Blood-Horse

AND THE BIDS JUST KEEP ON COMING

After just four days of bidding that included a three-day holiday weekend, 20 of the Coolmore stallion nominations donated to aid the International Red Cross in its efforts to help the victims of the tsunami in Southeast Asia have attracted offers. Paul and Linda Shanahan of Ireland's Ashtown House Stud have bid \$150,000 for a 2005 nomination to Fusaichi Pegasus, while Stan Cosgrove of Moyglare Stud in Ireland has called in an identical offer for Giant's Causeway. Cosgrove has also bid €40,000 for a nomination to Danehill Dancer (Ire). Several stallions have topped their 2005 stud fees, including Galileo (Ire), who attracted a bid of €40,000 from Michael O'Leary of Gigginstown Stud in Ireland; and Hawk Wing, who has drawn an offer of €30,000 from David and Diane Nagle of Barronstown Stud in Ireland. Stuart Ramsey of Turrunga Stud in Australia has matched the stud fee for Encosta de Lago (Aus) at A\$132,000, and Lord and Lady Webber of Watership Down Stud in Britain went to the advertised fee of €55,000 for Rock of Gibraltar (Ire). Bidding closes at 5 p.m. EST on Jan. 11, the second day of the Keeneland January Sale. A complete list of the updated bids appears at the end of the Headline News edition.

Every time a Japanese Group 1 event falls to one of Sunday Silence's offspring--a very common occurrence--I can't help thinking back to the summer of 1990, when this Horse of the Year was forced into retirement by a ligament tear.

At the time, Arthur Hancock commented that:

"It's the end of a wonderfully blessed racing career and the beginning of a new one... He and Easy Goer were both great horses and will both be great stallions."

At that stage Sunday Silence was scheduled to retire to Hancock's Stone Farm--his birthplace and home also to his sire Halo--with Easy Goer heading for the Hancock family's Claiborne Farm.

At the same time, Charlie Whittingham recalled, "all those people didn't want to buy him, at the auctions and privately, because he was kind of gangly and awkward as a young horse. Despite all that, he turned out to be a classy freak that everyone misjudged." Cont. p2

That misjudgement continued over the next few weeks. Although it was announced that Sunday Silence would stand the 1991 season at \$50,000 live foal, and that some shares might also be sold, September brought news that Sunday Silence had been sold entirely to Zenya Yoshida. The Shadai Stud master had initially bought a 25-percent interest six months earlier for \$2.5 million and then stepped in with another \$7.5 million for the remaining 75 percent when American breeders showed little interest in using this "freak."

Unfortunately Hancock's prediction that Sunday Silence and Easy Goer were destined for greatness as stallions proved to be only half right. It was Sunday Silence who earned that accolade with a totally dominant career which has earned him comparison with Sadler's Wells.

The latter has occasionally been responsible for first, second and third in major races and Sunday Silence has often pulled off this feat, including in October's G1 Tenno Sho, when Zenno Rob Roy led home Dance In The Mood and Admire Groove. Since then, Zenno Rob Roy has become only the second horse to complete the very difficult treble of Tenno Sho (1 1/4 miles), Japan Cup (1 1/2 miles) and Arima Kinen (1 9/16 miles).

This trio of Group 1 successes gives Zenno Rob Roy star billing among a celebrated 2004 cast of over 20 Japanese group winners by Sunday Silence, which also featured Durandal (Mile Championship), Admire Groove (Queen Elizabeth II Commemorative Cup) and the winners of the 1000 Guineas, 2000 Guineas and Oaks.

The 1000 Guineas winner Dance In The Mood ventured to California last July to finish second to Ticker Tape in the G1 American Oaks. There was further international evidence of Sunday Silence's prowess in Sundrop's close second to Attraction in the 1,000 Guineas at Newmarket and in Layman's victory in the G3 Prix de Cabourg. In the past we have seen Sunday Picnic win the G3 Prix Cleopatre, To The Victory finish second in the Dubai World Cup, Stay Gold win the Dubai Sheema Classic and Hong Kong Vase, Sunday Joy win the AJC Oaks and Silent Honor take the G3 Cherry Hinton S.

