MAKING A POINT IN THE SANTA YNEZ

Sharp Lisa (Dixieland Band) looked like she had flattened out after a strong middle move in the GII Santa Ynez S. at Santa Anita Monday, but found another gear late and surged to the popular victory over a game **No Bull Baby** (Indian Charlie). Purchased privately by J. Paul Reddam, et al, after an open-lengths win at Calder in September, Sharp Lisa came back to

be runner-up in the GII Darley Alcibiades S. Oct. 8. Her lone off-the-board effort came in a sixth-place effort in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies S. Oct. 30, but she returned with a solid runner-up finish to Splendid Blended in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. Dec. 19. Fourth at the first call here as No Bull Baby stalked the pace of **Mother** (Lion Hearted), Sharp Lisa bid wide on the turn, grabbed a breather in upper stretch, then kicked clear in the final furlong to win with verve. "Incredible filly," gushed jockey Tyler Baze. "I just waited and as soon as they straightened up for home, I asked her to switch leads. Her whole body just dropped to the ground and her stride just went so far. It was awesome." Trainer Doug O'Neill said the Feb. 21 GI Las Virgenes S. was a likely target. 'WILD' FINISH IN SAN MIGUEL

Jumping right into stakes company off an eye-catching maiden victory, Bob and Beverly Lewis' **Going Wild** (Golden Missile) set a quick pace in yesterday's GIII San Miguel S. at Santa Anita before gamely staving off **So Long Birdie** (Pioneering) for the narrow win. Going Wild hit the board in a pair of New York maiden events this fall, rounded out the exacta in his West Coast bow at Hollywood Nov. 13, then earned a 102 Beyer in a trip-and-track victory Dec. 26. Trying to make it two straight, he cut out a half in :44.32 with mild pressure from the outside, inched away turning the corner and dug deep as a running-on So Long Birdie made it interesting late. "In the gate he threw his head down just as the doors opened and it cost him the jump," revealed winning jockey Mike Smith. "I would have been on a nice clear lead instead of being pressured like that. He's just so naturally quick he was there anyway. It was a gallant effort on his part. He hung in and got the nod. Way back in 1968, Claiborne Farm added a new stallion to its impressive roster. Named Forli, the new arrival had won nine of 10 starts after starting his career in the Southern Hemisphere. He had shown great versatility in Argentina, winning from seven furlongs to 1 7/8 miles on his way to Horse of the Year honors.

Forli had then created quite a stir in winning his first two starts--both over 1 1/16 miles--in the U.S. Sadly, he suffered a fractured cannon bone when second in the Citation H. and was therefore denied any further chances of demonstrating his considerable talents before an American audience.

Some 32 years later, Claiborne added another stallion to its roster. Named Horse Chestnut, this colt had also won nine of 10 starts after starting his career in the Southern Hemisphere. He too had shown great versatility, this time in South Africa, winning from five furlongs to 1 1/2 miles while earning a Horse of the Year title.

Horse Chestnut also created quite a stir in winning his first start in the U.S, the Gill Broward H. over 1 1/16 miles on his dirt-track debut at the start of 2000. This impressive victory had raised realistic hopes that Horse Chestnut was going to prove just as brilliant in his new base as he had been in South Africa, but an injury in a workout ended his career just a couple of weeks later.

There were also parallels between the two stallions' pedigrees. Forli was by a son of Hyperion, a multiple champion sire in Britain and Ireland, and was out of a mare with European bloodlines. The same applies to Horse Chestnut, except that his sire, the G1 Grand Prix de Paris winner Fort Wood, is by Sadler's Wells, the longest reigning champion sire in the history of British and Irish racing.

Forli, of course, left an indelible mark on the breed. Not only did he sire the magnificent Forego, a three-time Horse of the Year, but he also sired a string of high-class European runners, such as Home Guard, Thatch, Gay Fandango, Fordham, Formidable, Posse, Asteroid Field and Sadem. Perhaps his greatest achievement, though, was to sire Special, the broodmare who ranks as the dam of Nureyev and the second dam of Sadler's Wells. *Caulfield cont. p4*

But could Horse Chestnut be fairly expected to achieve similar success in a different era?

Times have changed considerably since Forli embarked on his stallion career in the 1960s. The Cold War is over; we've got Eminem instead of Dylan; and Motown and psychedelia have long faded out of fashion, as, generally, have stallions imported into the USA.

