet. "The main thing is to me that she's in good hands," Mrs. Chandler commented. "The people that bought her will give her every chance to succeed." Sharp Cat, as many of Storm Cat's progeny, had a penchant for nervousness, especially at the track. But the mare has matured, according to Chandler. "You can do anything with her," Mrs. Chandler explained. "She's a good mother. I was just telling John Ferguson, my only concern is that she and Turko's Turn have been buddies and John said to me, 'you're trying to tell me that I've got to buy Turko's Turn too.' She's a nice, good-looking mare. She's like human." A distinct sense of melancholy could be discerned in Chandler's face. "I'm walking around here with tears in my eyes. It's been so much fun to have [the horses] and we've been so lucky in what we've been able to raise for [The Thoroughbred Corporation]. They get to be personal friends. I hate to see them go."

**Point Given, Junior...**

Immediately following the sale of his dam **Turko's Turn** (Turkoman), hip 486, the weanling full brother to Horse of the Year Point Given was sold for \$800,000. "Whenever you can buy a horse like that for less than a million, that's still pinhooking territory," said Eaton Sales' Reiley McDonald, who signed the ticket on behalf of Chestnut Valley Farm, a "partnership being put together for pinhooking purposes." According to McDonald, "He's a nice looking colt and looks like he's got a lot of upside potential. I don't know exactly where he's going to sell, but you'll see him either here [at Keeneland] or at Saratoga next year." Chestnut Valley Farm was also listed as the buyer of hip 490, a weanling colt by Giant's Causeway-Twigazuri (Dixieland Band). The chestnut is closely related to MGSW Futural (Future Storm).

**The Adam Family...**

Don Adam of Courtlandt Farm said he was looking to upgrade his broodmare stock and he did so in a big way yesterday with the purchase of **Purrfectly** (Storm Cat). The nine-year-old mare, in foal to Unbridled's Song, is already the dam of graded stakes winner Santa Catarina (Unbridled), second in this year's GI Kentucky Oaks and third in last year's Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. Bidding shot back and forth, with David Plummer's ClassicStar and representatives of Stanley Gumberg's Skara Glen Stables inside and Adam bidding from the walking ring behind the sales pavilion. The chestnut mare finally fell to Adam for a price tag of \$3,150,000. She was consigned by Denali Stud, agent. "We had her as the number one horse pedigree-wise, in our view, of the sale," said Adam, who currently has a broodmare band of approximately 25. Purrfectly is his biggest purchase to date, but Adam bought Kalookan Queen for \$1.85 million as a broodmare prospect and Gourmet Girl for \$2.25 million, in foal to Fusaichi Pegasus, at this sale last year. "I bought two really nice broodmares last year," Adam explained. "We're just trying to add quality broodmares and hopefully get quality runners to race and enjoy."

The last two days' Sale of the Century has seen 366 horses gross \$140,093,000, averaging \$382,768, and including a record (or at least a 20-year high) 15 mares which have sold for \$2-million or more. With only two fewer sold than in last year's corresponding sessions, the gross is up 25 percent, and the average 26 percent, over 2002's Book 1. What is more significant is that we can compare it with the record Monday-Tuesday sessions in 2000. There were 449 horses sold in those two sessions, which grossed a record \$174,963,000, and averaged \$389,672. This year's Book 1 average is within 2 percent of the 2000 Monday-Tuesday average, and the 15 mares which sold for \$2-million-plus this year easily beats the 2000 total of 10. There were seven at \$3-million or more in each year. Those kinds of figures illustrate the phenomenal strength of this year's Book 1, even though the overall sale won't come close to those in 1999 and 2000, which each grossed over \$300-million.

Whereas the 30-percent rises in some of this year's key yearling markets have to be tempered by significant differences in the sales and sales dates, the 25-percent Book 1 increase over last year has to be tempered by what may be significant differences in the catalogue itself, which is always true of mixed sales. For example, six of this year's 15 mares at \$2-million-plus came from The Thoroughbred Corp., which is actually a great testimony to the record of the late Prince Ahmed Salman and his buying team. Though there are nearly always dispersals in the November catalogue, it's pretty rare to see one operation produce six individual mares who are worth that kind of money.

But there is a development which is perhaps even more significant in this year's Book 1. Though it is very difficult to measure in an aggregate manner (because November catalogues vary so much from year to year), there is little doubt that the price of admission to the Book 1 tier of the breeding sector has increased significantly now. What do I mean by that? There are a couple of examples I can give, though I think it is fairer, in this respect, to make my comments general rather than specific. Here's what I mean, though: take the case of a young mare, not a winner, in foal to a respectable horse (say a \$50,000 stud fee), who is the daughter of a really top-class racemare, now herself about 15, and who may have produced winners, but no black type. This sort of mare, I would have said, has been about a \$300,000 mare the last few years. One sold Monday for \$600,000 and another yesterday for \$500,000. I think there's a line of reasoning which says that the price of this kind of mare has doubled ... and there are a few more categories like that where the same multiple applies. Besides the stars in the catalogue, it's the price of these kinds of mares which suggests that buying into the good stuff really is just about at record levels.

