COUNTY COMMANDS GENERAL GEORGE

Saratoga County (Valid Expectations) forged to the lead in the final stride to take yesterday's GII General George H. at Laurel Park by a determined nose over pacesetting favorite **Don Six** (Wild Escapade). The bay colt, winner of last year's GIII Gotham S. and fourth in the GII Riva Ridge Breeders' Cup S. and GII Jerome H., earned his second graded victory with a late-running 2 1/2-length victory in the Jan. 8 GIII Mr. Prospector H. at Gulfstream last time out. A 5-2 shot to add to his graded tally yesterday, Saratoga County loomed a threat with a three-wide move into the lane and gradually reeled in Don Six despite drifting out at midstretch. "His form has stepped up a notch over the last three races," confirmed winning trainer George Weaver. "I thought we had Don Six easy when we were coming off the turn, but Don Six dug in and it kind of surprised me. As they approached the wire, I didn't think we were going to get there. MUDDY VIEW APPEALS TO URAIB

Uraib (Ire) (Mark of Esteem {Ire}) was allowed to tarry well back of the field in a muddy and scratch-depleted renewal of the GIII Buena Vista H. at Santa Anita yesterday, but the dark bay mare closed relentlessly down the stretch to just nip pacesetting **Resplendency** (Tale of the Cat) at the wire. The consistent Uraib, on the board in six of her last eight outings, was second in the off-the-turf GIII San Gorgonio H. at this track in January and returned to the lawn for a runner-up effort in the Jan. 30 Brown Bess H. at Golden Gate last time out. With the field shortened to five when the Buena Vista came off the turf, main-track performer Resplendency, coming off a third-place effort on the dirt in the Jan. 30 GI Santa Monica H., was the 3-2 favorite. The bay filly showed the way from the start through fractions of :21.79, :44.08 and 1:08.14 and appeared home free at midstretch, before Uraib powered into the picture in the waning strides to earn a narrow victory. "We got up in the last jump and that's the way we like to see it happen," winning rider Jon Court said of the tight finish. "It was just a matter of if she would handle the track and get up in time and she got up in that final jump, so we're very pleased." Brisnet.com chart or [video replay](#).

FALLON TO RETURN TO BRITAIN Jockey Kieren Fallon has decided to abruptly end his stay in the United States, *Racing Post* reports. Six times a champion rider in Britain, Fallon had originally planned on remaining in the U.S. through mid-March, but soured on the idea recently, reportedly complaining about the racing surfaces at Gulfstream Park. Fallon admitted that he did not like racing on the dirt and expressed a desire to ride exclusively in turf racing. But his American agent, Terry Miller, explained that his client has had a change of heart. "He doesn't like the fast ground--Kieren thinks the ground is too hard," Miller told *Racing Post*. "I don't really know what happened, but he told me four or five days ago that he'd be going back. It's a shame. He's such a nice guy and is a great rider." Fallon got off to a quick start in South Florida, winning with three of his first 11 mounts, but his fortunes had turned since. Through Sunday's racing, he had ridden a total of six winners from 62 starts.

After four wins from 12 starts on the turf, Meisho Bowler switched to the dirt and took the G3 Garnet S. by three lengths in his first try over that surface Jan. 9. He followed with an even better effort in the G3 Negishi S., winning that Jan. 29 event by a commanding seven lengths and making him the even-money choice to make it three in a row. Sent immediately to the lead by Yuichi Fukunaga, Meisho Bowler set good fractions of :45.9 and 1:09.7 over the sloppy going and held off Seeking the Dia to win in track-record setting time. "It was a really strong performance," the winning jockey commented. "He was pulling in the early going, so I let him have his way. It takes a strong horse to go wire-to-wire." The winner is likely to return to the turf for the G1 Takamatsunomiya Kinen at Chukyo Mar. 27.

PEDIGREE INSIGHTS

DANZIG DOWN UNDER

Anyone trying to illustrate the impact Danzig's descendants have made on Australian racing need look no further than the leading sires' lists for the 2003-04 season. The general sires' table was headed by Danzig's son Danehill, who was recording his eighth Australian championship in 10 years, and the Danzig male line accounted for six of the top 12 stallions, which featured four sons of Danehill. The dominance of the Danzig/Danehill line was even more pronounced among the sires of two-year-olds, accounting for six of the top eight positions.

So you can imagine that the arrival of Fusaichi Pegasus--who is out of a Danzig mare--created something of a quandary for the many Australian breeders with mares by Danehill or his sons. Sending a Danehill mare to Fusaichi Pegasus would create 3x3 inbreeding to Danzig, which some breeders would consider a bit too close for comfort.

