EUROPEANS WORK IN HONG KONG

Overseas challengers for Sunday's Hong Kong International Races were out in force at Sha Tin for the first time yesterday. The French team, numbering six, all did light exercise on the all-weather circuit. Cup contenders **Bright Sky (Ire)** (Wolfhound) and **Tigertail (Fr)** (Priolo) were followed by **Fair Mix (Ire)** (Linamix {Fr}), **Polish Summer (GB)** (Polish Precedent), **Vallee**

Enchantee (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) (Vase) and **Special Kaldoun (Ire)** (Alzao) (Mile). Godolphin's **Firebreak (GB)** (Charnwood Forest {Ire}), who will have the assistance of jockey Frankie Dettori for the Mile, also enjoyed a light canter. "He's well, runs well fresh and has won over a mile in Dubai, so the trip should pose no problems," commented travelling head lad Steve Avis. British representatives **Falbrav (Ire)** (Fairy King) and **Rakti (GB)** (Polish Precedent), the market leaders for the Hong Kong Cup, made their first appearances on the track, where both enjoyed a quiet canter. **Acclamation (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}), Europe's main hope for the Sprint, also stretched his legs, as did fellow Sprint hope **Deportivo (GB)** (Night Shift), who was making his first track appearance after a delayed flight from England. Of Acclamation, groom Leslie Jefford said, "He travelled well and I am happy with the way he has settled in."

DEAUVILLE DECEMBER SALE WRAP-UP

L'Agence Francaise's December Mixed Sale concluded Monday in Deauville with 2-percent decline in aggregate and a 16.5-percent drop in average. The final session was topped by [Hip 621](#), six-year-old **Full of Elegance (Fr)** (Cadoudal {Fr}--Full of Pep {Fr}, by Hard To Beat {Ire}), in foal to Lavirco (Ger). A half-sister to four steeplechase stakes winners, the unraced mare was consigned by Haras du Chenet and purchased for €32,000 by MAB Agency. There was also sessions of yearlings and horses in training held Monday. The yearlings saw 61 lots bring an aggregate of €383,400 for an average of €6,285, up 21.6 percent from 2002. Twenty-two horses in training sold for a gross of €218,600 and an average of €9,945, a gain of nearly 27 percent on last year. **Deauville stats, p4**

Haras Firmamento, the breeders of Sunday's GII Bayakoa H. winner Star Parade (Arg), entered a strong three-horse team in the G1 Copa de Plata. The favorite was Empenosa Fitz (Arg) (Fitzcarraldo{Arg}), who won this race last year, but was coming back after an 11-month layoff. She was joined in the gate by a pair of Group 1 winners, three-year-old Perugia Wells (Poliglote {GB}) and five-year-old Miss Loren. Perugia Wells set the pace, closely followed by La Virtual, with Empenosa Fitz in the middle of the group and Miss Loren near the back of the pack. La Virtual took the lead as they came into the stretch, but Miss Loren and Paulistinha were closing. With the leader drifting badly in the final 50 yards, Miss Loren managed to squeak by, but Paulistinha was bothered badly and crossed the line in third. The stewards took a look at the finish, and La Virtual was disqualified from second and placed third.

As there was nothing more important than a Grade II over the latest weekend, I hope you won't mind if I harp back to the last day in November, when the British-bred Sweet Return gained a thoroughly deserved victory in the GI Hollywood Derby.

That victory set the seal on an excellent year for his sire Elmaamul, a Shadwell stallion who has collected a few air-miles during his 16 years. This top-class son of Diesis will soon begin his second consecutive season at the Beechwood Grange Stud in northern England at a fee of only £2,000--a fee which surely represents very good value in view of the achievements of Elmaamul's current crop of three-year-olds.

