**CO-TOPPERS AT KEENELAND**

A pair of offerings brought \$100,000 to share top billing at yesterday's session of the Keeneland November Breeding Stock sale in Lexington, Kentucky. [Hip 3010](#), a weanling colt by Grade I winner More than Ready, was the first to bring the session-topping figure when purchased by KGBJ Stables from the consignment of Peter and Gina Kirwan's Glenmalure Farm, agent. The chestnut colt is out of Ministra (Deputy Minister). Also bringing \$100,000 was [hip 3038](#), **Norwegian Wood** (Wild Again). The three-year-old filly, in foal to Millennium Wind, is a half sister to Horse of the Year Holy Bull. Consigned by Millennium Farms Kentucky, agent, the unraced Norwegian Wood was purchased by Bayne Welker, agent. Through nine of 11 sessions, Keeneland has sold 2,186 horses for \$232,687,800. The average is up 26.4 percent from a year ago and the median is up 36.7 percent.

**SYMBOLI KRIS S TO SHADAI**

Japan's reigning Horse of the Year **Symboli Kris S** (Kris S.--Tee Kay, by Gold Meridian) has been syndicated for a reported \$15 million and will stand the 2004 breeding season at Shadai Stallion Station on the Japanese island of Hokkaido. The four-year-old is expected to start twice more before retiring, tackling the Nov. 30 G1 Japan Cup and the Dec. 28 Jpn-G1 Arima Kinen. Should he win those two races, his syndication pricetag would soar to \$17.5 million, with 60 shares selling for \$291,667 each. Symboli Kris S won last season's Arima Kinen and the 2002 and 2003 runnings of the Jpn-G1 Tenno Sho and was third in the 2002 Japan Cup. On the board in 12 of 13 starts, the dark bay has won seven times and earned \$6,121,006.

June, Presidentialaffair reeled off three straight wins at the Jersey shore oval before just being nosed out of a win in the Maryland Million Classic in his last start Oct. 11. The bay set the pace at Aqueduct yesterday, with pedestrian fractions of :24.42, :48.45 and 1:12.09 and had enough "We bounced out of there and he came away in good order," said winning rider Richard Migliore. "He made my job easy rating him; he wasn't headstrong at all. I've watched a few races of him and he's :44 fast. My job was to get him to contain it. He was really reaching for it the last sixteenth. Having broken her maiden at the third attempt in a conditions event at Compiègne Apr. 30, Walkamia entered the stakes fraternity for the first time when fifth in the Listed Prix Madame Jean Couturie at Vichy July 22. She returned to winning ways with victory in another conditions race at Maisons-Laffitte Sept. 22 and followed up with a second-place finish in the Listed Prix Joubert at Saint-Cloud Oct. 3. Starting in her first group contest here, she swooped wide and late to justify the faith of the punting support and garnered France's final group race of the season. Champion-jockey elect Christophe Soumillon settled Walkamia in rear for much of the race and coaxed added momentum from his mount with a half mile remaining. The eventual winner made her bid on the wide outside approaching the final furlong, led soon after and ran on strongly in the closing stages to comfortably account for the British-trained challenger Monturani.

Switched to the outside for her stretch run, the filly quickened gamely at the top of the straight and forged to the lead late to score by 1 1/4 lengths. "She was still green," commented winning jockey Koichi Tsunoda. "She did not like being in tight quarters, so I moved her to the outside. She was very impressive in the stretch." The filly will be targeted for the G1 Hanshin Juvenile Fillies Dec. 7.

**\$800-MILLION AND COUNTING**

In the year 2000, the major North American and European yearling and mixed sales (the yearling sales plus Keeneland November and Tattersalls December) totaled an estimated (by me, unofficially) \$1 billion. The total fell to an estimated \$850-million in 2001, and fell further to an estimated \$725-million last year. With three days to go at Keeneland November--after Monday, midway through Book 5--the corresponding 2003 gross crashed through the \$800-million mark (estimated \$573-million in yearlings plus \$228-million at Keeneland). With a very strong December catalogue at Tattersalls, it seems just a formality that this year's sales will be the second-highest total, at least in the last 20 years, at somewhere over the \$900-million mark.

What is very significant about that is that nobody thinks that the pedigrees available at auction have improved. We saw for certain at the yearling sales that relatively weaker first dams did not dissuade buyers, who focused first on the sire and then the individual. We have seen it even more so at Keeneland the last two weeks. It's not that the good-to-top first dams have dropped in value. Quite the reverse. They're just not on the market. If they were, that \$1-billion mark would be shattered in a hurry.

