DECLAN'S MOON FIRES BULLET

Champion two-year-old **Declan's Moon** (Malibu Moon) worked five furlongs in :59.80 at Hollywood Thursday.

The move was the best out of 22 workouts at the distance. "It couldn't have gone any better," trainer Ron Ellis said of the drill. "I didn't want him to over extend himself and if I didn't know any better, I would have thought he went in 1:02 or 1:03. He had his ears pricked and it was like he was going in a high gallop."

The undefeated gelding will make his highly anticipated sophomore debut in the GII Santa Catalina S. at Santa Anita Mar. 5. Also on the worktab yesterday, was champion two-year-old filly **Sweet Catomine** (Storm Cat), who worked five furlongs in 1:01.40 at Santa Anita for the Mar. 13 GI Santa Anita Oaks.

ROCKPORT HARBOR ON HIS WAY

Undefeated three-year-old **Rockport Harbor** (Unbridled's Song) continues to impress in his training, working five furlongs in 1:02.20 at Oaklawn Park yesterday. The move was the sixth fastest of 53. "I was very happy with the work," said trainer John Servis. "It was just what I wanted. He was well within himself and he galloped out really good.

Jan. 8. Off since finishing second to **Medallist** (Touch Gold) in the GIII Withers S. May 1, **Forest Danger** (Forestry) makes his long awaited return to the races versus that rival and five others in the GIII Deputy Minister H.

DEVIL'S BAG DIES Claiborne Farm stallion **Devil's Bag** (Halo--Ballade, by *Herbager) was euthanized Thursday morning after sustaining an injury in his stall. The 24-year-old stallion had stood at the Paris, Kentucky nursery since his retirement from racing in 1984. "It's the end of an era for us," said Dell Hancock. "It's sad. Woody Stephens trained him, and we were so close with Woody. We still have Danzig on the farm, but Devil's Bag was the last active stallion we had that had been with Woody." He was described as being in good health, and was standing for a fee of \$10,000 at the time of his death. Bred in Maryland by E.P. Taylor, Devil's Bag was purchased as a yearling by the Mills Family's Hickory Tree Stables for \$325,000 at the 1982 Keeneland July Yearling Sale.

A Meteoric Rise

He had a tough example to follow in the shape of his older full sister Glorious Song--a champion in the U.S. and Canada in 1980--but Devil's Bag managed to do just that. Guided by Woody Stephens, the dark bay with the distinctive face sailed unchallenged through a five-race juvenile campaign that included victories in the GI Champagne S., the GI Laurel Futurity and the GII Cowdin S. He set a track record in his win at Laurel and produced a stakes record of 1:34 1/5 in capturing the Champagne. Those performances earned him an Eclipse Award and consideration as Horse of the Year for 1983, but wound up losing to the trans-Atlantic exploits of All Along (Fr). Syndicated for \$36 million, Devil's Bag was expected to top himself at three in 1984, but things didn't exactly follow the storyline.

The Star Comes Back to Earth

His seasonal bow was a facile seven-length tally at 1-20 in the Flamingo Prep at Hialeah, but Devil's Bag lost his perfect record and his mystique next out. In the GI Flamingo S., the Hickory Tree colorbearer ran fourth as the 1-5 chalk to Time for a Change and Dr. Carter. Though he rebounded with a lengthy allowance win at Keeneland and added the Derby Trial S. at Churchill, Devil's Bag exited the latter with an injury which ended his career. He stood on the sidelines as his stablemate, the ill-fated Swale, swept both the Kentucky Derby and the Belmont S.

In the Breeding Shed

There were even more expectations for Devil's Bag at stud and, even though he didn't live up to his \$36-million price tag, he did manage to establish himself as a solid sire. "He wasn't the top-echelon stallion we hoped that he would be," Hancock acknowledged, "but he sired useful horses. He had a nice life." From 18 crops of racing age, he has sired 43 stakes winners to date, and his progeny have earned over \$47 million. His chief earner was Japanese champion Taiki Shuttle, with a bankroll of nearly \$5 million. Among his leading U.S. representatives was the admirably tough Devil His Due, a multiple Grade I winner of over \$3.9 million and now a successful stallion in his own right. Devil's Bag also sired millionaire Twilight Agenda, the Grade I-winning fillies Buy the Sport and Devil's Orchid, and German champion Quebrada. Devil's Bag was predeceased by his full brother Saint Ballado, another successful stallion.

‘WONDER’ AROUND AGAIN The Phillips’ millionaire **Wonder Again** (Silver Hawk) will remain in training this season, according to *Daily Racing Form*.

