A BEAR MARKET

He has yet to win going seven furlongs, but today's GII General George H. at Laurel Park could set up perfectly for **Gators N Bears** (Stormy Atlantic). The five-year-old has tried seven panels three times in the past, finishing third in this event last year and second in the GIII Toboggan H., with George favorite **Dox Six** (Wild Escapade) third, in March. First at the finish of the GIII Maryland Breeders' Cup H. in May and the James B. Moseley Breeders' Cup H. in June, the bay was winless in his last three starts of 2004, but picked up checks every time and was gaining on Don Six in his 2005 debut, running second to that rival in the six-furlong Paumonok H. at Aqueduct Jan. 29. Jockey Ramon Dominguez picks up the mount on Gators N Bears. "The two got acquainted during a bullet half-mile work in :46 3/5 at Laurel Feb. 13. "He was very impressive," Dominguez said. "Not only did he go fast, but he did it very much within himself. Don Six is a very fast horse, and if someone goes with him, I wouldn't mind sitting right behind them." Don Six ended last season with a front-running victory in the Dec. 19 GIII Gravesend H. before leading gate to wire in the Paumonok, and trainer Scott Lake believes he is ready for another stellar effort. "He came out of his New York races tremendous, and that might be an understatement," Lake said.

MUCHA BUENA

A full field of 11, with two on the also-eligible list, has been entered for the GII Buena Vista H. going a mile on the grass at Santa Anita, but it is likely that, one way or the other, as much as half the runners could be scratched. The constant rain in Southern California forced Saturday's San Luis Obispo H. to the main track and, with severe thunderstorms in the forecast, it's odds-on that there will be another surface switch here. But that's just what trainer Bob Baffert might have been expecting when he threw **Resplendency** (Tale of the Cat) into this event. The four-year-old filly has never raced on the turf, but she took advantage when the Dec. 31 Monrovia H. was moved to the main track, winning by a length in the slop at Santa Anita. She followed that effort with a third-place finish in the Jan. 30 GI Santa Monica H. and, if she can handle the stretch out to a mile, will be tough to handle today. Another with solid dirt form is **Miss Terrible (Arg)** (Numerous). The six-year-old mare captured a pair of Group 1 races going a mile on the main track in her native country, taking the Estrellas Juvenile Fillies and the Argentine 1000 Guineas in 2002. She has been off the board in her two starts since shipping to the U.S. and has not been out since finishing sixth in a Saratoga allowance test in August of 2003, but she has been working sharply for her belated return, most recently posting a bullet six furlongs in 1:11 4/5 on Valentine's Day. She was caught behind horses

as they came into the stretch, but found room on the far outside, rallied to catch Dynamite Lass and pulled away to a make it three-for-three on the lawn. "I had no problem running them down," jockey Jerry Bailey said.

VINOTECH (c, 3, Smoke Glacken--Tension Point, by Danzig) captured a seven-furlong allowance test at Calder Dec. 18, but failed to handle the jump into stakes company and finished 11th in the Jan. 8 Aventura S. at Gulfstream. A 3-1 chance with the return to the allowance ranks, the 1/2 to Marigalante (Silver Ghost), GSP, \$136,846, pressed through sharp splits, drove to a short lead inside the final eighth and pulled away late to best Lucky Frolic (Carson City) by 3 1/4 lengths. The winner was a \$67,000 FTKJUL yearling. Lifetime Record: 5-3-1-0, \$60,400. O-Jaime S Carrion-Trustee. B-Silverleaf Farms, Inc (FL). T-Edward Plesa Jr.

Defer Tunes up for FOY:

There were only two five-furlong workouts yesterday accomplished in under one minute, and both were turned in by horses trained by Shug McGaughey. McGaughey's top Triple Crown hopeful **Defer** (Danzig) stopped the clock in :59 4/5 with Jerry Bailey in the irons. "He was just breezing around there nicely," the trainer explained. "He galloped out in 13 seconds. He's telling us he's going to get better going long." Fourth in the GII Hutcheson S. Feb. 5, he is scheduled to make his next start in the GII Fountain of Youth S. Mar. 5.

