LIGHTWEIGHT CHAMP

Roused by jockey Gary Stevens with two furlongs to run, the diminutive **Salt Champ (Arg)** (Salt Lake) circled the field and tracked down 3-2 chalk **Island Fashion** (Petionville) to take her U.S. debut in the GI Santa Monica H. at Santa Anita. The five-year-old, a three-time Group-1 winner in Argentina, had only one beaten after a half in a blistering :44.32, but was switched to the outside entering the stretch and closed with a rush to win going away. So did winning trainer Richard Mandella think Salt Champ could make an immediate impact in the U.S.? "You never know what they're really made of until you run them here," he said, "but her tapes showed races kind of like that, coming from behind, and I was impressed." Mandella added that he'd savor this win before mapping out Salt Champ's next start.

'BIG A' BE GOLD

The cagey veteran **Country be Gold** (Summer Squall), who had been enduring a six-race dry spell, broke through in a big way Sunday with a driving victory in the GIII Aqueduct H. The eight-year-old, the second-longest shot on the board at 22-1 odds, was unhurried as the leaders battled through a quick half in :46 3/5. Skimming the rail on the far turn, he came through on the inside of favored **Aggadán**

(Carnivalay) and edged past that tired but game foe in the dying strides. "I was able to save ground most of the way," said jockey Jose Espinoza. "The last sixteenth, he took off. HOST WINS MARRED MAC DIARMIDA

Host (Tabasco Cat) managed to gut out a victory over fellow pacer and longshot **Navesink River** (Unbridled) in yesterday's GIII Mac Diarmida H. at Gulfstream, but the race was marred when two horses went down on the far turn. Navesink River clicked off :25:46, :50.30 and 1:15.07 fractions, then failed to stave off Host, who hit the front in the final panel and maintained a neck advantage to the wire. It was the first stakes victory for the John Kimmel trainee. Meanwhile, **In Hand** (Belong to Me), under Gary Boulanger, lost his footing on the turn and fell, tossing his rider. **Macaw (Ire)** (Bluebird) unseated his jockey, Eddie Castro, but avoided falling himself after hitting In Hand. Boulanger was taken to a local hospital after suffering a head laceration; In Hand was euthanized. Both Castro and Macaw escaped serious injury. Click for the [brisnet.com chart](#). Could be a Contenda...

Salt Champ debuted a winner at San Isidro, Argentina, in May of 2003 and just missed Group 1 glory in her very next start, finishing a nose shy in the Estrellas Juvenile Fillies S. The dark bay got the job done in her third trip to post, winning the G1 Mil Guineas in August, and made it two straight in the G1 Argentine 1000 Guineas. Third, beaten seven lengths, in the G1 Gran Premio Seleccion in mid-October, she concluded 2003 with a fifth to eventual U.S. Grade I-winner Miss Loren (Arg) in the G1 Copa de Plata in December. Salt Champ managed just one start last year, but made it count, registering a head victory in the G1 Gran Premio Gilberto Lerena in mid-April. She was moved to Richard Mandella's shedrow about four months ago.

Island Fashion a Solid Second...

Island Fashion, winner of the GII Lady's Secret BC H. over this strip in October, was game in defeat yesterday. Making her first start since finishing fourth in the Nov. 28 GI Matriarch S., the Everest Stables homebred was forced to take up a bit at the three-eighths pole, forged to the front in upper stretch, but ran out of gas late.

Host proved his affinity for the Gulfstream's sod last March, winning a pair of allowance races to kick off his season. He was a neck back of **In Hand** (Belong to Me) in the Greenwood Cup H. two starts later at Philly Park in June, then added more black type in August with a third in the restricted John's Call H. at Saratoga. He returned to the allowance ranks, and to the winner's circle, in a Saratoga NW3X Sept. 6 and concluded his year with a good fourth, beaten just half a length, in the 11-panel John Henry S. at the Meadowlands Oct. 29. Making his first start in three months, he stayed on the hip of Navesink River before overhauling that foe late. "He got some time off after that last start that wasn't supposed to be," said winning trainer John Kimmel. "He got a post-race bute shot and the veterinarian shot him outside the vein, so he swelled up real bad and missed about a month. But he's come back well. Now we'll have to give him some consideration for the Grade 1 [Mar. 6 Gulfstream Park Breeders' Cup H.] after the way he ran today." The 8-5 pick **Burning Sun** (Danzig), off since May, was ideally placed but couldn't catch the leaders late.

