**MEDAGLIA D'ORO, SIGHTSEEK STAY PUT**

Unhappy with the weights assigned to two of his star runners, **Medaglia d'Oro** (El Prado {Ire}) and **Sightseek** (Distant View), trainer Bobby Frankel has announced that neither will compete in Churchill Downs' upcoming "Big Four Weekend." Edmund Gann's multiple Grade I stakes winner Medaglia d'Oro, originally slated to contest Friday's GII Clark H., and Juddmonte Farms' Sightseek, a four-time Grade I winner this term and the probable favorite for Thursday's GII Falls City H., were each assigned highweight of 125 pounds. Frankel expressed to *Daily Racing Form* that he "wasn't upset with the weight spreads, but I

thought they could have started with 123 and taken everyone down two more pounds. Both of my horses are coming off losses. The most that Medaglia d'Oro has ever carried in a handicap is 123, and the most Sightseek has ever carried [in a handicap] is 121. If they won, then they'd have to start off next year with 125. If you go to another track, what are they going to do? They can't drop you in weight." Medaglia d'Oro finished second as the favorite in the Oct. 25 GI Breeders' Cup Classic; Sightseek was unplaced as the favorite in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

**Take Charge Lady Works Towards Falls City...**

It's hard to imagine that trainer Ken McPeck shed too many tears of sympathy after hearing of Sightseek's defection. His **Take Charge Lady** (Dehere) figures to be the filly to benefit most. The four-year-old, who came of a sharp victory in the GI Spinster S. to be sixth in the Distaff, breezed three furlongs yesterday in an easy :37 1/5 over a Churchill Downs course rated good. "She's been doing so well, I figured that we'd just let her stretch her legs today," explained McPeck.

**MACHIAVELLIAN COLT TOPS TATTERSALLS**

Sheikh Mohammed, represented by John Ferguson, bought the two six-figure lots at the Tattersalls December Yearling Sale in Newmarket yesterday to help ensure the fixture just passed last year's record figures. The sale turned over 3,310,200gns for 161 head sold at an average of 20,560gns, which was a marginal advance on 163 sold for 3,293,400gns and averaging 20,204gns in 2002. The median rose sharply from 9,000gns to 14,000gns this year. Roy and Belinda Strudwick's Ballygallon's Stud in Co. Kilkenny, Ireland, consigned the topper, **Lot 200**, a colt with a pedigree that Sheikh Mohammed knows well. By Darley sire Machiavellian, he is out of Jumilla (El Gran Senor), a mare who raced for Sheikh Mohammed. "He's for Darley and is a quality, athletic colt with a pedigree," said Ferguson, after outbidding agent John Warren at 130,000gns. Ferguson paid 120,000gns for **Lot 142**, a Fasliyev filly out of Go Honey Go (Ire) (General Assembly), a Group 3-winning half sister to The Caretaker (Ire) (Caerleon), dam of this year's GI Flower Bowl Invitational winner Dimitrova (Swain {Ire}) and G1 St Leger winner Mutafaweq (Silver Hawk). "She's an attractive filly and we know the family really well because we own The Caretaker and raced Mutafaweq," said Ferguson. The December Sale resumes tomorrow at 9:30 a.m. with the first of four sessions of foals.

A winner in his debut Oct. 19, Admire Big gave trainer Mitsuru Hashida and jockey Yutaka Take another reason to celebrate following Admire Groove's win in last week's G1 Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup. Settled near the back early here, the colt quickened impressively in the stretch and held off the late challenge of Focal Point to record his first graded stakes victory and remain undefeated. "He lost a shoe in the race," confirmed Take. "It may have affected his performance." According to the colt's connections, the injury will force him to the sidelines for about three months and he will be aimed toward next year's Japanese Derby.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a @ will indicate first-time graded stakes-winners, a ▲ will denote a first-time Grade/Group 1 winner, a + will first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races.

It didn't take long for the numbers to start flashing after four horses had blazed across the line, separated by only three-parts of a length, at the end of Saturday's Hollywood Turf Cup. Whatever the stewards decided, there were going to be claims that justice had not been done, but one man with less cause to worry than most was Dr. John A. Chandler.

If the stewards decided to leave Epicentre as the winner, that would have been another Grade I success in a remarkable year for Juddmonte Farms, for whom Chandler handles the North American racing division.

And if the stewards decided to take down Epicentre's number after his altercation with Bowman Mill early in the stretch, there would be compensation for Chandler. Continuously, the runner-up who had avoided any trouble, is by Diesis, an excellent stallion based at John and Alice Chandler's Mill Ridge Farm, while the third-placed Bowman Mill is a homebred belonging to none other than Dr. John A. Chandler.

Of course, the stewards came to the conclusion that Epicentre had to be placed behind Bowman Mill, so Continuously was the chief beneficiary, with Bowman Mill moving up to second.

Chandler wasn't the only thread running between horses in the first three: Bobby Frankel trains Epicentre and Continuously; Kris S. sired both Epicentre and Bowman Mill; and Diesis was responsible not only for Continuously, but also for the dam of Bowman Mill.

By my reckoning, Continuously is the 42nd individual group/graded winner on the flat by Diesis and his 81st stakes winner, which are remarkable totals for any stallion, but especially so for one who will be priced at \$30,000 for an 11th consecutive season next year.

