ROYAL MEETING TWEAKED

This year's Royal Ascot meeting at York took shape on Tuesday with the announcement that two of the major contests will undergo slight changes to their distances. Officials at Ascot unveiled the running order for the festival June 14-18, with the news that the traditional mile events, including the G1 Queen Anne S., G1 St James's Palace S. and G1 Coronation S. will be shortened to seven furlongs and 205 yards. Among the other changes, the G1 Prince of Wales's S. will be run over 88 yards further than its

usual 10 furlongs and York has also imposed a reduced safety-limit restriction of 20 runners in the five and six-furlong contests, including the G2 King's Stand S. and of 23 participants in the seven-furlong races.

SANTA MONICA H.-GI, \$250,000, 4yo/up, f/m, 7f

Elusive Diva (Elusive Quality) worked a bullet five furlongs at Santa Anita Tuesday in :59. Making her first start in five months, the speedy four-year-old set the pace before tiring to third in the Dec. 27 GI La Brea S., but she may not be setting the pace Sunday. "I don't think she has to be in front to win," said trainer Mark Glatt.

"Nobody really wanted the lead the other day and she's got good natural speed so she found herself on the lead. It wasn't ideal for coming off a layoff, but she ran well."

California Sophomores Eye San Vicente:

Consolidator (Storm Cat), winner of the GI Lane's End Breeders' Futurity, worked six furlongs for trainer D. Wayne Lukas Thursday at Santa Anita in a bullet 1:11.60. The colt is being aimed at the Feb. 13 GI San Vicente S. "He's doing great," Lukas said of the colt. "He's the one." Also aiming for the San Vicente is trainer Ted West's **Kirkendahl** (Meniffee), who suffered his first loss when fifth in the Jan. 15 GI San Rafael, and the highly regarded **Fusaichi Samurai** (Fusaichi Pegasus). Neil Drysdale, who trained Fusaichi Pegasus to a Kentucky Derby victory and now trains Fusaichi Samurai, doesn't find the son as hard to handle as the father. "[Fusaichi Samurai] is very straightforward, very kind," Drysdale said. "[Fusaichi Pegasus] was very strong, very rambunctious."

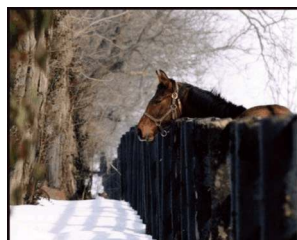

EXTREME COLD CAUSES MORE CANCELLATIONS Racing at Aqueduct, Turfway Park, Charles Town and Penn National was cancelled yesterday due to extremely cold weather conditions. Racing at the Big A was called off after the second race, but the track remained open for simulcasting. Wednesday night's card at Turfway Park was called off after two races due to unsafe track conditions and yesterday's races were also cancelled due to extreme cold. Action is scheduled to resume Friday at Aqueduct, Charles Town and Turfway. Penn National has already terminated its card for Friday.

BRITISH ALL-WEATHER STAR TO FRANKEL Kingsgate Bay (Ire) (Desert Sun {GB}), winner of three straight starts over the Lingfield all-weather surface late last year, has been sold to Satish Sanan's Padua Stables for a sum in excess of £200,000, according to *Racing Post*. The three-year-old gelding is scheduled to depart England on Tuesday to join the stable of Bobby Frankel. The deal was brokered by bloodstock agent Niall McLoughlin. "We'll miss him obviously," trainer John Best told *Racing Post*. "But a sale like that is a very good advertisement for what we do here and [owner] John [Mayne] is reinvesting a substantial portion of the money. He has already asked me to go out and find two or three new horses for him and I reckon, all being well, he should have his next three years racing free." Kingsgate Bay was a €9,500 Goffs November weanling and 21,000gns Doncaster September yearling purchase.

Juvenile **Darci Brahma (Aus)** (Danehill), who topped New Zealand Bloodstock's 2004 Premier Sale in Karaka at NZ\$1.1 million, will make his racing debut Sunday at Avondale in New Zealand. The colt, who was purchased by David Ellis of Te Akau Racing Stables, has had two eye-catching trial victories for trainer Mark Walker. He is the first foal from Group 1 winner Grand Echezeaux (NZ) (Zabeel {NZ}).