The six-year-old has been freshened since running a close third to champion Ouija Board (GB) in the GI Breeders’ Cup F/M Turf. “She was in Kentucky until last week,” trainer Jimmy Toner told *DRF*. “She’s just hacking around in Camden [South Carolina]. We’ll bring her in here [Florida] on Mar. 1 and

start her in some serious training.” A Grade I winner at three, the bay had a quiet four-year-old campaign, but was resurgent at five, winning both the GI Diana H. and the GII New York H. in addition to her good Breeders’ Cup performance at Lone Star. Toner indicated that having Belmont as the site of this year’s Breeders’ Cup was one reason for keeping Wonder Again in training. “It’s nice having the Breeders’ Cup at Belmont this year,” he added. “She just has to walk across the street and run.” He mentioned the GII Just a Game Breeders’ Cup H. at Belmont June 11 as her possible first start back.

BREEDERS’ CUP STAKES PROGRAM WORTH \$7.3 MILLION Officials of Breeders’ Cup Limited and the National Thoroughbred Racing Association announced yesterday that the 2005 Breeders’ Cup Stakes program will feature 125 races—including 69 U.S. graded stakes—and distribute \$7.3 million in Breeders’ Cup Funds. Now in its 10th year, the Breeders’ Cup Stakes program is cooperatively funded by Breeders’ Cup Ltd. and 42 participating racetracks. “We are pleased to continue substantial allocations in funding to horsemen across the U.S. and Canada and provide them with multiple opportunities to earn Breeders’ Cup money throughout the year,” said D.G. Van Clief Jr., president of Breeders’ Cup Ltd. and NTRA Commissioner.

Increased Insurance Coverage for Gulfstream Jocks:

Gulfstream Park will provide jockey accident insurance in the amount of \$500,000 per accident to riders who compete at the Hallandale track during the remainder of the 2005 season. This is an increase over the previous level of \$100,000. Should the industry-wide approach regarding jockey accident insurance be enacted prior to the end of the Gulfstream meet, that program will supersede the interim program announced yesterday. "Gulfstream looks forward to an industry-wide solution to this issue," said Scott Savin, Gulfstream Park president and general manager. "In the interim, it was felt that this step was appropriate as a temporary measure under the circumstances."

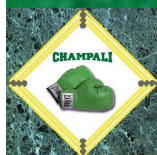
Top Jocks Coming Back:

Jockeys Corey Nakatani and Alex Solis will resume riding Friday and Saturday after extended absences. Nakatani returns from a 30-day suspension Friday, while Solis returns Saturday after getting injured in a spill at Del Mar last July. "I haven't really raced for 6 1/2 months and it's ironic how life is," said Solis, who has fully recovered from a fractured vertebra and three broken ribs. "You do something for 24 years and you don't realize how much you love it until you don't do it. It's very difficult. It makes me understand how much I love riding horses and how much I love being here."

Santa Anita to Honor Delahoussaye:

Hall of Fame jockey Eddie Delahoussaye will be honored with a ceremony at Santa Anita Saturday Mar. 5. "It will be great to see the fans and owners, everybody at Santa Anita and everyone who supported me," the 53-year-old said. "This gives me a chance to thank everyone. The ceremony isn't so much for me. Basically it's for the fans. Two years ago it would have been too hard emotionally for me to do it. But now it's been over two years since I retired and I don't have to worry about it." Delahoussaye, who retired with 6,384 victories, called it a career after sustaining head and neck injuries in a spill at Del Mar in 2002.

WINSTON RELEASED

Robert Winston was released on bail on Wednesday evening after his arrest as part of the City of London Police's investigations into alleged race-fixing. The 25-year-old former champion apprentice, who partnered Magical Romance (Ire) to success in last year's G1 Cheveley Park S., became the fifth jockey to be arrested in the on-going case and will report back to the police station in May. Jockeys' Association Chief Executive John Blake yesterday explained to *PA Sport* that Winston had gone to the police in York voluntarily and that he "hopes to be supported and continue to earn his living." Blake added, "He felt embarrassed about the whole thing, about his reputation and the people he works for. He's got nothing to hide and he is co-operating as appropriate. He was upset and shocked."

BLACK MINNALOUSHE COLT TOPS KARAKA

A bay colt by Black Minnaloushe out of Riposte (NZ) (Straight Strike) brought top bid of NZ\$140,000 at Thursday's first session of New Zealand Bloodstock's Select Sale at Karaka. Purchased by English-based Richard O'Gorman Bloodstock, [hip 637](#) was consigned by Haunui Farm. Leading the buyers during the first session, Paul Moroney Bloodstock purchased eight head for a total of NZ\$330,000, while Windsor Park Stud Ltd topped all consignors with gross receipts of NZ\$598,500 for 14 head. At the completion of the first of two sessions, aggregate, median and average were all up over last year. A total of 256 lots brought NZ\$6,237,000, 14.5 percent better than last year's gross receipts of NZ\$5,447,000. The median increased by 15 percent to NZ\$30,000 this term, while average rose by 17.5 percent to NZ\$35,640. Day 2, the final portion of the select catalog, continues today.

February 7, 1969...Jockey Diane Crump became the first woman rider in America to compete in a pari-mutuel race, finishing 10th aboard 48-1 shot Bridle 'n Bit in the seventh race at Hialeah.