So, whereas Forli started his career alongside Ambiorix, Herbager and several other imports at Claiborne, Horse Chestnut is the only foreigner among today's Claiborne team. Forli started out at a time when the emphasis was firmly on quality rather than quantity (there were initially 32 nominations available to his influential shareholders, and his first four crops totalled 96 named foals). Horse Chestnut, though, would have to appeal to a much larger number of breeders to prove competitive in an industry where weight of numbers is now so important.

I suspect he would have been much harder to market had he not shown such potential on dirt in the Broward, but that win, combined with a pair of correct forelegs and a sensible fee of \$10,000, has ensured plenty of interest in him.

Despite being retired after most breeders had already made arrangements for their mares, Horse Chestnut covered 60 mares in 2000 and he has since attracted 88 mares in 2001, 93 in 2002 and 97 in 2004. His total of 74 mares in 2003 would no doubt have been a good deal higher had he not undergone colic surgery during a crucial part of the covering season.

The excellent news is that Horse Chestnut is justifying the faith placed in him, with a pair of graded winners from his first two crops--with both of these good winners being graduates of Florida two-year-old sales.

First came that fine turf filly Lucifer's Stone, who was scoring for the fifth time in 10 starts when she took the GI Garden City Breeders' Cup H. last September. Horse Chestnut can take plenty of the credit for this filly's talents, as she is out of a minor winner by Demons Begone and her second dam is an unraced mare without a stakes winner to her credit.

Potentially even more important to Horse Chestnut's future is Spanish Chestnut, who earned some rave reviews from his trainer Patrick Biancone after his victory in the GII San Rafael S. over a mile.

Spanish Chestnut had achieved the second-highest price of last year's OBS Calder Sale, when Demi O'Byrne went to \$500,000 to secure him. The colt covered an eighth of a mile in :10.2, with O'Byrne commenting that he looked "to be very mature and very fast. His [work] was as good a performance as I've ever seen on this track. He did it very fast, very efficiently, and with lovely action. He has lovely balance."

You can get a good idea of the standard of Spanish Chestnut's family from the fact that his dam Baby Rabbit made only \$32,000, carrying this son of Horse Chestnut, at Keeneland three years ago. Although there is plenty of black type under his first three dams, most of it wasn't earned at group or graded level, the exceptions being the two Grade-II successes of

Apalachee Prince, a stamina-packed half brother to Spanish Chestnut's second dam, Snuggle Bunny.

More to the point, Spanish Chestnut's first three dams were respectively sired by No Sale George, Wild Wind and Abe's Hope--none of them exactly a household name. For the record, No Sale George was a twice-raced Raise A Native horse with earnings of \$7,220 who stood cheaply in Florida; Wild Wind was another minor winner by a famous sire, Never Bend; and Abe's Hope, a talented and durable son of Better Bee, sired only 63 foals.

It says plenty for Horse Chestnut that he has sired a colt as promising as Spanish Chestnut from this run-of-the-mill background. It is also good news that the colt's Grade-II success came on a fast dirt track. Sadler's Wells's name isn't normally associated with success on the main track, but his son El Prado has been busily showing that this male line has plenty to offer American breeders. Maybe his grandson Horse Chestnut is also destined to help the Sadler's Wells line make the transition to dirt.

THREE WONDERS FILLY TOPS OBS DAY ONE

A yearling filly by Three Wonders elicited a bid of \$90,000 to lead the way during the first consignor preferred session of the Ocala Breeders' Sales Company's Winter Mixed Sale. Catalogued as Hip 55, the Lindie Reiss, agent, consignee was purchased by M.S.T.S. The April Fool's Day baby is out of the stakes-placed Honey Jay mare Loudmouth Time, making her a half sister to

stakes winners O'Rocky (Tour d'Or) and Tour Time (Tour d'Our), as well as a pair of stakes-placed runners. Hip 55 is from the first crop of Three Wonders (Storm Cat), a Grade III winner on the sod who stands for \$5,000 at Hidden Point Farm in Florida. The first day's highest-priced broodmare was Hip 71, the Relaunch mare Ascloseasitgets, who was knocked down to Martin Stables, Inc., on a bid of \$82,000. Out of Grade III winner Marianna's Girl (Dewan), the eight-year-old Ascloseasitgets is a half to the speedy Christine's Outlaw (Wild Again), who annexed the Gill Poker H. at Belmont last July. Marianna's Girl, from the draft of Montgomery Farm, sold in foal to Montbrook. The second session of the consignor preferred edition gets underway today, followed by two open sessions Wednesday and Thursday.

