ROCKPORT HARBOR GETS BACK TO WORK

After taking a brief vacation to recover from a deep gash suffered in his victory in the Nov. 27 Gill Remsen S., **Rockport Harbor** (Unbridled's Song) went back to

work yesterday, breezing five furlongs at Oaklawn Park. The exercise didn't go off without some drama, however. Just before the colt was to commence his work, a horse got loose and was sprinting toward the Fox Hill Farms' colorbearer, but the wayward animal was gathered in by an alert outrider. As the backstretch let out a collective sigh, Rockport Harbor galloped up the

backstretch, broke off at the half-mile pole and ran splits of :13 1/5, :25 2/5, :38 and :49 before concluding the move in 1:02 flat. It was the seventh fastest of 52 works at the distance. "All I was doing in the early part was trying to keep him together," explained exercise rider Bobby Velez. "Then, at the head of the stretch, he changed to his right lead, and really picked it up on his own. At the eighth pole, I reached down and grabbed him because he was wanting to do more than we wanted." Just before watching Smarty Jones take the Eclipse Award in the three-year-old colt division Monday, trainer John Servis said that Rockport Harbor would make his return in either the Feb. 19 Southwest S. or Mar. 19 Gill Rebel S. Both races were won by Smarty last year on his way to Classic glory. Also working yesterday at Oaklawn was Gill Kentucky Jockey Club S. winner **Greater Good** (Intidab). Trained by Robert Holthus, he went an easy half in :50.20.

BLUE DIAMOND PREVIEW VOIDED Despite an effortless performance, the royally bred **Langless (Aus)** (Danehill) lost her three-length victory in Wednesday's A\$120,000 G3 Blue Diamond Preview S. at Caulfield when stewards declared the race void. Chief Steward Des Gleeson's panel heard evidence from six riders and deliberated for almost an hour before making the decision to void the race. Tony McEvoy, who trains Langless for the Sangster family, argued vehemently that the result should stand, but Gleeson said stewards ruled that horses were disadvantaged when barriers broke unevenly. "Immediately after the finishing post, the siren went because it was an uneven start, on face value. The starter reported it, and the stewards around the track reported it straight away," Gleeson said. "Six riders said they were disadvantaged. Nicholas Ryan [aboard Jestajewel] said his gate opened early, thought it was a false start and reined his horse in. No horse can gain an advantage at the start. We considered all the circumstances. Two gates opened prematurely so we deemed the race to be void." Gleeson said the relevant racing rule would be reviewed. "The rules need tweaking from time to time and I will have a look at what measures might improve this rule and cover this situation should it arise again," Gleeson said. Before the race was declared void, Adam Sangster said the daughter of champion sprinter Isca (Aus) (Rory's Jester {Aus}) had overcome significant problems to even make it to the races. "She had a few problems as a yearling," Sangster said. "We couldn't sell her. Tony McEvoy has done a terrific job to bring her this far when we were going to retire her unraced at one point." Sangster added, "She was incredibly impressive; we thought she had speed and she cruised like her mother, who was a great sprinter." Isca won the G1 Lightning-Newmarket double in 1999. McEvoy said he would apply to Melbourne Racing Club for either compensation or an exemption from the ballot for the filly to race in the G1 Blue Diamond S. on Feb. 26.

"We are very disappointed, very upset," McEvoy said. "No one on the course today would deny that if we ran that race 10 times, we would have seen the same result. I am very frustrated because I had no intention of running her again before the Blue Diamond. A poor decision has cost the Sangsters about three-quarters of a million in terms of the value of the filly," he said. "We might go to the Golden Slipper [G1, Sydney, Mar. 26] instead. I can't alter her conformation and constitution to force her to have another run in the Blue Diamond Prelude so she can get into the Blue Diamond. She ran her race three-quarters of a second quicker than the colts. No reasonable person would deny her a place in the Blue Diamond field."

SANTA MONICA H.-GI, \$250,000, 4yo/up, 7f

Tizakitty (Distinctive Cat) will be looking to add to her family glory when she heads postward in this contest Sunday. Produced by a full sister to Horse of the Year Tiznow as well as multi-millionaire Budroyale and graded stakes winner Tizdubai, the four-year-old is coming off a victory in the Kalookan Queen H. Jan. 5. "This is a step up, but she's as good as she can get," said trainer Bob Hess Jr. "She has a great family in her pedigree and she has a right to be able to win one of these kinds of races." Tizakitty was assigned 115 pounds for the Santa Monica. Among her scheduled rivals in the year's first Grade I contest are defending champion **Island Fashion** (Petionville) and the swift **Elusive Diva** (Elusive Quality). Opting to skip the race in favor of the \$500,000 Barretts/CTBA Distaff is **Alpha-bet Kisses** (Alphabet Soup), upset winner of the G1 La Brea S. "We could have gone in the Santa Monica or continued in the La Canada series," explained trainer Marty Jones. "The money was a factor and it's a tough race, but she's going well and Mr. Harris [owner John Harris] wanted to run here. She's already won a Grade I, so her value is established."

2005 NATC FUTURITIES AT MONMOUTH The National Association of Two-Year-Old Consignors has announced that the 2005 NATC Futurities will be run Sept. 24 at Monmouth Park in Oceanport, New Jersey. There are two races--one for fillies and one for colts and geldings--each at six furlongs and worth \$200,000. "The NATC is excited that buyers and consignors support two-year-old in training sales and have enabled us to achieve our goal to enhance the sales of juveniles," said NATC Board Member Mike Mulligan. "These races were run at Delaware Park the first three years, and it really jump-started the program. We feel moving the series to Monmouth, on the Jersey Shore, will add a new dimension by attracting both horsemen and racing fans." NATC Futurity eligibility requirements include consignments by 2005 NATC members who also contributed to the NATC advertising fund this year.

A Washington-bred yearling filly by Tale of the Cat elicited a top bid of \$72,000 at the second and final session of the Barretts January Mixed Sale at Fairplex Park in Pomona. Hip [515](#), the second foal out of three-time stakes winner One Number Short (Katowice), was purchased by Sheehy Brother's Ireland from the draft of Mary Knight, agent. Hip [408](#), the MSP Kingdom Bound (In Excess {Ire}), was the afternoon's highest-priced mare on the \$42,000 bid of G. Chris Coleman. Mary Knight, acting as agent to dissolve a partnership, again was the consignor. The six-year-old mare is a half to Grade II stakes winner Smokin Mel (Phone Order) and two other stakes performers. For the session, 162 head sold for \$1,583,500 and an average of \$6,598. The median was \$3,000. Overall, the two-day sale grossed \$3,214,300 for 403 sold, with an average of \$6,520 and a median of \$3,500.

He stands at Gainsborough Farm for a 2005 fee of \$20,000 live foal. We regret the error.
