MAPLEJINSKY DEAD

MGISW **Maplejinsky** (Nijinsky II--Gold Beauty, by Mr. Prospector), dam of champion Sky Beauty, died Dec. 5 of a ruptured aorta. The 18-year-old mare was carrying a foal by Giant's Causeway. A daughter of champion sprinter Gold Beauty and a half to European champion Dayjur, Maplejinsky was bred in Florida by Mrs. Georgia

E. Hofmann and sold for \$750,000 as a KEEJUL yearling. She won five of her nine career starts for owner Susan Kaskel and trainer P.G. Johnson, including the GI Alabama S. and the GI Monmouth Oaks. Her first foal was Sky Beauty, who captured the GI Coaching Club American Oaks, GI Mother Goose S., GI Alabama S. and GI Acorn S. at three and was named

champion older mare of 1994 after winning the GI Ruffian H., GI Shuvee H., GI Hempstead H. and GI Go for Wand H. Her last foal is a weanling filly by Rahy. Maplejinsky was purchased by Osamu Yasuda for \$2.7 million at the 1994 KEENOV sale while in foal to A.P. Indy. Exported to Japan, she returned to the U.S. in 1999 and was owned by Richard Santulli's Jayeff "B" Stable at the time of her death. She was buried in the cemetery at the Old Bradley Place division of Three Chimneys in Midway, Kentucky.

BRIGHT SKY SHARP IN HK CUP WORK

Trainer Ellie Lellouche was delighted with the performance of **Bright Sky (Ire)** (Wolfhound), who dashed the final two furlongs of the Sha Tin Turf in 23.20 seconds under her big-race jockey Dominique Boeuf. "Everything is going to plan and her work today was just ideal," Lellouche said. "Bright Sky is back over 10 furlongs in the Cup, a better distance for her than the extra quarter mile of her last race, the [GI] Breeders' Cup Turf. I'm very happy with her." Denmark's **Dano-Mast (GB)** (Unfuwain), third in the race last year, did only light work on the dirt surface under

trainer Flemming Poulsen, who said, "He has had a bit of travel sickness and his blood count was wrong, but it is okay now. He is still fit enough to do himself justice on Sunday." **Falbrav (Ire)** (Fairy King) looked relaxed as he cantered on the all-weather and was at ease with his surroundings as he headed home after the exercise. Conditioner Luca Cumanì is going to let his charge get to know the grass track with a gentle canter today before giving him a stronger workout tomorrow. Falbrav's big race partner, Frankie Dettori, endured an injury scare whilst taking part in the first leg of The Sixth Hong Kong International Jockeys' Championship at Happy Valley on Tuesday (*story pg. 2*).

Godolphin's runner **Firebreak (GB)** (Charnwood Forest {Ire}) went half speed on the dirt to the satisfaction of traveling head lad Steve Avis, who said, "Looks well, doesn't he? He hasn't run since Goodwood in July due to a couple of niggling problems. He was due to run at Newmarket [in the G2 Challenge S.] in October, but was withdrawn owing to the same thing. OUR MIMS EUTHANIZED Our Mims, the 1977 three-year-old filly champion, was euthanized Dec. 9 at the Rood and Riddle Equine Hospital in Lexington after a bout with colic. ReRun, the equine retirement foundation that arranged for her adoption in 1999, has reported. She has been buried at the place of her birth, Calumet Farm. She was the first foal of Sweet Tooth, also the dam of Alydar. In 1977, she won five times, including the Fantasy, the Coaching Club American Oaks and the Delaware Handicap. She was retired in 1978 with a career record of six wins from 18 starts and earnings of \$368,034. She was sold by Calumet in a January 1991 sale at Keeneland and was purchased by Narvick International for \$190,000. She had 11 foals, six of whom started. She did not produce a stakes winner. Our Mims was adopted on February 9, 1999 and spent the last years of her life under the care of Jeanne Mirabito. "Never was a horse more loved or cherished than this great mare," said Mirabito. "It was an honor to have her as part of my family." Our Mims was laid to rest at Calumet. "The grounds crew was extraordinary in the gentleness they showed their champion," said Mirabito. "This mare was given a burial fit for a queen."

OLIVER WINS CHAMPIONSHIP; DETTORI INJURED Australian jockey Damien Oliver pulled out a narrow one-point victory over U.S. representative Victor Espinoza in yesterday's Sixth Hong Kong International Jockeys' Championship at Happy Valley in Hong Kong, but the event got off to an ominous start when Frankie Dettori suffered an ankle injury after his mount broke down the evening's first event. Oliver won that race aboard **Ace Academy (Aus)** (Royal Academy) and finished second on **Zerubbabel (NZ)** (Carnegie {Ire}) in the next leg, but didn't wrap up the victory until earning a crucial two points when fifth on **Indubitably Bliss** (Dixieland Band) in the final leg. For Espinoza, it was too little too late, as his victory in the final leg on **Classa Win** (Tremolino) saw him finish runner-up by the narrowest of margins. Oliver edged out Espinoza with a 20 to 19 score. "I'm very pleased and proud to have been able to do this," said Oliver, who lost by a similar margin to Dettori in 2001. "I came close once before. This time, the bob of the head went my way." Dettori was injured when his mount, **Champion Speed (Aus)** (Danehill), fractured his off foreleg on the final bend. The jockey twisted his ankle while jumping off his stricken mount. Dettori, who had to give up his remaining rides on the card, was taken to nearby Queen Mary hospital for precautionary x-rays, but suffered no broken bones. He should still be fit to partner Falbrav on Sunday. Cumani told *Sporting Life*, "I was at the races and saw it happen. I have spoken to Frankie. He thinks he has just twisted his ankle, and he should be okay."

