LANGFUHR HEADING TO LANE'S END

Gustav Schickedanz's **Langfuhr** (Danzig) will be moving to Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky for the 2004 breeding season, according to a press release issued by the farm. His stud fee will be \$20,000 live foal. "I am extremely pleased that Langfuhr will be relocating to Lane's End," Schickedanz said of the 11-year-old stallion. "They have an excellent record for promoting stallions and a first-class broodmare band. Lane's End has been interested in Langfuhr since he first retired from racing." A Schickedanz homebred, the Ontario-bred bay was named Canada's champion sprinter in 1996 following victories in the GI Vosburgh H. and the GII Forego H. He added victories in the GI Met Mile and the GI Carter H. as a five-year-old in 1997. Langfuhr began his breeding career at Vinery Kentucky, siring the multiple Grade I-winning millionaire Imperial Gesture in his first crop and Canadian Triple Crown hero Wando in his second crop. "He has been very successful under our management," said Vinery's Bates Newton. "We wish them the best of luck." Langfuhr is currently fifth among leading North American sires of 2003.

ROUSING FINISH TO DAY FOUR AT KEENELAND

Just when it looked like the fireworks were over on the fourth day at Keeneland's November Breeding Stock Sale, [hip 1432](#) strode into the ring. **Limelighter**, who is by Seeking the Gold out of the stakes-winning mare Miraloma (Deputy Minister) stole the show with a \$650,000 final bid from Hill 'n' Dale's John Sikura. "She'll be bred to Vindication," said Sikura. "That's the kind of quality that we are looking for. She's young, by a very good broodmare sire, she's magnificent to look at and traces to a significant female family. I tried to buy her all summer from Bob Lewis and he was right to put her in the sale. I thought she stood out and we're happy to have her. Being so young, she has a long career ahead of her and maybe she'll look inexpensive in the years to come."

As Blue as the Grass...

Consigned by Denali Stud, the three-year-old filly is from the family of the Stick to Beauty, who is the dam of Champion Sprinter Gold Beauty. The winner of the Test S., Fall Highweight H. and the True North H. produced English Horse of the Year Dayjur and Grade I winner Maplejinsky, the dam of Champion Older Mare Sky Beauty. I used to own [this filly's second dam] Stick to Beauty before I sold her to Calumet Farm. It's a family that keeps reproducing itself." Limelighter's older half sister of 1999, Gone to the Moon, brought \$2.8 million at Keeneland.

Nunatall's International Appeal...

Second highest priced mare on the night was **Nunatall (GB)**, a bay by Night Shift out of the Bering (GB) mare Nunatak. Bought by McKeever St. Lawrence for \$375,000, [hip 1093](#) was consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent. "We bought her for very good clients of mine, the Irish National Stud," said John McKeever. "We've been here all week trying to buy a mare and its proved to be very expensive. We liked this one a lot because she's got solid European pedigree and I think Chester House will get on very well. She's a Grade III winner which is what we wanted to get, a mare with a group win behind them. She also won as a two-year-old in France. She's got all the right ingredients. She was also a very good physical."

A Grand Slam at Keeneland...

A youngster by sophomore sire Grand Slam continued the good times for the Ashford-based stallion when [hip 1165](#), out of the Honey Jay mare Sheza Honey, realized the highest price for a weanling Thursday during Keeneland's fourth session. Coolmore's Timmy Hyde signed the ticket on the bay, after being extended to \$400,000 to land the colt for Mike Byrne. Out of a half sister to the dam of MGSW & GISP Rob 'N Gin (Farma Way), the Mar. 21 produce was consigned by Steve and Greg Justice's Justice Farm. "The horse is a beautiful horse," Greg Justice said. "His profile was pretty from the side, was a good-walking horse, just looked like a racehorse. We knew he'd make good money. I knew by the number of scopes and the quality of people that I had interested in the horse that the horse was going to bring money." [Hip 1137](#), also gave the stallion a boost when Peter O'Callaghan, whose family operates Woods Edge Farm near Lexington, went to \$230,000 on behalf of Cherokee Equine International to acquire the colt out of Canadian MSW Ring Star (Great Gladiator). Consigned to the sale by the Elm Tree Farm LLC of Jody and Michelle Huckabay, the Mar. 7 foal hails from the female family of MSW O'Martin (Geiger Counter) and MSW & GSP Geraint (Ascot Knight). "I just thought he was a fantastic horse," O'Callaghan commented. "He's by a great sire. [Grand Slam] has really stepped up to the plate this year. He had the Breeders' Cup Sprint winner [Cajun Beat] and a great horse in [GII Jim Dandy S. winner] Strong Hope...he's just a good sire. I've been looking to buy one of these Grand Slams and I guess we had to give a bit more than we wanted, but that's the nature of the game."

