A wide-open field of 12 will contest this afternoon's GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. at Santa Anita, including former juvenile champion **Action This Day** (Kris S.). The bay colt has only raced once since finishing sixth in last year's Kentucky Derby, but appears to be feeling pretty good these days, if a :34 1/5 three-

furlong bullet workout at Santa Anita Jan. 12 is any indication. His disappointing ninth in a turf allowance Dec. 26 should serve as a good prep for this. Unraced since a fourth-place finish in the Derby, GI Santa Anita Derby victor **Castledale (Ire)** (Peintre Celebre) makes his long awaited return to the races here. **Mass Media** (Touch Gold) earned a 115

Beyer Speed Figure in his 3 1/2-length tally in the GIII Sport's Page H. at Aqueduct Oct. 31, then finished fifth as the even-money chalk in the GI Malibu S. last out Dec. 26. **Imperialism** (Langfuhr) labeled himself as a top three-year-old season with wins in the GII San Vicente S. and the GII San Rafael S., but is winless in six attempts since, including a third-place place finish in the grassy GI Hollywood Derby last out Nov. 28.

TEXCESS HEADS COMPACT SAN RAFAEL

Delta Jackpot hero **Texcess** (In Excess {Ire}), who was entered in both the Golden Gate Derby and the GII San Rafael S., will run in the latter trainer Paul Aguirre confirmed Friday. "He was already in a van over the hill at Santa Monica headed for the Bay Area, but when we saw the condition of the track there, we turned around and came back," Aguirre said. "We had intended to run there, but we had reservations after we saw how the track was. It wasn't drying out well." A one-length allowance winner over **Chips Are Down** (Distorted Humor) Nov. 14, Texcess delivered as the 7-5 favorite in his latest attempt in the Delta Jackpot S. Dec. 4. The Bob and Beverly Lewis colorbearer bounced back from a second-place finish behind Texcess with an allowance tally over **Spanish Chestnut** (Horse Chestnut {SAf}) at Hollywood Dec. 3. "He's improving," trainer Bob Baffert said of Chips Are Down. "With his breeding, that puts distance into him. This will be a good test. We're trying to get to the Derby and even though it's real early, so far I like what I see with this horse."

TRAINER GREG MARTIN INDICTED New York trainer Gregory Martin, son of Hall of Fame trainer Frank "Pancho" Martin, and Thoroughbred owner Gerald Uvari were among 17 people indicted on fraud and conspiracy charges Thursday in Manhattan federal court, according to published reports. The indictment alleges that Uvari was an associate of the Gambino crime family, and that the "Uvari Group" was a conspiracy of 15 partners who operated an illegal sports gambling business that included placing pari-mutuel bets on horses which brokered more than \$200 million. It also alleges that Martin and harness driver Rene Poulin participated in a conspiracy with a member of the Uvari Group to fix a horse race at Aqueduct Dec. 18, 2003 by giving the Martin-trained horse A One Rocket a performance-enhancing substance. A One Rocket won that day by 10 lengths as the 9-5 favorite. The New York State Racing and Wagering Board suspended the racing licenses of Martin, Uvari and Poulin pending a Jan. 18 hearing.

GULFSTREAM CANCELS CARD AFTER 6TH Gulfstream officials cancelled Friday's racing card after the sixth race when heavy rains and an impending severe lightning storm moved into the Hallandale, Florida area. "Due to the inclement weather and our concern for the safety of the patrons, horses and riders, we decided to cancel the balance of the program," said track president Scott Savin. "Cancelling the balance of the racing program also gives us the ability to make sure we can make the track safe and ready for tomorrow." Friday's Pick 6 wagers were refunded. Gulfstream has carded 10 races for today's card.

F-T CALDER SALE CATALOGUES 355 Fasig-Tipton has catalogued 355 head for its 2005 Selected Two-year-olds in Training Sale at Calder Race Course. The sale will begin at 11:00 a.m. on Tuesday, March 1, with under-tack shows slated for Feb. 20 and 27. "Since we began accepting horses during our inspections last fall, we have felt the 2005 catalogue would be exceptional," commented Fasig-Tipton president Walt Robertson. "Because of its pinhooking history, our regular consignors were very active at the top end of the yearling sales. With five Grade I winners in 2004, the sale has been very much in the public eye." Catalogues will be available online Jan. 19 at fasigtipton.com.

First Up:

Gulfstream's fifth race, a nine-furlong maiden on the main track, features the career debut of **First Word** (Chester House), a Juddmonte homebred trained by Bobby Frankel. The bay is the second foal--and first to race--from Harpia (Danzig), a graded stakes winning full sister to leading sire Danehill. From the first crop of the deceased Chester House, First Word has been training steadily at Palm Meadows. Jockey Edgar Prado has the mount aboard the three-year-old, who will break from the rail.

"A Night for Noah" at Laurel Park:

A committee headed by former Pimlico General manager Chick Lang and Fran Raffetto, wife of Maryland Jockey Club Chief Operating Officer Lou Raffetto, have organized a fundraiser for five-year-old Noah Grove, who was diagnosed with bone cancer nearly a year ago. Grove is the son of Maryland trainer Chris Grove and grandson of former jockey and Maryland Racing Commission steward Phil Grove. He has undergone several rounds of chemotherapy and had to have his leg amputated at the knee to remove a cancerous tumor. "A Night for Noah," to be held in the Carriage Room at Laurel Park after the last race on Sunday, Feb. 13, will raise money for medical expenses and for the prosthetics the boy will need as he grows up. There will be silent and live auctions, food and entertainment. Tickets, at just \$5 per person, can be purchased in the Maryland Jockey Club racing office. Donations to the cause have already reached more than \$25,000, and owner Michael Gill has pledged to pay the expenses for a second prosthesis, as only the first was covered by insurance. "It is amazing how everyone has pulled together like a family," Chris Grove said. "I had to take a step back because of all the support. I don't think that happens in other businesses. Chick and Fran have done a tremendous job and, because of them, it will be a great event for a great cause." Items to be auctioned include the bit Smarty Jones wore during the Kentucky Derby and Preakness, and the shoes Birdstone wore for his win in the Belmont S. INGLIS CLASSIC SALE KICKS OFF SUNDAY

Following on the heels of last week's successful Conrads-Jupiter Magic Millions Yearling Sale, the Sydney-based William Inglis & Son will begin its two-day Classic Sale Sunday with 569 cataloged lots. Inglis had given its traditionally low-key January yearling sale a makeover several years ago, christening it the Inglis Classic and introducing a A\$500,000 incentive race that has since been won by such notable horses as Choisir (Aus) (Danehill Dancer {Ire}), a A\$55,000 purchase who went on to Group 1 victory in England. The Classic sale has grown rapidly since Inglis focused attention on it, recording a 30-percent average increase last year, to A\$34,646 for 390 sold, with a top price of A\$220,000 and gross of A\$13.5 million, up A\$3 million up on the previous year. This year the catalogue has expanded with major studs offering drafts: Widden has 35, Arrowfield 15, Newhaven 13, Emirates Park 13, and Alanbridge 17, including nine by its own fast-emerging sire Beautiful Crown (Danzig). Leading buyers are increasingly likely to add the sale to their auction itinerary as it has yielded an almost disproportionate number of excellent racehorses from a relatively small catalogue. Another star advertisement for the sale is Hong Kong International Sprint star Silent Witness (Aus) (El Moxie), who cost the same amount as Choisir and has returned A\$5-million prize money to date with 13 straight wins, including his victory Dec. 12 G1 Cathay Pacific Hong Kong Sprint at Sha Tin. The sale's second and final session begins Monday at 10 a.m.
