“STAR” OUTSHINES ADORATION IN BAYAKOA

She was sent off a 12-1 outsider, but **Star Parade (Arg)** (Parade Marshal) wasn't watching the tote board. The South American import, who cut out all the running in yesterday's GII Bayakoa H. at Hollywood, was threatened by GI Breeders' Cup Distaff heroine **Adoration** (Honor Grades) as they raced down the stretch, but turned back that challenge and pulled away to win by a decisive 3 1/4 lengths. A maiden winner in her native country, the dark bay filly kicked off her U.S. campaign with a win over optional-claiming company at Del Mar July 27. Second in her next outing, she added a front-running Santa Anita allowance score Oct. 3. The Argentine miss was rank when taken back into second in a Hollywood turf allowance Nov. 13, then tired to be fourth. Allowed to go to the front by new jockey Victor Espinoza through solid splits yesterday, Star Parade had more than enough left down the lane to earn her first stakes triumph. "I just let her run today," Espinoza said. "I didn't even take a hold. I felt Adoration coming a little bit, then I hit my horse just a little to keep her focused and we opened up...this really is a very, very good filly." **Bayakoa H. cont. p2**

CANADIAN HORSE OF THE YEAR TO WANDO

Gustav Schickedanz's homebred **Wando** (Langfuhr--Kathie's Colleen, by Woodman) was named champion three-year-old male and Horse of the Year at the 29th annual Sovereign Awards gala in Toronto Saturday night, which honors the best in Canadian Thoroughbred racing. Following rousing victories in the Queen's Plate S. and the Prince of Wales S., Wando became the seventh horse to capture Canada's Triple Crown with a determined 1 1/2-length tally in the Breeders' S. in front of an adoring Woodbine crowd. The robust chestnut began his sophomore campaign with a second in the Achievement S. at Woodbine in late March, then went on to notch consecutive victories in the Woodstock S. and the GIII Marine S. before endearing himself to racing fans with his Triple Crown heroics. "It's a blessing for any rider to get on a horse like him," gushed jockey Patrick Husbands after riding Wando to victory in the Breeders' S. "He'll do anything you want him to do." Finishing a game fourth in the GI Atto Mile in his first test against elders in mid-September, Wando was given a well-deserved rest by trainer Mike Keogh off a third-place effort in the GIII Indiana Derby. The last horse to win Canada's Triple Crown was Peteski in 1993. Other stars of the evening

No Love for Adoration...

Adoration, off at 7-5, chased the winner into the stretch, but was no match. "Around the three-eighths pole, I had to start picking it up to get to [Star Parade]," jockey Pat Valenzuela said. "My filly picked it up very willingly, but we just couldn't get to the winner. I thought I might have had her measured...but coming out of the turn, I knew I was in trouble." **Bare Necessities** (Silver Deputy), the 9-10 chalk, ran evenly to be third. "I had my filly in contention," jockey Rene Douglas said. "I thought for sure the leaders were going to give it up in the end because they went from a slow pace to a fast pace. I was right behind them, but they just took off again."

Trainer Hidekazu Asami watched with pride as his two runners, Yamanin Sucre and Yamanin Alcyon, came to the wire together in the G1-JRA Hanshin Juvenile Fillies, with the former prevailing by a neck in a thrilling finish. Yamanin Sucre had won at Sapporo Sept. 13 before stepping up in company in the G3-JRA Sapporo Nisai S. Oct. 4 over the same course, finishing third to Moere Espoir (Jpn) and Azuma Sanders (Jpn) (Sunday Silence). Her stablemate, Yamanin Alcyon, aired by five lengths in her career debut Nov. 9. The two fillies broke side by side from post 16 and 17, respectively. Yamanin Sucre's experience gave her the edge in this hotly contested race as she narrowly prevailed over her stablemate, with 1 1/4 lengths covering the first five finishers. Both fillies are granddaughters of champion American racemares. Yamanin Sucre's second dam is Tiffany Lass, the U.S. champion three-year-old filly of 1986, when she captured the GI Kentucky Oaks and the GI Fantasy S. Tiffany Lass, who captured eight of 10 career starts, sold for \$2.3 million at Keeneland November in 1990 while in foal to Nijinsky II and foaled the dam of Yamanin Sucre the following spring. The runner-up is a granddaughter of Althea (Alydar), who took the Eclipse as top two-year-old filly in 1983. She produced Yamanin Paradise, an \$800,000 Keeneland July yearling who developed into Japan's champion two-year-old filly of 1994.