Vase...

France's **Fair Mix (Ire)** (Linamix {Fr}) covered the firm turf nicely as he quickened up in the straight in preparation for the Vase. "That was exactly what I wanted,"

Trainer Marcel Roland said. "[Jockey] Gerald Mosse was very pleased with the horse. The track here is in very good condition. They just leave a little print and the ground will be no problem for him."

Vallee Enchantee (Ire) (Peintre Celebre) was ridden by Thierry Thulliez upsides stable companion Bright Sky in a fast piece of work on the turf, covering the last quarter mile in 23.20 seconds. She also pleased trainer Elie Lellouche, who added, "No problems. That was good work, she's in good form." Trainer Mick Channon's **Imperial Dancer (GB)** (Primo Dominie {GB}) continues to please head lad Andy Larkin, who explained, "He has still got his summer coat which is remarkable for a horse that has had such a busy season. Mick will do a bit with him on the grass on Friday." It was later announced that the ownership of MGSW Imperial Dancer transferred to Mr. Peter Taplin on Monday, Dec. 8, but that the five-year-old horse would race under his former owner's silks. The Clive Brittain-trained **Warrsan (Ire)** (Caerleon) had his first sight of the Sha Tin track yesterday, cantering slowly for a couple of laps of the turf track. "That was the idea, to let him have a good look at the place. He'll do a stronger gallop tomorrow," said Brittain. German raider **Sabiango (Ger)** (Acatenango {Ger}) had a canter on the sand and looked relaxed, as did **Maktub (Ity)** (Love The Groom), who showed no ill-effects after crashing through the inside rail on the turf track on Tuesday. **Polish Summer (GB)** (Polish Precedent), fifth in the Vase last year, had another light day on the dirt.

Sprint...

English trainer Michael Blanshard, who conditioned **The Trader (Ire)** (Selkirk) to finish fifth in the 2001 Sprint, was present as his charge reacquainted himself with Sha Tin. The Trader looked in fine form as he had a gentle canter on the all weather under exercise rider Fiona Whitfield. "He's a fresh horse, and seems very well in himself," the trainer said. "He's two years older, and a stronger horse. I don't think the ground will be a factor. He's won on fast ground and handled soft at Longchamp. He's best when there's a strong pace up front and he likes to run through horses. I expect that will be what he gets here. He'll do a stronger piece of work tomorrow." Milton Bradley, trainer of another British hopeful **The Tatling (Ire)** (Perugino), is happy with the way his six-year-old has taken the trip to Hong Kong. "We gave the horse a 10-day holiday after his last run at Newmarket in October and he is looking very well," Bradley said. "His temperature has been spot-on, he's been eating and drinking fine. He is the best horse I have trained." Meanwhile Freddie Hollis, the traveling head lad responsible for **Acclamation (GB)** (Royal Applause {GB}), enthused, "[Acclamation] will love the ground here and there have been no problems with his well-being since he got on the plane. We're looking forward to the race."

The winner of the GIII Cowdin S. at two, Sunray Spirit was off for nearly 10 months after that effort, returning to be second in a Belmont allowance race in September of 2002. The chestnut tried stakes company in his next two outings, running fifth in the GII Forest Hills H. at Belmont that October, then turning up in the Jan. 30 Mekong Cup H. at Nad Al Sheba, where he ran seventh. Back in the States this spring, the Darley colorbearer took a July 17 allowance test at Belmont in his second start of the campaign, but had not been out since running third at Saratoga Aug. 20. The crowd's choice off the layoff, Sunray Spirit took over from second choice Don Six after a half and put daylight between them down the lane for an easy score.

Master David Transferred to Frankel:

Master David (Grand Slam), who in his stateside debut ran a solid second in the Nov. 29 GII Remsen S. at Aqueduct, has been transferred to trainer Bobby Frankel and will be shipped from New York to Frankel's homebase in Southern California. The two-year-old colt began his career in Britain, where he broke his maiden at Thirsk in mid-September for trainer Brian Meehan. Purchased privately from Roldvale Ltd. by Peter Minikes after that effort, the chestnut took to the dirt in his U.S. bow, finishing 3 3/4-lengths adrift of Read the Footnotes in the Remsen while still in Meehan's care. "[Minikes] called and told me he doesn't want to keep the horse in New York over the winter and asked if I'd be interested in training him," Frankel told *The Blood-Horse*. "He's already been a mile and an eighth, so I don't have to do too much with him. If he doesn't like the track out here, I can always point him for the [GI] Wood Memorial [at Aqueduct in April]."

Sackatoga Stables Earns Big Sport of Turfdom Award:

The Turf Publicists of America announced yesterday that Sackatoga Stables, the school bus-riding, free-smiling, jocular pack of pals from Sackets Harbor, New York, who campaigned Funny Cide to victory in the Kentucky Derby and Preakness S., has been awarded this year's Big Sport of Turfdom Award. The award is presented annually to a person or group of people who enhances coverage of Thoroughbred racing through cooperation with the media and Thoroughbred racing publicists. "Throughout the VISA Triple Crown season, and especially in the five weeks between the Kentucky Derby and the Belmont S., [managing partner] Jack Knowlton and his partners cheerfully accommodated countless media requests from all over the state, the nation and even the world," explained TPA president Michele Blanco. "That unflinching cooperation was partly responsible for a near-record crowd at Belmont Park, the highest television rating for a Belmont broadcast in over 20 years and increased interest in our sport."
