SHARP LISA LOOKS FOR RESPECT

Sweet Catomine might just be in a league unto herself, but **Sharp Lisa** (Dixieland Band) will look to bridge the gap as the heavy favorite in this afternoon's GII

Santa Ynez S. Purchased privately off a first-out maiden victory at Calder last September, the chestnut filly was caught in the final jump of the GII Darley Alcibiades S. at Keeneland Oct. 8, but could do no better than sixth to the champ in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies Oct. 30.

In her latest effort, Sharp Lisa ran into yet another potential superstar, chasing home Splendid Blended in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. Dec. 20. "In our minds, she's third in the category out here," trainer Doug O'Neill told *Daily Racing Form*. "We're trying to duck [Sweet Catomine and Splendid Blended]. We're looking for a spot where we can try to get a win." Sharp Lisa will have to live up to her name to stave off a pair of Bob Baffert runners. **No Bull Baby** (Indian Charlie) won the Moccasin S. across town going this distance Nov. 21, but failed to see out the trip in the 1 1/16-mile Starlet, finishing fourth. **Mother** (Lion Hearted) was one of the more impressive maiden winners at the current meet, posting an easy eight-length victory as the 2-5 favorite Jan. 2. The New Jersey-bred, owned by Eaton Sales' Tom Van Meter II, has trained well in the interim and need only overcome the inside post to be a serious factor.

Making her first start since taking the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies last Oct. 30, Sweet Catomine broke alertly and gained a cozy spot just behind a wall of three pacesetters as the field rounded the clubhouse turn. Under a long hold from jockey David Flores, the homebred tugged her way up and split rivals to make the lead leaving the half mile pole, edged away into the lane and drew clear under a couple of right-handed reminders from her rider. "I don't want to be cocky, but I know what I've been doing with her and there's more in the tank. There's a lot in the tank." Those words could prove ominous to the competition in the Feb. 12 GI Las Virgenes S., the next start for Sweet Catomine.

Bullish Luck, second in the G1 Hong Kong Cup five weeks back, rallied from last to take this first leg of the Hong Kong Triple Crown. Third to Ain't Here in the G3 Sha Tin Trophy going this distance Oct. 17 and in the G2 International Cup Trial Nov. 14, the six-year-old was coming into this off a short-head second to Alexander Goldrun (Ire) in the Hong Kong Cup. Taken back to trail behind a dawdling pace, the six-year-old gelding came widest of all into the stretch and finished well to win going away. "I was travelling well, nice and quiet, 600 meters out," said winning rider Christophe Soumillon, who picked up the mount when stable jockey Felix Coetzee opted for favored Perfect Partner (Aus) (Quest For Fame {GB}). "When he got to the front at the 200-meter mark, I drew the whip and he gave me a second acceleration--he finished very strongly. It's my first Group 1 win in Hong Kong and I'd like to thank [trainer] Tony [Cruz] for his support." Perfect Partner was a late scratch after breaking through the gate.

Girl Warrior made just one start at two, finishing third in a Newmarket maiden, and failed to graduate in three subsequent European efforts, capping off that portion of her career with a last-of-12 effort after being eased in a Sandown handicap June 11. Her fortunes changed immediately with a shift in venues and surfaces and she scored her maiden win by two lengths racing over the Del Mar main track Sept. 1. Entered against a group of males for her allowance debut at Hollywood Nov. 6, the chestnut lost third place on the wire, but bounced back with a two-length victory against her peers at Hollypark Dec. 10. The second choice in her graded stakes and four-year-old debut, Girl Warrior saved ground from the outset as Tarlow cut out the early fractions. She rode the rail through an opening into the stretch, led inside the final sixteenth and just held off a late run from odds-on A.P. Adventure. ACTION THIS DAY RETIRED He was named the champion two-year-old of 2003 after posting a 2 1/4-length victory in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile, but B. Wayne Hughes' **Action This Day** (Kris S.--Najecam, by Trempolino) finished off the board in all six subsequent

starts and has now been retired to stud. The four-year-old was a promising fourth in the Feb. 8 Sham S. to open his sophomore season, but was out of the money in three tries on the Triple Crown trail and went to the shelf with a back injury after