A practical redefinition of what is an acceptable first dam is underway in the marketplace. The old formulas, whatever they were, no longer apply. That by itself gives pause for thought. Markets which get out of hand have a tendency to crash. On the other hand, markets do grow and change. As I was saying last week, evidently the money is there, and this is the best available. But then the \$1-billion question is, what are the new formulas? That's what we really need to know. The Committee hasn't reported back to us on that yet (they say they've been very busy just keeping track of developments). They're working on it, they say. We'll let you know.

**Tiznow Gets the Call**

Being by Relaunch's California son Cee's Tizzy, Tiznow would have been an unlikely candidate to be one of the first 'new' horses to earn the respect of both European and American buyers alike. There's no doubt, the pond is pretty wide these days in stallion terms, yet there will be horses who are acceptable to both. Of course, beating first [Giant's Causeway](#) and then Sakhee in successive Breeders' Cup Classics was good for his name recognition. He's a big, good-looking dude, too, and he seems to be throwing good-looking foals. Through Book 3 (Monday's *Insta-Tistics*), his nine foals at Keeneland November had averaged \$133,556, over four times his stud fee. This surprisingly beat Point Given, who had 15 sell for a \$122,667 average, less than his advertised 2002 fee of \$125,000. In a sale in which The Thoroughbred Corp. has had a huge impact--even in Books 2 and after--Point Given's weanling average was undoubtedly the low point. All it really means is that the Point Givens aren't flashy weanlings, so it will be interesting to see how they develop for next year's yearling sales.

In an incredibly strong foal market, two other first-year sires registered six-figure weanling averages (5+ sold) by the end of Book 3. The crack miler El Corredor had seven weanlings average \$116,000, but you want to talk about a name recognition problem? Americans may love him, but no European I spoke to had the slightest idea who he is. They've just about heard of [Mr. Greeley](#), and they definitely know Gone West. For the moment, at least, El Cordeor is strictly an all-American sire. Aptitude, Juddmonte's very good son of [A.P. Indy](#) who everybody has heard of, came next, with eight selling for an average of \$111,125. Three \$10,000 sires who had very good sales through Book 3 are: the very speedy Forrest Camp (10, avg. \$82,900); Forty Niner's son Ecton Park (5, avg. \$77,800, including a \$250,000 colt); and Pin Oak's Unbridled horse, Broken Vow (8, avg. \$68,250). The latter is even developing a little bit of a cult following.

Among first-year covering sires, six averaged over \$90,000 for four or more mares sold in-foal. World champion two-year-old [Johannesburg](#)--another horse who is certain to get a hearing on both sides of the pond--led the group, with 17 in-foal mares selling for an average of \$138,529. Next came last year's champion sprinter, [Orientate](#) (13, avg. \$128,923), followed by [Came Home](#) (9, avg. \$109,444); [Street Cry](#) (7, avg. \$104,286); [Officer](#) (10, avg. \$98,700, some of which were Thoroughbred Corp. mares); and [E Dubai](#) (4, avg. \$91,250). Know what's significant here? No first-year sire of weanlings or covering sire even averaged as much as \$150,000, and only [Point Given](#) stood for more than \$40,000. Contrast that to this year's first-yearling debutants [Fusaichi Pegasus](#), [Giant's Causeway](#), [War Chant](#) and [Lemon Drop Kid](#), who all kicked off at \$75,000 and above, and next year's retirees, [Mineshaft](#), [Empire Maker](#) & co.

**Away From the Sales**

I was interested to read a couple of columns in Sunday's *Daily Racing Form*, by Steve Crist and Alan Shuback. Crist was arguing for a two-day Breeders' Cup Festival. Shuback was criticizing the European Pattern Committee and the BHB for the promotion of filly and mare races in Europe to Group 1 status. I do agree with Crist that the time has come for a two-day Breeders' Cup, and that it must be on Friday-Saturday because America watches football on Sunday. Here's my two cents worth: create three new races, a turf sprint (Oasis Dream would have been 1-to-5), and two turf races for two-year-olds. I'd run the turf sprint on Saturday, and run all four two-year-old races on the Friday, which could then become a Super Futures Day. The further they can move the Breeders' Cup Juvenile away from the Kentucky Derby, the better. Every day helps.

Shuback's column, I thought, displayed some typical misunderstandings about European racing from the American side. First of all, he opined that European owners would still seriously think about selling Group 3 and Listed class fillies to America for \$200,000. Try \$500,000. You might buy a maiden winner for \$200,000. But he also criticized the European Pattern writers, basically, for being pro-active rather than reac-

tive. The Pattern system is far from perfect, but it is about the only aspect of the international horse business where the various countries at least talk to each other and have a system. No, it doesn't work the same way everywhere. For one thing, a far higher percentage of European black-type races are group races than in America, where there are tons of Listed contests (one of the side effects of this is that American sires, who have lots of runners in Europe, like [Nureyev](#), [Riverman](#), and [Lyphard](#) used to, always score very high on the 'percentage-of-GSW' lists). For another, the Europeans make decisions which will alter the course of history, rather than just reflect it. This industry needs more change, not less. The American Pattern Committee maybe should be a little more pro-active itself. Start with the sprinter-milers, please, then maybe we could have a better idea beforehand that the likes of [Distorted Humor](#) and [Elusive Quality](#)--neither a Grade I winner--had big chances to be good sires.

