RAZOR SHARP

A field of seven headed by **Sharp Lisa** (Dixieland Band) will line up for Saturday's feature at Santa Anita, the GI Las Virgenes S. A 6 1/2-length maiden winner in her Calder debut last September, the chestnut filly just missed by a head in her second career start in the GI Darley Alcibiades S. Sharp Lisa disappointed with a sixth-place finish in the GI Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies, but rebounded with a second-place

showing in the GI Hollywood Starlet S. Dec. 19. Backed at odds of 4-5 in her sophomore debut, the Doug O'Neill trainee reported home a 1 1/2-length victress in the seven furlong Santa Ynez S. Jan. 17. "We're all kind of gung-ho for this race," O'Neill told *Daily Racing Form*. "She should be tough, but she's got to run her race. I think it's a good opportunity." The Bob and Beverly Lewis colorbearer **Classic Elegance** (Carson City) flashed plenty of talent last summer notching the GIII Debutante S. and the GII Schuylerville S., but hasn't done much since. After finishing seventh in the GII Spinaway S., the bay filly was eased in the Alcibiades in her most recent outing. The \$650,000 KEESEP juvenile purchase adds Lasix for her three-year-old debut.

JOHN GAINES DIES

John R. Gaines, founder of the Breeders' Cup and former owner of Gainesway Farm, died yesterday from complications of diabetes at the age of 76. One of the true innovators of the sport, Gaines was one of the first to import stallions from Europe on a major scale and to form stallion syndicates. He was honored with a Special Eclipse Award, as a Thoroughbred Club Honor Guest and was the lone recipient of the Breeders' Cup Special Award. It all began when he took over the Standardbred operation started by his grandfather in 1925 and opened a Thoroughbred division of Gainesway Farm in 1962 with champions Oil Royalty and Bold Bidder and former broodmare of the

year Cosmah. As a Gainesway stallion, Bold Bidder sired two Kentucky Derby winners and led the world's sire list in 1974. Cosmah was the dam of three-time champion Tosmah and of Halo, the world's leading sire in 1983 and 1989. He managed 11 stallions who were champion sires 23 times in North America, South America, England, Ireland and France. Gainesway stallions and their progeny include nine winners of the Prix de l'Arc de Triomphe, six winners of the Kentucky Derby, seven winners of the Preakness S. and six winners of the Belmont S. Gainesway was one of the first farms to start multiple breeding sessions per day and had success with putting mares under lights before many farms began the practice. In 1989 Gaines sold Gainesway Farm to South African Graham Beck, but reemerged after the founding of John R. Gaines Thoroughbreds with his son Thomas and daughter Gloria along with Olin Gentry in 1993. From 1993 to 2000, John R. Gaines Thoroughbreds was represented by 114 broodmares. The broodmares and their progeny earned over \$70 million and include 15 champions. John R. Gaines Thoroughbreds also acquired significant interests in stallions, including Gilded Time and Southern Halo.

Breeders' Cup

"The Breeders' Cup is a rather unwieldy organization. There are 50 directors and about an eight-man executive committee, and it's not a very good structure for getting something done. I think that we need to streamline the enterprise and we have to find better ways of marketing the sport than we have up to this point and time."

"One thing that I am disappointed about is that is no recognition whatsoever in the racing Hall of Fame for all of the great breeders and owners. Horses that have run some of the most important and exhilarating races in the history of the sport -- there's not even a mention in the racing Hall of Fame about the Breeders' Cup. That's something that should be resolved."

Racinos

"The simple truth of the situation is that in order to compete in today's world which is very competitive for the entertainment dollar, the sporting dollar, racing without a subsidy such as the video lottery terminal will have a very hard time of maintaining it's position in pursuit of the gambling dollar. Where VLTs have been implemented, there has been a miraculous turnaround, bringing a benefit to the horsemen and the industry that couldn't be achieved any other way. If we can't compete, like the Commonwealth of Kentucky, if we don't get VLTs at the tracks, the whole breeding industry will move from out of here to the states that do have the foresight, intelligence, and the political will to establish VLTs."

Sikura: Gaines Was "Peerless"

John Sikura of Hill 'n' Dale Farm is one of many in the industry who feel privileged to have known John R. Gaines. "My father and he were very dear friends," Sikura recalled yesterday. "I met him in Kentucky and, after I moved to Lexington in the 1980s, he became a very dear friend to me. He was a supporter and a confidante."

Sikura feels Gaines's influence can be felt throughout the entire Thoroughbred industry, from breeding to racing.

"He revolutionized the industry," he said. "From the Breeders' Cup, to the importation of European stallions, to syndicating stallions and selling weanlings. It's just amazing that one man did so many things."