Country Be Gold beat Supah Blitz in a Delaware allowance last August, then was placed first in the Gate Dancer S. over that oval two weeks later for trainer Reynoldo Nobles. The bay managed only a third in four subsequent efforts, however, and was transferred to Steve Kappes' barn in November. In his first start for Kappes, Country Be Gold never got going when seventh in the GIII Queens County H. at Aqueduct Dec. 4, and was hardly a threat when fifth, beaten 13 lengths, in the 13-furlong Gallant Fox H. Dec. 29. But he finally got back on track in yesterday's feature at the Big A, closing into fast fractions to best Aggadan. "The first time, I ran him in the Queens County, and he was way too far back," commented Kappes. "Then, last time, we figured we'd experiment with the mile and five-eighths. That didn't work out. We were fortunate that we got a good pace [yesterday]. They went very quick, and that set up well for us. We'll probably bring him back in the [Mar. 9, \$75,000] Stymie H."

"He must have taken a bad step and the torque caused the injury. He worked, came back to the barn, and had his bath before he showed any signs. He has the fracture in his cannon bone." Howard said the injury wasn't necessarily career-ending. "It's not displaced, so they say he may come back to race again. We'll have to see how he comes out of the surgery." **Midway Road**, second to **Funny Cide** in the 2003 GI Preakness S., won a trio of stakes last year, including a track-record breaking performance in the GIII Ben Ali S. at Keeneland.

CANCELLATIONS CONTINUE A trio of tracks were forced to call off live racing yesterday as inclement weather continued to wreak havoc on Central and East Coast racing. West Virginia's Charles Town and Mountaineer Park, Maryland's Laurel Park and Kentucky's Turfway Park all scratched their entire cards Sunday. It was the seventh time since the New Year that Turfway, which also cancelled racing Saturday night, lost all or part of a live card.

Toll Taker to Make 2005 Debut in Old Hat:

Toll Taker (Bernstein), who won the GIII Astarita S. at Belmont last October, is set to make her seasonal debut in Saturday's GIII Old Hat S. at Gulfstream. The Illinois-bred has been off since being pulled up because her saddle slipped in the Showtime Deb S. at Hawthorne Nov. 13, but gave every indication that she was primed for a big effort with an unpublished :46 2/5 four-furlong breeze Sunday. "It was a really nice work," commented trainer Tim Hills. "She sat about 10 lengths behind another worker and she blew by him. She galloped out in :59 4/5."

Defer to Hutcheson:

Trainer Shug McGaughey plans on starting GIII Laurel Futurity winner **Defer** (Danzig) in Saturday's 7 1/2-furlong GII Hutcheson S. at Gulfstream Park. "Defer is ready to go," confirmed the Hall of Fame conditioner, who sent his charge out to a five-furlong breeze in 1:00 3/5 Sunday at Gulfstream. The Phipps homebred is unraced since the Nov. 20 Futurity. Another Phipps homebred, GI Hollywood Derby winner **Good Reward** (Storm Cat), may also start Saturday. The colt worked four furlongs in :52 4/5 yesterday and is a possible for the GI Donn H. McGaughey said that he'd wait until later in the week before making a decision.

WRITERS UP

LIVE WIRE

All it took was 660 feet. Eric Hamelback had been reasonably sure the chestnut was a good young horse, but in that span, one furlong, he realized that what Live Oak Stud had on its hands was a legitimate Classic prospect.

Hamelback, general manager of Charlotte Weber's Live Oak, watched as the homebred **High Fly** (Atticus) battled around the turn and into the lane in the one-mile Aventura S. at Gulfstream Jan. 8. But just as a gritty stretch duel was set to unfold, the colt merely shrugged off his rival and bounded clear to an impressive nine-length tally.