One of the reasons why Diesis is so reasonably priced is that his offspring have enjoyed many of their finest moments on turf, usually in Europe. His daughters Diminuendo, Ramruna and Love Divine have all won the Epsom Oaks and he has enjoyed group success this year with Sea Dart in Ireland and with Magistretti and Three Valleys (one of Europe's best two-year-olds) in England. According to the latest Blood-Horse Stallion Register, no less than 92 percent of his progeny earnings had been gained on turf, and this naturally limits Diesis' appeal to breeders intent on producing dirt performers for the American market.

Diesis has shown, though, that he can be a very sound choice, not just for owner-breeders, but also for commercial breeders. For example, his yearling average stood at \$176,240 in 2000 and \$152,223 in 2001. This year the star of his yearlings was a colt out of Danehill's daughter Kitza which set a new record at Tattersalls October Yearling Sale when he sold for 1,000,000 guineas (\$1,648,920) to Demi O'Byrne.

There could be more good prices for Diesis at Tattersalls' December Sales, as his triple Group 1 winner Ramruna is among the Diesis mares on offer next week. Bowman Mill is one of six group winners out of Diesis mares this year, with Honor in War (GI Woodford Reserve Turf Classic) among the others. There are now 10 Group 1 winners out of Diesis' daughters, including the outstanding British juvenile filly Queen's Logic, Senure, Crimplene, Cetewayo and Mandar.

To get back to Continuously, this late-bloomer follows Storm Trooper as Diesis' second winner of one of Hollywood's major turf events. Continuously's win makes him easily the best winner out of Play On and On, a Stop the Music mare who gained her only win in 24 starts as a five-year-old. Play On and On in turn is out of Heavenly Blue, an unraced Raise a Native mare who produced nothing out of the ordinary.

Although Continuously is the first black-type performer produced by either of his first two dams, he qualifies as a well-bred horse because his third dam is the outstanding Our Mims--a name which takes us back to the glory days of Calumet Farm.

As a daughter of Herbager, Our Mims was bred to stay quite well and this she did, as she showed by winning the CCA Oaks over a mile and a half and the Alabama S. and Delaware H. over a mile and a quarter. Her efforts made her the champion three-year-old filly of 1977, a year which saw her year-younger half-brother, Alydar, rank second to Affirmed among the juvenile colts. Alydar, of course, was by Raise a Native, so Continuously's second dam was a three-parts-sister to him.

Our Mims' broodmare career could be politely described as anti-climatic, although disastrous might be a more appropriate adjective. Mated to the likes of Raise a Native, Best Turn, Roberto, Spectacular Bid, Seattle Slew and Woodman, she produced 11 foals, of which only four were winners and none were black-type earners.

However, one of her Raise a Native fillies, Mimbet, produced Elmhurst, winner of the Breeders' Cup Sprint, and her Seattle Slew colt Slewvescent hit the Grade I target as a sire through Tout Charmant, Lazy Slusan and Ringaskiddy. This suggests that--as often seems to happen with top-class racemares--Our Mims' ability skipped a generation, and now it has emerged once again in her great-grandson Continuously.

With a Stop the Music mare as his dam, this four-year-old is another example of Diesis' fruitful relationship with mares from the Hail to Reason line. Diesis sired the top mile-and-a-quarter colt Elmaamul and the Group 3 winners Defacto and Duck Row from Roberto mares, plus the Group 1 winner Knifebox from a daughter of Hail to Reason. As he also sired Diadella from a Dynaformer mare and Sacred Song from a Red Ransom mare, it is clearly more than just coincidence that a mating between Kris S. and a Diesis mare produced Bowman Mill.

**Lightnin N Thunder to Bridlewood:**

**Lightnin N Thunder** (Storm Cat--Things Change, by Stalwart) will begin his stud career next season at Bridlewood Farm in Ocala, Florida. "We are excited to have Lightnin N Thunder following in the footsteps of Stormy Atlantic at Bridlewood Farm," said Doug Cauthen, president of WinStar Farm, which campaigned the two-year-old. "They were very similar in pedigree and both were very talented horses whose careers were limited by injury. The sky is the limit and we will support him with nice mares, as is our practice." Out of a Grade I winner, Lightnin N Thunder was a seven-length maiden winner at Ellis Park in July before running third behind Cactus Ridge in the James C Ellis Juvenile S. and second behind Tiger Hunt in the Sept. 1 Cradle S. Lightnin N Thunder was on the board in three of four starts, with one win and earnings of \$68,510. "While he did not get the chance to prove as much as Victory Gallop or Distorted Humor, I think he had the talent to be a Grade I horse," said the colt's trainer Elliott Walden. Lightnin N Thunder will stand for \$4,000. "Lightnin N Thunder brings a strong physical presence and a stallion's pedigree to Bridlewood," said George Isaacs, general manager of Bridlewood Farm. "He will be well-supported by WinStar and Bridlewood and we expect a strong reception from Florida's breeders."

Among the mares due to support him in this first season will be La Papagena (GB), dam of Grand Lodge, and Prince Faisal's G2 Prix Robert Papin runner-up Massara (GB).
