**RECORD-SETTING NOVEMBER SALE WRAPS**

Keeneland closed the books on a remarkable November Breeding Stock Sale yesterday afternoon, with significant increases in the cumulative average and median. The gross receipts of just over \$236 million represented the fourth highest in the history of the event while the overall median (\$32,000) tied the record from 1999. "It was a sale that went way beyond our expectations," said Keeneland's Director of Sales Geoffrey Russell. "It's great to end the year on such a high, positive note, not just for Keeneland, but also for the industry in general. It was an amazing sale."

**Coolmore Cashes in on Top Mare...**

It didn't take long for the sale to reach fifth gear. During the opening day of trade Monday, Nov. 3, John Magnier, bidding on behalf of Coolmore Stud, outlasted J.B. McKathan, acting as agent for Satish Sanan, to land 1999 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies champion **Cash Run** (Seeking the Gold), carrying a foal by Storm Cat. Sanan had sold Coolmore a 50-percent interest in the mare

for a reported \$2.6 million shortly after her retirement from the track. The \$7.1-million pricetag for Cash Run last Monday established a new world record price for a broodmare. But she was far from the only offering to light up the Keeneland sales tote board. (cont. p2)

**“A Once In a Lifetime Opportunity”...**

Buyers at Keeneland had the rare chance to purchase horses from the late Prince Ahmed Salman’s The Thoroughbred Corporation and made the most of that opportunity. **Windsharp** (Lear Fan), the dam of Breeders’ Cup Turf dead-heat winner Johar (Gone West) and carrying a full sibling to that four-year-old, was knocked down to the bid of John Ferguson. On the phone with Sheikh Mohammed during the bidding, Ferguson went to \$6.1 million for the 12-year-old during the Tuesday, Nov. 4 session. She was consigned by Dr. and Mrs. John Chandler’s Mill Ridge Sales. **Spain** (Thunder Gulch), the upset winner of the 2000 Breeders’ Cup Distaff and runner-up in that event the following year, also made headlines when Gerry Dilger of Dromoland Farm survived a bidding war to take home the six-year-old mare, pregnant to Storm Cat, for \$5.3 million. The attractive bay was consigned to the sale by Three Chimneys Sales on behalf of The Thoroughbred Corp. Her weanling colt was next into the ring.

**Furious Bidding for Foals...**

The market was buoyant throughout the sale for weanlings, with a foal topping a session as late as Wednesday night. But it was Spain’s first produce, a colt by Storm Cat, that attracted the most attention. With little time to gather his composure following his purchase of Spain just one hip earlier, Gerry Dilger was back on the cell phone, bidding \$2.4 million on behalf of Dromoland for the April 27 foal. The price was the highest ever for a North American weanling colt. Storm Cat was the sire of the three most expensive foals, including a filly out of Serena’s Tune (Mr. Prospector), a daughter of Serena’s Song; as well as a three-parts sister to GI Acorn S. winner Forest Secrets (Forest Wildcat). A weanling full brother to Point Given was hammered down for \$800,000 to the bid of Chestnut Valley Farm, a pinhooking partnership. The results from Book One were surprising even to the auctioneer. “Even the top ones, the ‘jewels,’ they surprised me the level they went to,” Geoff Russell admitted. “I didn’t expect going into the sale that we’d have a world-record price for a broodmare or a North American record for a foal. I knew the market was strong and I knew that they would be well received, but I was very surprised that we broke that record.”

**Thursday's Finale...**

Keeneland reported sales on 191 horses during yesterday's final session for gross receipts of \$1,262,600. The average was \$6,610 and the median was \$3,500. [Hip 3393](#), **Golden Image** (Strike the Gold), sold in foal to first year covering sire Yonaguska (Cherokee Run), brought a final bid of \$66,000 to top the proceedings. Consigned by John Williams, agent, the eight-year-old mare was purchased by P.F. McCarthy, also acting as agent. A three-time winner at the races, Golden Image is out of Imaglee (Grey Dawn II), making her a half sister to four black-type earners, including GSWs I Rejoice (Lord Gaylord), Millencolin (Dehere) and I'm A Thriller (Tri Jet). **Russell Pleased With the Results...**

"The jewels at the top definitely set the tone," Geoff Russell added. "We joked about it, but as I said earlier, it was a sale of the 'young and the beautiful.' That is the kind of horse that is top of the market at the moment and they were bringing more money this year than they had in the past." Russell was particularly pleased with the performance of the middle market. "[Wednesday] was the only time that the median was down for the sale and the averages were high every day," Russell continued. "I also have to give credit to the tax depreciation going back to September. I think the market in September got a boost from the bonus depreciation that has now carried over into November. I have never met a more optimistic, positive-feeling group of buyers than were here in November."