### WALDEN COMES FULL CIRCLE

Ben Walden has lived through the ups and the downs of the Thoroughbred business over the course of the past quarter century. The lows can be very low, but the highs can be very high. Walden and his partner and good friend Jim Bohannon struck gold yesterday at Keeneland when Purrfectly (Storm Cat-Perfect Example, by Far North) sold for \$3.15 million.

But for Walden it's been a long and winding road.

His parents owned Dearborn Farm near Lexington, "a small, but highly successful operation," according to Walden. As Ben progressed through his teenage years, the elder Walden insisted that his son branch out into other areas and not rest on his laurels, thinking that he would just take over the day-to-day business of running the farm when the time came.

Walden departed, but found himself wandering a bit aimlessly, indecisive about a career choice and uncertain about the direction his life would take. In his late twenties, after a brief stint as a racing official, Walden took action.

"It became clear to me that I had to do something worthwhile," Walden explained. "I wasn't going to make much progress in my life so I came home and leased 50 acres of land from my parents and started a little operation called Vinery."

Primarily a mare-boarding operation in the early and mid 80s, when times were lean in the business, Walden's entrepreneurial spirit began to emerge as he devised ways to grow Vinery.

"It became so clear to me that the recession in the business, or close to being a depression in the business...everyone was selling and no one really had stallions on their minds at all," he said. "I realized that I had to make the phone ring and to create growth, I felt I had to get a stallion and it was really not competitive at the time, in fact there was no competition at all."

And the phones did begin to make noise. The expansion of Vinery was on.

"I talked to an Oklahoma oil man who let me stand a horse called Bionic Light, third in the inaugural Breeders' Cup Juvenile," he explained. "We stood him for \$2,000 and I bred about 70 or 80 mares to him and about 60 of them were free. All you had to do was drive in the gate with a van with a mare on board and she'd get served. Greentree let me stand a stallion called Steady Beat, an Alydar half brother to Stop the Music and Hatchet Man and they gave me a quarter of him in return for me not sending them any bills. A year or two later, Graham Beck, before anyone knew who Graham Beck was, bought him for \$400,000 to go to South Africa and that \$100,000 for my quarter was the seed for me to stay in business."

After Warner Jones, who was cutting back his business, sent the stallion Far Out East to the emerging stud, Walden began getting serious about acquiring stallions, and the roster began to grow. Lost Code, [Red Ransom](#), Cryptoclearance, Twilight Agenda and [Marquetry](#) became fixtures at Vinery. Things were looking up. At least on the business end of things.

A series of events in his personal life, including the death of his mother in the mid-nineties and the birth of his first child, left Walden yearning for more time to spend on himself and his family. It became clear to him that it was time to cut ties with Vinery and get away for a while.

Vinery was sold, for a profit, and Walden and his family left. At least for a little while.

"It didn't take me long to realize that I knew nothing about anything else," he admitted. "I had some grandiose idea that I might be smart enough to tackle some other industry or other walks of life professionally. But I was wrong, so I came back and bought 300 acres at the corner of Iron Works and Newtown and renamed the property Gracefield."

While the property itself was owned by Walden and his wife, Walden sought out the assistance of an old business acquaintance, Bohannon, to help on the bloodstock side. The team set out with the goal of buying nicely bred mares. The duo meshed nicely.


"Jim is the kind of partner you dream about," Walden said proudly. "There is a unique rapport that we as partners enjoy."

The team was just starting out and were mindful of the pitfalls of shopping for well-pedigreed mares, particularly at Keeneland and especially for mares catalogued in Book 1.

"In this business, as a small breeder, you're very fortunate to pick up two or three nice mares a year that are 'choice,'" Walden said. "You get blown out on most of them by competitive bidding. It is very tough, but she was a mare that had it all...her sire, her family, her age, her first foal had broken out for a lot of money and was purchased by arguably the top racing principal in the business in Bob and Beverly Lewis and Bob Baffert."

Purrfectly had been bred in her first season at stud to Unbridled and produced Santa Catarina, whom the Lewis' bought for \$950,000 at the Keeneland September Sale in 2001. Two months later, her dam was offered in foal to Arch and to Team Gracefield the purchase was a no brainer.

"I never saw her," Walden said, referring to Santa Catarina. "I had just heard about her in reputation only. I liked this mare. The record spoke for itself on Santa Catarina. We thought the mare would cost between \$200,000 and \$250,000, but it really was a non-issue to go to \$330,000."

Yesterday at Keeneland, that decision proved wise. However, it is not under the happiest of circumstances that the mare was offered. Bohannon is suffering from several physical problems, and he and Walden, at Bohannon's behest, decided to "clean Bohannon's plate" to allow him to concentrate on the task of getting better. Come what may, Walden is determined to carry on what has been started at Gracefield.

"Gracefield is owned by my wife and me and is on solid footing, and Jim's illness has been a cause for concern for us," Walden says. "But God has always taken care of me. I named the farm Gracefield for that very reason, for His grace, which has always been incredible to me. I feel secure that He is always going to find people to put in my path to do business with."