Daydreaming Given Green Light for Sabin:

Next Saturday's GIII Sabin H. will mark the 2005 debut of the Shug McGaughey-trained **Daydreaming** (A.P. Indy). The four-year-old Ogden Mills Phipps homebred turned in her final pre-race breeze yesterday, stopping the clock in :59, the fastest of 16 moves at the five-furlong distance. "She went a little quicker than I wanted, but I got what I wanted out of it," said McGaughey. "She gets kind of heady out there. There was another horse in front of her and it dropped inside of her. It got her going a little harder than I would have liked." The bay concluded her three-year-old season on a high note, winning the Oct. 1 GIII Indiana Breeders' Cup Oaks and the Nov. 26 GII Top Flight H.

Friday Features High-Profile Claims:

The Friday program at Gulfstream Park featured the claims of a pair of high-profile horses. **This Fleet Is Due** (Northern Afleet), who returned from a 16-month absence to win for \$50,000, was halted out of the race by trainer John Charles Zimmerman on behalf of one of his main clients, the Trade Winds Stable. Seven-year-old This Fleet Is Due gained attention as a three-year-old when he was a good second in the Long Branch Breeders' Cup S. before going a close fourth to Point Given in the GI Haskell Invitational H. His victory Friday was his first since taking a third-level allowance at Belmont in May 2002. **Siphon City** (Siphon {Brz}) was claimed for \$75,000 out of the afternoon's last race. A \$500,000 graduate of the 2004 OBS February sale, the sophomore colt went wire-to-wire to win his turf and two-turn debuts by 3 1/4 lengths as the 6-5 favorite. Previously conditioned by Todd Pletcher for Michael Tabor and Derrick Smith, the chestnut colt now joins the shedrow of Dan Hurtak, who claimed the colt for owner Dennis Panches.

Papua, who won his first Hollie Hughes H. in 2003, had been held winless since taking the 2004 edition by a neck just over a year ago. The bay had been knocking on the door, however, finishing second in the Nov. 28 GIII Fall Highweight H. and third in the Dec. 19 GIII Gravesend H. before opening this season with a fifth in the Jan. 29 Paumonok H. Favored with the return to the state-bred ranks, the six-year-old was content to sit at the back of the pack through an opening half in :44.91, but closed from the rail on the final bend and dashed past pacesetter Show Boot in the stretch, opening it up to win handily. "This was as strong as any of his races," trainer Mike Hushion said. "He just 'whooshed' to the lead today." Added jockey Richie Migliore, "I had a good trip and the best horse, and a lot of times, that's unbeatable."

A finalist for the Eclipse Award as the top sprinter of 2003, Shake You Down was sidelined after running sixth in the GIII Bold Ruler H. in May. The veteran has failed to regain his stakes-caliber form since returning to be 10th in the Nov. 20 GI DeFrancis Dash. The chestnut managed a three-length tally in an optional claimer at Pimlico Dec. 8, but had been off the board in his two prior starts this term, running seventh in the Jan. 8 GIII Mr. Prospector H. and sixth in the Jan. 29 Sunshine Millions Sprint S. Dropping back into an optional-claiming event in search of the winner's circle, he was bet down to 7-10 and lived up to his odds. After breaking quickly, Shake You Down set a rapid pace, opened up seven lengths on his three rivals at the eighth pole and was in hand as he cruised to an easy win.

Megascape Gets Fresh Challenge in Dearly Precious:

Megascape (Cape Canveral) is clearly the most accomplished runner in a field of seven assembled for this afternoon's \$75,000 Dearly Precious S. at Aqueduct. But despite being a three-time stakes winner, including back-to-back scores in the Gill Valley Stream S. and the Ruthless S., the dark bay faces the stiffest competition of her career in the form of **Slew Motion** (Slew Gin Fizz). A New York-bred, the \$52,000 OBSAUG yearling and \$60,000 FTMMAY two-year-old was previously trained in Northern California by Greg Gilchrist and took her last two starts, including a Dec. 30 allowance over a sloppy main track at Golden Gate by six lengths. Her 92 Beyer for that effort rates as tops in the field. Slew Motion is owned by IEAH Stables and partners that include New York Yankee manager Joe Torre, and is trained by Richard Dutrow, Jr.