DEAUVILLE DECEMBER DAY 2 The second session of trading at the three-day L'Agence Francaise December Mixed Sale in Deauville saw a gain in aggregate and average, but the overall numbers were still down. Sunday's average was €15,022, up 21 percent from a year ago, but the two-day figure was €17,866, off 16 percent from 2002. Yesterday's top seller was the three-year-old filly **Commercante (Fr)** (Marchand de Sable--Deception {Fr}, by Tropular {GB}), who brought a final bid of €200,000 from Alain Falourd Bloodstock. Consigned by Haras de Bernesq as part of the dispersal of l'Ecurie Fabien Ouaki, the French-bred broke her maiden as a juvenile, then came back this season to capture the G3 Prix de Psyche. She was also runner-up in the G3 Prix de Flore and third in the G3 Prix Penelope and has earned €72,500. Also selling well yesterday was the three-year-old **Senkaya (Fr)** (Valanour {Ire}--Sendana {Fr}, by Darshaan {GB}), who went for €180,000 to Wertheimer et Frere. The filly, from the consignment of HH The Aga Khan's Stud SC, is a half-sister to Sendawar (Ire) (Priolo), who was named champion in England and France after winning the G1 Poule d'Essai des Poulains, G1 Prix du Moulin de Longchamp, G1 Prix d'Isphahan and G1 St James's Palace S. The sale concludes today, with bidding for the final session beginning at 10 a.m.

Fasliyev Filly Tops Weanlings...

A filly from the third crop by Europe's leading freshman sire Fasliyev (Nureyev) topped the weanlings at yesterday's session in Deauville. Sold as **Hip 282**, she was consigned by Haras de Bernesq as part of the dispersal of l'Ecurie Fabien Ouaki and purchased by F. Rohaut for €90,000. Out of the unraced mare **Baronne Volante (Ire)** (Fairy King), the bay is a half-sister to stakes-placed **Marchand Volant (Fr)** (Marchand de Sable). To date, Fasliyev has sired 33 winners from his first crop, including seven stakes winners. His four Group winners are headed by G1 Cheveley Park S. heroine Carry On Katie and G2 Prix Robert Papin victor Much Faster (GB). The top weanling colt yesterday was **Hip 306**, a son of Peintre Celebre out of Far Distance (Distant View), who brought €75,000 from Paul Nataf, agent. From the family of G1 Epsom Derby winner Quest for Fame (GB), he was also part of the Ouaki dispersal. Sophomore sire Peintre Celebre (Nureyev) has sired Group 1 winners Dai Jin (GB) and Pearl of Love (Ire).

MIDLANTIC MIXED SALE OPENS The buyers and consignors had to brave the winter weather, but the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December Mixed Sale opened yesterday as planned in Timonium, Maryland. The first of two sessions featured broodmares and broodmare and racing prospects. Three mares attracted final bids of \$52,000 to top the opener. The first, Hip 9, was **Jazz Lady** (Indian Charlie--Jazzy One, by Horatius), a three-year-old filly sold as a broodmare prospect. The winner of a division of the TTA Sales Futurity at Lone Star Park, the bay was consigned by Walnut Green (Jones Bros.), agent, and bought by Josham Farms Ltd., agent. Out of a multiple-stakes winner of \$248,848, Jazz Lady is a half-sister to MSW Bruanna (Housebuster). The second co-topper was Hip 71, the unraced three-year-old filly **Picasso's Girl** (Broad Brush--True Affair, by Believe It), in foal to freshman sire Malibu Moon. From the consignment of Bill Reightler, agent, she was purchased by Tony Everard, agent. Her dam was a two-time Grade III winner of \$501,069. Rounding out the trio was Hip 276, 11-year-old **Hooked** (Known Fact--Midnight Rapture, by Giboulee). In foal to MGSW Broken Vow (Unbridled), whose first foals are weanlings this year, she was hammered down to Robert H. Harris from the consignment of Marshall W. Silverman, agent. The bay, a half-sister to MGSW Lemhi Go (Lemhi Gold), has produced two winners from three foals of racing age. The Midlantic December Sale continues today with a session of weanlings, yearlings and horses of racing age. Bidding starts at 10 a.m.