"We were pleasantly surprised," admitted Hamelback. "It looked like it was going to be a dogfight for the first few furlongs, but for him to open in the final eighth like he did--we weren't expecting an effort like that."

Time will tell if High Fly, who completed the Aventura distance in 1:35 4/5, is Kentucky Derby material or simply a solid runner beating up on inferior competition. He's done everything right so far, however, capturing his three starts by a combined 21 1/4 lengths, and stands a shot at becoming yet another serious contender in what is a very deep sophomore class.

High Fly, who is conditioned by Bill White, debuted at Calder in October. Leaving the gate as the 3-2 pick, he took charge turning the corner and sprinted home a 9 1/4-length-winner, taking the six-furlong maiden special weight in 1:10 3/5.

In his next, versus first-level Calder allowance foes Nov. 20, he rallied from off the pace and posted a workmanlike victory by three lengths.

Hamelback liked what he saw in the two efforts.

"At Calder, I pay less attention to the competition than to the figures, so when he ran a six on the Ragozin sheets in his first race, I knew he was a nice horse," he said. "Then, in his second start, he ran an eight. I really trust the numbers, and I was hoping he would come out in the Aventura and put up a big effort. He ran a five, in just his third start, which is pretty impressive."

While High Fly's dominance in the Aventura answered many questions for Hamelback, a few unknowns remain.

"Now we'll see if he can handle the distance," said Hamelback, who joined Live Oak two years ago after a stint as assistant manager at Adena Springs Kentucky. "Atticus was a miler, but High Fly's heart scans indicate that he'll have plenty of stamina. He also looks like a horse that would get two turns."

High Fly might get some stamina help from his dam, the Slewpy mare Verbasle. The Kentucky-bred, now 17, showed ability at a route of ground, following a second to Meadow Star in the GI Matron S. with a fourth to that foe in the 8 1/2-panel GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. As a three-year-old the following year, Verbasle won a 10-furlong turf allowance at Belmont. Further down the line in his family is 1981 GI Belmont S. winner Summing.

Michael Youngs, bloodstock advisor to Mrs. Weber, selected Verbasle carrying High Fly in utero out of the 2001 Keeneland November sale, where she left the ring a \$200,000 Live Oak purchase.

"Michael had seen Estimraar, her [1997] Holy Bull foal, and liked him," said Hamelback, noting that the victor of the 2003 G3 Maktoum Challenge-Round I had won a Listed stakes in Dubai this past Thursday. "Michael also liked the mare and thought that, physically, she fit Live Oak's breeding program well, and that she matched well with Atticus. We put much more emphasis on the mare and female family than we do the stallion."

Live Oak's confidence in Verbasle was evident when they booked her to Giant's Causeway the following breeding season, then, after she failed to catch in 2003, to Seeking the Gold last year. Perhaps some of that confidence stemmed from the way a young High Fly was progressing.

"He was well-made," Hamelback recalled. "As a yearling, we had some conformational issues with him; he toed out a little bit. But even then, he was one of the best we had on the farm. We actually thought we could have sold him for a ton of money because he was such a nice physical, but we kept him because he was so athletic and

because his heart scans were so good. We don't buy or keep solely on the scans, but that played into the decision."

The choice to keep High Fly looks like the right one for Live Oak, the Florida-based operation that bred and raced three-time Grade I winner Sultry Song, as well as 2005 stakes winners Slews Final Answer and Electric Light.

High Fly's first test against graded company will come this weekend, when he lines up in the nine-furlong GIII Holy Bull S. at Gulfstream. In preparation, he worked a sharp 1:14 2/5 over a fast Calder track yesterday morning. The move convinced conditioner Bill White that targeting the Holy Bull is the right choice.

"We're good to go," he said. "He came out of his last really good and there's been a full month to recover. That's plenty of time and there's simply no reason to wait another 30 days to race him again."

So is there another High Fly in the pipeline with the Giant's Causeway sibling, a two-year-old colt named Giant Basil?

"He's a similar type to his brother, but he's lighter-boned," said Hamelback. "He looks good and the fellow who has him now likes him quite a bit. We'll see."