The question this raises is whether Sunday Silence would have become such a superstar stallion had American breeders been able to get past the fact that his first two dams were daughters of Understanding and Montparnasse.


It is hard to say, partly because the mares he covered in Japan were probably higher up the pecking order than the mares he might have attracted from skeptical American breeders. It could also be argued that most of his success has come on the turf, but this is largely because he has been mated with turf performers in Japan. The broodmare sires of his Group 1 winners in 2004-- Tony Bin, Dr Devious, Northern Taste, In The Wings and Mining--were turf performers with the notable exception of Mining, the broodmare sire of Zenno Rob Roy.

Mining was sold to Japan in October 1995, at the age of 11, after seven years at Glencrest Farm. With Mr. Prospector as his sire and a Buckpasser mare as his dam, Mining was bred to the same pattern as Seeking the Gold, Woodman, Miswaki and that good broodmare Proflare. Sunday Silence also sired important winners out of daughters of Miswaki (Silence Suzuka, winner of the G1 Takarazuka Kinen over 1 3/8 miles) and Woodman.

Mining was inbred 2 x 4 to Raise a Native and this could help explain not only why he raced infrequently but also why he was so talented. When he proved too good for Gulch in the G1 Vosburgh S. over seven furlongs in October of his four-year-old season, Mining was winning for the sixth time in six starts. However, he could finish only 10th behind Gulch when favorite in the Breeders' Cup Sprint.

Mining had sired eight stakes winners from three crops of racing age by the time he was sold, his only Grade I winner being Zenno Rob Roy's dam Roamin Rachel.

Zenno Rob Roy, who finished second in the 2003 Japanese Derby, clearly stays a mile and a half very well, but speed was his dam's forte. Thirteen of her 15 starts came in sprints and she was fast enough to win nine of them, including the GI Ballerina H. over seven furlongs. Roamin Rachel's sister Choice Claim has also produced a graded winner (Another), who gained her best win over six furlongs even though she is by Seattle Slew.

Roamin Rachel was exported to Japan after selling for \$750,000, in foal to Storm Cat, at Keeneland's 1998 November Sale. She had already produced three foals and one of them, her Deputy Minister filly Darling My Darling, was second twice at Grade I level as a juvenile, before winning two stakes events.

The tragedy of Sunday Silence's death was that it came when he was still only 16, but his influence is sure to live on. The JRA sire rankings published in last week's TDN showed sons of Sunday Silence in second, fourth and ninth places behind their sire on the general list. There are also three sons among the top nine juvenile sires, which are again headed by Sunday Silence, including the first-crop sire Admire Vega. This winner of the Japanese Derby has the smart Stormy Café among his eight winners.


No doubt Zenno Rob Roy is also destined to become a very successful sire and I can't help thinking that Sunday Silence's descendants may well have an important role to play outside Japan.

LUCKY ADDITION TO DARLEY STALLIONS An already formidable Darley stallion roster became that much stronger over the weekend when it was announced that **Lucky Story** (Kris S.--Spring Flight, by Miswaki), a full brother to the top-class Dr Fong, will take up stud duties for the 2005 breeding season at Tweenhills Stud. He will stand as the property of Darley and will be managed by Darley. Trained by Mark Johnston, the \$95,000 Keeneland September yearling purchase won four of his five starts at two, capped by Group 2 wins in the Vintage S. and the Champagne S. An injury prevented him from running in the G1 Dewhurst S., won by Milk It Mick, who was no closer than five lengths to Lucky Story in the Champagne. In an abbreviated sophomore campaign, the bay was twice second, including a half-length defeat at the hands of Rakti (GB) in the G1 Queen Elizabeth II S. "Lucky Story is a top-class addition to the stallion ranks," commented Sam Bullard, head of stallion nominations for Darley. "Among new stallions in Europe in 2005, only Sulamani (Ire) and Haafhd (GB) were rated above him and we'll be doing all we can to get him off to as impressive a start at stud as his brother Dr Fong has managed." Dr Fong is the sire of 10 percent stakes winners in his first crop, including G1SW Ask For The Moon (Fr). Located on 290 acres some five miles north of Gloucester, England, Tweenhills Stud is operated by David Redvers and is also home to GISP Arkadian Hero (Tremolino), Fraam (GB) (Lead on Time) and Ishiguru (Danzig).

