AZERI TO STORM CAT IN 2005

Azeri (Jade Hunter--Zodiac Miss {Aus}, by Ahonoora {GB}), who was retired in December as North America's all-time leading-money earning distaffer, has been booked to top sire Storm Cat for the 2005 breeding season. Storm Cat stands for \$500,000 at Overbrook Farm in Lexington, Kentucky. Owned by the Allen Paulson Living Trust and trained by D. Wayne Lukas, the chestnut mare is a finalist to secure an unprecedented third consecutive Eclipse Award as champion older female. Azeri retired with 17 victories from 24 lifetime starts and earnings of \$4,079,820.

MAYO ON THE SIDE RETIRED

Robert Lothenbach's Grade I winner **Mayo On the Side** (French Deputy--Slewveau, by Slew O'Gold) has been retired from racing. The six-year-old mare will be bred to GI Breeders' Cup Sprint hero and Eclipse Award finalist Speightstown (Gone West) during the upcoming breeding season. Bred in Kentucky by Lothenbach Stables, the bay sold for \$47,000 at the 2000 Keeneland September Sale. Trained by Carl Nafzger, Mayo On the Side's career highlight came when she defeated Horse of the Year Azeri in the GI Humana Distaff H. at Churchill Downs last May. She also captured the Doubledogdare S. during a career in which she compiled a record of 28-7-4-8 and earnings of \$642,366. Mayo On the Side hails from the immediate family of Canadian champion Honky Tonk Tune. Her granddam is German champion Istria (GB).

SOLID OPENER FOR MAGIC MILLIONS

The Conrads Jupiter Magic Millions Yearling Sale kicked off Thursday at Queensland's Gold Coast with figures comparable to last year's opening session. The sale averaged A\$110,510 for 157 sold with the clearance rate dipping--unusually for Magic Millions--to less than 80 percent. That fact led Magic Millions principal Gerry Harvey to acknowledge that despite plenty of activity by South African and Hong Kong buyers, the sale was down slightly on last year's first session A\$112,230 average. "But we've got great expectations over the next couple of days as the sale progresses and there's been quite a lot of activity from international buyers with the Hong Kong Jockey Club securing five horses," he said. As expected, representatives from Danehill's final crop were in demand. Agent Tim Stakemire, acting for Dubai-based Sheikh Mohammed bin Khalifa al Maktoum gave A\$500,000 for Lot 190, a Danehill half sister to G1 Prix de Diane victress Rafha (GB) (Kris {GB}), herself the dam of five European black-type performers. "She had a really nice page and to go with that she was a nice athletic type," said Stakemire. Stakemire also purchased a Danehill filly from Drama of Life (Royal Academy), a half sister to European Classic hero Rodrigo de Triano, for A\$330,000. He said both fillies would be prepared by trainer John Sadler at Flemington. Coolmore's rising young stallion Encosta de Lago (Aus) recorded the day's second-highest price when a 3/4-brother to Delago Brom (Aus) sold for A\$400,000 to John Wallace. "I just loved him the first time I saw him," Wallace said of the colt from the Rothwell Park draft. "I thought there were two outstanding colts on the complex and he was one of them." Delago Brom was among a squadron of stakes winners for Encosta de Lago--a son of Fairy King--who initially stood at a modest fee in Victoria before being promoted to Coolmore's Hunter base with a hefty fee hike.

Craft Work, looking to capture the first Japanese group race of the 2005 season, had not started since defeating champion mare Fine Motion in the G3 Hakodate Kinen last July. He delivered a powerful challenge along the rail in the stretch and pulled clear late to win in stakes record time. "It was a perfect race," said winning rider Norihiro Yokoyama. "The stable staff did brilliant work with him, so I never worried about him being ready."

Hat Trick, allowed to settle well back in the pack, showed an impressive turn of foot in the home stretch for his third straight win. "He did a great job today," said winning rider Yutaka Take. "He gave a brilliant performance and it was a good start to the season." According to trainer Katsuhiko Kadoi, Hat Trick's future targets include the G3 Tokyo Shimbun Hai at the end of the month and the G1 Yasuda Kinen in June. After winning the first two starts of his career, the colt was ninth in the G3 Radio Tampa Hai in July, but improved to take a middle-class stakes race in October and an upper-class stakes race last time out in November.