The potential problem of inbreeding to Danzig, of course, was one of soundness, or the lack of it. Remember, Danzig's exciting debut victory in the June of his two-year-old season was immediately followed by the discovery of bone chips. Away from the races for over 10 months, Danzig returned the following May to record two impressive allowance victories. Unfortunately, X-rays taken after his third success revealed that a slab fracture was developing in a knee and Danzig was forced into retirement before he had tackled stakes company.

On the other hand, Danzig's progeny have a reputation for being sounder than their sire. Around three-quarters of his progeny have made it to the races and around 60 percent of his named foals have won. More to the point, more than 18 percent of Danzig's foals have become stakes winners, which is surely a compelling incentive for trying to strengthen his influence by inbreeding.

Often, where close inbreeding is concerned, few breeders are prepared to experiment unless they can point to a successful precedent. This can become a Catch 22 situation and inbreeding to Danzig hasn't been widespread. Its main successes have been the Australian Group 1 winner Hit The Roof (inbred 2x3), the dual American Grade III winner Strolling Belle (2x3) and the English Group 3 winner Foss Way (3x3).

Hit The Roof is the most interesting of these, as he is out of a Danehill mare and his win in the Victoria Derby of 2000 was very timely for Fusaichi Pegasus' arrival in 2001.

The 2000 Kentucky Derby winner covered 123 mares in his first year in Australia (compared to "only" 87 in 2003 and 153 in 2004). Ninety-nine of those 123 first-season mares produced live foals and no fewer than 22 of them were daughters of Danehill. Among these Danehill mares were the Group 1 winners Dane Ripper, Danelagh, Danendri, Dashing Eagle and Joie Denise, together with the Group 2 scorers Precious Glitter and Cashier.

The list also included mares by Danehill's sons Danzero, Danewin and Flying Spur, as well as others by Danzig's sons Chief's Crown and Kashani. Inbreeding to Danzig is therefore going to receive a thorough testing via Fusaichi Pegasus' Aussie offspring over the next few years.

The experiment paid its first dividend at the end of last week when Flying Pegasus won the G3 Kindergarten S. over 5½ furlongs to put himself into the reckoning for the G1 Golden Slipper S. Another bred on the Fusaichi Pegasus-Danehill cross is Flying Dansino, who was third in a Listed race on her debut. Dr Green, the other promising Australasian stakes winner by Fusaichi Pegasus, is out of a Last Tycoon mare.

Flying Pegasus, who has also been second at Group 2 level, appears to have his sire's combination of plenty of ability coupled with a hot temperament. I suspect that we will have to get used to this in some of Fusaichi Pegasus' progeny, as some of them give the impression of being leery, highly strung types who will require time to mature mentally. *Cont. p. 4*

But as long as any temperament problems are balanced by above-average ability--as appears to be the case--I don't suppose the trainers will mind having to work a little harder for their wages.

Flying Pegasus' dam Cashier was also very effective as a juvenile, winning the G2 Silver Shadow S.

It is good to see Danehill's broodmare daughters beginning to come up with the goods. I can remember an American pedigree expert asking me years ago whether I had noticed that Danzig's daughters were not doing particularly well as broodmares. I had to admit that the results hadn't been impressive up to that point, but wondered whether the explanation had something to do with the standard of mare covered by Danzig in his early years.

Of course, Danzig was never a bargain-basement stallion covering poor mares, but the overall quality of his mares surely rose significantly after his first runners propelled him to stardom in 1984. Danzig's daughters from his later crops could therefore be expected to outshine those from his early crops. This has happened, with these mares producing Arch, Ecton Park, Distorted Humor, The Cliff's Edge, Dancethruthedawn, Fusaichi Pegasus, Grass Wonder, Hula Angel, Soaring Free and Wonder Again. It is worth mentioning that Danzig's daughters had five percent stakes winners among their foals up to November 1995, whereas that figure had risen to seven percent nine years later.

I think that we can expect a similar improvement in Danehill's record as a broodmare sire, at least in the northern hemisphere. His fee in Ireland slid over his first few seasons, sinking as low as IR9,000gns, so it would be wrong to expect the daughters from these early crops to fare as well as Danehill's younger daughters. The situation may be different in Australia, where Danehill's tremendous talents were recognised much sooner. Thorn Park, Hit The Roof, Barely A Moment, Sunday Joy and Unworldly have already become Group 1 winners in Australia for Danehill mares and Flying Pegasus could well develop into another.

GRADED STAKES NOTE... Saturday's running of the San Luis Obispo H. was automatically downgraded to Grade III status when it was taken off the Santa Anita turf. After reviewing the race, the American Graded Stakes Committee has reinstated its Grade II status.
