STEADY AS SHE GOES AT HONG KONG SALE

It may have failed to match last year's event, when a colt by Desert King (Ire) sold for a record HK\$4.8 million, and did not approach the all-time gross of HK\$56.3 million achieved at the 2001 edition, but last night's Hong Kong International Sale featured lively

trade which produced solid increases in both average and median versus 2002. The average of HK\$1,660,000 (\$213,780) was the second best in the sale's history. "The results of this year's sale are very encouraging," said Winfried Engelbrecht-Bresges, executive director of racing for the Hong Kong Jockey Club. "What we saw tonight was a very strong middle market and that's something that's very healthy for Hong Kong racing." From 25 horses through the ring, all but two realized seven-figure price tags, and six lots sold in excess of HK\$2 million, including hip 28. From one of the final crops of the late Danehill, the Australian-bred colt was purchased for HK\$3.6 million (\$463,619) by Sabrina Chao Sih Ming, whose family is prominent in the Hong Kong shipping business. Sold for A\$360,000 at the 2002 Magic Millions Yearling Sale, the bay is out of Secret Truth (Secretariat), the dam of Chilean Group 2 winner Pleasant Secret (Pleasant Tap) and herself a daughter of the good racemare Truly Bound. Ms. Ming indicated immediately after the sale that her purchase would be turned over to trainer John Moore, currently the second-leading trainer in the SAR by number of wins. Danehill was also responsible for the evening's second most popular offering in hip 17. Out of the Irish River (Fr) mare Spell On You, the New Zealand-bred hails from the female family of Unbridled's Song and GSW Malabar Gold. The gelding was purchased by Wong Cho Bau, a residential and commercial developer in Hong Kong and China, for HK\$2.5 million (\$321,958). Of the three horses to sell which were purchased at American auction houses, the best performer was hip 11. Knocked down for HK\$1.8 million (\$231,809), the Devil's Bag gelding was an \$80,000 purchase at the 2002 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky July Sale. *(Sale Stats p4)*

"He had a nice piece of work there and he is very, very well," said trainer Marcel Rolland after watching **Fair Mix (Ire)** (Linamix {Fr}) speed across the dirt stretch in :22.40. "He showed earlier in the week that



he has a good action on this turf. I just hope there is enough pace in this race as he can pull a bit." Elie Lellouche, trainer of **Vallee Enchantee (Ire)** (Peintre Celebre), explained:

"This race does not look quite as good as last year's, so I can give Vallee Enchantee a chance. She is nearly four now, but she is getting nine pounds from the older horses and that will be in her favour. She has trained well." **Warrsan (Ire)** (Caerleon) worked well on the turf, clocking the final quarter mile in :23.50. "It's been gently, gently, gently with Warrsan," said trainer Clive Brittain. "I've got to say I haven't been as happy with him since June. I'm really looking forward to the race." **Imperial Dancer (GB)** (Primo Dominie {GB}) impressed in his final piece of work. The Mick Channon-trained five-year-old led fellow Vase contender, **Indian Creek (GB)** (Indian Ridge {Ire}), who was partnered by Richard Quinn, over the grass yesterday. The pair quickened up in early stretch and Imperial Dancer stretched out nicely on the bridle, going the last two furlongs :24. "Although he won the [G3] St. Simon S. over a mile and half last time, I am a little worried about his getting the distance in a truly run G1 race," said Channon. "Ideally, I would like to see them slow the pace down a bit at some stage. However, he is in great shape and I am very pleased with the way he is going." David Elsworth, trainer of Indian Creek, after watching his charge spin home in :23.90 added: "I am a lot happier with him now than earlier in the week. I hope he will run well over this trip."

The most important race in Latin America, at a one-turn 2400 meters on the turf, has drawn an overcrowded field of 26, but only 24 competitors can start. The top three-year-olds in the field are G1 GP Nacional (Argentine Derby) hero **Mr. Alleva**, who broke his maiden on this main track, and G1 GP Jockey Club winner **Lancettier**. They will face the unbeaten filly **Lazurita**, who will try to become the first Brazilian to take the race since Imensity (Brz) in 1983. "She'll be trying the distance and running against males for the first time," trainer Mario Rodriguez said. "Her perfect record against her own sex tempted us to give her a shot in the Pelligrini." The team of older horses is headed by **Grand Vitesse**, who was fourth in this event last year, then returned after a 10-month layoff to take the Oct. 12 G1 GP de Honor last time out; and **El Charlatan** (Arg) (Mutakddim), who was beaten just a head by Grand Vitesse, then won the G1 Dardo Rocha three weeks ago; and G1 Estrellas Classic winner **Manpower**.

THE MAKING OF SHA TIN

The first meeting in Hong Kong occurred in 1846 at Happy Valley, a rare tract of flat land on Hong Kong Island. As the years rolled by and the popularity of racing increased, so too did the quality of the product, and it became apparent to the Hong Kong Jockey Club that a more modern facility should be constructed.

