STONERSIDE BUYS INTEREST IN SORT IT OUT

Stonerside Stable has purchased a controlling interest in Feb. 12 Whirlaway S. winner **Sort it Out** (Out of Place) from Preferred Pals Stable, it was announced yesterday. The three-year-old New York-bred will be moved to Bob Baffert's barn in California before possibly returning to the Empire State for a tilt in the Apr. 9

GI Wood Memorial S. Baffert trained champion Chilukki and MGISW Congaree for Stonerside. While under the tutelage of trainer Allen Iwinski, Sort it Out finished second in the restricted Damon Runyon S. in December and won two allowance races prior to his upset win over Galloping Grocer in the

Whirlaway. Explaining why they purchased Sort It Out, Stonerside's Racing and Bloodstock Manager John Adger said, "Well, it looks like a lot of our three-year-olds are going to be later-developing horses, so we thought we'd take a shot. He's got a nice pedigree--we own several shares in his sire, Out of Place--and we thought he ran a real nice race in the Whirlaway. Right now, the Wood Memorial is in the long-range plan." Adger said the colt had been moved to John and Tonja Terranova's barn at Belmont and would likely be shipped to the West Coast next week.

A MILESTONE FOR GONE WEST

With yesterday's front-running victory by Conroy in the Longchamp International S., a handicap over 1200 meters at Nad al Sheba, Mill Ridge Farm stallion **Gone West** (Mr. Prospector) surpassed the \$60-million mark in career progeny earnings. The sire of reigning Eclipse Award winning sprinter Speightstown, the 21-year-old has been represented by an additional pair of champions, Zafonic and Royal Abjar, as well as four individual winners of Breeders' Cup races. "He definitely is the pillar of our operation," commented Bayne Welker, Jr., head of stallion marketing and sales development at Mill Ridge. "You feel fortunate when you run a small band of stallions, especially in today's environment, that you're able to acquire one of his quality--they're hard to come by. To be able to accomplish what he has over the years is great and he obviously has a soft spot in our heart. He's certainly repaid everyone who has believed in him over the years and to surpass the \$60-million mark is a nice feather in his cap." Conroy is likely to make his next appearance in the Mar. 5 G3 Mahab al Shimaal, a prep race for the G1 Dubai Golden Shaheen, which he was won the past three years.

CHRB REVIEWS MEDICATION ISSUES The Medication Committee of the California Horse Racing Board discussed toughening medication rules, policies and penalties during its meeting Wednesday. Other proposals under consideration are raising the standard for official drug-testing laboratories, freezing urine samples for future analysis, better identifying horses entering and leaving restricted areas and forming an advisory group to help the board stay on top of issues of concern. "We are trying to do some things differently," said the board's executive director Ingrid Fermin. "The thought is to be more of a deterrent--to provide more reasons for people to follow the rules and regulations of the California Horse Racing Board." Of new deterrents already in place, Fermin said, "We've posted signs at the gates advising everyone that if they enter the restricted area, they are subject to being searched. We've collected equine samples at uncustomary times--both much earlier and after the race. We are and will continue to be more visible. We want people to know that we intend to be more proactive within the restricted area." CHRB Commissioner Richard Shapiro issued a call for stricter penalties. "If we are going to tighten security and do all of the things being advocated to catch people who violate our rules, then the next logical step is to impose strict penalties [whereby] people can lose their licenses, purses are going to be redistributed and horses are going to be denied entry," Shapiro said. The meeting came on the heels of the announcement that three trainers at the current Santa Anita meeting have had horses test for high levels of TCO2 or milkshakes. As a result, horses trained by Jeff Mullins, Vladimir Cerin and Julio Canani will be required to be placed in a detention barn the day before they run.

Nelson Suffers Separated Shoulder:

Jockey Leroy Nelson, who sustained a separated shoulder when he fell off his mount in the second race at Gulfstream Wednesday, will be out of action indefinitely, according to Jockey Guild representative Roger Velez. Velez said Nelson had an operation on the same shoulder last year following a spill. Nelson was unseated from Hail to the World in a \$25,000 maiden claimer Wednesday just as they were crossing under the finish line. Hail to the World would have finished third, but stewards ruled Nelson was coming off prior to the wire and the three-year-old colt was therefore not carrying the assigned weight.

Satin Kiss is not an original nominee for the May 6 GI Kentucky Oaks and would have to be supplemented for \$25,000.