Makybe Diva consolidated an eye-catching close-up fourth in the G1 Caulfield Cup last time out to win the Melbourne Cup with a late burst of speed. The lightly raced mare was the pick of astute punters among 122,736 people at Flemington early in betting, but went off the second choice as late money came in for Godolphin's Mamool (Ire) (In The Wings {GB}) and for the Bart Cummings-trained Frightening (Aus) (Langfuhr). Zagalia (Zabeel {NZ}) sprinted forward from her wide barrier to take an early lead, but by the 2000-meter mark, Millstreet (GB) (Polish Precedent) had taken his anticipated front-running role, three lengths clear while setting an honest pace, with Makybe Diva rating in mid-pack. As the field fanned at the home turn, Makybe Diva's stablemate Pentastic (Aus) (Pentire {GB}) pushed into contention, but at the 300 meter mark, the jockey Glen Boss said go and Makybe Diva snatched the lead as backmarker She's Archie also flew down the outside to earn second-place honors. **Cont. p9**

"I just sat toward the fence and the runs just kept coming," said winning rider Glen Boss. "It was as though I was in 'the zone.' Everything was just happening for me like it was meant to be. But the last 200 meters was the longest 200 meters I have ever been through." Winning trainer Hall said he'd planned the Cup assault for a year. "I followed Bart Cummings' plan that you have to have 10,000 meters in their legs, but at about 7,000 I backed off and it turned out the right thing to do," he said. "I purposely gave her a light campaign in autumn so she could come back for a long spring schedule." Makybe Diva's last win was the G2 Queen Elizabeth S. at Flemington last November.

**Disappointment for Godolphin...**

While English-bred Makybe Diva snared the Melbourne Cup, the rest of the international contingent did not fare as well, including Godolphin's **Mamool (Ire)**, who pulled up lame in his right hind leg after being eased down in the closing stages of the race. Across the wire last, Mamool's performance left his soft-spoken trainer, Saeed bin Suroor, wondering if the battleground at Flemington was just too tough. "Frankie [Dettori] felt the horse had gone behind," said the conditioner. "He was perfectly happy during the run and felt as though he could go on and win. But coming round the turn he felt something was wrong and he eased him down, he jumped off and led the horse back to scale. He has recovered quickly, but tomorrow we will have a clearer picture. He was obviously not in form. This is a tough race, too tough." Second stringer Millstreet set a cracking pace early, but tired to beat only two others home, pulling up distressed and sore in front, ensuring that at its seventh attempt, the Melbourne Cup is as elusive as ever for Godolphin. "One way or another the result was very disappointing, we will have to wait for next year," said bin Suroor. "If we have the right horse, we will be back. If it was easy to win, it wouldn't be worth winning."

**Issues Pile Up for Scratched Mummify...**

**Mummify (Aus)** (Jeune {GB}) was scratched from the Melbourne Cup after trainer Lee Freedman concluded a tumultuous 24 hours, reporting to stewards the horse had an elevated temperature. "Had he run, the chances are he would have run a shocking race and put himself in danger," said Freedman of the 11-1 chance. "Worse things can happen. Everything fell apart over the last few days; we'll come back and get them next year," the three-time Melbourne Cup winning trainer added. Mummify's defection proved bittersweet for regular jockey Dan Nikolic, who was forced off the horse by Freedman after he was charged with failing to ride Mummify to the best of his ability when the horse came home a lackluster eighth in last Saturday's G1 Mackinnon S. Racing Victoria stewards grilled connections of Mummify for four hours Monday while Nikolic argued that he had not ridden Mummify vigorously because the horse, "did not feel right" in his action. Nikolic, who successfully sought an adjournment in order to seek legal advice, told *The Age Newspaper* Tuesday, "Obviously the horse is not 100 percent. You wouldn't want to be riding in the state he is in; he had no hope in the Cup. I was sure he wasn't right on Saturday and said as much." Things only got worse for Freedman when one of his owners revealed he'd sold a 2.5-percent share in the horse to an unidentified party, but had not registered the change. Since silent partners are not allowed according to Australian rules, Mummify was banned from racing until the appropriate papers were lodged.

Final all-sources wagering on the 12-race program from the Oct. 25 Breeders' Cup during the Oak Tree meeting at Santa Anita Park totaled \$120,631,437, establishing a record Breeders' Cup Day handle. The 2003 total handle was 3.7 percent higher than the previous BC mark of \$116,367,198 set last year at Arlington Park. Worldwide simulcast wagering on the day increased by 1.7 percent with \$104,284,749 wagered on the card. Among wagering by individual states, California with \$27,211,970 bet while New York led all simulcast jurisdictions with \$12,089,433 wagered. "Our fans responded positively to this year's Breeders' Cup wagering opportunities, both on track at Oak Tree at Santa Anita and off track at sites around the world," said BC President and NTRA Vice Chairman D.G. Van Clief Jr. "We are grateful to the staff and management of the Oak Tree Racing Association, Santa Anita Park and the 9,400 wagering facilities worldwide that did such a magnificent job working together to make this event a success." *Industry Info cont. p4*
