HIGH YIELD TO LA QUEBRADA

Multiple Grade I stakes winner **High Yield** (Storm Cat-

Scoop the Gold, by Forty Niner) will stand at Haras la Quebrada in Argentina in 2004 instead of shuttling to Australia for a fifth season. High Yield, whose first crop stakes winner came courtesy of **Amazing Buy**, winner of the Busanda S. and Wide Country S., is currently standing at Ashford in Kentucky. His first Australian winner was registered last

month when the promising Lee Freedman-trained youngster **Canary Islands (Aus)** won at Sandown. High Yield covered 77 mares at Coolmore Australia in 2004.

HOW SWEET IT IS

Sweet Win, a chestnut filly by King of Kings (Ire) out of the St. Jovite mare Win For Juno, rounded out two days of action with a record bid of \$370,000 at Monday's final session of Fasig-Tipton's Kentucky Winter Mixed Sale in Lexington, Kentucky. Consigned by Craig Bandoroff's Denali Stud, the four-year-old broodmare prospect was purchased by North Hills Management, acting on behalf of Koji Maeda. The first foal produced by her dam, who is out of GI Acorn S. winner Special Team, Sweet Win was unraced at two, but came back to win the GII San Clemente H. and finish runner-up in the GI Del Mar Oaks the following season. Edmund Gann, well known for buying up-and-coming foreign runners, tested his mettle in the breeding stock game and was responsible for the day's second highest price of \$300,000 which Anthony Stroud paid for hip 383.

Venturi (GB), a bay four-year-old filly by Danehill Dancer (Ire) out of Zagreb Flyer (GB) (by Old Vic {GB}), was consigned by Mill Ridge Sales, agent. While the first day failed to improve upon 2004, the final day blew last year's corresponding session away, posting across the board increases in gross, average and median. Average soared by 150 percent to \$25,359, while median also showed gains of 112 percent, a rise from \$4,000 in 2004 up to \$8,500 this year. *(FT stats p.4)*

"He'll start next in the G2 Spring S. on Mar. 20 or in the G3 Mainichi Hai on Mar. 26," said winning trainer Kenji Yamauchi.

"We do an extensive analysis once a month of every baby in our barn," Virginia Kraft Payson explained at Saratoga's 2003 sale, after her handsome A.P. Indy yearling--a three-parts-brother to Vindication--had come under the hammer. "And at every stage of his development, we liked him a tad better than Vindication. He's a beautiful colt, and we think he is very special. From the beginning I wanted to keep a piece of him."

Until Saturday's GIII Risen Star S., this assessment of the A.P. Indy youngster--Scipion--seemed over-optimistic. Having won only one of his first four starts, Scipion looked destined to fall short of the very high standards set by Vindication, just as he had done in the Saratoga ring. Whereas Vindication sold for \$2.15 million, Scipion was originally recorded as an RNA, but was later purchased by a group headed by trainer Patrick Biancone for \$1.9 million. And whereas Vindication strolled through all four of his two-year-old starts, including the Breeders' Cup Juvenile, to take championship honors, Scipion failed to impress in his two starts in graded company after his eye-catching debut victory. *(Caulfield cont. p3)*

But the way that Scipion charged from the rear to win the Risen Star suggests that the Payson camp may yet have the last laugh. Vindication, after all, never made it to the races as a sophomore, whereas Scipion has the potential to do very well up to 12 furlongs.

Could the significant differences in the careers of Scipion and Vindication be attributed to their respective sires? My knee-jerk reaction is to say it can't, as there are distinct similarities between the racing records of their sires. Seattle Slew, sire of the more precocious Vindication, was unbeaten in three starts at two, starting on Sept. 20, and landed the GI Champagne S. at that age. Although A.P. Indy began his career just four days later on the calendar, he squeezed four starts into his first season and won three of them, including the GI Hollywood Futurity. Both father and son went on to prove that a mile and a half held no fears for them by taking the Belmont S.

The parallels between the stallion careers of Seattle Slew and A.P. Indy are less pronounced. Seattle Slew, of course, was able to sire major performers in every age group. He was very adept at getting exciting juveniles, as was illustrated by the Grade I victories of A.P. Indy, Capote, Fast Play, Landaluce, Seattle Song, Seattle Meteor, Surfside, Swale and Vindication.

Roughly 12 percent of Seattle Slew's 1044 progeny succeeded in winning at two. It was reasonable to expect A.P. Indy to be at least as effective in this area, in view of the fact that his dam Weekend Surprise was a dual Grade III juvenile winner by Secretariat, a champion juvenile himself. Sure enough, A.P. Indy has sired 15 percent juvenile winners, including 17 individual stakes winners at two. However, Lane's End's champion sire currently lags behind Seattle Slew in that only two of his 628 racing-age progeny have so far won at the highest level in their juvenile season (Tempera in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies and A.P. Valentine in the Champagne S.). Contrast this to A.P. Indy's total of 14 Grade I winners after the age of two, which suggests that his progeny often take longer to reach peak performance than the Seattle Slews used to.

In other words, Scipion is conforming to the general pattern of his sire's stock and could therefore be expected to be less precocious than the January-foaled Vindication, who was born 41 days earlier.

We shouldn't overlook the role played by Scipion's dam Strawberry Reason, who carried the Payson colors after being bought in utero when Pretty Reason was acquired for \$20,000 in 1991. Strawberry Reason didn't break her maiden until March of her sophomore season and it was October of that year before she became a stakes winner, on her 11th outing. That win came in the GIII Martha Washington S. over a mile and a sixteenth on turf.

Scipion's broodmare sire, Strawberry Road, wasn't exactly an early bird either. A winner of neither of his juvenile starts, he flourished to such an extent as a three-year-old that he won 10 of his 14 starts. This very tough Australian horse remained a potent force on the international scene up to the age of seven, when the GII Arcadia H. became the last of his 17 successes. Strawberry Road later proved remarkably effective as a sire, notably becoming one of the few stallions to have sired three individual Breeders' Cup winners (Ajina, Escena and Fraise).

A background like this encourages the belief that Scipion is sure to add to his achievements as the distances lengthen and Virginia Kraft Payson must now be delighted that there wasn't more interest in her colt at Saratoga. Indeed she could have a popular stallion for Payson Stud, judging by the reception that Vindication has received. Starting out at \$50,000, he attracted 140 mares in his first season at Hill 'n' Dale. Seventeen of those mares were sold for an average of over \$580,000 and a top price of \$1.45 million, so it is hardly surprising that Vindication's fee has now risen to \$60,000.