CANCELLATIONS CONTINUE Still feeling the effects of the early snowstorm that hit the area Friday, three Northeast tracks called off racing for the third straight day Sunday. New York's Aqueduct Racetrack, Pennsylvania's Philadelphia Park and West Virginia's Charles Town all canceled their cards yesterday. The Big A and Charles Town are scheduled to be back in action Wednesday, with Philly Park set to resume racing this afternoon.

A solid third behind House Party in the Sept. 6 GIII Endine H. at Delaware Park, she returned to the Jersey Shore and made it three in a row at her summer base with a front-running tally in the Sept. 27 Red Cross S. She shipped across the country for her most recent start and cut out the early fractions, but faded to fifth in the Oct. 25 Very Subtle H. at Santa Anita. The Florida-bred had been off the board in two prior turf tries, but found herself on that surface once again after the trip back to her home state for this. Mooji Moo was breathing down Petrina Above's neck from the start and drove past her in the final yards before edging clear late.

Eddery was held winless in three mounts in the International Jockeys' Challenge at Champs de Mars racetrack, but was philosophical about the final day of his illustrious career. "I still had a really good time and enjoyed every minute of it. The Mauritius Turf Club has always been good to me. I will come back, but only for a holiday." SHIBATA WINS WORLD SUPER JOCKEYS SERIES

Local representative Yoshitomi Shibata accumulated 48 points--six better than his nearest competitor--on his way to capturing the 17th annual World Super Jockeys Series (WSJS) at Hanshin Racecourse in Japan. Held over two days, with points being awarded from a total of four races, the WSJS brought together 14 outstanding jockeys from Europe, North America, Oceania, Asia and Japan. Shibata, from the Japan Racing Association, earned 20 points with a first-place finish aboard **Verdurous Hill (Jpn)** (Timber Country) in the Golden Spur Trophy and 11 points with a fourth aboard **Meisho Battler (Jpn)** (Meisho Homura {Jpn}) in the Golden Whip Trophy, both on Friday. Earning just two points with a 10th in the first of Saturday's races, the Golden Boots Trophy, Shibata sealed the victory while riding **Sanrei Fleur (Jpn)** (Dance in the Dark {Jpn}) to a runner-up finish in the Golden Saddle Trophy. Australian Damien Oliver, victorious in the Golden Saddle on **Albiereo (Jpn)** (Sunday Silence), earned 42 points to be second in the Series. Other jockeys involved included Irish-based jockey Kieren Fallon (fifth with 32 points); U.S.-based Edgar Prado (ninth with 22 points); U.S.-based Jose Santos (seventh with 27 points); French-based Christophe Soumillon (12th with 17 points); and Japanese-based Yutake Take (11th with 20 points).

ANOTHER DIAMOND FROM THE EIGHT CARAT MINE?

The three-year-old colt **Mutheer (NZ)** (Zabeel {NZ}), a grandson of the famed broodmare Eight Carat (GB), easily handled his racing debut at Randwick Dec. 3, winning by 3 3/4 lengths while posting a class-record time of 1:24.74 for the 1400 meters. "He's taken a while, a long while but he's such a big horse he needed the time," trainer Graeme Rogerson told *racenet.com.au*. "He'll have one more run over maybe a mile or 1800m and then he'll go for a break. It won't be a long break as he's such a big horse, the last thing he needs is a long spell. Don't get me wrong, he's got a long way to go, but there's a lot of promise there." A NZ\$1.05 million yearling purchase by Nasser Lootah at Karaka's Premier Sale in 2002, Mutheer was produced by Group 1 winner Our Marquise, herself a half to four Group 1 winners. A full brother Shower of Roses (NZ), a Group 1 winner last season, the three-year-old will target the 2400-meter G1 AJC Derby in the autumn. "Looking at his pedigree though, imagine how much he'll be worth as a stallion and what he'll be worth if he does win the Derby," Rogerson added.