**ALL ALONG PENSIONED** Alec Wildenstein has announced that 1983 Horse of the Year **All Along (Fr)** (Targowice--Agujita {Fr}, by Vieux Manoir {Fr}) has been pensioned from breeding. The 24-year-old mare, who resides at Three Chimneys Farm in Midway, Kentucky, was barren this year when bred to Cryptoclearance. "She was truly one of the great ones," commented Wildenstein. "My brother Guy and I appreciate the fine home Three Chimneys will provide her for the rest of her days. She deserves nothing less." Bred by the late Daniel Wildenstein's Dayton Limited in France, All Along was a very good three-year-old in 1982, winning the G1 Prix Vermeille while defeating subsequent Arc heroine Akiyda (Fr). Though unplaced in the Arc itself, All Along concluded her 1982 campaign with a second in the G1 Japan Cup, a precursor to her success on the international stage the following year. In the space of 41 days in 1983, All Along captured an unprecedented sequence of the G1 Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe at Longchamp, the G1 Rothmans International at Woodbine, the G1 Turf Classic at Aqueduct and the G1 Washington DC International. Trained by Patrick Biancone, she earned a \$1-million bonus for sweeping the last three races and was the first foreign-based horse to earn the Eclipse as Horse of the Year, and the first to win that award without racing on dirt. She returned at five in 1984 with less success, but concluded her racing career with a second in the inaugural G1 Breeders' Cup Turf at Hollywood Park. With earnings of over \$3 million, she was inducted into the National Museum of Racing Hall of Fame in 1990. Her first foal, **Along All (GB)** (Mill Reef), proved to be her most successful, winning the G2 Prix Greffulhe and the G3 Prix des Chenes as well as finishing second in the G1 Grand Criterium. All Along was later represented by Listed winner **Arnaquer** (Miswaki). Her final foal is **Artist's Dream** (Atticus), a yearling colt.

**SUNLINE PRONOUNCED IN FOAL TO 'ROCK'** **Sunline (NZ)** (Desert Sun {GB}), a 16-time champion in Australia and New Zealand, is in foal to Rock of Gibraltar (Ire) (Danehill), Melbourne's *The Age* newspaper reports. The eight-year-old mare, who won 13 Group 1 events in her stellar career, was covered by the Coolmore stallion several weeks ago, but did not get in foal and was re-booked to the four-year-old. "She is safely in foal and is doing magnificently," Coolmore Assistant Manager Adrian O'Brien told *The Age*. "I don't know what the McKees [owners] have planned for her, but she will remain under our care for a little while."

**VICTORY U. S. A. TO MOCCASIN** Tom Van Meter's **Victory U. S. A.** (Victory Gallop), most recently a solid third behind Halfbridled in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, will cut back in distance and drop in class for Saturday's seven-furlong Moccasin S. at Hollywood Park. Trained by Bob Baffert, the chestnut filly broke her maiden at first asking, was third to the likely champion in the G1 Del Mar Debutante Aug. 30 and second in the G1 Frizette S. Oct. 4. She was given the green light for the Moccasin following a five-furlong breeze in 1:01 1/5 Wednesday at Santa Anita. Julie Krone will be in the irons on Saturday.

Miss Lodi, the winner of last year's GIII Safely Kept H. at Pimlico, finished a respectable third in the seven-furlong GI Humana Distaff H. at Churchill Downs earlier this spring, but didn't hit the board again until a close second three back in the six-furlong West Virginia "Secretary of State" H. at Mountaineer Park Aug. 9. A well-beaten 10th in the slop at Philadelphia Park Sept. 1, Miss Lodi recorded her first win in 13 months when she scored at Keeneland against allowance foes Oct. 5. Close early, the well-supported favorite moved to the fore after a solid half mile, was challenged momentarily by Salty Farma a quarter mile from home, but had enough left in reserve to fend off that foe and draw off to a 3 1/4-length victory.