This crop, sired at a fee of £3,500 when Elmaamul was temporarily based at Banstead Manor Stud, contains only 39 foals, but it has produced three Group winners. In addition to Sweet Return there is Risk Seeker, a dual Group 3 winner over 1 7/8 miles in France who is inbred 3x2 to Roberto, and Lateen Sails, a Juddmonte-bred who took the G3 Prix Daphnis by five lengths for Godolphin.

It may also pay Californian racegoers to remember the name of Salcombe, another of Elmaamul's talented three-year-olds, who was bought for 170,000 guineas at Tattersalls at the end of October on behalf of Wally Dollase.

In view of his fee, you won't be surprised that some of Elmaamul's good winners this year are out of mares with unexceptional records, the exception being Risk Seeker, who is out of a Group 2 winner. Salcombe is out of an unraced mare, Lateen Sails is out of a winner of one race and Sweet Return is out of Sweet Revival, a mare who finally got her head in front at the 14th attempt, at the age of five. Two of Sweet Revival's early defeats were in selling handicaps (where the winner is put up for auction) and her Timeform rating in the year of her victory was 41--fully 90 pounds below the year's top-ranked horse.

Sweet Return's Grade I success provides an object level on the vagaries of bloodstock breeding, illustrating how matings between the same mare and stallion can produce wildly different results. A previous visit paid by Sweet Revival to Elmaamul resulted in a colt named Classic Revival. When Classic Revival made his debut in a National Hunt Flat Race in June, he was beaten 85 lengths into 19th place and he has since failed to complete the course in two appearances over hurdles.

Sweet Return, on the other hand, showed good form at two in England, where he failed by only a head to land the G3 Solario S. Since his transfer to California, he has won a division of the Oceanside S., finished a creditable third in the GII Del Mar Derby and been beaten only a head in the GII Oak Tree Derby. His Hollywood Derby success boosted his earnings to nearly \$525,000--a pretty good return for a colt of his humble origins.

His broodmare sire, Claude Monet, belonged to the first crop by the great Affirmed and became one of his first stakes winners. Indeed, he arrived at the 1984 Derby unbeaten in three starts, but finished towards the rear and was reported to have suffered a breathing problem. Claude Monet raced only one more time, at four, when he won at Longchamp. He retired to stud in Newmarket, but sired nothing out of the ordinary and ended his days in South Africa.

The next dam, Semperflorens, cost only 1,300 guineas as a foal and showed little ability in three starts at two. Her sire, Don, was a high-class miler, winner of the St James's Palace S. at three and the Lockinge S. at four, but he too achieved little as a stallion. Sweet Return's third dam Firelass, a fair winner at two, was by Firestreak, a stallion best known as the sire of Snow Knight, a Derby winner who went on to become America's champion turf horse of 1975.

As Sweet Return is the first stakes winner produced by any of these three mares, the credit for his talent must go largely to Elmaamul.

During his racing days, Elmaamul pretty much filled the criteria laid down by Wally Dollase after his purchase of Salcombe.

"The things I look for are conformation, they must look like a racehorse, they must be sound for California," said Dollase.

Elmaamul's conformation was good enough for him to cost Hamdan Al Maktoum 320,000 Irish guineas as a yearling in 1988. He must have looked like a racehorse, and he quickly showed himself to be well above average. Two starts in 1989 yielded two very decisive victories, and Elmaamul fulfilled his promise during a testing three-year-old campaign. After finishing third in the Derby, Elmaamul specialised at a mile and a quarter, notably defeating the older horses to take the G1 Coral-Eclipse and G1 Phoenix Champion S.

As Sheikh Hamdan had retired the magnificent Nashwan to his Nunnery Stud at the end of 1989, together with Nashwan's excellent half-brother Unfuwain, it was no doubt felt that there wasn't enough demand for high-class middle-distance stallions from British breeders for Elmaamul to join them.

Instead, Elmaamul joined Dayjur as one of the first stallions at the Sheikh's Kentucky farm. Unfortunately, that decision has made Elmaamul's stallion career an uphill struggle from the word go. Even though he was competitively priced at \$10,000, scepticism about the value of European middle-distance turf horses limited demand for his services and he sired only 70 foals in his three years in Kentucky.