A location was selected 10 miles north of the main island in the New Territories, in an area called Sha Tin, but the planned construction proved to be a logistical nightmare. Michael Suen, who became the first District Officer for Sha Tin in 1974, was told, in no uncertain terms, that the first day of racing at the new facility would take place Oct. 7, 1978. Four years seemed to be enough time to accomplish the task at hand, but it proved a challenge for all involved.

"As if I didn't have enough on my plate already...we had to coax the inhabitants to leave Sha Tin Hui [the old village] and the other settlements," explained Suen, who today occupies the post of Secretary for Housing, Planning and Lands. "We had to negotiate, argue, cajole, plead, give a little here and take a strong stand there. It seemed to be never-ending.

"Sha Tin New Town is today home to three-quarters of a million people and also has one of the most magnificent racecourses in Asia, if not the world."

Sha Tin opened its 35,000-seat grandstand on schedule and played host to its first International event in 1988, when six local representatives vied against six invitees from Malaysia and Singapore in the Hong Kong Invitation Cup, the precursor to the International Races.

The Hong Kong Jockey Club has since devoted itself to the development and modernization of its facilities.

"Every new season, racegoers arrive at the two courses to find still more services and facilities have been upgraded," HKJC Chief Executive Larry Wong said. "At Sha Tin, we now have the world's longest Diamond Vision screen. We are also enclosing the saddling enclosure to double the seating capacity to 4,800-guarded against rain by a huge and exciting retractable roof. At Happy Valley, we are giving the entrance a dignified look in keeping with the new millennium."

Sha Tin, which celebrated its 25 anniversary in October, now boasts a seating capacity of 85,000 as it welcomes the world for the International Races.

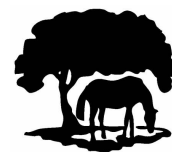

VIKING RULER TO SHUTTLE TO IRELAND New Zealand-based **Viking Ruler (Aus)** (Danehill), who entered stud this season at Cambridge Stud, will head to Ireland's Oak Lodge Stud Dec. 28 to stand the Northern Hemisphere breeding season at the Co. Kildare nursery, according to *New Zealand Thoroughbred Marketing*. "It's an exciting development for Cambridge Stud and for the New Zealand breeding industry to have Viking Ruler going to stand at stud in Ireland," Cambridge Stud owner Sir Patrick Hogan told *NZTM*. Produced by the Group 1-winning mare Tristalove (NZ) (*Sir Tristram), Viking Ruler's third dam is the renowned broodmare Eight Carat (GB). After topping the Easter Yearling Sale at A\$1.5 million, he captured the G1 Spring Champion S. at three. "I believe Viking Ruler is the right horse to shuttle because of his relaxed temperament and his ability to handle travel," Hogan added. "He covered a high-class book of 100 mares in his first season at Cambridge Stud and is a very fertile horse, which is another valid reason for him to shuttle." Viking Ruler commanded a fee of NZ\$20,000 at Cambridge.

HUGS DOWN UNDER

A winner of multiple valuable British handicaps, **Hugs Dancer (Fr)** (Cadeaux Genereux {GB}) has left James Given's Lincolnshire yard and is set to continue his career in Australia. The six-year-old gelding has been Down Under before, running ninth in the Nov. 4 G1 Melbourne Cup at Flemington. Now in quarantine, he will join new trainer Tony McEvoy. Given told *PA Sport*, "It's very sad that he's got to go, and everyone in the yard is pretty upset about it. He's been part of the furniture for the last four years and every season, when he comes back in, you know you're going to get two or three big wins with him." He added, "He's taken us to some big races and big days, but the highlight has to be the Ebor. It's such a tough race and to win from such an awful draw was an amazing performance. It has to have been his finest hour."

NORTON'S COCAINE BAN

Jockey Francis Norton received a four-month worldwide ban at a Jockey Club disciplinary hearing in London on Thursday. Norton tested positive for a metabolite of cocaine, namely benzoylecgonine, in September 2002, but the case has taken nearly 15 months to resolve due to repeated legal wranglings. Norton based his defence around two suggestions; that he drank an exotic herbal tea which may have been responsible for the positive sample, and/or; the positive sample could have arisen due to environmental contamination from handling banknotes. Neither explanation satisfied the Jockey Club's Disciplinary Committee. Jockey Club public relations director John Maxse told *PA Sport*: "The length of the suspension is at the discretion of the disciplinary panel and depends upon how culpable the rider was for the sample." Norton's legal representative Christopher Stewart-Moore added: "The sentence reflects the third of the Jockey Club's findings, which will appear in the Racing Calendar, to the effect that there was no proof of deliberate ingestion of cocaine, given the extremely low reading of the urine test, as agreed by the experts giving evidence at the hearing." Norton's suspension begins Dec. 19, and he will need to pass a medical conducted by the Jockey Club's Dr. Michael Turner before resuming his career Apr. 19. Speaking about the delay in bringing the case to a close, Maxse also added: "It is obviously very regrettable that it has taken such a long time for proceedings to take place. We will be having a look at the case to see what lessons can be learned, if any, which would enable us to speed things up in the future. However, the current system is vulnerable when a legal team is determined to explore every single avenue that is open to them."
