**CASUAL LOOK RETIRED**

William S. Farish's homebred **Casual Look** (Red Ransom--Style Setter, by Manila), heroine of the G1 Vodafone Epsom Oaks earlier this year, has been retired and will be bred to another Farish colorbearer, the recently retired Horse of the Year candidate **Mineshaft** (A.P. Indy). The bay is slated to join the broodmare

band at Lane's End Farm in Versailles, Kentucky, sometime next week. Casual Look began her career in Britain under the tutelage of trainer Ian Balding, where, following an eight-length maiden victory in mid-September, she completed the exacta in the G1 Fillies' Mile S. and the G2 Rockfel S.

Her 2003 campaign got off to an inauspicious start with a sixth in the G1 English 1000 Guineas in early May, but she made amends when capturing the Epsom Oaks a month later and ran a good third in the G1 Darley Irish Oaks in July. Shipped stateside following two off-the-board efforts in Group 1 events in late summer, she finished third once again in the G1 QEII Challenge Cup S. at Keeneland, her final start for Andrew Balding, who had taken the reins this term upon his father's retirement. In her first effort for trainer Neil Howard--her final career start--she ran fifth in Saturday's GII Mrs. Revere S. at Churchill Downs. "She may not have cared for the soft ground in the Mrs. Revere, but Casual Look still closed well and put in a very good effort at a distance that may not have been her best," said Howard. "She came out of the race perfectly and now Mr. Farish has decided that her future is in the breeding shed." Mr. Farish said the decision to send Casual Look to Mineshaft--a horse he also bred--was an easy one. "Pedigree wise, they're a perfect fit," he said. "Both have had fantastic seasons, and it's great to be able to mate two homebreds. Casual Look's a lovely mare with good size and a lot of length to her. She's very correct and is really an ideal broodmare prospect." Casual Look concludes her career with a record of 12-2-2-3, with earnings of \$604,422.

**INTO THE GROOVE**

The success of Riichi Kondo's **Admire Groove (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence) in Sunday's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup in Kyoto, Japan--her first Group 1 win--marked the third top-level victory for her family, following in the hoofprints of her dam and granddam, and giving the JRA its first three-generation Group 1 winners. **Smile Tomorrow (Jpn)** (White Muzzle) set a fast early pace while Admire Groove settled well off the lead in 10th. When Yutaka Take asked the well-bred filly for run with a furlong to go, Admire Groove catapulted to the lead and just held off the late-closing Filly Triple Crown winner **Still in Love (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence). "She has always been a filly with Group 1 potential, but she just hadn't gotten there before now," said Take. "She was very relaxed today, so all I was concerned with was timing her run." Admire Groove was third behind Still in Love in the G1 Oka Sho and seventh in the Oaks. After a summer freshening, she returned to the winner's circle in the G2 Rose S. and was coming off a runner-up finish in the Oct. 19 G1 Shuka Sho last time out.

MEGAHERTZ TO FACE MALES IN TURF CUP

Michael Bell's Megahertz (GB) (Pivotal {GB}) will be supplemented to Saturday's GI Hollywood Turf Cup and will aim to become just the second female to win the 1 1/2-mile test in the race's 23rd running. "I would have run her in the [Nov. 30, GI] Matriarch S., but they changed the distance on me [shortening it to a mile]," explained trainer Bobby Frankel. "I was going to run her in the Las Palmas H. [closing day of the Oak Tree meet], but they cancelled that. I was going to ship her to Kentucky for the [Nov. 22, GI] Cardinal H. [at Churchill Downs], but they're having bad weather there." While Megahertz, supplemented for \$12,500, has never attempted 12 furlongs, she "gets 1 1/4 miles very easily," said Frankel. Megahertz won the GI John C. Mabee H. at Del Mar in late July before finishing fifth in the GI Breeders' Cup Filly and Mare Turf Oct. 25. The only female to win the Hollywood Turf Cup was Miss Alleged, whose tally in the 1991 renewal wrapped up an Eclipse Award for the Charlie Whittingham trainee.

Back in 1959, a sister to the remarkable Round Table (winner of 43 of his 66 starts) showed that she too had inherited a fair measure of her family's talents. Named Monarchy, she won the Arlington Lassie S. and was officially rated just five pounds inferior to that year's champion juvenile filly, My Dear Girl.

More than 40 years later, Monarchy's name continues to crop up, usually in association with other very talented two-year-olds or horses with speed to spare, thanks largely to the efforts of her Grade III-winning granddaughter Narrate. This daughter of Honest Pleasure produced two daughters by Mr. Prospector, and both of them have added significantly to the family fortunes.

You'll hardly need me to remind you that Preach, herself a Grade I winner, is the dam of Pulpit, or that her sister Yarn ranks as the dam both of Tale of the Cat and Minardi, the champion European juvenile of 2000. Yarn, of course, is also the second dam of Johannesburg, the world's best juvenile in 2001.

In view of this story of two-year-old excellence, it was no surprise to see that the impressive winners of Saturday's two graded stakes for juveniles in the U.S. were sired by Pulpit and Tale of the Cat. Coincidentally, both these winners--Pulpit's well-connected son Tapit and Tale of the Cat's son Lion Heart--are unbeaten in two starts and both appear to have bright futures, but probably in different spheres of the game.

With A.P. Indy and Unbridled as his grandsires, Tapit surely has prospects of developing into a Kentucky Derby candidate, especially as his second dam is a daughter of Nijinsky II and his third dam is a sister to Relaunch. The only seeds of doubt about his stamina come from the fact that he is yet another very good two-year-old inbred to Mr. Prospector (3x4 in this instance) and that his dam, Tap Your Heels, a minor stakes winner over six furlongs as a two-year-old, is a three-parts sister to Rubiano, a champion sprinter.