Making A Point...

An weanling colt by 2001 Horse of the Year and new sire Point Given (Thunder Gulch) was knocked down for a final bid of \$355,000 yesterday at Keeneland. Representatives of Coolmore Stud, bidding from the far right side of the ring, saw off all challengers to secure the son of Crafty Queen (Crafty Prospector), a half sister to \$5.3-million purchase Spain. The Mar. 30 foal is similarly bred to the leading distaff money earner. "He was a nice colt. We knew he was going to sell well from the action at the barn and the vetting," said Craig Bandoroff, whose Denali Stud consigned the chestnut for Craig and Cathy Beam. They purchased the mare carrying this foal for \$175,000 at last year's November sale. "They're small breeders from Ohio, really good people," Bandoroff explained. "They had a tough September sale so this is good for them." Of the colt, Bandoroff added, "He had enough leg, he was going to be big enough, he has a lot of quality, he's a pretty horse, a real good mover. He had the criteria and he had good people on him. I had a couple of people tell me he was the best Point Given they saw. He [Point Given] was a great racehorse, so if you bring out a good one, they're going to buy it." Through yesterday's session, Point Given's 15 yearlings sold from 16 through the ring have grossed \$1,840,000 for an average of \$122,667.

Anet Sold...

Anet (Clever Trick--Romantic Story, by Quadratic), who has stood at David Greathouse's Glencrest Stud since 1999, was sold yesterday at Keeneland for \$80,000. The nine-year-old, who scored his most important victory in the GII Del Mar Derby, was represented this year by Dixie High, winner of the Barretts Debutante S. and sixth in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. He is the sire of an additional stakes winner in Puerto Rico and has been represented to date by 28 individual winners from his two crops to race with progeny earnings of \$765,098. Greathouse explained the reason for the sale. "I tried to move the horse to some other places and I really didn't get any response or any type of offers," he said. "I thought the horse has a place in a market, but not in Kentucky. There were a number of offers that were higher than that, but the syndicate never voted to sell him. I hope he has a good home where ever he goes. This is a tough place to sell a horse like this. I had no luck privately, so I was left with no other choice but to sell him." The stallion was purchased by Tom Bozarth's Arch Bloodstock LLC. No decision has been made where Anet will stand in 2004.

Rhiana to Run at Churchill...


Claimed for just \$40,000 out of a second-place finish at Hollywood Park just over a year ago, **Rhiana** (Run-away Groom) was haltered again yesterday, only this time for \$270,000. Sold as a racing or broodmare prospect, the bay mare was knocked down to Des Ryan, bidding on behalf of Frank Justice's Dell Ridge Farm, and was consigned to the sale by Craig Bandoroff's Denali Stud, as agent. "Physically, she was very good. She's a very nice mare," Ryan commented. "She has some pedigree under her second dam and she has been stakes placed since the catalogue." Trained in California by Dan Hendricks, Rhiana improved off the claim, finishing third to Starrer and You in the GI Santa Maria H. at Santa Anita Feb. 16. Second in the GII Hawthorne H. at Hollywood Apr. 25, she was most recently runner-up in the Oct. 18 Golden Poppy H. at Bay Meadows. With a bullet five-furlong work Monday under her belt prior to shipping to Kentucky, she will race in the colors of Dell Ridge Farm in Saturday's GII Churchill Downs Distaff H. in Louisville. She breaks from the 10 hole and will be saddled on Saturday by trainer Eddie Kenneally. "We'll race her and see what happens," Ryan continued. "After that, I don't know. We'll take it as it comes. Either way, she has plenty of residual value as a broodmare."

Banner Day for Bandoroff...

Denali Stud, piloted by Craig Bandoroff, led all consigners on the fourth day, with gross receipts of \$3,225,000. "It's maybe the best sale ever," said Bandoroff. "What a great sale." Most notable of Bandoroff's coups was hip 1432. "I thought there was a chance she'd bring \$500,000," Bandoroff said of the \$650,000 session topper. "She was gorgeous, it's a great family. It's been a good day."