TDN Team Leader Barry Weisbord made a presentation last Friday morning to a group of journalists, investors, potential traders and a scattering of other interested parties about the new project he's undertaking in partnership with some heavy-hitting farms and Keeneland, the internet trading company EquineCommerce.com. Now, Barry told me not to say anything I don't really think, and not to say anything at all if I didn't want to, so there's no pressure from the top here. But he needn't have worried. There are plenty of skeptics who think this market will not develop into anything, and it does depend on Barry, his partners and the trading members being able to generate good listings. Barry, who deserves the industry's annual fictional Entrepreneur of the Year award just about every year, is a tireless worker, and brings to the concept enthusiasm and energy which hasn't been there before. But ultimately it will be the partner farms and trading members who will decide if the concept works and a new Thoroughbred financial market emerges.

There are two areas in particular where market expansion may occur. He/she who has the dam of, or close relation to, impressive maiden winners, etc., can capitalize this week instead of whenever the next sale is. That, I think, has big possibilities. **Cont. p. 5**

## WEEKEND PEDIGREE PERSPECTIVES

Blue hens don't always come from the most predictable places. Take Gwenjinsky: on her first two trips through the sales ring, she realized just \$4,000 as a Keeneland November weanling, and \$9,700 as yearling at the Texas August Sale. She didn't exactly excel on the racetrack either, with only three seconds and a third to show from 10 starts. At stud, however, it has been a different story. From four foals of racing age and three starters, Gwenjinsky has produced three stakes horses. She led off with Glory Glory, a stakes-placed daughter of Honour and Glory. This promising start was improved on with the appearance of Gwenjinsky's second foal Lead Story, a daughter of Editor's Note who took her earnings to nearly \$400,000 with a win in this weekend's GII Churchill Downs Distaff H. Gwenjinsky's third starter is the current two-year-old Capejinsky, a son of Cape Town, who captured the Dover S. at Delaware Park.

We mentioned that Gwenjinsky was sold cheaply as a weanling and as a yearling. However, when she passed through the ring at the 1997 Keeneland November Sale in foal to Honour and Glory, she realized a far more respectable figure when knocked down for \$87,000.

The reason for her appreciation--apart from the Honour and Glory covering--was that her year younger half sister Glitter Woman was just coming off a three-year-old season in which she captured four graded events, including the GI Ashland S. The pedigree has continued to improve in recent years. Not only did Glitter Woman go on to take her earnings to \$1,256,800 over the next two seasons, but her younger half sister turned out to be Unbridled Elaine, heroine of the 1991 renewal of the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

The female line traces back to Swoon, dam of the prolific stakes-winning brothers Swoon's Son and Dogoon, but this branch had been very quiet until the appearance of Gwenjinsky's dam Carols Folly. A daughter of the In Reality stallion Taylor's Falls, Carols Folly did win a pair of stakes at Birmingham. Her pedigree is an outcross at five generations, but there is close inbreeding in the pedigrees of both her parents. Taylor's Falls' sire In Reality is inbred 3x3 to War Relic, and No Trespassing, the dam of Taylors Falls, has Alibhai 4x3. There are quite a lot of commonalities between War Relic and the dam of Alibhai, so perhaps this is the key to the upgrading of the pedigree. It's very probably significant that Unbridled Elaine has In Reality (with the War Relic double) 5x3, while Glitter Woman has that horse 3x3.

Gwenjinsky's first foal, the stakes-placed Glory Glory, continued this pattern since her sire Honour and Glory is a grandson of In Reality. However, Lead Story and Capejinsky, Gwenjinsky's next two runners, are bred on a different pattern. Capejinsky has a very clever pedigree, as he is by Cape Town, a horse whose broodmare sire Seattle Slew is half brother to Gwenjinsky's sire Seattle Dancer.

Cape Town is a grandson of Mr. Prospector and so is Editor's Note, the sire of Lead Story, although Cape Town is by Seeking the Gold, and Editor's Note is by Forty Niner. The Forty Niner/Nijinsky II cross which Lead Story represents has produced seven previous unrestricted stakes winners, including graded scorers Banker's Gold and Announce. Editor's Note is particularly likely to appreciate the Nijinsky II strain, as he has a second dam by Tom Fool (bred on a reverse Menow/Bull Dog cross to Nijinsky II's dam).