Lion Heart, on the other hand, appears to have too much speed to be talked of as a Derby horse at this stage, though we will know a lot more about him if he tackles the Hollywood Futurity over a mile and a sixteenth in five weeks time. That speed was first apparent when this son of Tale of the Cat covered an eighth of a mile in :10 before being sold for a sale-topping \$1.4 million at Fasig-Tipton Florida in February.

His buyer, Demi O'Byrne, commented, "He breezed very well, and I like his sire. He looks like Tale of the Cat, and I hope he can run as fast as he did."

You may recall that Tale of the Cat showed spectacular speed in winning the GII King's Bishop S. over seven furlongs in 1997, when he set fractions of :21.69 and :43.58 before drawing away to win by 5 1/2 lengths. This sparkling display prompted Coolmore to try to buy into the son of Storm Cat and the competition was so strong that the price, reportedly, was \$7.1 million for a 50-percent interest. The remaining half-interest was priced at \$4.5 million, or \$7.1 million if he were to win a Grade I. *Caulfield cont. p4*

Unfortunately, a Grade I victory eluded Tale of the Cat. He completed his five-race three-year-old season with a third in the Vosburgh S., but missed the Breeders' Cup and didn't reappear until July 1998. Although he won two allowances at around a mile (including one on turf) he was again thwarted at the top level, finishing a three-length second to Awesome Again in the Whitney H. over a mile and an eighth and third again in the Vosburgh. His connections were apparently convinced that he was suited by a mile and an eighth, as he was being aimed at the GI Meadowlands Cup H. when he suffered a small fracture in an ankle. The injury surfaced a day after Tale of the Cat had worked five furlongs in :59.4 and trainer John Forbes commented that "horses like Tale of the Cat are just a little too fast for their own good."

Lion Heart has inherited that speed, judging by the way he covered half a mile in :44 on his way to winning his debut. The fact that his winning time of 1:20.6 in the GIII Hollywood Prevue S. represents a new stakes mark must also raise questions about his stamina potential.

It is well worth pointing out that Lion Heart is the fourth graded winner to emerge from Tale of the Cat's very successful second crop, following Be Gentle (Debutante S. over five and a half furlongs), Feline Story (Sorority S. over six furlongs) and Whoopi Cat (Adirondack S. over six and a half furlongs). No wonder the stallion's fee has been raised for next year--especially as one of his graded winners is out of a mare by the unraced Really Secret and another is out of a daughter of Sky Filou, a Group 1-winning sprinter in Australia who is hardly a household name.

Lion Heart's prospects of successfully moving up the distance scale should be helped by the fact that his dam, Satin Sunrise, is a daughter of Mr. Leader. This son of Hail to Reason became one of Kentucky's most prolific sires of winners throughout the 1980s, owing much of his success to the toughness of his progeny. Satin Sunrise embodied this toughness, racing 78 times for 23 wins, including a stakes success over a mile and 70 yards at the age of five.

**A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.**

Significantly, all five of Mr. Leader's Grade I winners--Ruhlmann, Martial Law, Quiet Little Table, Hurry Up Blue and Wise Times--won over a mile and a quarter. Bearing in mind that Lion Heart's half-sister French Satin (by French Deputy) won the GIII Florida Oaks over a mile and a sixteenth, distances of around a mile should hold no fears for Lion Heart. The question will be whether he can carry his speed over nine furlongs or more. If he can, he could prove a bargain, even at his seven-figure price.

**DRESS TO THRILL TO DEFEND MATRIARCH**

Trainer Christophe Clement's **Dress to Thrill (Ire)** (Danehill) was scheduled to ship yesterday from New York to California in order to contest the Nov. 30 GI Matriarch S. at Hollywood, a race she won last year in a thrilling finish. "It's getting cold here and it's time to go to California," said Clement. "I've had luck there in the past with Voodoo Dancer." Dress to Thrill finished fourth in her most recent, the GI Flower Bowl Invitational at Belmont Sept. 27. Clemente will also send French Group 1 victress **Dedication (Fr)** (Highest Honor {Fr}) to the Matriarch. The filly, who captured the G1 Prix de la Foret last year, is coming off an open allowance score at Belmont Oct. 13. The four-year-old fillies will be accompanied by assistant trainer Arnaud Delacour.

His Highness the Aga Khan's Kalanisi has an eye-catching representation as hip [866](#), a filly from the family of Run the Gauntlet from the draft of Churchland Stud. Another of Darley's new sires, Agnes World also has just one in the sale, hip [836](#), a colt from the family of Green Dancer offered by Coppice Farm. Coolmore's Fasliyev, who created such an impression with his first runners in 2003, has a team of 12, including hip [870](#), a filly from Seskin Stud out of a stakes winner. The weekend's action involves the 585 fillies and broodmares. His Highness the Aga Khan's consignment is always well-received and a highlight of the 23-strong draft is hip [1176](#), **Deylviyna (Ire)** (Doyoun {Ire}), from the family of Daylami (Ire) and this year's Prix du Jockey-Club and Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe hero Dalakhani (Ire). The preceding lot **Bayrika (Ire)** (Kahyasi {Ire}) is a daughter of Arc runner-up Behera (Ire), who produced this year's G2 Prix Hubert de Chaudenay winner Behkara (Ire). Both are believed to be in foal to Ashkalani (Ire). Moyglare Stud Farm's offerings include hip [1206](#), **Clear Issue** (Riverman), a half sister to Market Slide, the dam of this year's 2000 Guineas winner Refuse to Bend (Ire) and last year's Melbourne Cup hero Media Puzzle.
