NYRA TO BEGIN PRE- & POST-RACE TESTING

The New York Racing Association has announced that it will institute pre- and post-race milkshake tests beginning next Wednesday, Feb. 16. Random pre-race testing will be conducted every day, while post-race testing will be conducted on all races to determine if blood gas levels exceed legal thresholds. "There has been a vigorous debate within the industry over which testing practice employs the best methodology," said NYRA Co-Chairman C. Steven Duncker. "We will do both to help New York racing and the entire industry in becoming knowledgeable through this collection of data. As owners and caretakers of three of the most important race-tracks [Aqueduct, Belmont and Saratoga] in the sport of Thoroughbred racing, it is imperative that NYRA pursues all avenues to prevent illegal practices." Any trainer whose horse tests positive for illegal substances will be required to move--at his own expense--any entered horses to a NYRA security-monitored barn by 5 p.m. prior to race day. This policy will continue for a 30-day period after a first offense. For a second offense, a trainer's stalls will be revoked and he/she will not be allotted stalls in the future.

Mandella Making Plans:

Trainer Richard Mandella, who won the G1 Dubai World Cup with Pleasantly Perfect last year, is likely to stay home this year. The Hall of Fame conditioner had a pair of candidates for the \$6-million contest, **Rock Hard Ten** (Kris S.) and **Congrats** (A.P. Indy), but is leaning towards keeping the pair in town for the \$1-million GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 5. "I wouldn't say I've made a decision, but the inclination would be to stay home and run in the Handicap with both of them," he said. "After discussing the situation with the owners, the tentative idea would be to stay here." Both runners have made two starts at the Santa Anita meeting, with the four-year-old Rock Hard Ten taking the GI Malibu S. and the GI Strub S., while five-year-old Congrats won the GI San Pasqual H. and most recently ran third in the GI San Antonio H. Another Mandella trainee, GI San Fernando S. winner **Minister Eric** (Old Trieste), may target the GI Tokyo City H. Apr. 2.

Youbet Contributes \$100K to Arizona's RTIP:

Youbet.com has contributed \$100,000 to the University of Arizona's Race Track Industry Program to help endow a faculty chair that will conduct industry business research and to head the RTIP's masters degree program. "Youbet's decision to fund a substantial part of the RTIP Chair is gratifying and enlightened," said the program's director, Doug Reed. "Racing lacks a source of 'real world' research on issues facing the industry today. The formation of the Chair will help fill that void." The professor named to the Chair will focus on producing relevant research and statistical modeling in the areas of racing industry economics, finance and marketing. The research will be made available to the industry at no cost. "Racing is a \$3-billion industry that directly and indirectly employs 472,800 in the U.S.," said Youbet Chief Executive Officer Charles F. Champion. "Today's managers need access to the kind of industry-wide research that can be uniquely conducted in an academic setting."

"You've got to be happy in life and I had to move to be happy," he said. "I took the view I didn't want to jeopardize that for racing. I've come out of it a tougher person and learned more about life than racing, I'd say." On his riding last season, Spencer said he felt he "rode well, to a point," before adding that "every jockey says they could have done better, even if they won every race in a season." He paid tribute to John Magnier and Michael Tabor, adding that they "are great men and still great friends." He added, "John Magnier has been nothing but nice to me and there was never any pressure from him or Mr Tabor and I look forward to riding for them in the future." He also revealed that Ireland's quieter fixture list helped sway him back to England. "I've missed riding every day more than anything," he continued. "I've had a great response from lots of trainers I've ridden for before like David Loder and Luca Cumani and the fire is still burning."