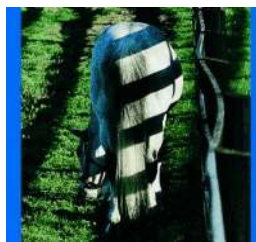
KEN RAMSEY SUSPENDED AND FINED The Kentucky Horse Racing Authority announced yesterday that owner Ken Ramsey has been fined \$25,000 and suspended for seven days for attempting to "cause a licensed person to interfere with the orderly conduct on a race," according to a settlement signed by Jim Gallagher, the executive director of the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority, and Ramsey's attorney, Burr Travis. The settlement further stated that Ramsey "did not purposely violate said rule or any other rule of racing, and, further, his actions were not undertaken with any desire or intention to denigrate the integrity of the sport of horse racing." Ramsey, an Eclipse Award finalist as top owner, reportedly asked owner/trainer Barbara Conner to scratch Mamaroni from the first race at Turfway Park Dec. 31, a \$7,500 maiden claimer, so that his Ken's Cat could draw into the event from the also-eligible list. While Mamaroni did not scratch, Ken's Cat drew in following the scratch of other entries. Ken's Cat was subsequently withdrawn by order of Turfway stewards after they were contacted by Conner. Ken's Cat is by Catienus (Storm Cat), a freshman sire of 2004 owned by Ken and Sarah Ramsey.

A # will distinguish first-time stakes-winners, a + will first-time starters, an (S) will be used for state-bred races, a (C) will be used for maiden-claiming races and an (R) will be used for other restricted races. Purses for Canadian races are in Canadian dollars.

Midas Eyes to Stretch Out in Sunshine Millions Classic:

Edmund A. Gann's **Midas Eyes** (Touch Gold), last seen running second to Wildcat Heir in the six-furlong GI Frank De Francis Memorial Dash Nov. 20, is set to stretch out in the \$1-million Ocala Breeders' Sales Sunshine Millions Classic at Gulfstream Jan. 29. The five-year-old Bobby Frankel charge breezed six furlongs at Palm Meadows in 1:13.60 Sunday in preparation.

"He worked very good," said assistant trainer Brian Lynch. "We'll probably give him another three-quarters work between now and then just to top him off." Midas Eyes, winner of the GIII Swale S. in his lone Gulfstream start three years ago, finished a solid fourth in his only try at two turns last season, the GII Strub S. in February.

 Maddy's Lion finished a respectable third in the Rollicking S. against Maryland-bred competition Oct. 30 before heading to the sidelines for the rest of the year. Fresh for his 2005 debut, the bay won by an easy two-length margin in the mud against \$75,000 optional claimers over track and trip Jan. 5 and was installed the third betting choice for his step up to stakes company. On top by a narrow margin early, Maddy's Lion increased his advantage at every call and continued to dominate late en route to a facile score. MORE THAN READY HOT AT INGLIS Vinery sire More Than Ready, whose oldest Australian progeny are juveniles of this year, accounted for two of the top five priced lots as the Inglis Classic Yearling Sale concluded on a moderate note Monday in Sydney. Craig Anderson's boutique Broadwater Farm in the Segenhoe Valley offered three of the top five, including Lot 503, a half sister to SW Presently (Aus) (Unbridled's Song). A pattern often seen at Magic Millions was again on display, as the filly had an \$80,000 reserve, but competition resulted in trainer Paul Perry going \$100,000 beyond that figure to secure her. The buying bench was dominated by Eastern State trainers--Ross Stitt gave A\$100,000 for a More Than Ready colt from the Danehill mare Dane Orla (Aus) offered by Vinery as agent (Lot 544). Fellow conditioner Darren Smith gave A\$120,000 for Lot 528, a colt by Danehill's promising young sire son Commands (Aus) from the Zoffany mare Court House Lane (Aus). Encouraged by a bullish Magic Millions, where first crop Australian sires achieved sparkling averages, many vendors perhaps raised their sights too high, as evidenced by a flagging clearance rate of 79 percent with 523 offered and 415 sold at an average A\$34,793 and aggregate of A\$14,438,955. Several yearlings by sires such as Iglesia (Aus), Beautiful Crown and Honours List (Ire), failed to meet their reserves. But Inglis managing director Reg Inglis pointed out that a dozen yearlings fetched A\$100,000 or more, and pointed out there were 65 more yearlings in the catalogue on last year. "A great result with the extra yearlings on offer to better last year's record," Inglis commented. "Thank you to all the vendors and buyers for supporting this sale and we look forward to the Premier and Easter sales with great excitement."