finishing sixth in the May 1 GI Kentucky Derby. He returned to be ninth in an allowance test on the Santa Anita turf in December, and was retired after running eighth in Saturday's GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup S. "The lack of success I had in trying to get him back [to his Juvenile form] was one of the most disappointing things I've ever experienced," trainer Richard Mandella said. "He was such a good two-year-old. Believe me, he was good. He hurt his back...and, obviously, we underestimated the seriousness of it. If we had to do it again, I'd give him six months off, not two, because it must still twinge him when he runs." Mandella added, "This is a horse that was supposed to be a Classic horse. I know he got a bad rap, but he was a good horse." Added Castleton Lyons' General Manager Julian Dollar, "The plan was always for Action This Day to retire to Castleton Lyons at the end of his racing career and whilst this is sooner than we had hoped, we are very excited about standing a horse of his quality." Action This Day, who compiled a record of 9-2-1-0 and earnings of \$822,484, will head to Lexington to stand the 2005 breeding season at Castleton Lyons. His will stand for a fee of \$10,000, live foal guarantee.

KEENELAND JULY SALE CANCELED AGAIN

Keeneland officials have announced that, for the third straight year, they will not hold the July Selected Yearling sale in Lexington. The sale was first dropped from the schedule in 2003 due to the effect on the foal crop caused by Mare Reproductive Loss Syndrome and, after a stellar September Sale that year, did not return to the calendar in 2004. Keeneland will sell all yearlings during the 13-day September Yearling Sale, to be held Sept. 12-24. That sale closes May 2.

★ **GULFSTREAM** ★

Second of June Ready for Twenty-Ninth of January:

Second of June (Louis Quatorze), winner of last year's GIII Holy Bull S. and a memorable runner-up to Read the Footnotes in the GII Fountain of Youth S., remains on track for the \$1-million Sunshine Millions Classic Jan. 29. The four-year-old colt was sidelined with a fractured cannon bone following the Fountain of Youth, but returned to action with a strong runner-up finish in a Dec. 26 Calder allowance. "We expected him to get a little bit tired and that's what happened," trainer Bill Cesare commented. "We were pleased with the race. We would have been happy if he had won, but that was a lot to ask of a horse. He's come out of the race good and he's training good." In his lone published work since the race, Second of June went a mile over the Gulfstream main track in a handy 1:39 Jan. 8.

McGaughey Sophs Gearing Up:

A pair of three-year-old sons of Danzig from the barn of trainer Shug McGaughey, GIII Laurel Futurity winner **Defer** and Belmont maiden winner **Survivalist**, are training towards their respective seasonal debuts at Gulfstream Park. "Both three-year-olds seem to be going well," the conditioner commented. "Everything is good, and I'm looking at schedules now. Survivalist popped a splint a couple of months back, but we've got him going again. We'll try to find an allowance race for him. Defer got a short break. We're going to point him for the [GII] Hutcheson S. [Feb. 5] to get him started out this year." Defer is two-for-three in his career, his lone defeat coming at the hands of Rockport Harbor in the GIII Nashua S. Nov. 2.

EDDINGTON (c, 4, Unbridled--Fashion Star {MGSP, \$214,759}, by Chief's Crown), perhaps considered a horse that failed to realize his potential as a three-year-old, gave every indication that 2005 will be a break-out season. The handsome chestnut, a \$450,000 KEEJUL yearling, completed the trifecta in the GIII Gotham S., GI Wood Memorial and GI Preakness S. before finishing fourth in the GI Belmont S. Again third, placed fourth, in the GII Jim Dandy S., he completed the trifecta in the GI Travers S. in late August. A game second-place effort in the GIII Pegasus S. Oct. 1 hinted that the colt was sitting on a big performance, and he came through for his backers in his next, capturing his turf bow in the Oct. 23 GIII Calder Derby by a hard-fought head. Given a breather, he returned here to a track that saw him win two of three last winter. Allowed to settle off the front rank, he parlayed a strong middle move into a narrow advantage midway on the turn. Nudged on under Eibar Coa, Eddington powered away by six lengths in upper stretch and was still clear by 8 3/4 lengths at the wire despite being geared down. "He's never been that professional before, and that's what we were hoping for," said Hennig, adding, "The [Feb. 5, GII] Strub S. [at Santa Anita] is a possibility and, of course, there's also the race here [Feb. 5, GI Donn H.]" Lifetime Record: GSW & MGISP, 13-4-3-4, \$636,760.

