Madcap Escapade (Hennessy) makes her long-awaited return in the GII Shirley Jones H. at Gulfstream Park this afternoon. But her first race back will be anything but easy with MGISW

Society Selection (Coronado's Quest) lining up in the gate next to her. "This is an extremely tough spot to start out in," trainer Frank Brothers told *Daily Racing Form*. "It's a huge jump she's making against older fillies, and seven furlongs is a tough distance, since you've got to run pretty

much the whole way. But I guess you can never write the script perfectly." Madcap Escapade exploded onto the scene last year at Gulfstream, winning her first three efforts by a combined 26 1/2 lengths, including the GII Forward Gal S. in mid-March. She managed to stretch her speed to two turns when annexing the GI Ashland S. at Keeneland in her next start, but failed to see out the nine furlongs of the GI Kentucky Oaks and finished third to Ashado. She was sidelined with a fractured hip shortly thereafter, but has been working forwardly. Society Selection was sensational when she took the GI Test S. by 6 1/4 lengths at today's distance last July, then underlined her versatility by winning the 10-furlong GI Alabama S. in her very next start. She's been off since a ninth-place showing in the GI Breeders' Cup Distaff.

GOLD CUP TO BE RUN AS A HANDICAP

The 66th edition of the GI Hollywood Gold Cup, set for Saturday, July 9, will be run as a handicap for the first time since 1996, it was announced yesterday. The 10-furlong event offers a purse of \$750,000.

"Through the combined efforts of the Thoroughbred Owners of California and Hollywood Park, the Gold Cup has been returned to handicap status," said Hollywood Racing Secretary Martin Panza. "The race has a rich tradition and we're hopefully reverting to its roots as a handicap will make it more appealing nationally." The Gold Cup headlines a Hollywood stakes schedule worth \$9.46 million.

KING'S BOY TAKES KING'S CUP

King's Boy (Ger) (Platini {Ger}), with jockey Aaron Gryder aboard, successfully defended his title in yesterday's King's Cup in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, cruising to a 5 1/2-length score over American hopeful **Dynever** (Dynaformer) and jockey Jose Santos. The highweight older horse at 14 furlongs and up in Germany at four, the eight-year-old was named the champion older horse and champion stayer in the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia in 2004 after winning the country's most prestigious race, which is also known as the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques Cup. He bettered his time in the 3400-meter event by more than four seconds, completing the distance in 3:36.12 yesterday. Gryder was also in the saddle for last year's King's Cup victory and had flown to the Middle East in December to pilot the chestnut, who races under the name Qaayed Alkhail in Saudi Arabia, to a three-length score in the Crown Prince Cup. King's Boy is owned by Prince Mohammed bin Saud Al-Kabeer and trained by Jerry Barton, a former assistant to D. Wayne Lukas. He has won 14 of his 31 career starts, earning \$569,390. Dynever, racing as Ittasak, picked up his fifth second-place finish in his last seven starts. His fellow U.S. shippers were both off the board, with **Kissin Saint** (Kissin Kris) (racing as Moustabsil) running eighth and **Tamburello** (Chi) (Gallantsky) (under the name Mostahek) finishing 14th.

Silmaril, who has won six of her last seven races, looks to make it seven for eight. The four-year-old filly captured the Oct. 9 Maryland Million Oaks and, after running fifth in the Nov. 20 GIII Anne Arundel S., bounced back to take the Dec. 11 Geisha S. and the Jan. 29 Nellie Morse S. In at 114, she gets seven pounds from highweight **Bear Fan**. "We didn't peak her for [the Nellie Morse] because we had the Fritchie in mind," said trainer Chris Grove. "She was unlucky in her first graded experience, but they don't give \$200,000 away, so we'll have to run for it." Even-money choice Bear Fan began a four-race win streak with her three-length victory in last year's Barbara Fritchie. In addition to a stakes win over the Santa Anita turf in March, the bay mare earned main-track victories with a five-length tally in the GII Genuine Risk H. and a nine-length score in the GII Vagrancy H. Sidelined after a runner-up effort behind Ema Boverly (Chi) in the GII Princess Rooney H. at Calder last July, Bear Fan returned to finish second in the Sunshine Millions F/M Sprint at Gulfstream last time out Jan. 29. She was third in that race at Santa Anita last winter before her '04 Fritchie win. "She came out of the Sunshine Millions great," confirmed trainer Wesley Ward. "That's why I'm willing to run her back so quickly." **Sensibly Chic** missed by just a head in the Garland of Roses H. to end 2004 and returned with a front-running 6 1/2-length triumph in the Jan. 29 What a Summer S. at Laurel.

License to Run, a Group 1 winner at this marathon distance in his native Brazil, is still looking for his first U.S. win. The dark bay was a narrowly beaten third in his North American bow in the Dec. 4 GI Hollywood Turf Cup, but tired to fifth last time out in the Jan. 22 GII San Marcos S. "He acts like a very good horse," said Pat Valenzuela, who has the mount on License to Run for the first time Saturday. "I don't know what happened in his last race. It looked like he was a little temperamental and stalking the pace. I don't know if [trainer] Bobby [Frankel]'s going to want to put him on the lead or what he's going to want to do, but the horse has worked well for me in the past and I look forward to riding him." Veteran runner **Continental Red** will be making his first start for trainer Adam Kitchingman, who takes over for the Riyadh-bound Ian Jory. The nine-year-old gelding closed strongly to finish fourth in the Jan. 29 nine-furlong Sunshine Millions Turf S. and has hit the board in 11 of 17 starts at 1 1/2 miles. "He's tries hard every time," Hall of Fame jockey Gary Stevens said of his San Luis Obispo mount. "In the Sunshine Millions, he came flying on the inside. He just needed more ground and we're getting more ground. If it comes up soft, I know he likes soft turf. He's an old warrior." Rain was in the forecast both Friday and Saturday. **T.H. Approval**, winner of a 12-furlong optional claimer at Hollywood last November, returned from a two-month freshening to run third in the San Marcos for trainer Eduardo Inda.