Tempted by World Cup, Imperialism a Go for Big 'Cap:

There's a \$6-million purse awaiting the world's top handicap horses half way around the world Mar. 26, but **Imperialism** (Langfuhr) won't be there. The four-year-old, third to Smarty Jones in last year's Kentucky Derby, will pass on a possible huge payday in favor of one that's handsome enough in the \$1-million GI Santa Anita H. Mar. 5. "There's been some pressure from some sources to run [in Dubai], saying it's more money and possibly an easier race," explained owner Steve Taub. "But [trainer] Kristin [Mulhall] doesn't want to go and I respect her judgment, so we're not going." Imperialism comes into the Big 'Cap on the heels of a head defeat at the hands of **Rock Hard Ten** (Kris S.) in the GI Strub S. and Taub has visions of an enduring rivalry between the two colts. "I know we're going to race Imperialism through his five-year-old year," he commented. "I hope that will be the case with Rock Hard Ten, because it would have the potential for great competition between the two of them. It's the kind of stuff that could bring people to the races on Big 'Cap day to see something they haven't seen before, the beauty of our sport."

Southern California Odds 'n Ends:

Trainer Wally Dollase is considering the GI Frank E. Kilroe Mile for the return of GI Manhattan H. winner **Meteor Storm (GB)** (Bigstone {Ire}). "I might use that as a prep for the GII San Luis Rey H. [12 furlongs, turf, Mar. 27]," he said. "I know he can do good in the Kilroe. Whether he can win it or not, I don't know. But he's training ghostbusters right now, so we'll give it a shot." The six-year-old is unraced since finishing seventh as the favorite in the GI United Nations H. July 3... Undefeated **Chandtrue** (Yes It's True) remains on track for a start in the GII Swale S. at Gulfstream Park Mar. 5 despite the recent run of wet weather. "It's not going to screw him up, it already has," said trainer Bob Hess Jr. "Is Chandtrue off schedule? No. Has it compromised him a little bit? Yes, like everyone else." A treble stakes winner, the Florida-bred colt was most recently the half-length winner of the GIII Hollywood Juvenile Championship last July 17.

Sibille To Receive Woolf Award:

Ray Sibille, who rode the winners of 4,264 races in a career spanning 35 years, has been named the winner of the 2005 George Woolf Award, which honors riders whose careers and personal character reflect positively on themselves as well as the sport of Thoroughbred racing. Born in Sunset, Louisiana, in 1952, Sibille rode his first winner at Evangeline Downs in 1969 and shifted his tack to the Chicago circuit in 1973, where he won multiple titles at Sportsman's, Hawthorne and Arlington. He rode in Southern California from 1981 to 1993 and acquired the mount on Great Communicator, who he guided to victory in the 1988 Breeders' Cup Turf. Sibille, who retired from the saddle last July, outpointed fellow jockeys Rick Wilson, David Flores, Richard Migliore and Casey Lambert to win the award. "It's quite an honor and I guess this puts me up there in the major leagues," the 52-year-old commented. "It's great to be recognized by your fellow riders."

"He has more improvement in him, but so does the filly," winning trainer David Payne told *Australian Associated Press*, adding, "I put blinkers on Flying Pegasus today to keep him focused and it seems to have done the trick, although he still has a lot to learn." Flying Pegasus had his Slipper chances slashed from \$17 to \$7, while Mnemosyne was eased out to \$4.50 joint favorite with **Snitzel (Aus)** (Redoute's Choice {Aus}) for the Mar. 19 Golden Slipper.