With his female line also being responsible for Zafonic, the champion of his generation in 1992 and 1993, Elmaamul proved popular when he returned to England for the 1994 season, when he attracted 70 mares at a fee of £3,500. By then, though, the all-too-familiar roller-coaster ride of highs and lows had been set in motion.

Each high is followed by a better bunch of mares the following spring, but the lows also tend to repeat themselves.

Elmaamul's first English crop contained his first Northern Hemisphere Group 1 winner, Muhtathir, but Muhtathir's first Group 1 victory came towards the end of 1999, by which time Elmaamul had left England for Italy. He spent three years there before moving back to England, leaving me to wonder what he might have achieved had he been based in Britain or Ireland from the very start.

CORNELIO VELASQUEZ TAKES CLASICO DEL CARIBE Jockey Cornelio Velasquez piloted **Cafajeste (Pan)** (Alphard {Arg}) to a three-length victory in the \$300,000 Clasico del Caribe at El Commandante in Puerto Rico Sunday. The three-year-old colt, bred by Haras San Miguel, owned by Stud Full House and trained by Rafael Fernandez, closed from the back of the pack to win going away as the 2-1 favorite. The final time for the mile and an eighth was 1:53.73 over the sloppy track. The Clasico del Caribe brings together a field of three-year-olds from the Caribbean and the Americas. This year's event included representatives from Colombia, the Dominican Republic, Panama, Puerto Rico and Venezuela. Jockey John Velazquez was also on hand for this year's race, riding 7-2 **Gran Esmeralda (Ven)** (Slew Prince) to a fourth-place finish.

MALIBU MOON FILLY TOPS FASIG-TIPTON A weanling full sister to MGSW Perfect Moon (Malibu Moon) led the way at yesterday's finale of the Fasig-Tipton Midlantic December Mixed Sale at Timonium, Maryland, realizing the highest bid of the two-day event. Hip [320](#), consigned by Litz Bloodstock Services, agent for Mr. & Mrs. Hugh J. O'Donovan, was knocked down for \$150,000 to the Castleton Group. Out of the Parfaitement mare Perfectly, the Maryland-bred chestnut is thus far the highest-priced weanling for freshman sire Malibu Moon, who has 11 winners in 2003. Perfect Moon, winner of the GII Best Pal S. earlier this year, shipped in to be third in last Friday's \$1 million Delta Jackpot. Topping the colts was Hip [366](#), a weanling out of the second crop from New York-based sire City Zip (Carson City). Hart Farm went to \$55,000 for the Jeffrey T. Minton, agent for Akindale Farm, consignee, who is out of the Personal Flag mare Sugar Blues. Sugar Blues is a half sister to GISP Jazzing Around, a well-rounded New York-bred that banked nearly \$500,000. Session totals remained on an even keel from last year's figures, with gross (\$1,610,000 in 2003 vs. \$1,655,500), average (\$8,256 in 2003 vs. \$8,713) and median (\$4,000 in 2003 vs. \$4,050) going virtually unchanged. Overall, numbers were on the up, as the average jumped 14.5% from \$6,557 last year to \$7,506 in 2003; and the median went from \$3,200 last year to \$3,700 in 2003. BAFFERT LOSES APPEAL The U.S. Supreme Court will not hear trainer Bob Baffert's appeal regarding a positive drug test from three years ago, it was reported yesterday. The Baffert-trained filly Nautical Look tested positive for morphine after winning at Hollywood Park in May of 2000, and the conditioner was suspended for 60 days. He filed suit against the California Horse Racing Board, claiming that blood samples from the filly had been destroyed intentionally, and a federal court judge in California overturned the suspension and awarded Baffert \$102,780 for legal expenses. But the CHRB appealed and the decision was reversed. Yesterday's Supreme Court ruling put an end to Baffert's attempt to continue the case.