Here, the bay caboosed a tightly packed field after the first quarter, bid wide on the second turn and was soon in command. Putting away the reluctant favorite, Pleasant Home (Seeking the Gold), in mid-stretch, the 7-2 pick then held on determinedly as a resurgent India Halo (Arg) (Halo Sunshine) got to within a half length on the line. Third in her career opener at Aqueduct Dec. 12, Amazing Buy came back to break her maiden by 10 impressive lengths on New Year's Day and was odds-on to make it two in a row in her stakes bow. The dark bay sat a stalking trip off the heels of longshot pacesetter Dancin on Broadway (Menifee) through six furlongs in a liesurely 1:15.03, strode past that rival as they raced into the stretch and drew off to a handy victory. She becomes the first stakes winner for sophomore sire High Yield, who now has 14 winners overall, including six in the last 30 days. "She did exactly what she was supposed to do," winning trainer Jennifer Pedersen said. "I felt confident she would rate today. How did you get into racing? My

dad is a bookmaker in Ireland. I started out riding for an Irish trainer during school holidays, then I got a job working as an assistant trainer, first for Barry Hills and then for Paul Cole. Now I have set up on my own as a bloodstock agent.

Favorite horse of all time: Dancing Brave - I was at an impressionable age at the time he was running and he looked a real superstar.

If you could change one thing about our sport, what would it be? In Britain, there should be more incentive for people to own racehorses. If a horse wins a couple of races, it should pay the training fees for the year. We need more prize money in Britain to encourage more people to keep horses, but the purses just aren't very good. It's not a simple thing to work out, but one example would be to get a better deal from the bookmakers.

What is your favorite racetrack? The Curragh - I used to go racing there a lot when I was younger. It is a good fair track and all of the Irish Classics are run there.

Who is your mentor in racing? I learned a lot from Paul Cole.

What is your favorite vacation spot? I like to stay at The Vineyard in Cape Town, South Africa.

Where would you like to go that you haven't visited yet?

Australia - it's one place I haven't been, and I like the people. All of the people I have met from Australia have been such good fun.

What would you most like to accomplish in racing? I want to continue having success in buying horses, keep buying yearlings, keep buying at all levels. If I could buy the future winner of any race in the world, it would be the 2000 Guineas in England.

SOMETHING TO SING ABOUT

He stood just one season in Australia and will not be returning, but top European sire **Singspiel (Ire)** (In the Wings {GB}) is off to a sharp start Down Under. The stallion had his first Australian winner at Warwick Saturday when well-made filly **Paulini (Aus)** captured the A\$300,000 Inglis Two-Year-Old Classic at Warwick Farm Saturday. Purchased for A\$47,500 as a yearling, the juvenile was sent off the 11-4 favorite and recorded a soft 1 1/4-length win from **The Jonker (Aus)** (Over {Aus}). Paulini is raced by prominent owner George Cloros and prepared by former multiple Sydney premier-ship winning jockey Kevin Moses. Runner-up on debut at the same venue Jan. 3, she was allowed to settle and find her feet by jockey Corey Brown, but showed a clean pair of heels in the run to the line to beat back-marker The Jonker. Singspiel, the sire of 19 stakes winners from two crops in Europe, stood just one season at Darley Australia at a fee of A\$20,000. The G1 Japan Cup winner left 69 foals, with 20 sold in 2004 at an average of A\$74,705. "We're thrilled he has his first winner," said Darley Australia manager Olly Tait. "But Singspiel will definitely not shuttle again. It's not [just] that he is a valuable stallion--we shuttle valuable horses--but he suffered travel sickness to the extent that he gave us a bit of a scare. He travelled during his racing career and he suffered from it, but when he came down here, he got really sick." Singspiel stands at Darley's Dalham Hall Stud in Britain. His 2005 stud fee is listed as private.