"The Breeders' Cup is the event that still influences today," Sikura continued. "It's a true world championship and it was the brain child of one man. He was able to travel through what was then a very competitive environment. He traversed all these different groups of people to put the Breeders' Cup together. It was a great achievement."

Sikura also pointed to Gaines's revolution of the breeding industry through his importation of European champions such as Blushing Groom, Riverman and Lyphard.

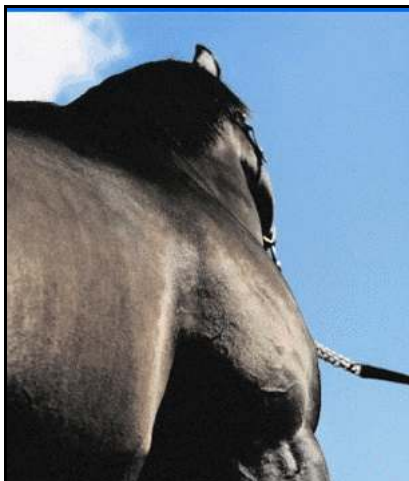
"They were all breed-changing stallions," Sikura remarked. "So, from a breeding point of view, that was very significant to the industry."

Gaines's presence can also be felt in the sale's ring.

"He was the first to sell well-bred, expensive weanlings in that number," Sikura explained. "That was a new method of vending horses."

"It's amazing, when you look at his resume, to think that one man did all of this--it's just an amazing body of work. He was peerless. It's a sad day, not just for me personally, but for the industry. He was a great man."

An Innovator and an Educator...

James Keogh of Grovendale Advisory Services worked at Gainesway from 1982 until 1992, first in the stallion barn and later in the office. "It was a serious education, let me tell you," Keogh said. "I like to joke that I never went to college, but I learned all I needed to know from Mr. Gaines." When Keogh went out on his own, Gaines was quick to lend a helping hand. "He spoke to several influential people and encouraged them to sell horses with me," the Irishman said. "You can't believe how significant that was. He gave me several of the first important horses I had to sell and we had a lot of successful pinhooks and made a lot of money selling mares over the years. But it wasn't about the money with Mr. Gaines, it was about the education. You couldn't put a price on it." He added, "Mr. Gaines was always very insistent that anything worth doing was worth doing well. He was constantly looking for ways to improve anything he undertook, whether it was stallion management or the Breeders' Cup or KEEP. He was a fabulous innovator--what a fabulous mind he had." But, while Gaines was well-known for his accomplishments in the racing industry, Keogh offered another side to the story. "A lot of people don't realize how many good deeds he has done without anyone knowing about them," he said. "They don't know the number of lives he impacted. He was a very, very special person."

Gaines Forever Dedicated...

Gainesway President Antony Beck, son of Graham Beck who purchased Gainesway Farm in 1989, also paid tribute to Gaines in a statement. "John Gaines had tremendous vision and did so much for the horse industry he loved. He was forever dedicated to this industry and, through KEEP, maintained his involvement even in his latter years. He had tremendous intellect and was a genuinely unique and special person. I feel very fortunate to have had the opportunity to spend time with him and get to know him. He will be missed."

A wide open field of 11, including blue-blooded colts **Harlington** (Unbridled) and **Scipion** (A.P. Indy), have been entered in this contest. The former sold for \$2.8 million at the Keeneland September sale as a yearling and has been perfect since, graduating at Aqueduct last November and adding a Gulfstream allowance last out Jan. 15. The son of former champion Serena's Song faces his biggest challenge here. Scipion, a 3/4- brother to Breeders' Cup Juvenile hero Vindication, looks to get back on track after going winless in three attempts since his impressive maiden victory at Saratoga last summer. Likely to be favored in the betting is Overbrook farm's homebred **Storm Surge** (Storm Cat). Winner of the Lone Star Juvenile last season, the dark bay rides a two-race winning streak into this, including the GIII Lecomte S. over this strip last time Jan. 15.

MITCHELL WARNED OFF

Juddmonte Farms General Manager Philip Mitchell has been disqualified for three months by the Jockey Club as the Endless Summer (GB) case was brought to a close yesterday. The "warning off," which runs from next Saturday to May 19, was imposed by the disciplinary panel for falsifying the date of birth of the former high-class performer. Mitchell was found guilty under Rule 201(v) in that he had committed a fraudulent practice in registering that the G2 Richmond S. winner had been born Jan. 2 1998 instead of Dec. 26 1997, allowing him to run in juvenile contests in 2000. Juddmonte Farms have repaid the prize money earned by the colt in those starts, which also included a second placing in the G1 Prix Morny and G1 Middle Park S. The Jockey Club praised Mitchell's "open and honest cooperation" with the inquiry and recognised that his actions were not carried out for personal financial gain.
