EPSOM CHANGES CONFIRMED

Starting with its 2006 running, the Epsom Derby will be held on the first Saturday in June. The race had been run on the Saturday after the first Wednesday of June. The change was approved by the British Horse-racing Board, which also agreed, for the first time, to allow reserves to be put on standby for the Derby at the 24-hour deadline. That change was put in place after the establishment of a 20-runner safety limit was criticized when horses were eliminated from this year's running of the race. Of the changes to England's 224-year-old Classic, Epsom managing director Stephen Wallis said, "I'm absolutely thrilled by both decisions, but most especially by having the Derby on a set date each year. It's really big news, because it means we will get away from such events as the soccer World Cup final forever and just as importantly, the Derby will be back into the national psyche and people will know exactly which date it will take place."

FERGUSON ISSUES WRIT

Sir Alex Ferguson has reportedly issued a writ against Coolmore Stud regarding his claims over the profits from the stud career of Rock of Gibraltar (Ire). As the

Racing Post stated yesterday, the latest action follows a reported attempt to settle out of court, which is thought to have been rejected by Ferguson. Having owned a half-share in the "Rock" as a racehorse, the Manchester United Football Club manager is thought to have claimed certain stallion ownership rights in the record-breaking colt, who is currently covering in Australia after his first season at stud in Ireland. Public Relations firm Murray Consultants yesterday issued a statement on behalf of John Magnier and Coolmore Stud, which read, "We wish to point out in response to the lodging of legal proceedings against our clients by Sir Alex Ferguson in Dublin, that our clients consider them to be without

Since the fall of 1999, when Four on the Floor took the GI Grey Breeders' Cup S., the Secretariat male line had been without a Grade 1 winner in the Northern Hemisphere. With Florida veteran Tour d'Or--a grandson of Secretariat--the only representative of the male line getting stakes winners with any regularity, it might have been a fair bet that Four on the Floor might end up with the honor of being the last Secretariat line horse to score at the highest level.

That, however, was reckoning without A Huevo and trainer Michael Dickinson. Starting his career in 1999, A Huevo commenced by finishing first past-the-post in his first four outings. The fourth of those came as a track-record setting 7 3/4-length triumph in the West Virginia Breeders Classic, a race which A Huevo subsequently lost after testing positive for clenbuterol. A Huevo came out of that contest with an injured suspensory and knee chips, and Dickinson wasn't able to get him back into competition for almost four years. When he did this August, A Huevo ran poorly in a minor stakes at Mountaineer Park. A Huevo did win his next start, an optional claimer at Delaware Park, and off a preparation which consisted of just two races in 43 months, the seven-year-old gelding then headed into the Dash, the first graded stakes event of his life. Remarkably, A Huevo not only won, but won "with something in reserve," storming home 1 3/4 lengths clear of the GI Breeders' Cup Sprint third, Shake You Down.

As mentioned at the start of this article, A Huevo represents Secretariat's male line. One might expect this to be via one of Secretariat's better known sons, such as Risen Star, General Assembly, Tinners Way, Medaille d'Or or D'Accord. In fact, A Huevo's grandsire is Cold Comfort, a Secretariat son who won just once from 10 starts, and earned only \$12,205. Cold Reception met with a little more success at stud, siring four stakes winners, one of which was A Huevo's sire, Cool Joe, who earned black-type honors in the restricted Maryland Million Sprint. Cool Joe, who is now 21-years-old, stood for only \$500 in 2003, and although he'd been represented by 30 winners from 39 starters, he'd never had a stakes winner until this weekend.

The distaff side of A Huevo's pedigree is a little more familiar. His dam, Verabald, is a two-time winning daughter of the good broodmare sire, Baldski. A Florida-bred, Verabald is a sister to the stakes placed colt, Logistical, and half sister to Jera, a Jeblar filly who captured the Pinellas S. at Tampa. Verabald is also a half sister to Frisson, an unraced daughter of Fappiano who produced two stakes winners, including the GIII Thoroughbred Club of America S. winner Sky Blue Pink. A Huevo's second dam, Maveria, a daughter of Reviewer, was one of only three foals produced by her dam, the Graustark mare, Miz Spock, but the family gains more luster one generation further back. Fly By Venus, the fourth dam of A Huevo, was a multiple stakes winner, and produced the graded stakes winner North of Venus. The fifth dam, Fly Bye Babe, is also the fourth dam of champion sprinter Housebuster.

I have no idea what inspired A Huevo's breeder to send A Huevo's dam, Verabald, to Cool Joe, but inspired is certainly the right term to use for the notion in terms of pedigree pattern. To start with, Cool Joe is not only a grandson of Secretariat, but he's also out of Abbey R, a mare bred on very similar lines to Nijinsky II, since she is by a son of Northern Dancer, out of a granddaughter of Flaring Top, where Nijinsky II is by Northern Dancer and his second dam is Flaring Top.

A look at the distaff side of the pedigree of A Huevo reveals that his maternal grandsire, Baldski, is a son of Nijinsky II, giving A Huevo Northern Dancer 4 x 4 and Flaring Top 5 x 5 through the similarly bred Abbey R and Nijinsky II. If these two related strains of Northern Dancer weren't enough, when we come to study the pedigree of Cool Joe's sire, we see that she is out of the mare Cold Comfort, who is by Nearctic out of a Native Dancer mare, and therefore a three-quarters genetic relative to Northern Dancer, giving A Huevo Cold Comfort/Northern Dancer 3 x 4 x 4.

Given that neither Cool Joe nor Cold Reception had ever sired a graded stakes winner before, we have to ask whether the appearance of A Huevo as a top-class sprinter can be just a fluke, or whether he is yet another horse whose pedigree has been upgraded by an accumulation of genetic relatives?

Take Charge Lady Readies for Falls City:

MGISW **Take Charge Lady** (Dehere) worked five furlongs at Churchill Downs yesterday in 1:00.20 in preparation for the Nov. 27 GII Falls City H. "She was very relaxed the first part of it and we wanted her to finish up pretty good and she did," said jockey Tony D'Amico. "We were very pleased with the work." Take Charge Lady, coming off a sixth-place effort in the Breeders' Cup Distaff, worked in company yesterday, breaking off several lengths behind her workmate and easily blowing past the other horse in the stretch. "We just wanted a target for her to run at a little bit," said D'Amico, who will ride the four-year-old filly in the Falls City. "She ran him down really easy, so that was kind of what we wanted." Take Charge Lady ran second behind Allamerican Bertie in last year's Falls City. In this year's renewal of the race, she will likely meet MGISW **Sightseek** (Distant View), GII Churchill Downs Distaff winner and runner-up **Lead Story** (Editor's Note) and **Awesome Humor** (Distorted Humor).

Quick Tip (Unaccounted For) worked four furlongs around the dogs on Churchill's turf course yesterday in preparation for a start in Saturday's GIII Cardinal H. "She looked good," said trainer Neil Howard. "It looked like she finished good and that was the main thing." Likely Cardinal favorite **Bien Nicole** (Bien Bien) breezed five furlongs in 1:01.60 over a good surface on Monday at Churchill Downs's Trackside Louisville Training Center. The five-year-old mare, winner of the GII WinStar Galaxy at Keeneland, is coming off a ninth-place finish in the Breeders' Cup F/M Turf.