NIELLO TO STUD

Triple Group 1 winner **Niello (Aus)** (Octagonal {NZ}--Shadea {NZ}, by Straight Strike), a full brother to Australian Horse of the Year and champion three-year-old Lonhro (Aus), has been retired and will stand at Chatswood Stud in Victoria at a fee of A\$16,500 for 2005. The Ingham family's Woodlands Stud, which bred both horses, will retain 50 percent of Niello in a deal with Chatswood. Trained by John Hawkes, the four-year-old put together a record of 15-4-2-3, earning A\$974,345. He captured the 2003 G1 AJC Spring Champion S. over 2000 meters at Randwick in October and returned last autumn to take both the G1 Canterbury Guineas and G1 Rosehill Guineas.

Makin is also dispatching **Starcraft (NZ)** (Soviet Star) to England, where the champion three-year-old of 2003/2004 will take up residence in the barn of trainer Luca Cumani. A treble Group 1 winner, including the G1 AJC Australian Derby, Starcraft has nine career victories and earnings of A\$2.1 million.

WRITERS UP

IT COULD BE DUTROW DAY *by Lucas Marquardt*

Saturday, Feb. 5, could wind up being a very good day for Richard Dutrow, Jr. The 45-year-old conditioner will send out a pair of talented horses on opposite coasts, with **Love of Money** (Not For Love) taking aim at the GII Strub S. at Santa Anita and **Saint Liam** (Saint Ballado) tackling Gulfstream's GI Donn H. The latter proved himself capable of competing with the best last year, battling to second- and third-place finishes behind Peace Rules early in the season and running a memorable runner-up to eventual Horse of the Year Ghostzapper in the Sept. 11 GI Woodward S. Saint Liam finally notched a well-deserved graded stakes win in the GII Clark H. at Churchill in late November and will try for Grade I glory in the Donn.

"He's been training great," said Dutrow, who sent the colt out for a six-furlong move in 1:14 at Palm Meadows Wednesday. Dutrow understandably has high hopes for Saint Liam this year, seeing how the colt made trainer Bobby Frankel's Ghostzapper work every step of Belmont's stretch before falling a neck shy in the waning strides of the Woodward.

"I felt like a winner after that race," said Dutrow. "He ran a huge race to a very nice horse." Asked if he'd try to avoid Ghostzapper for the time being, Dutrow laughed, "Let's put it this way: I'll let Bobby pick his races before I pick mine for Saint Liam. Look, we don't want to run against him before we have to. But he doesn't want to run against us, either. That was a tough race for both horses."

Dutrow will have plenty of opportunities to ruminate with Frankel, as the Hall of Famer is currently overseeing Love of Money in California. The four-year-old Jay Em Ess colorbearer, last year's dominating GII Pennsylvania Derby winner, was originally scheduled to run in the Dec. 26 GI Malibu S., but was waylaid by bad weather and shipping woes. "We could have run,

but he'd been up all night in a box in a Texas warehouse," said Dutrow. "We didn't want to do that to the horse. Then we were going to run him in the next race [Jan. 15 GII San Fernando Breeders' Cup H.], but it just kept on raining and we couldn't really train him."

If his workout Thursday was anything to go by, Love of Money is back on schedule in a big way. Over a Santa Anita track rated fast, he blitzed through seven furlongs in 1:24 flat, the fastest of six works at the distance and a full two seconds quicker than the second-best horse, three-year-old prospect Southern Africa.

"People keep calling me and telling me how well he's doing," said Dutrow.

If having those two in the barn weren't enough, Dutrow's **Offlee Wild** (Wild Again), winner of last year's GII Massachusetts H., worked five furlongs in a bullet :59 1/5 (best of 19) at Palm Meadows Wednesday and is nearing a return. "Even through the work looked real fast, we've got a bit to do with him before he's really fit," Dutrow said. "It'll probably be another month or two before he's ready for a start."

Offlee Wild has been off since the Mass 'Cap, but should he return to the form that saw him beat Funny Cide in that event, Dutrow might just have to find another coast to compete on.