Spirits High at Keeneland...


With gross, average and median prices up across the board, Keeneland was understandably elated at the sale's continuing progress. "The most impressive figure is the median figure yet again," said Keeneland Director of Sales Geoff Russell. "We hoped it would keep rolling from book one to book two and it certainly did so. And people are still hungry to buy horses, and they haven't spent their money yet, so that makes us look forward to book three. The strength of the sale has been the young and the beautiful. The weanlings have also been sensational. The price of the weanlings is interesting. They are wholesale prices, so obviously these pinhookers are optimistic that next year's yearling market is going to be strong too. We love their optimism."

DENON SOLD TO SEKIGUCHI Multiple Grade I winner **Denon** (Pleasant Colony--Aviance {Ire}, by Northfields) has been purchased by Japanese owner Fusao Sekiguchi and will make his next start in the G1 Japan Cup Nov. 30, according to *Thoroughbred Times*. Michel Zerolo brokered the deal for the five-year-old; the purchase amount was not disclosed. After winning the G3 Prix de Fontainebleau and placing in a pair of Group 1 events in France, the bay came to the U.S. in the fall of his three-year-old season in 2001 and annexed the G1 Hollywood Derby. Racing for Edmund Gann and breeder Flaxman Stable, Denon added victories in the G1 Turf Classic and the G1 Charles Whittingham H. in 2002 and triumphed in the G1 Manhattan H. this year, all under the tutelage of Bobby Frankel. In his most recent start, he ran third in the G1 Man o' War S. Sept. 6. To date, he has earned over \$1.7 million while compiling a record of 19-6-4-3. Denon will stand at stud in Japan upon his retirement. Produced by G1SW Aviance, he is a half brother to MG1SW Chimes of Freedom, the dam of GISWs Aldebaran and Good Journey; and to the dam of champion miler Spinning World.

SILVER DEPUTY MARE TOPS EARLY ACTION

AT FASIG-TIPTON Silverdew, a seven-year-old daughter of Silver Deputy out of the *Grey Dawn II mare Dawnelo, brought a bid of \$75,000 from David Hayden to top the early proceedings of yesterday's Adena Springs Annual Broodmare Sale, hosted by Fasig-Tipton. In foal to Pimlico Special winner Golden Missile, hip 226 sold with a 2004 season to Preakness hero Red Bullet. "I thought she was the quality of the sale," commented Hayden. Not far behind in price was hip 209, a six-year-old mare by Diesis (GB) out of the Lear Fan mare Prominent Feather. Purchased for \$65,000 by Pablo Suarez, the dark bay is believed to be in foal to Touch Gold and will be bred to Greatness in 2004. "It will be nice to take a Touch Gold back to California," said Suarez, who was an underbidder on Keeneland's sale topping Seeking the Gold (hip 1432) mare earlier in the evening. GSW Prime Timber (Sultry Song--Wine Taster, by Nodouble) will stand the 2004 breeding season at the New York division of Sez Who Thoroughbreds, it was announced yesterday. The winner of the 1999 GII San Felipe S. and runner-up in the GI Santa Anita Derby and GI Hollywood Futurity, the seven-year-old stood his first two seasons at Sez Who's main base in Ocala, Florida. 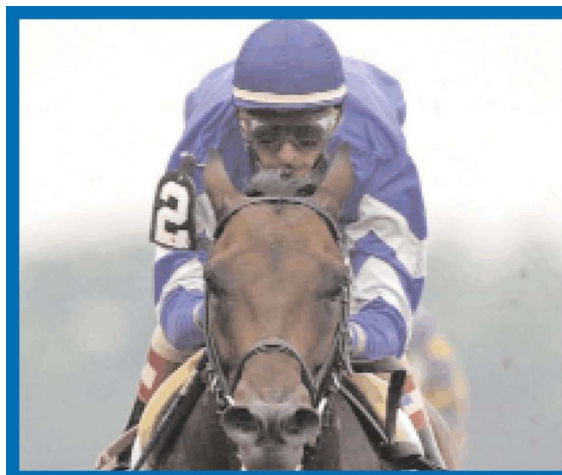