NOMINATION DONATION FOR RED CROSS WORK IN INDIAN OCEAN

To assist with the alleviation of the suffering and the crisis faced by the survivors of the tidal waves that affected 10 countries surrounding the Indian Ocean this week, the Coolmore stallion owners are donating a nomination to every one of their Flat and National Hunt stallions, including Sadler's Wells in Ireland, Fusaichi Pegasus in the USA and Encosta de Lago in Australia. The total fund will be given to the International Red Cross to assist its work with those devastated communities. Beginning Friday, Dec. 31, Ashford Stud in Kentucky and Coolmore Stud in Ireland will accept bids for nominations to each of their stallions while Coolmore Australia will do so for its one permanent resident, Encosta de Lago. Bidding will close at 5 p.m. local time on Tuesday, Jan. 11, during the Keeneland January Sale. The highest bids and the names of the bidders for each stallion will be published daily in the Thoroughbred Daily News and the final charitable purchasers will be released to all major racing and breeding publications. In order to respond to the urgent needs of the Red Cross and their international partners, payment will be required immediately. These nominations will therefore be on a no-guarantee basis, but will include a "right of return" in 2006 for mares barren in 2005. Richard Henry, a spokesman for Coolmore, said, "Everybody has been so affected by this unprecedented human disaster that Coolmore, its stallion owners and staff wanted to do something to help. It will also provide a way in which breeders internationally can contribute to the excellent work of the Red Cross. Supplying a nomination to every stallion across the board offers the widest possible involvement. Coolmore welcomes the participation of other stud farms or syndicates to add stallion nominations to the auction for this charitable effort. Coolmore and the TDN will be willing to assist them in handling the details in any way possible."

OAKLAWN PARK RECEIVES ECLIPSE Oaklawn Park and the Cella family, which has operated the Hot Springs, Arkansas, racetrack since its opening in 1905, have been awarded the Eclipse Award of Merit, the National Thoroughbred Racing Association announced Thursday. The award, which will be presented Jan. 24 at the 34th annual Eclipse Award ceremony at the Regent Beverly Wilshire in Beverly Hills, is given annually in recognition of lifetime achievements in Thoroughbred racing. Oaklawn Park celebrated its Centennial season in 2004, the year that the track raised the purse of the Arkansas Derby to \$1-million and offered a \$5-million Oaklawn Centennial Bonus to any horse that could sweep the Rebel S., GII Arkansas Derby and GI Kentucky Derby. 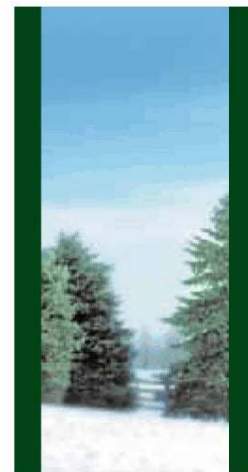

The number was nine short of the record entry for the 2005 Classic and surpassed the next highest total of 634 set in 1993--the first time yearling entries were taken. The 2006 Derby, to be run on June 3, will have a guaranteed prize fund of £1.25 million, with £725,000 for the winner. There are 213 different owners represented by yearlings in the entries. Godolphin, which won the race in 1995 with Lammtarra, has the highest number of entries at 75. Godolphin founder Sheikh Mohammed is directly responsible for 39 entries. Godolphin's entries include a \$3.1-million Kingmambo--Zuri (Danzig) colt bought at Keeneland and the €700,000 Grand Lodge--Native Twine (Be My Native) colt who topped Deauville's August Sale. "The Vodafone Derby is attracting more and more owners, which is a very healthy situation for the premier classic," said Stephen Wallis, the Epsom Downs racecourse managing director. "We are grateful for the continued and growing support and hope they thoroughly enjoy living the dream of Derby success."