Greater Good had the distinction of being the only juvenile male last year to have won two graded stakes around two turns. After capturing the GIII Kentucky Cup Juvenile S. in September, he was forced to settle for third in the GIII Iroquois S. after jumping a fallen rival, but returned to the winner's circle in the GII Kentucky Jockey Club S. in late November. On holiday since, he has been working exceptionally--earning the bullet in three of his last six--including a six-furlong tightener in 1:13 1/5 Feb. 12. "We've been pointing for the Southwest all along," says trainer Bob Holthus. "Now it's time to find out what we have. I know he'll be the favorite, but the last I looked, he has to get around the track before they give us the check."

CANADIAN INTERNATIONAL PURSE UPPED TO \$2 MILLION The purse for the GI Pattison Canadian International S. has been increased from C\$1.5 million to C\$2 million for 2005. Woodbine will host the 68th running of the mile-and-a-half turf test on Sunday, Oct. 23. The Woodbine Entertainment Group also announced C\$250,000 purse increases for the GI E.P. CALIFORNIA CONSIDERS ELIMINATING SCALE OF WEIGHTS

The California Horse Racing Board has started the process that could eventually lead to the elimination of the standard scale of weights and an increase in the minimum weight that Thoroughbreds carry in the state. If the new rule is put into effect, the minimum weight would be raised to 116 pounds, and a rider's attire and equipment would no longer be considered a part of the weight carried. The minimum weight in handicap races would be 112 pounds. An addition to the program would list the weight of the equipment and attire, the weight of the jockey and how many pounds of lead were needed to fulfill the required weight assignment. During a meeting Thursday, California's seven racing commissioners gave their unanimous approval for a 45-day notice to the public regarding the proposed rule change. Racing secretaries Tom Robbins (Del Mar), Martin Panza (Hollywood) and Rick Hammerle (Santa Anita) joined Thoroughbred Owners of California President Drew Couto and California Thoroughbred Trainers Executive Director Ed Halpern in dissent of the measure. Robbins voiced the option that a raise in the minimum weight would harm the sport of racing in California, as trainers might ship out of state in search of lower weight assignment for their horses. But requests to table the proposal until concerns are addressed were denied. "We've been discussing this for one year already, and now it is up to the Board to accomplish things," said commissioner Jerry Moss. The proposed amendment would also establish a minimum body fat content of five percent for male riders and 10 percent for female riders. Final approval could be given after a public hearing, possibly at the CHRB's next meeting on Apr. 28.

KEENELAND CATALOGS 262 FOR APRIL A total of 262 lots have been catalogued for the Keeneland April Two-Year-Olds in Training Sale. The 13th edition of the auction will be held Apr. 19. This year's offering is just three fewer than last year's record of 265 hips. The two training previews are set for 10:30 a.m. on Apr. 11 and Apr. 18. Bidding for the one-day sale begins at 1 p.m. The 2004 April Sale saw 101 horses sell for an aggregate of \$22,012,000. The average was \$217,941 and the median was \$135,000.

VIRGINIA DERBY GETS PURSE BOOST Pending approval by the Virginia Racing Commission, the purse for the GIII Virginia H. at Colonial Downs has been raised from \$500,000 to \$750,000 for 2005. In addition, the Colonial Turf Cup, which was slated to carry a purse of \$250,000 for its inaugural running, has been raised to \$500,000. The Colonial Turf Cup, the prep for the Virginia Derby, is set for June 25, while the Derby itself will be run July 16. The 40-day Colonial Downs meet opens June 24 and runs through Aug. 16.

Aqueduct Main Track to Open in March:

Racing at Aqueduct is tentatively scheduled to be moved from the inner track to the main track beginning Mar. 16. The move was originally slated for Mar. 9, but track superintendent John Passero decided to delay the switch a week. "This is a transitional period for weather here in New York and it is always best to take a cautious approach," Passero said. "The inner track is a great surface for this time of year and it is best to maximize this asset. The plan, weather permitting, is to open the main track for training on Mar. 14 and then begin racing two days later." The GIII Toboggan H. and the Broadway H., both set for Mar. 12, were to be run at seven furlongs, but, because of the extended inner track meet, will be shortened to six furlongs. Post time will, however, change from 12:30 to 1 p.m. on Mar. 9.

A \$475,000 Fasig-Tipton Saratoga yearling, Saint Marden captured the 2002 GIII Discovery H. for trainer Michael Matz and owners Martin Schwartz and Dennis Drazin. On the board in six of eight starts, the six-year-old won four times and earned \$159,800. He is a half brother to Sweet Lips (Kris S.), a stakes winner and graded stakes placed. Kentucky Urged to Begin Testing for Milkshakes:

The Kentucky Equine Drug Research Council is recommending that the Kentucky Horse Racing Authority come up with a proposal that would allow for testing for "milkshakes." A "milkshake" is an illegal substance made up primarily of bicarbonate of soda that is administered by a gastric tube on the day of a race. It is purported to prevent the build up of lactic acid, giving a runner an energy boost late in the race. Tests measure the amount of carbon dioxide in the blood, and the Council will recommend that a measurement over 37 millimoles per liter will constitute a positive.