REVISED FEES FOR CAUSEWAY, PEGASUS

Ashford Stud has raised the stud fees for 2004 leading freshman sires **Fusaichi Pegasus** (Mr. Prospector) and **Giant's Causeway** (Storm Cat) to \$150,000 for the upcoming breeding season, reports the *Blood-Horse*. The stud had previously announced a fee of \$100,000 for Fusaichi Pegasus and \$135,000 for Giant's Causeway. Led by GII Norfolk S. hero Roman Ruler, Fusaichi Pegasus finished third on the list of freshman sires and was represented by an additional four stakes winners. Giant's Causeway checked in fourth on the list and had four stakes winners of his own. His leading earner was Shamardal, who completed a Cartier Award-winning season with a victory in the G1 Dewhurst S. Oct. 16.

★ GULFSTREAM ★

Shake You Down on Track for Mr. Prospector:

Shake You Down (Montbrook), the defending champion in the Sunshine Millions Sprint, kicks off the 2005 season in this Saturday's GIII Mr. Prospector H., with an eye on this year's Sunshine Millions program Jan. 29. The seven-year-old bounced back from a last-place finish in the GI Frank De Francis Dash Nov. 20 with a Dec. 8 allowance win at Pimlico and is ready for Saturday's test. "He's doing great and the surface [at Gulfstream] is fantastic," said trainer Scott Lake. "He's worked great and we're looking forward to running."

Zito Full of Hope for Commentator:

Tracy Farmer's **Commentator** (Distorted Humor) carries a perfect record into this weekend's GIII Hal's Hope H., and trainer Nick Zito has supreme confidence in the four-year-old gelding. "He's done everything we've asked of him so far and he keeps on going and each time we're trying to put him in against better and better horses," the conditioner explained. "We should get that again on Saturday and be able to see where we are." Bred in New York, Commentator has won his five career starts by a combined 41 3/4 lengths. His lone stakes success came in Keeneland's Perryville S. last October, but he makes his two-turn and graded-stakes debut in the Hal's Hope.

Drama Kicks off First Day of Gulfstream Meet:

Many eagerly awaited the beginning of Gulfstream's 2005 racing season, but nobody could have scripted a more dramatic finish to the day's first race. The first event of the current meet, a nine-furlong \$8,000 claimer, went off as scheduled and through the opening mile, it appeared that it was going to proceed without a hitch. Turning for home, however, outriders were ordered to flag down the competitors, because of a gate malfunction and the stewards declared the race a no contest. All monies bet on the race were refunded. Gulfstream officials also ordered the cancellation of the 10th race, a \$62,000 maiden claiming race, because of concerns of lack of daylight.

Second by a neck at this level at Saratoga Aug. 28, the chestnut was a good third in a Belmont optional claimer Sept. 25 and was making his first start since finishing fifth in the GII Knickerbocker H. at Aqueduct Oct. 30. Allowed to settle in midpack, the full brother to Miss Loren (Arg), MG1SW-Arg, GSW & GISP-US, \$288,032-US; and half to Milano Phone (Arg) (Speakerphone), GSW & MG1SP-Arg, angled out on the far turn and swept to the front at the eighth pole en route to a 2 3/4-length win over Icy Atlantic (Stormy Atlantic). GIPSY LIMITS (f, 4, Limit Out--Go Gipsy Go, by Regal Search), in the money in only one of four allowance starts while coming from off the pace last fall, appeared to benefit from a change of tactics and drop in class last time in the mud to finish third in a \$30,000 claimer at Aqueduct Nov. 26. Given little respect at 20-1 this time, the bay bumped hard with Catarina (Tomorrow's Child) at the start, but was soon up to take command. Clear with a furlong left to run, the filly maintained her momentum late to score by two lengths over Peer (Pulpit). Lifetime Record: 13-4-0-3, \$61,270. O-D McKillop & T Cullen. B-J Shields Jr (FL). T-D Ryan.

Regal Sanction to Stand for Charity:

Susan and John Moore have retired their GII Pegasus H. winner **Regal Sanction** (Regal Classic--Northern Sanction, by Affirmed) and will stand the six-year-old at Metropolitan Stud in Pine Plains, New York. "We are pleased to have Regal Sanction join our stallions at Metropolitan," the stud's Michael Lischin said. "He is quite correct and is a strikingly handsome 16.2-hand son of Regal Classic--long a favorite with New York breeders and for many years a leading New York sire. We hope he will be well received by breeders looking for value." The Moores have decided to donate all revenue generated from stud fees to equine charities, including the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation, Thoroughbred Charities of America, New York Horse Rescue or the Moore Foundation, as each breeder pleases. "We are hopeful that Regal Sanction will generate interest among the Mid-Atlantic breeding community and that he will become an excellent New York stallion who will generate revenues for equine charities for years to come," Susan Moore commented. Regal Sanction will stand for an advertised fee of \$3,000, but Metropolitan will adjust the fee according to the financial circumstances of each breeder. Regal Sanction retires with a record of 24-5-7-3 and earnings of \$485,158.

Media Eclipse Awards Announced:

Cindy Pierson Dulay, *Los Angeles Times* columnist Bill Christine and Mike Jensen have been named winners of Media Eclipse Awards by the National Thoroughbred

Racing Association. Pierson Dulay was awarded the Eclipse for her photograph of the three-year-old filly Stephan's Angel leaping into the air while being saddled for last year's GIII Miss Preakness S. "I'm thrilled to win this award in a business I love very much," commented

Pierson Dulay, who admitted she was in the right place at the right time. "I do look for horses acting up from time to time, but this was a lucky shot." Christine, a 22-year veteran of the *Los Angeles Times*, won the Media Eclipse Award for Writing for his article entitled "Kayak II," which was published Dec. 24, 2003. The piece chronicled the events surrounding the Santa Anita Handicap of 1940, in which Seabiscuit defeated his stablemate Kayak II. "With all the attention Seabiscuit garnered in 2003, I thought that the forgotten horse, Kayak, got lost in the shuffle," Christine said. "Had he beaten Seabiscuit that day, his career may have changed. He was a terrific horse with Hall of Fame credentials." Jensen, a reporter for the *Philadelphia Inquirer*, was named the winner of the Media Eclipse Award for Writing in the "Feature/Enterprise" category for a series of articles on the run of Smarty Jones through last year's Triple Crown. A staff writer for the paper since 1988, Jensen traced the stories of the horse, trainer John Servis, owners Roy and Pat Chapman and others associated with the horse from May 1 through Aug. 6.

Joe Durso Dies:

Joe Durso, a former sportswriter and editor for the *New York Times* and author of many books on sports history, died last Friday from cancer, his wife Margaret said. The resident of Nissequogue, New York, was 80 years old. Durso retired from the *Times* in 2001 and covered the Mets and the Yankees as his major assignment. He frequently wrote about the Kentucky Derby for the paper and regularly reported on Thoroughbred racing during the 1990s. A member of the writers' and broadcasters' wing of the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, New York, Durso was the author of several books on baseball, including "My Luke and I." Written in conjunction with Eleanor Gehrig, the widow of former baseball great Lou Gehrig, the book was made into the 1978 television movie "A Love Affair: The Eleanor and Lou Gehrig Story," starring Blythe Danner, Edward Herrmann and Patricia Neal. In addition to his wife Margaret, Durso is survived by a brother, a sister, three sons, a stepson, a stepdaughter and nine grandchildren.
